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Co-foreword

We appreciate your interest in the 2025 Minnesota Child Support Performance Report. This year, Minnesota joins the nation in celebrating 50 years of the national child support program. Created by President Gerald Ford and Congress, the program was established to help children receive the economic support they need to thrive.

Over the past five decades, Minnesota's program has shown lasting impact and the ability to adapt to families' changing needs. Since the program's start, staff have:

- Collected \$8.3 million of child support in the program's first year, compared to \$510.3 million in 2024
- Managed 35,000 cases involving parents or caregivers who received public assistance and 2,900 involving those not receiving assistance in 1976, compared to 16,000 and 157,000 cases, respectively, in 2024.

Additionally, the program's evolution has made it more responsive to the needs of parents, caregivers, and their families over the last 50 years. From its early framework in the 1970s through the 1990s, the program established the guidelines courts use to set support amounts, built a statewide case management system, and implemented federal welfare reform requirements. Since the turn of the century, the program has continued to evolve—updating the guidelines to an income-shares model, incorporating a parenting expense adjustment, and modifying enforcement remedies to better align with parents' ability to pay.

This year, county and Tribal child support agencies continued to help the program's growth through their active participation at all levels. For example, Hennepin County committed to providing services in ways that build trust and promote the importance of children being supported by both parents. Through family-centered thinking and intentional engagement efforts, we have demonstrated that commitment by:

- Participating in the federal Safe Access for Victims' Economic Security (SAVES) grant
- Participating in the federal Next Generation Employment Services grant
- Creating Motion to Enforce procedures as an alternative to contempt
- Participating in the program's Advisory Board Equity Committee
- Collaborating with the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF), counties, Tribes, and community non-profit agencies; and
- Actively participating in more than 40 community events in 2025.

Our county's comprehensive family and community engagement efforts reflect DCYF's goal to integrate a whole-family approach into how child support services are provided and experienced.

Thanks again for learning more about Minnesota's child support program. As we look ahead to 2026, the program remains focused on helping children and families build stability and thrive.

Executive summary

In federal fiscal year (FFY) 2025, Minnesota's child support program served 269,142 parents and 189,912 children through 1,361 staff members from the counties and state. They collected and disbursed \$500.4 million. For every \$1 spent on Minnesota's child support program, it collected \$2.42 in support of children.

Minnesota's 2025 Child Support Performance Report details the program's accomplishments and highlights its achievements. It includes comprehensive data on statewide and county-specific performance, comparing outcomes from the past five years. The report focuses on five key performance measures:

- **Paternity establishments**
- **Child support order establishment**
- **Collections on current support**
- **Collections on cases with arrears**
- **Program cost-effectiveness**

Minnesota competes with other states for federal funding incentives administered by the Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE). States earn these incentives by meeting specific targets across the five performance measures. In FFY2025, Minnesota's program maximized its federal incentives on two of five measures, paternity establishment and orders established; it has opportunities to earn additional incentives based on collections, which maximize at 80%, and cost-effectiveness at \$5.

In FFY2025, Minnesota's child support program:

- Served 189,912 children; 10% of them received public assistance in the form of cash, as of September 30, 2025.
- Distributed \$507 million, including:
 - \$359.7 million from employers withholding child support from parents' paychecks
 - \$70.8 million from cash and check payments
 - \$33 million received from other states and countries' collections
 - \$26.7 million through tax intercepts
 - \$14.9 million from unemployment insurance
 - \$1.7 million from financial institution data match levies.

In FFY2025, Minnesota child support workers:

- Established paternity through 1,740 court orders and 463 Recognition of Parentage forms signed at county offices
- Established 7,765 orders for support; 86.53% of Minnesota child support cases have an order in place
- Adjusted 35,190 cases for cost of living, which increases the amount of child support ordered every two years
- Modified 5,751 child support orders
- Attended over 1,300 trainings
- Completed nearly 590 web-based trainings.

In 1975, Congress launched the National Child Support Enforcement Program to help families get the financial support they need. States were required to set up their own child support offices to qualify for federal funding and performance-based incentives. Now, 50 years later, we're recognizing the powerful impact this program has had on children, families, and communities.

- Over the past five decades, the program has collected more

- than \$786 billion to support families across the country.
- In 2024 alone, it secured \$29.5 billion, helping an estimated 12.2 million children—about 1 in every 6 kids in the U.S.
- It's also highly efficient: for every \$1 spent, the program collects \$4.24 in child support.

In 1976, most child support cases in Minnesota involved families receiving public assistance. Today, most cases are for families who previously received assistance or never did. The dramatic increase in collections and staffing shows how much the program has grown to meet the needs of Minnesota families.

Since the inception of the national Child Support Enforcement Program in 1975, Minnesota has emerged as a national leader—providing financial stability, equitable services, and innovative strategies to ensure every child receives what they deserve. As we commemorate this 50-year milestone, we are proud to reflect on our successes, acknowledge ongoing challenges, and recommit to a future where all children in Minnesota thrive.

The child support program has seen many changes over the past 50 years. When the program started in 1975, its main purpose was not to support families – it was to reimburse the state and federal government for Aid for Dependent Children (AFDC) payments. Families who received these benefits had to assign their child support rights to the state. Most child support collected went to repay the government, though families were allowed to keep a small portion through a system

like today's pass-through. This was meant to encourage cooperation with the program. Over time, that focus changed. Today, the child support program emphasizes family self-sufficiency and child well-being.

In 1976, non-AFDC cases totaled 159,115 nationally. Today, the number of non-AFDC cases is 10.7 million. That is a 6,600% increase. In addition, collections have increased nearly 5,400% over that same period.

Minnesota child support over the last five decades



1975–1985

- ▶ **1975:** President Ford and Congress create the federal and state child support enforcement program. The federal government approves Minnesota's program effective Aug. 1.
- ▶ **1978:** Minnesota enacts significant revisions to Statute 518, primarily dealing with procedures for marriage dissolution and annulment. These changes build on the 1974 no-fault foundation and establish the framework that will guide future updates to child support provisions.
- ▶ **1983:** Minnesota implements biennial cost-of-living adjustments (COLA) for child support orders. Minnesota also becomes the first state to enact a statewide child support guidelines statute. This preceded the federal government mandating all states establish guidelines in 1984.

1985–1995

- ▶ **1985:** The Minnesota Indian Family Preservation Act (MIFPA) passes, solidifying the role of Tribes in child welfare decisions, including Tribal jurisdiction in family law, enabling Tribal courts to have a role in child support cases for Native American children in the state.
- ▶ **1985:** The federal government mandates wage withholding and states implement expanded enforcement tools in their programs.
- ▶ **1988:** Federal Family Support Act reforms include expanding services to include families not receiving public assistance.

1995–2005

- ▶ **1996:** The federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRWORA):
 - Establishes Minnesota Tribal child support agencies
 - Focuses on enforcement and collection
 - Establishes the National Directory of New Hires
 - Streamlines the legal process for establishing paternity
 - Creates the "Family First" policy directing certain payments to go to families before reimbursing the government
 - Provides uniform interstate child support laws.
- ▶ **1997:** Minnesota develops PRISM, a case management computer system to standardize the collection and distribution of child support payments across the state.

2005–2015

- ▶ **2005:** Minnesota makes significant changes to existing child support laws and introduces new guidelines. Key components of the legislation include:
 - Establishing guidelines based on parents' combined gross income
 - Presuming both parents are entitled to 25% custody of their children
 - Granting an expense adjustment of 12% based on parenting time
 - Allowing deductions for non-joint children in the home.

2015–2025

- ▶ **2016:** Minnesota provides a new method for calculating the parenting expense adjustment based on "overnight equivalents" and creates a child support task force to make recommendations on policy and practice.
- ▶ **2018:** Minnesota provides additional ways for parents to pay their support using PayNearMe and MoneyGram.
- ▶ **2021:** Minnesota passes legislation to stop charging interest on past due child support and codify child support task force recommendations including:
 - Updating the basic child support table
 - Adjusting the guidelines to determine child support amounts more accurately for parents with lower incomes
 - Adjusting deductions for non-joint children.
- ▶ **2024:** Minnesota's Child Support Division moves into the state's new Department of Children, Youth, and Families.

Payments

Partnerships

The child support program facilitates financial partnerships between parents, providing essential services to ensure children receive necessary financial, medical and childcare support. These services collectively establish a monthly child support obligation.

When a family applies for services or is referred by county workers because they receive public assistance, all child support payments must be routed through the Child Support Payment Center. States are required to maintain a central payment center to accurately receive and disburse child support payments, ensuring parents receive credit for making payments and payments disburse correctly. Many state and federal agencies, employers and other service programs help the child support program operate effectively and efficiently.



Income withholding

Employers in Minnesota play a crucial role in advancing child support initiatives, significantly benefiting children's welfare. They must report new hires to the Minnesota New Hire Reporting Center, which helps identify parents who have child support obligations. Collaboration between employers and child support agencies promotes parental accountability, diminished public assistance expenditures and bolsters families' capacity to meet their children's needs.

The majority of new or adjusted child support court orders mandate income withholding, where employers and payors deduct child support obligations directly from parents' earnings or other income sources and send them to the payment center. Through income withholding, employers collected \$359.7 million from parents' paychecks, which accounts for 70.9% of all support distributed.

Many state and federal agencies, employers and other service programs help the child support program operate effectively and efficiently.

Processing

Division staff promptly receive and apply payments. In most cases, they send support collected and owed to custodial parents within two business days by direct deposit into a checking or savings account, or stored value card. Certain payments are held for further identification or, if collected through tax refund offsets, to ensure accurate interception procedures.

In FFY 2025, the program collected a total of \$500.4 million for child support cases. Payment center operations for the year included:

- Processed payments totaling \$519.9 million, with approximately \$12.9 million returned to senders or placed on hold for verification
- Recorded 2.2 million transactions, comprising approximately 406,000 paper-based items (checks, money orders) and 1.8 million electronic transactions through automated clearing houses (ACH)
- Deposited 95.44% of collections directly into parents' accounts.

Payments

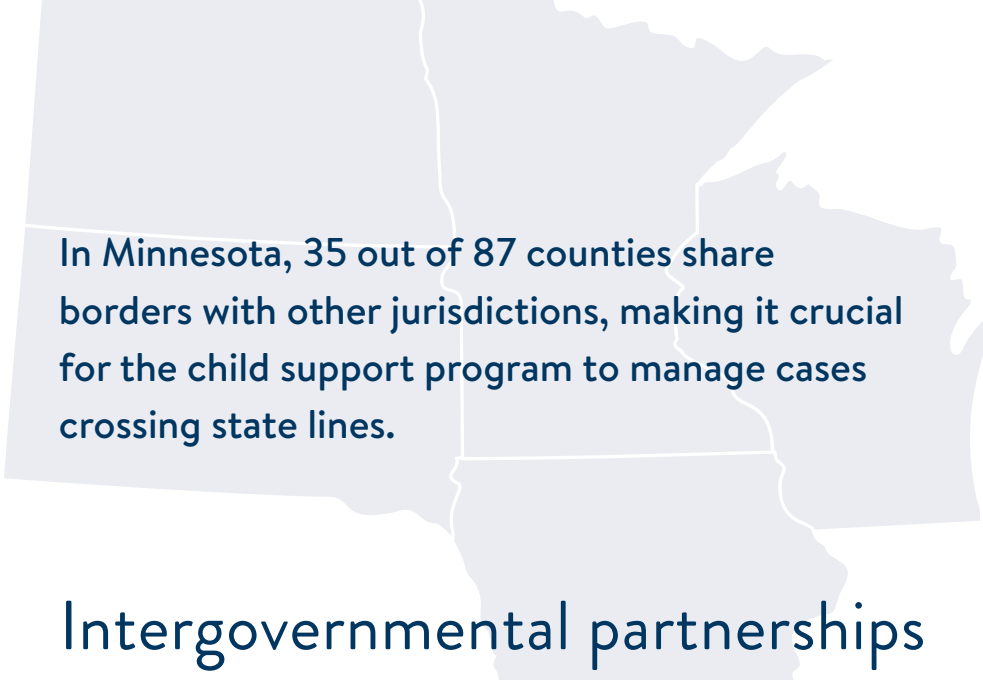
Payment sources

The Child Support Division tracks the origins of child support payments to assess the effectiveness of enforcement strategies and collection methods. The table below illustrates payment sources for FFY2025.

Further details on payment sources per county are provided in the Collections – Sources table on Page 50.

Intergovernmental partnerships

About one in every seven of Minnesota's child support cases involves parents who live or work in different states or countries. These cases fall under the category of intergovernmental cases, which occurs when:

- The parties involved live in separate jurisdictions
- A child support order originates from a different jurisdiction than where the parties live
- Multiple child support orders apply to the same parties.

In Minnesota, 35 out of 87 counties share borders with other jurisdictions, making it crucial for the child support program to manage cases crossing state lines. Despite each state having its own court system and laws, agency staff are required to collaborate in handling requests for assistance. When Minnesota seeks help from another jurisdiction for child support services, it is referred to as an initiating case. Alternatively, when another jurisdiction seeks assistance from Minnesota, it is referred to as a responding case. Minnesota's child support program has shown notable success in establishing and collecting child support in these intergovernmental cases.

Initiatives

Advancing Equity in Child Support:

Minnesota's Child Support Division (CSD) continued working on this federally funded grant to study issues of diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) issues within the child support program. One highlight from 2025 was the creation of the Parent Advisory Council to hear from parents and caregivers in underserved populations and learn from their lived experience with the program. The Council will help improve the program's ability to make more informed decisions and develop policies to reduce disparities.

NextGen Employment Services:

This grant's goal is to increase the consistent payment of child support and improve the financial well-being of children and 750 noncustodial parents. In 2025, Minnesota created a collaborative of ten county and Tribal child support agencies to develop and refine child support-led employment services for parents court-ordered to pay support.

One highlight from 2025 was the creation of the Parent Advisory Council to hear from parents and caregivers in underserved populations and learn from their lived experience with the program.

Safe Access for Victims' Economic Security (SAVES):

Minnesota's child support program made significant progress on this grant to make it safer for domestic abuse survivors to learn about child support services, stay safe while receiving services, and understand their options if it is not safe to receive services. This year, the Child Support Division issued a rare, joint policy bulletin with public assistance programs about the Good Cause exemption and improved its computer system to help staff track information for parents and caregivers with safety concerns.

Charting a Course for Economic Mobility and Responsible Parenting (Paths to Parenthood):

The Child Support Division made significant progress on these grants by piloting a preparenthood curriculum to prepare justice-involved youth and young adults for parenthood. The division also sought partners to help develop a curriculum for Tribal and Indigenous youth and young adults that will cover the financial, emotional, and legal realities of being a parent. These grants are also known as the Paths to Parenthood grants.



Guide and introduction to performance data

Calculations

The 2025 Child Support Performance Report highlights accomplishments and presents program performance measures for FFY2025. It reports the most recent data showing statewide and individual county performance, and a five-year history of the five federal performance measures. The division participates in the federal incentive funding system based on program performance, as required by the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Act of 1996. The federal office evaluates states competing for federal incentive funds based on five federal performance measures. The five measures are:

Paternities established:
The number of open cases in the child support program with paternity established during the federal fiscal year divided by the

number of children in open cases in the child support program born outside of marriage during the prior federal fiscal year.

Child support orders established:
The number of cases open at the end of the federal fiscal year with support orders established divided by the number of cases open at the end of the federal fiscal year.

Collections on current support:
The total amount of support disbursed as current support during the federal fiscal year divided by the total amount of current support due for the federal fiscal year.

Collections on arrears:
The number of total cases with support disbursed as arrears during the federal fiscal year divided by the number of total cases with arrearages due during the federal fiscal year.

Program cost effectiveness:
For the federal fiscal year, the amount of collections forwarded to other states plus total collections disbursed, including fees retained by other states divided by total dollars in the child support program expended during the federal fiscal year.

Distribution is the identification and allocation or apportionment of a support collection to current and past-due support, as applicable, of a specific case or individual. Disbursement is the actual process of dispensing or paying out the collection.

Unlike other performance measures, the Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) allows state agencies to choose between two methods of reporting paternity establishment percentages. One method uses all children born in the state. The second method, which is used by Minnesota, uses only

children in the child support state system. Both methods involve paternities and births that span more than one 12-month period. The paternities established by child support workers during the federal fiscal year, therefore, are not necessarily for the same children born of non-marital births in the same federal fiscal year. This explains why some states have a paternity establishment percentage exceeding 100%. For the federal performance incentive, Minnesota's paternity establishment is 95.9% for FFY2025.



Federal incentives

States can earn federal funding by maximizing specific performance goals across five key measures. Minnesota maximized federal benchmarks in two areas: paternity establishment (at 95.9%) and order establishment (at 86.5%). There is potential for Minnesota to earn additional federal funds based on its performance in collections, which maximize at 80% with cost-effectiveness at \$5. For FFY2025, collections on current support were 73.1%, collections on cases with arrears were 68.9% and cost-effectiveness was at \$2.42.

The federal government matches 66% of state and county expenditures and provides funding linked to performance outcomes, which the division passes on to county agencies. Counties must reinvest these incentives into the child support program.

Secure, accurate and reliable data is crucial for the child support program's success and funding. States must maintain a data reliability standard of 95% to ensure completeness and accuracy. Federal auditors assess

the reliability, completeness and security of data, as well as the accuracy of reporting systems used for calculating performance measures.

For the federal performance incentive, Minnesota's paternity establishment is 95.9% for FFY2025.

Failure to meet federal performance or data reliability standards jeopardizes a state's eligibility for incentive funds and could lead to penalties affecting the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) grant. Corrective action is required if standards are not met, with penalties ranging from 1-5% of the state's TANF grant, not to exceed 25% in total.

Minnesota has a strong track record in federal audits, consistently meeting data reliability standards without incurring corrective actions or penalties.

Performance comparison with other states

To demonstrate Minnesota’s standing relative to other states, this report includes the latest national data, which ranks states based on FFY2024 figures. Minnesota ranked sixth for collections on current support and eighth for collections on arrears nationally during this period. Detailed national performance data is available online through the federal office. The table below outlines Minnesota’s performance metrics for FFY2024 in comparison to the four neighboring states.

The collection base serves as the foundation for the incentive structure. Once established, the federal office evaluates states based on five performance measures, aggregating these results nationally and distributing a prorated portion of the incentive pool to each state.
