Executive Summary

In 2023, the Minnesota Legislature amended Minnesota Statute 16A.151, requiring that when the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) recovers \$250,000 or more in a civil penalty from a permitted facility, 40 percent of the funds be distributed to the local Community Health Board (CHB). In 2024, the MPCA entered into a stipulation agreement with a facility in East Grand Forks, resulting in a \$350,000 civil penalty, of which \$140,000 was transferred to the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board (PNM CHB)—the first case statewide to qualify for funding under the new law. The PNM CHB, delegated to Polk County Public Health (PCPH), and in partnership with the MPCA, Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and the City of East Grand Forks, implemented a comprehensive community engagement process to identify local projects that would enhance environmental and public health outcomes. Based on community input, four projects were funded: the Griggs Park Trailhead Playground, Community Tree Planting Program, Library Art/Sensory Garden, and LaFave Park ADA Improvements, with a portion reserved for administrative oversight. The purpose of this report is to ensure transparency, accountability, and alignment with the intended community engagement and public health and environmental objectives of the funding. This initiative strengthened interagency collaboration, advanced environmental health priorities, and lessons learned for future implementation of Minnesota Statute 16A.151.

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Project Scope

1. Community Engagement Process

Planning and Consultation with State Partners

The community engagement process began with a series of planning and consultation meetings involving Polk County Public Health (PCPH), the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency Industrial Division (MPCA) (contract agreement), Minnesota Department of Health – Public Health Strategy and Partnership Division Governance and Administration, and Environmental Health Division Environmental Surveillance and Assessment Section –Site Assessment and Consultation Unit (MDH), and Association of Minnesota Counties Local Public Health Association. These initial discussions established a shared understanding about the Community Health Board Penalty Collection Process, consultation on the scope and application of the statutory requirements, outlined reporting expectations, and provided access to subject matter expertise to explore potential health risks and inform effective strategies.

Coordination with Local Interest Holders

PCPH led subsequent planning meetings with city officials, council members, and representatives from the facility in East Grand Forks, MN. These sessions were instrumental in identifying community needs and developing potential project concepts aimed at funding "projects that benefit the environment or public health".

As the convener and facilitator of the engagement process, PCPH created a collaborative forum for dialogue and coordination. Guided by the principle of "nothing about us, without us," the process emphasized inclusive participation. Each interest holder was engaged for a specific purpose and brought unique perspectives and expertise to the table, such as technical knowledge, operational experience, or community insight. This approach encouraged shared ownership and ensured that decision-making was informed by those closest to the issues.

Proposed projects were reviewed by PCPH and City officials for community benefit to the environment or public health, overall feasibility, and alignment with federal priorities that promote fair access to resources and community well-being. Each project was analyzed using the Justice 40 Initiative and the Climate and Economic

Justice Screening Tool (CEJST) to identify potential impacts on disadvantaged census tracts.

Initial Meetings and Work Sessions

A MPCA contract agreement was scheduled to be presented at the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board (PNM CHB) meeting on May 10, 2024; however, was removed from the agenda when the MPCA provided notification that the contract needed modified language. A PNM CHB meeting was held on July 19, 2024, where the proposed MPCA contract was approved, followed by an East Grand Forks City Council Work Session on August 27, 2024. Both meetings were convened with representation from PCPH and the city, board/council members (respectively), state agencies, and the facility. The meetings included an overview of the proposed contract and statutory language, presentations from MPCA, MDH and facility representatives were available for comments/questions. PCPH reviewed their role and a proposal for community engagement which featured a community input flyer and online community survey to gather resident feedback.

Community Input and Feedback Opportunities

A comprehensive public engagement process was implemented to gather community input on the preferred use of available funds. Public events were held at multiple locations to ensure broad accessibility and meaningful participation:

- September 4, 2024: East Grand Forks Showcase (Outdoor Community Event)
- September 6, 2024: East Grand Forks Senior Center
- September 9, 2024: East Grand Forks Campbell Library

PCPH and/or City staff were present to provide information, answer questions, and address residents' concerns in real time. State subject matter experts were available for PCPH consult as needed.

Participants of all ages were invited to participate in Dotmocracy (N= 134 dots), also known as dot-voting or idea rating, and share feedback on four proposed projects—

Griggs Park Trailhead Playground, Community Tree Planting Program, Library Art/Sensory Garden, and LaFave Park ADA Improvements—as well as suggest additional project ideas that would enhance the environment or public health in East Grand Forks, MN.

In addition to the in-person events, an online community survey was available from August 28 through September 13, 2024, generating 141 responses.

Outreach and promotional materials were developed by PCPH in collaboration with state and local partners and widely disseminated by PCPH, the City, local schools, the Family Resource Center, and other community organizations. Engagement efforts utilized multiple channels, including social media, posted flyers, and liaison networks, to ensure diverse community representation and inclusive participation across the community.

Data Analysis and Presentation of Results

Survey data and community feedback were compiled and analyzed by PCPH and shared with City staff. The summarized results were presented during an East Grand Forks City Council Work Session (November 26, 2024), where findings and recommendations were discussed.

Payment, Resolutions and Approval

The grant contract was executed in August 2024; however, disbursement of state funds did not occur within the ten-day period outlined in the grant agreement. In November 2024, PCPH contacted the MPCA about the delay and learned that it was due to a staffing transition and the complexities associated with the new grant type and disbursement process.

On December 3, 2024, the East Grand Forks City Council adopted Resolution No. 24-12-90 supporting project funding for the recommended initiatives that provide a benefit to the health and wellness of the community. The resolution affirmed that the City and CHB, delegated to PCPH, collaboratively sought public input through multiple engagement channels, such as public events and online surveys.

The results and recommendations were presented to the PNM CHB for consideration and formal resolution on December 13, 2024. The resolution authorized the disbursement of one-time funds and affirmed coordinated approval between city governance and public health leadership. As part of the recommendation, management proposed that \$126,000 of the total \$140,000 award

be directed toward four community projects, with the remaining 10% reserved to cover reasonable administrative and reporting costs associated with project management and required state documentation.

2. Purposes and Activities for Which Funds Were Used

The total award of \$140,000 was allocated as follows:

Project Allocations (\$126,000 Total)

1. Griggs Park Trailhead Playground - \$76,000

Funding supported the development of a new playground at Griggs Park Trailhead, enhancing recreational opportunities and promoting active lifestyles for the nearby school, neighborhood, home childcare and families and children.

2. Community Tree Planting Program - Private Property Trees - \$4,300

Originally proposed as bare-root tree plantings along public boulevards and within city park spaces, the project scope was modified in response to community input. Funds were redirected to provide trees for private properties, thereby expanding localized tree canopy coverage, improving ambient air quality, and advancing long-term environmental resilience. This approach broadened participation by allowing residents to directly contribute to community-level environmental improvements.

3. Library Art/Sensory Garden - \$10,000

This project supported the development of an interactive outdoor art and sensory garden at the Campbell Library, designed to foster creativity, inclusion, and community connection. Sensory gardens provide therapeutic and restorative benefits for individuals with sensory processing challenges, such as children and adults experiencing anxiety, autism, or recovering from a stroke or brain injury. The garden incorporates a variety of tactile surfaces, plant textures, fragrances, and visual elements to engage multiple senses and promote relaxation and well-being. The space includes an inclusive environment that supports both passive enjoyment and interactive programming led by library staff.

4. LaFave Park - Approximately \$35,700 (remaining funds)

Remaining project funds were designated for accessibility improvements at LaFave Park, based on recommendations by Community Options and their Americans with

Disabilities Act (ADA) consultant for improving access for individuals with disabilities and ensuring compliance with ADA standards.

Administrative Allocation (\$14,000 Total)

The shared administrative structure reflects the joint responsibilities of PCPH and the City in planning, implementing, and monitoring community projects that advance both public health and environmental goals with 10% of the total award (\$14,000) reserved for administrative and reporting expenses. Of this amount:

- \$9,800 (70%) was designated to Polk County Public Health
- \$4,200 (30%) was designated to the City of East Grand Forks

Accordingly, administrative cost allocations in this report align with the grant agreement to minimize administrative costs and reflect reasonable expenses necessary for project administration, fiscal oversight, and required reporting to the State of Minnesota.

3. Account of Expenditures

Total Funds Received and Expended: \$140,000. Full details in Appendices.

Reflections

Because this funding mechanism was new, the process provided important learning opportunities for both the state and local partners. The experience underscored the value of early and joint communication, access to subject matter expertise and clear guidance, and flexible problem-solving as processes and procedures continue to be refined for future projects.

The introduction of this new law, which distributes a portion of money recovered to local Community Health Boards, provided a valuable opportunity to strengthen the connection between environmental enforcement and community health. The process highlighted the important role of local public health as a convener of diverse partners, fostering coordinated community engagement and serving as a health strategist to identify local priorities and guide meaningful projects. The ability to retain a portion of administrative funds to support coordination, fiscal and project oversight, and state reporting was also beneficial in ensuring effective local implementation.

At the same time, this first application of the statute revealed challenges related to limited clarity in the statutory language, particularly regarding definitions, eligibility, and procedural expectations for community engagement. Consideration should be given to clarifying the statute and establishing consistent administrative guidance to support local implementation, improve efficiency, and ensure equitable use of future penalty-related funds. Continued collaboration with state partners will help refine the process and establish clearer guidance for future funding distributions.

Process Observation – This was the first case to qualify for the Community Health Board funding since the statute went into effect and therefore, no explicit process or precedent existed for implementation of the new statutory requirements. The statue specifies only that the Community Health Board, "must meet directly with the residents potentially affected by the pollution that was the subject of the litigation or settlement to identify the residents' concerns and incorporate those concerns into a project that benefits the residents". However, the statutory language does not define how the Board should determine which individuals or groups constitute "residents potentially affected by the pollution," nor does it outline the method for incorporating those concerns into a qualifying project. In the absence of specific procedural guidance, the Community Health Board and its partners relied on best practices in public engagement, transparency, and collaboration to design and implement a fair and inclusive process.

The stipulation agreement did not indicate that any individuals or specific areas were directly affected by the described violations. MPCA rules and regulations governing facility permits are intended to protect human health and the environment by limiting pollution emissions and discharges. When these requirements are not fully met, pollution may pose risks to people and the environment, but no information was available regarding potential off-site impacts or exposure to nearby residents. To assess possible impacts, the MPCA would need to provide supporting data. Without being provided evidence directly linking the violations to possible affected persons or locations, identifying them with confidence is difficult.

Process Observation – A requirement of this grant was for the Community Health Board to submit a report to select members of the Legislature describing the community engagement process, the purposes and activities supported by the funds, and a summary of expenditures. This reporting structure differs from the customary process in which local boards typically report directly to a state agency rather than the Legislature. As this funding mechanism continues to evolve, clarifying the reporting pathway and aligning it with existing state–local structures may help streamline future reporting and ensure consistency across similar grant programs.

16A.151 PROCEEDS OF LITIGATION OR SETTLEMENT.

Subdivision 1. State funds; general fund. (a) This subdivision applies, notwithstanding any law to the contrary, except as provided in subdivision 2.

- (b) A state official may not commence, pursue, or settle litigation, or settle a matter that could have resulted in litigation, in a manner that would result in money being distributed to a person or entity other than the state.
- (c) Money recovered by a state official in litigation or in settlement of a matter that could have resulted in litigation is state money and must be deposited in the general fund.
- Subd. 2. Exceptions. (a) If a state official litigates or settles a matter on behalf of specific injured persons or entities, this section does not prohibit distribution of money to the specific injured persons or entities on whose behalf the litigation or settlement efforts were initiated. If money recovered on behalf of injured persons or entities cannot reasonably be distributed to those persons or entities because they cannot readily be located or identified or because the cost of distributing the money would outweigh the benefit to the persons or entities, the money must be paid into the general fund.
- (b) Money recovered on behalf of a fund in the state treasury other than the general fund may be deposited in that fund.
- (c) This section does not prohibit a state official from distributing money to a person or entity other than the state in litigation or potential litigation in which the state is a defendant or potential defendant.
- (d) State agencies may accept funds as directed by a federal court for any restitution or monetary penalty under United States Code, title 18, section 3663(a)(3), or United States Code, title 18, section 3663A(a)(3). Funds received must be deposited in a special revenue account and are appropriated to the commissioner of the agency for the purpose as directed by the federal court.
- (e) Any money received by the state resulting from a settlement agreement or an assurance of discontinuance entered into by the attorney general of the state, or a court order in litigation brought by the attorney general of the state, on behalf of the state or a state agency, related to alleged violations of consumer fraud laws in the marketing, sale, or distribution of opioids in this state or other alleged illegal actions that contributed to the excessive use of opioids, must be deposited in the settlement account established in the opiate epidemic response fund under section 256.043, subdivision 1. This paragraph does not apply to attorney fees and costs awarded to the state or the Attorney General's Office, to contract attorneys hired by the state or Attorney General's Office, or to other state agency attorneys.
- (f) Notwithstanding paragraph (e), if money is received from a settlement agreement or an assurance of discontinuance entered into by the attorney general of the state or a court order in litigation brought by the attorney general of the state on behalf of the state or a state agency against a consulting firm working for an opioid manufacturer or opioid wholesale drug distributor, the commissioner shall deposit any money received into the settlement account established within the opiate epidemic response fund under section 256.042, subdivision 1. Notwithstanding section 256.043, subdivision 3a, paragraph (a), any amount deposited into the settlement account in accordance with this paragraph shall be appropriated to the commissioner of human services to award as grants as specified by the opiate epidemic response advisory council in accordance with section 256.043, subdivision 3a, paragraph (e).
- (g) If the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, through litigation or settlement of a matter that could have resulted in litigation, recovers \$250,000 or more in a civil penalty from violations of a permit issued by the agency, then 40 percent of the money recovered must be distributed to the community health board,

as defined in section 145A.02, where the permitted facility is located. Within 30 days of a final court order in the litigation or the effective date of the settlement agreement, the commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency must notify the applicable community health board that the litigation has concluded or a settlement has been reached. The commissioner must collect the money and transfer it to the applicable community health board. The community health board must meet directly with the residents potentially affected by the pollution that was the subject of the litigation or settlement to identify the residents' concerns and incorporate those concerns into a project that benefits the residents. The project must be implemented by the community health board and funded as directed in this paragraph. The community health board may recover the reasonable costs it incurs to administer this paragraph from the funds transferred to the board under this paragraph. This paragraph directs the transfer and use of money only and does not create a right of intervention in the litigation or settlement of the enforcement action for any person or entity. A supplemental environmental project funded as part of a settlement agreement is not part of a civil penalty and must not be included in calculating the amount of funds required to be distributed to a community health board under this paragraph. For the purposes of this paragraph, "supplemental environmental project" means a project that benefits the environment or public health that a regulated facility agrees to undertake, though not legally required to do so, as part of a settlement with respect to an enforcement action taken by the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency to resolve noncompliance.

- (h) A community health board receiving a transfer of funds under paragraph (g) must, no later than one year after receiving the funds, submit a report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the senate and house of representatives committees with primary jurisdiction over environment policy and natural resources that describes:
- (1) the process of community engagement employed to solicit community input regarding the use of the funds;
 - (2) the purposes and activities for which the funds were used; and
 - (3) an account of expenditures.
- (i) The commissioner of the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency must submit a report in September each even-numbered year, beginning in 2024, to the chairs and ranking minority members of the senate and house of representatives committees with primary jurisdiction over environmental policy and natural resources that includes:
- (1) the amount transferred under paragraph (g) to each community health board during the previous two years; and
- (2) any agency services provided to the community health board or community residents during the duration of the project funded by the transfer, and the cost of those agency services, for consideration by the legislature for future appropriations that address reimbursement of the amount of the transfers and the cost of services provided by the agency.
- (j) Any money received by the state resulting from a settlement agreement or an assurance of discontinuance entered into by the attorney general of the state, or a court order in litigation brought by the attorney general of the state on behalf of the state or a state agency related to alleged violations of consumer fraud laws in the marketing, sale, or distribution of electronic nicotine delivery systems in this state or other alleged illegal actions that contributed to the exacerbation of youth nicotine use, must be deposited in the tobacco use prevention account under section 144.398. This paragraph does not apply to: (1) attorney fees and costs awarded or paid to the state or the Attorney General's Office; (2) contract attorneys hired by the state or Attorney General's Office; or (3) other state agency attorneys. The commissioner of management

and budget must transfer to the tobacco use prevention account, any money subject to this paragraph that is received by the state before May 24, 2023.

(k) This section does not apply to money deposited in the consumer protection restitution account under section 8.37.

- Subd. 3. Definitions. For purposes of this section:
- (1) "litigation" includes civil, criminal, and administrative actions;
- (2) "money recovered" includes actual damages, punitive or exemplary damages, statutory damages, and civil and criminal penalties; and
- (3) "state official" means the attorney general, another constitutional officer, an agency, or an agency employee, acting in official capacity.
 - Subd. 4. Supersede. This section supersedes section 8.31, subdivision 2c.

RE: Project recommendations relating to MPCA Grant with Polk County Public Health

Background:

As previously discussed at an August 2024 City Council Work Session, the City of East Grand Forks will be receiving approximately \$126,000 in grant funding from Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) through the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board. In September 2024, Polk County Public Health and City Staff distributed online surveys and held community input open houses on three dates (at the Community Showcase, the Senior Citizens Center, and Campbell Library).

A list of the survey results and top submitted project ideas is included with the RCA.

Project recommended for funding with the available \$126,000 are as follows:

- Griggs Park Trailhead Playground; Budget Amount \$75,921.82
 - Location: Hill Street (269 Griggs Place) / near Sacred Heart Schools
 - b. Playground equipment for ages 2-12, ADA compliant safety surfacing, playground borders and installation
 - Project design picture and quote is attached.
- 2. Community Tree Planting Program; Budget Amount \$4,300.00
 - a. Parks Dept will order 100 additional trees to be available for donation to residents and planted on their private property. Private resident will be responsible for planting and care of the tree.
- 3. Library/Community Art Project; Budget Amount \$7,500-\$10,000
 - Full project budget and design is still being finalized for this project.
 - b. The library plans to create a Sensory Garden, using the Air Quality Funds. A Sensory Garden will provide therapeutic benefits for those who have sensory processing issues, such as children and adults experiencing anxiety, autism, stroke, or brain injury recovery. The Garden will include varied surfaces, plants, smells, sights, and space for interactive programs provided by Library staff. With raised beds for plants, seating,

accessible walkways and open space for scheduled events, the Garden will become an attraction for all residents

4. LaFave Park; Remaining Budget Funds: Approximately \$36,000

- a. Location: DeMers & 2nd Avenue NE
- b. MN Legacy Funds Project completed in summer/fall of 2024 (Boat launch, ADA kayak launch, Trail maint., Street/Sidewalk Softball area)
- c. The remaining funds will be applied to the LaFave Park project, used to cover costs of the added ADA improvements recommended by Community Options and their ADA Consultant.

Budget Impact:

No City budget impact. Total funds available for projects will be \$126,000. Of the \$140,000 award, 10% will be held back from project funds to help cover administrative time associated with the project and required reporting to the State. Of that \$14,000, Polk County Public Health will keep \$9,800 (70%) and the City of East Grand Forks will receive \$4,200 (30%).

Upon approval from the City Council, the recommended projects will be forwarded to the Norman-Polk-Mahnomen Public Health Board for their approval. Projects will need to be completed, funds spent, by end of July 2025.

Recommendation:

Seeking approval from City Council of the four proposed projects and project funding amounts.



Resolution Authorizing Disbursement of One-Time Funds

POLK-NORMAN-MAHNOMEN COMMUNITY HEALTH BOARD

The Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board, hereafter referred to as the "Board", by virtue of its authority under Minnesota Statutes 145A and by this Resolution of the Board adopted on __December 13, 2024___ at a scheduled meeting of the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board hereby authorizes disbursement of one-time funds:

WHEREAS, a new law passed in the 2023 session (MS 16A.151) requiring that when \$250,000 or more is paid for violating a Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) permit, 40% of the proceeds will be distributed to the community health board where the permitted facility is located;

WHEREAS, the Board and management have reviewed and discussed the statutory and financial requirements and the need for disbursement of one-time funds from the MPCA regarding American Crystal Sugar Company Enforcement Action Penalty Payment to the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board for "projects that benefit the environment or public health" in East Grand Forks, Minnesota;

WHEREAS, this case is the first to qualify for health board funding since this statute went into effect;

WHEREAS, management worked collaboratively with the Minnesota Department of Health, MPCA, City of East Grand Forks City Council and management, and American Crystal Sugar Company;

WHEREAS, management from Polk County Public Health and the City of East Grand Forks solicited community input to identify potential projects regarding the use of the funds through an online survey and three in-person community feedback opportunities, and were available to address any residents' concerns;

WHEREAS, the East Grand Forks City Council has approved four recommended projects, made by management from the City of East Grand Forks and Polk County Public Health, after reviewing and discussing the statutory and financial requirements, community engagement process and results, and scope and timelines of the recommended projects;

WHEREAS, management recommends \$126,000 of the \$140,000 total award be utilized for four projects including:

- 1. Griggs Park Trailhead Playground: \$76,000
- 2. Community Tree Planting Private Property Trees: \$4,300
- 3. Library Art/Sensory Garden: \$10,000
- 4. LaFave Park ADA improvements: Any remaining funds (Approximately \$35,700)

WHEREAS, management recommends 10% be held back from project funds to cover reasonable costs occurred to administer the project and required reporting to the State. Of the \$14,000, \$9,800 (70%) to Polk County Public Health and \$4,200 (30%) to City of East Grand Forks.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Board hereby approves the disbursement of funds in the amount of \$126,000 for the
 above-named four projects to the City of East Grand Forks, and \$9,800 to Polk County
 Public Health and \$4,200 to City of East Grand Forks for administrative time associated
 with the project and required reporting to the State.
- The funds will be disbursed from the Polk-Norman-Mahnomen Community Health Board through Polk County Public Health.
- 3. The four projects will be completed, funds spent, by end of July 2025.
- 4. A report detailing a) the process of community engagement employed to solicit community input regarding the use of the funds; b) the purposes and activities for which the funds were used; and c) an account of expenditures will be submitted to the chairs and ranking minority members of the senate and house of representatives' committees with primary jurisdiction over environment policy and natural resources as required in MS 16A.151.




