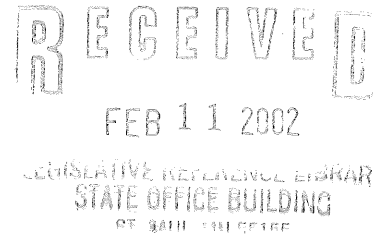

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Subject: Office of the Governor – Personnel Costs Supported by Agency Appropriations



Laws of 2001, 1st Special Session, Chapter 10, Article 1, Section 3 requires Commissioner of Finance to report to the chairs of the State Government Finance Divisions any personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office that were supported by appropriations to the other agencies.

During fiscal year 2001, there were no interagency agreements between the Governor's Office and agencies for personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office.

Two employees of the Department of Administration provided assistance with some LAN support services and maintenance of an integrated data base system for the Governor's Office.

As has traditionally been the case, one employee of Minnesota Planning has duties requiring coordination with the Governor's Office as well as project management responsibilities within the Planning Agency.

The Department of Administration provides the plant management responsibilities at the governor's residence by providing one full time groundskeeper/general maintenance worker at a cost of \$35,713/year.
