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Annualized Self-Support Index

This report provides the annualized Self-Support Index (S-SI) performance measure for county and tribal agencies and county consortia administering the Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP).

Prior to calendar year 2015, county, consortia and tribal agencies received 95% of their Consolidated Fund allocation, earning an additional 2.5% of the base by reaching the Work Participation Rate (WPR) target, and an additional 2.5% by reaching the S-SI. Service areas consistently performing below the customized range submitted an improvement plan.

The 2014 Minnesota Legislature amended Minn. Stat. 256J.626, subd. 7, so that service areas¹ will receive 100% of their Consolidated Fund allocation, plus potential for a 2.5% bonus, if they perform above their Range of Expected Performance on the annualized S-SI. Service areas consistently performing below the customized range submit an improvement plan and face a potential cut in funding.

Starting with calendar year 2016, the Minnesota Department of Human Services (department) uses the annualized S-SI to determine which county, consortia and tribal agencies are eligible for performance bonuses. Because of this change in awarding performance-based funding solely on the S-SI, the annualized Work Participation Rate will no longer be calculated or included in this report.

The three-year S-SI is an outcome measure tracking all adults receiving MFIP or Diversionary Work Program (DWP) cash assistance in a quarter and calculates what percentage of them left cash assistance or are working at least 30 hours a week during the quarter three years later. For the 2024 annualized S-SI, department staff averaged the three-year S-SI for quarters two, three, and four of 2023, and the first quarter of 2024, weighted by the number of adults in each baseline quarter.

This report provides the following data for each service area:

- Average (mean) number of adults eligible for MFIP or DWP for whom a county agency, consortium, or tribal provider was the most recent service agency across the four baseline quarters
- Annualized Self-Support Index
- Range of expected performance over the entire year for the current and updated S-SI
- Determination of whether the annualized S-SI was above, within or below the annualized range of expected performance for the current and updated S-SI.

Due to rounding of scores and range limits, some agencies may appear to be at their lower or upper bounds, but shown below, above, or within their range. These cases are noted in a footnote².

¹ The service areas reported here are five county consortia, four tribal employment service providers, and the remaining 72 counties. See the [Management Indicators Report](#) for details.
