Co-foreword

Thank you for your interest in the 2024 Minnesota Child Support Performance Report. This year, Minnesota's child support program underwent a few big changes and continued to evolve. After more than a year of planning and engaging with our partners, the Child Support Division moved to the new Department of Children, Youth, and Families in July. Gov. Walz and the legislature established the new department to invest in the youngest Minnesotans and their families, and to integrate the programs that serve them into one agency.

In addition, the division and county child support agencies created a strategic framework to provide high-level direction for the program and support the new department's whole family approach. Our vision is a program where all the children we serve have the economic support they need to thrive.

Thanks to the efforts of child support professionals across the state, Minnesota continues to be a national leader ranking in the top 10 nationally for the percentage of current, monthly child support collected and the percentage of cases with payments toward past-due support. Together, we collected \$513 million for 207,000 children while programs across the country collected \$30 billion for 12.7 million children based on 2023 Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) data.

County and Tribal child support agencies continued to help the program's evolution through their active participation at all levels while addressing issues of staff retention and the challenges of meeting performance expectations.

In Douglas County, partnerships were utilized that directly and positively affected the way child support services were delivered in Alexandria and across the county. We continued our work with Parent Advocates, LLC, to meet the needs of parents looking for parenting time, custody, or modification actions through this exceptional Father's Resource Program. Our staff also participated in the Safe Access for Victims' Economic Security and Next Generation Employment Services grant opportunities. Douglas County's goal is to provide services for parents that encourage safety and financial stability.

Thanks again for learning more about Minnesota's child support program. We will continue to do everything we can to meet the needs of the children we serve in 2025.

Executive summary

In federal fiscal year (FFY) 2024, Minnesota's child support program served 280,870 parents and 198,241 children through 1,342 staff members from the counties and state. They collected and disbursed \$510.3 million. For every \$1 spent on Minnesota's child support program, it collected \$2.65 in support of children.

Minnesota's 2024 Child Support Performance Report details the program's accomplishments and highlights its achievements. It includes comprehensive data on statewide and county-specific performance, comparing outcomes from the past five years. The report focuses on five key performance measures:



- Paternity establishments
- Child support order establishment
- Collections on current support
- Collections on cases with arrears
- Program cost-effectiveness

Minnesota competes with other states for federal funding incentives administered by the Office of Child Support Services (OCSS). States earn these incentives by meeting specific targets across the five performance measures. In FFY2023, Minnesota's program maximized its federal incentives on two of five measures, paternity establishment and orders established; it has opportunities to earn additional incentives based on collections, which maximize at 80%, and cost-effectiveness at \$5.

In FFY2024, Minnesota's child support program:

- Served 198,241 children; 10% of them received public assistance in the form of cash, as of September 30, 2024.
- Distributed \$517.1 million, including:
 - \$369 million from employers withholding child support from parents' paychecks
 - \$71.4 million from cash and check payments
 - \$33.9 million received from other states' and countries' collections
 - \$26.9 million through tax intercepts
 - \$14.7 million from unemployment insurance
 - \$1.2 million from financial institution data match levies.

In FFY2024, Minnesota child support workers:

- Established paternity through 1,715 court orders and 562 Recognition of Parentage forms signed at county offices
- Established 7,781 orders for support; 86.04% of Minnesota child support cases have an order in place
- Adjusted 36,992 cases for cost of living, which increases the amount of child support ordered every two years
- Modified 6,046 child support orders
- Attended over 700 trainings
- Completed nearly 4,700 web-based trainings.

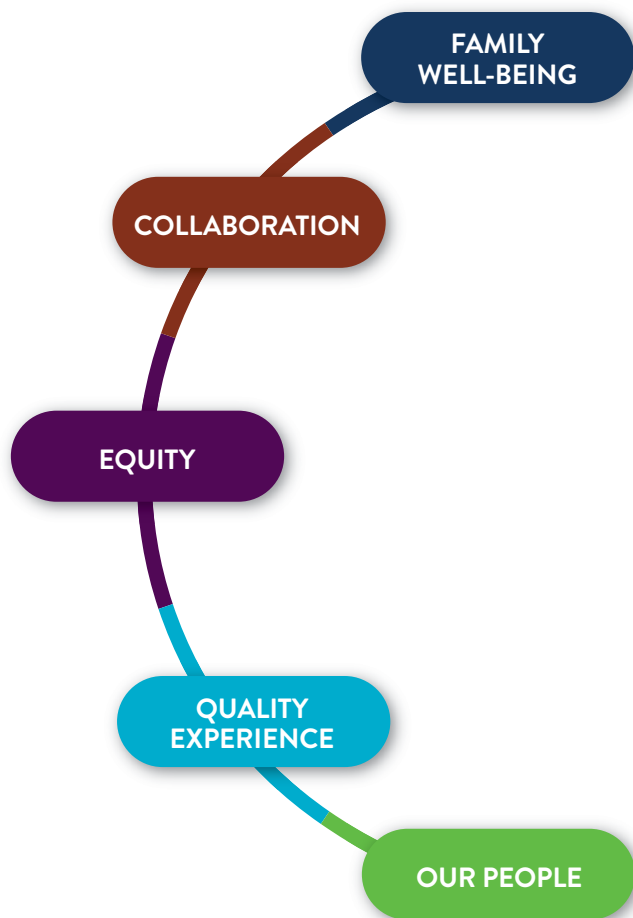

Minnesota child support services

Congress enacted child support programs in 1975 under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act. In Minnesota, the Department of Children, Youth, and Families Child Support Division supervises the program. County and Tribal agencies work with parents to establish and enforce child support orders. In collaboration with county and Tribal agency staff, the child support program in Minnesota serves 280,870 parents and 198,241 children spread across 87 counties and 11 Tribes.

Within the program, there are 1,342 employees statewide who work to meet the financial needs of Minnesota's children and families. The number of staff is a critical component of the cost-effectiveness performance measure. The division gathers staff counts through an annual survey that reports full-time equivalencies (FTE). FTEs represent staff directly engaged in child support cases or supporting them, including supervisors, managers and directors; child support workers; financial, administrative, training, technology and legal specialists; and contractors and system programmers, among others. Some staff included in the FTE count work outside the program under cooperative agreements.

County child support agencies initiate cooperative agreements to access additional resources beyond the agency, such as county attorneys, legal staff, office support personnel, sheriff's personnel and public health workers.

Minnesota's child support program serves children by:

- Locating parents and establishing parentage
- Establishing, reviewing and modifying child support orders to ensure children receive financial, medical and childcare support
- Collaborating with other state and country agencies to assist families when one parent lives outside of Minnesota
- Supporting families in achieving and maintaining self-sufficiency, emphasizing the importance of both parents contributing financially.

Child support is money a parent is court-ordered to pay to their child's other parent or caregiver for support of their child. Support may be part of an interim, temporary, permanent or modified court order in a divorce or legal separation, paternity action, order for protection, child custody action or separate child support action.

Child support services are available to:

- Parents of minor children when one parent does not live with their child
- Parents who pay child support through court-ordered income withholding
- Individuals with court-ordered physical custody of a minor child
- Recipients of public assistance for a minor child residing in their home.

Child support cases open when either parent applies for services or when a county public assistance office refers a case to the county child support agency.



Payments

Partnerships

The child support program facilitates financial partnerships between parents, providing essential services to ensure children receive necessary financial, medical and childcare support. These services collectively establish a monthly child support obligation.

Upon application for services or referral by county workers due to a family receiving public assistance, all child support payments must be routed through the Child Support Payment Center. States are required to maintain a central payment center to accurately receive and disburse child support payments, ensuring parents receive credit for making payments and payments disburse correctly. Many state and federal agencies, employers and other service programs help the child support program operate effectively and efficiently.

Processing

Division staff promptly receive and apply payments. In most cases, they send support collected and owed to custodial parents within two business days by direct deposit into a checking or savings account or stored value card. Certain payments are held for further identification or, if collected through tax refund offsets, to ensure accurate interception procedures.

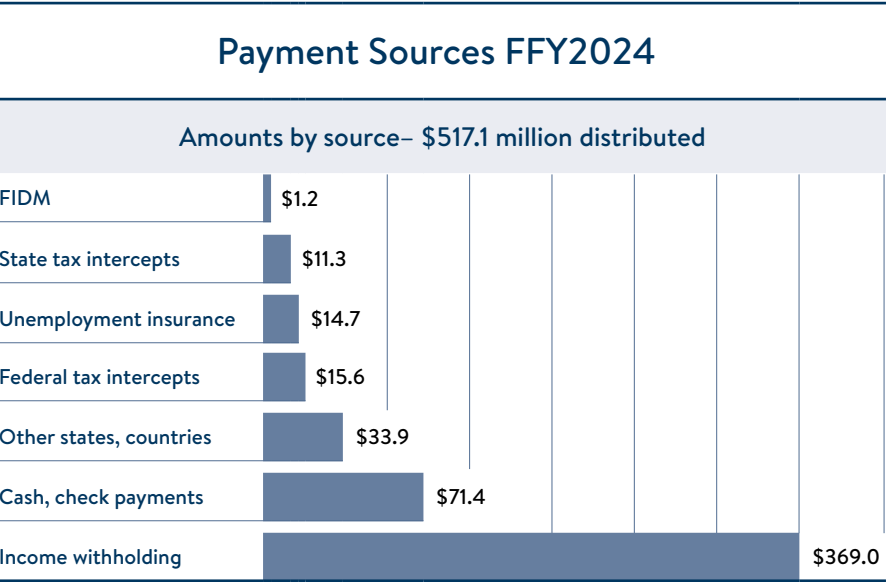
In federal fiscal year (FFY) 2024, the program collected a total of \$517.1 million for child support cases. Payment center operations for the year included:

- Processing payments totaling \$535.7 million, with approximately \$15.1 million returned to senders or placed on hold for verification
- Receipting 2,367,663 transactions, comprising 458,276 paper-based items (checks, money orders) and 1,909,387 electronic transactions through automated clearing houses (ACH)
- Deposited 95.56% of collections directly into parents’ accounts.

The child support program facilitates financial partnerships between parents, providing essential services to ensure children receive necessary financial, medical and childcare support.

Sources

The Child Support Division tracks the origins of child support payments to assess the effectiveness of enforcement strategies and collection methods. The graph below illustrates payment sources for federal fiscal year (FFY) 2024.



Income withholding

The majority of new or adjusted child support court orders mandate income withholding, where employers and payors deduct child support obligations directly from parents' earnings or other income sources and send them to the payment center. Through income withholding, employers collected \$369 million from parents' paychecks, 71.4% of all support distributed.

Employers in Minnesota play a crucial role in advancing child support initiatives, significantly benefiting children's welfare. They are required to report new hires to the Minnesota New Hire Reporting Center, facilitating the identification of working parents with child support responsibilities. Collaboration between employers and child support agencies promotes parental accountability, diminishes public assistance expenditures and bolsters families' capacity to meet their children's needs.

Cash and check payments

Parents who are self-employed or who do not utilize income withholding send their child support payments to the payment center using personal checks, cashier's checks, money orders or automatic recurring withdrawals. In federal fiscal year (FFY) 2024, these methods accounted for \$71.4 million, representing 13.8% of total collections.

Interstate and international collections

The child support program serves diverse families with complex needs, including those with family members living in other states and countries. For parents who owe support and work outside of Minnesota, other states and countries collected \$33.9 million, 6.5% of total support collections FFY2024.

Other sources

In cases where parents do not meet their child support obligations voluntarily, the program implements or uses enforcement actions. In addition to the enforcement methods listed below, parents who do not comply with their child support orders may be denied approval or renewal of a passport, reported to the credit bureau, subjected to civil contempt proceedings, charged with criminal nonsupport or have their driver's license suspended.

Other payment sources include:

- \$15.6 million (3%) from intercepts of federal tax refunds
- \$14.7 million (2.8%) from withholdings from unemployment insurance
- \$11.3 million (2.2%) from intercepts of state tax refunds.

Intergovernmental

About one in every seven child support cases involves parents who live or work in different states or countries. These cases fall under the category of intergovernmental cases, which occurs when:

- The parties involved live in separate jurisdictions
- A child support order originates from a different jurisdiction than where the parties live
- Multiple child support orders apply to the same parties.

The Uniform Interstate Family Support Act (UIFSA) governs these intergovernmental child support cases, and all states have adopted provisions from UIFSA 2008.

In Minnesota, 35 out of 87 counties share borders with other jurisdictions, making it crucial for the child support program to manage cases crossing state lines. Despite each state having its own court system and laws, agency staff are required to collaborate in handling requests for assistance. When Minnesota seeks help from another jurisdiction for child support services, it is referred to as an initiating case. Alternatively, when another jurisdiction seeks assistance from Minnesota, it is referred to as a responding case. Minnesota's child support program has shown notable success in establishing and collecting child support in these intergovernmental cases.

Initiating cases

In FFY2024, Minnesota had 15,546 initiating intergovernmental cases, out of which 14,192 had a court order for child support. Data indicates a high ratio (91.3%) of cases where Minnesota either established a child support order before or after initiating action with another jurisdiction. For these cases, the average amount collected per case with a child support order was \$3,030.

Responding cases

During FFY2024, there were 6,900 open intergovernmental cases where Minnesota was responding to another jurisdiction, with 6,525 of these cases having a court order for child support. This is a high establishment percentage for intergovernmental responding cases at 94.6%. The average amount collected per case with a child support order where Minnesota was the responding state was \$3,540.

Page 47 of the report contains detailed financial transactions related to collections to and from other states, as well as the size of initiating and responding caseloads.

In Minnesota, 35 out of 87 counties share borders with other jurisdictions, making it crucial for the child support program to manage cases crossing state lines.

Initiatives

- **Advancing Equity in Child Support grant:** Minnesota's Child Support Division started working on this federally funded grant to examine diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) issues within the child support program and identify barriers faced by historically underserved population. This year, staff added 15 additional race and ethnicity options to capture the ways parents in the program see themselves, improve the program's ability to make data-driven decisions, and develop policies to reduce disparities. (see page 13 for statewide demographic data).
- **Safe Access for Victims' Economic Security (SAVES) grant:** Minnesota's child support program continued work on this grant to make it safer for victims and survivors of domestic abuse to learn about child support services, stay safe while receiving services, and understand their options if it is not safe to receive services. A foundational component of the grant is centering lived-experience experts and close collaboration and engagement with domestic violence organizations, county child support staff, and state, Tribal and national experts. Over 140 people are now involved in the work of the grant.
- **Charting a Course for Economic Mobility and Responsible Parenting grants:** The Child Support Division made significant progress on these grants by piloting a preparenthood curriculum to prepare justice-involved youth and young adults for parenthood. The division also sought partners to help develop a curriculum for Tribal and Indigenous youth and young adults that will cover the financial, emotional and legal realities of being a parent. These grants are also known as the Paths to Parenthood grants.

- **NextGen Employment Services grant:** The federal Office of Child Support Services (OCSS) awarded Minnesota's Child Support Division a Next Generation Child Support Employment grant in 2024. Minnesota was one of six states and two Tribes to receive an initial award of nearly \$600,000 and a total of \$2.1 million over the next five years to develop and refine child support-led employment services for parents court-ordered to pay support. Through these services, the division aims to increase the consistent payment of child support and improve the financial well-being of children.
- **Driver's License Suspension Pilot Impact Evaluation report:** The Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) Impact Evaluation Unit published its [Minnesota's Driver's License Suspension Pilot Impact Evaluation Report](#) earlier this year. The pilot:
 - Was part of a federal Office of Child Support Services Procedural Justice Peer Learning initiative
 - Used flexible policies and procedural justice principles to improve communication and decrease license suspension rates and racial disparities
 - Resulted in a significant drop in suspensions a year after the program began.

This year, staff added 15 additional race and ethnicity options to capture the ways parents in the program see themselves, improve the program's ability to make data-driven decisions, and develop policies to reduce disparities.

Guide and introduction to performance data

Calculations

The 2024 Child Support Performance Report highlights accomplishments and presents program performance measures for FFY2024. It reports the most recent data showing statewide and individual county performance, and a five-year history of the five federal performance measures. The division participates in the federal incentive funding system based on program performance, as required by the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996. The federal office evaluates states competing for federal incentive funds based on five federal performance measures. The five measures are:

Paternities established – the number of open Title IV-D cases with paternity established during the federal fiscal year divided by the number of children in open Title IV-D cases born outside of marriage during the prior federal fiscal year.

Child support orders established – the number of cases open at the end of the federal fiscal year with support orders established divided by the number of cases open at the end of the federal fiscal year.

Collections on current support – the total amount of support disbursed as current support during the federal fiscal year divided by the total amount of current support due for the federal fiscal year.

Collections on arrears – the number of total cases with support disbursed as arrears during the federal fiscal year divided by the number of total cases with arrearages due during the federal fiscal year.

Program cost effectiveness – for the federal fiscal year, the amount of collections forwarded to other states plus total collections disbursed, including fees retained by other states divided by total Title IV-D dollars expended during the federal fiscal year.

Distribution is the identification and allocation or apportionment of a support collection to current and past-due support, as applicable, of a specific case or individual. Disbursement is the actual process of dispensing or paying out the collection. [AT-20-06 OCSE 157 Instructions]

Unlike other performance measures, OCSS allows state agencies to choose between two methods of reporting paternity establishment percentages. One method uses all children born in the state. The second method, which is used by Minnesota, uses only children in the Title IV-D state system. Both methods involve paternities and births that span more than one 12-month period. The paternities established by child support workers during the federal fiscal year, therefore, are not necessarily for the same children born of non-marital births in the same federal fiscal year. This explains why some states have a paternity establishment percentage exceeding 100%. For the federal performance incentive, Minnesota's percentage is 96.0 for FFY2024.



The federal government matches 66% of state and county expenditures and provides funding linked to performance outcomes, which the division passes on to county agencies.

Federal incentives

States can earn federal funding by maximizing specific performance goals across five key measures. Minnesota maximized federal benchmarks in two areas: paternity establishment (at 96.0%) and order establishment (at 86.0%). There is potential for Minnesota to earn additional federal funds based on its performance in collections, which maximize at 80% with cost-effectiveness at \$5. For FFY2024, collections on current support were 73.3%, collections on cases with arrears were 69.4% and cost-effectiveness was at \$2.65.

The federal government matches 66% of state and county expenditures and provides funding linked to performance outcomes, which the division passes on to county agencies. Counties must reinvest these incentives into the Title IV-D program.

Secure, accurate and reliable data is crucial for the child support program's success and funding. States must maintain a data reliability standard of 95% to ensure completeness and accuracy. Federal auditors assess the reliability, completeness and security of data, as well as the accuracy of reporting systems used for calculating performance measures.

Failure to meet federal performance or data reliability standards jeopardizes a state's eligibility for incentive funds and could lead to penalties affecting the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) grant. Corrective action is required if standards are not met, with penalties ranging from 1% to 5% of the state's TANF grant, not to exceed 25% in total.

Minnesota has a strong track record in federal audits, consistently meeting data reliability standards without incurring corrective actions or penalties.

Performance comparison with other states

To demonstrate Minnesota’s standing relative to other states, this report includes the latest national data, which ranks states based on FFY2023 figures. Minnesota ranked fifth for collections on current support and seventh for collections on arrears nationally during this period. Detailed national performance data is available online through the federal office. The table below outlines Minnesota’s performance metrics for FFY2023 in comparison to the four neighboring states:

The federal office provides funding to states by matching qualifying expenditures, and bases funding on performance, outcomes and the state’s collection base. The collection base serves as the foundation for the incentive structure. Once established, the federal office evaluates states based on five performance measures, aggregating these results nationally and distributing a prorated portion of the incentive pool to each state. Funding availability within the incentive pool is finite, and each state’s allocation is influenced by the performance of all other states under the incentive formula.
