**Topic:** Collect and report summary data on administrator preparation and performance outcomes.

# I. Report Requirements

- A. Faculty Information
  - 1. Content areas of undergraduate and graduate degrees.
  - 2. Years of experience as K-12 teachers or school administrators.
- B. Program Information
  - 1. The number of months needed to complete the program.
  - 2. The number of credits students are required to complete to graduate.
- C. Graduate Information
  - 1. The current number and percentage of students who graduate are disaggregated by race.
  - 2. The current number and percentage of students who received a standard Minnesota administrator license are disaggregated by race.
  - 3. The current number and percentage of students who were employed as administrators in a Minnesota school district disaggregated by race.
  - 4. Survey results measuring student, graduate, and employer satisfaction with the program in the preceding school year, disaggregated by race.

## II. Report Data

- A. Faculty Information
  - 1. 171 individuals served as a fully employed or adjunct faculty members.
  - 2. Of these 171 individuals, undergraduate degrees/content areas included:
    - a) BS
    - b) BA
    - c) Content areas included: History, Political Science, English, Elementary Education, Music Education, International Business, Pre-Law, etc.)
  - 3. Of these 171 individuals, graduate degrees/content areas included:

- a) Master's (MA, MS, MEd)
- b) Ed Specialist
- c) Doctorate (EdD and PhD)
- d) Other (JD, M.A.T, MBA)
- e) Content areas included: Administration and Supervision, Educational Leadership, Curriculum and Instruction, Special Education, JD, Industrial Relations, Communication Sciences and Disorders, etc.)
- 4. On average, an administrative faculty member had 10 years of experience as a K-12 teacher.
  - a) Teaching experience was as low as 0 years.
  - b) Teaching experience was as high as 38 years.
- 5. On average, an administrative faculty member had 18 years of experience as an administrator.
  - a) Administrative experience was as low as 0 years.
  - b) Administrative experience was as high as 35 years.

## B. Program Information

- 1. The average candidate took 21 months to complete their program.
  - a) The total number of months to complete a program was as low as 12.
  - b) The total number of months to complete a program was as high as 65.\*
    \*This number is from one university, and it is the number of months to complete a doctoral program for the Director of Special Education license.
- 2. The average candidate took 28 credits to complete their program.
  - a) Program credits were as high as 36 credits needed to complete the program.
  - Program credits were as low as 22 credits needed to complete the program.
    - (1) Principal K-12 Programs (23-36 credits)
    - (2) Community Education Director Programs (20-30 credits)
    - (3) Director of Special Education Programs (22-36 credits)
    - (4) Superintendent Programs (22-36 credits)

#### C. Graduate Information

- 1. Below is graduate information for the 2023-2024 school year.
- 2. Minnesota's accredited administrative preparation programs recommended 528 candidates for administrative licensure in the 2023-2024 school year. Below are the percentages of the candidates disaggregated by race:
  - a) American Indian 1%
  - b) Asian 3%
  - c) Black 8%
  - d) Hispanic 2%

- e) Pacific Islander 0%
- f) White 82%
- g) Other 4%
- 3. Of the 528 candidates recommended for licensure, 490 candidates obtained a license for a 93% completion rate. Below are the percentages of the candidates disaggregated by race:
  - a) American Indian 1%
  - b) Asian 3%
  - c) Black 8%
  - d) Hispanic 2%
  - e) Pacific Islander 0%
  - f) White 83%
  - g) Other 4%
- 4. Of those 490 candidates, 268 were employed as an administrator in a Minnesota school for a 54% employment rate. Below are the percentages of the candidates disaggregated by race:
  - a) American Indian 1%
  - b) Asian 2%
  - c) Black 11%
  - d) Hispanic -2 %
  - e) Pacific Islander 0%
  - f) White 82 %
  - g) Other 2%

# **Board of School Administrators 2024 Report**

Purpose of Report: Publicly report "summary data on administrator preparation programs approved by the Board of School Administrators" (MN Statute 122A.091 Subd. 1)

## **Study Limitations:**

- 1. Lack of consistency in surveys given to students, graduates, and employers
- 2. Challenges to obtaining graduate employment information

### **Summary Statements:**

- Minnesota's school administrator preparation programs approved by the Board of School Administrators (BOSA) recommended 528 individuals for administrative licensure in the 2023-2024 school year, with 490 of them actually getting licensed for a 93% rate.
- It took the average candidate 21 months to complete their program.
- The number of credits to complete their program:
  - o Principal: ranged from 23-36 credits
  - o Director of Community Education: ranged from 20 to 30 credits
  - Director of Special Education: ranged from 22-36 credits
  - Superintendent: ranged from 30-36 credits
- The surveys given by universities measuring student, graduate, and employer satisfaction are different in format and content. Therefore, it is difficult to report the results.
