Unemployment Insurance Aid

Report for Fiscal Year 2025

Laws of 2023, Chapter 41, created the Postsecondary Unemployment Insurance Aid program in Minnesota Statute, Section 268.193. Money appropriated for this program must be distributed to colleges and universities in the system by calculating “the difference between fiscal year 2022’s unemployment insurance costs and the current year’s unemployment insurance costs, as reflected in the unemployment insurance employer accounts maintained by the state. If the total eligible unemployment insurance aid for a fiscal year is greater than the annual appropriation for that year, [the system] must proportionately reduce the aid payment to each eligible entity.” This program was established to help defray increased employer costs associated with law changes that extended potential eligibility for unemployment insurance benefits to people who have worked at a postsecondary educational institution and are between academic years, if the applicant’s work was in a capacity other than instruction, research, or principal administration.

Based on the expanded eligibility allowed by the expanded provisions in the law, a legislative fiscal note prepared by Minnesota State estimated potential increases in annual unemployment costs to the system of \$809,000. This estimate was based on current staffing levels and cost parameters provided by the state Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED), which oversees the state’s Unemployment Insurance program.

Based on the fiscal note, \$809,000 was appropriated in each year of the 2024-2025 biennium “for unemployment insurance aid under Minnesota Statutes, section 268.193, to institutions within the system.”

Laws of 2023, Chapter 41, also required that, by January 15 of each year, Minnesota State must report to the higher education committees of the legislature on “the balances in unemployment insurance aid accounts and information about the annual changes in reimbursable costs for higher education workers receiving unemployment insurance benefits. To the extent possible, the report must break out the costs by campus and major job classes.”

The table on the following page breaks down fiscal year unemployment insurance claims cost increases by campus or institution according to the account structure each college or university has established. Based on these numbers, a total of \$670,784.66 is going out in aid to colleges and universities for fiscal year 2025 costs. After these payments, the balance in Minnesota State’s FY2025 appropriation of \$809,000 will be \$138,215.34.
