RE: Annual Report Regarding Obsolete, Unnecessary or Duplicative Rules as required by Minnesota Statutes, Section 14.05, Subdivision 5

Dear Governor Walz, Senators, Representatives, Revisor Inman and Director Yurich:

Minnesota Statutes, section 14.05, subdivision 5, directs state agencies to report to you by December 1 of each year whether any of its rules are obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative of other state or federal statutes or rules.

The Department of Commerce has reviewed its rules and has two rules to report that have become obsolete, unnecessary, or duplicative:

- Form of Annual Report, Registration, and Registration Amendment; Minnesota Administrative Rule 2860.1300 (2024). This rule is no longer necessary because the Department now utilizes online filings, and a cover sheet is no longer needed. Therefore, this rule is now obsolete as has been recommended by the agency advisory group. The Department will begin the rulemaking process to repeal this rule.
- Form for Application for Registration, Annual Report, or Amendment of Registration; Minnesota Administrative Rule 2860.9910 (2024). This rule is no longer necessary because the Department now utilizes online filing, and a cover sheet is no longer needed. Therefore, this rule is now obsolete as has been recommended by the agency advisory group. The Department will begin the rulemaking process to repeal this rule.
