03/11/25	<p>On 03/11/25 an ICS had been activated for incarcerated person (IP) for refusing directives which included returning to her cell. During the incident, IP threatened staff saying that she would drag him down the stairs. When the A-team arrived, IP was given directives to stand against the wall. She refused those directives and entered her cell. When directed to step out of her cell she told the A-team to "come get me". She was warned by staff if she did not comply that chemical irritant would be used. She told staff "If you spray me, I'll hit you." Staff deployed a short burst of chemical in her room with his bottle. She did not comply. Staff attempted to gain compliance with two more short bursts of chemical into her room. During this time, IP made threats, threw a chair at the door, and picked up a garbage can threatening to throw the can. Eventually staff was able to convince IP to exit the room and assisted in escorting her without further incident.</p> <p>The response to resistance was reasonable and appropriate. Of all options to gain compliance of the IP, chemical irritant was the safest and provided the least amount of risk to all involved.</p> <p>Because IP was secured in a cell, the on-scene supervisor should have issued an approval prior to deployment.</p>	Yes	No
