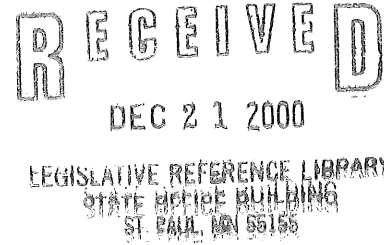

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**Subject:** Office of the Governor – Personnel Costs Supported by Agency Appropriations



Laws of 1999, Chapter 250, Article 1, Section 3 requires Commissioner of Finance to report to the chairs of the State Government Finance Divisions any personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office that were supported by appropriations to the other agencies.

During Fiscal Year 2000, there were no interagency agreements between the Governor's Office and agencies for personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office.

Two employees of the Department of Administration provided assistance with and some LAN support services for implementation and maintenance of an integrated data base system for the Governor's Office.

As has traditionally been the case, one employee of the Planning Agency has duties requiring coordination with the Governor's Office as well as project management responsibilities within the Planning Agency.

The Department of Administration is continuing to provide for the cost of plant management responsibilities at the governor's residence. An administrative order provides reimbursement of salary costs for a groundskeeper/general maintenance worker. These costs for Fiscal Year 2000 totaled \$38,960.
