Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 00 AND FY 01 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

The Board of Barber Examiners was created to protect the public's health, safety and welfare, provide the public with the highest quality of barbering services and to regulate the barber industry through the continued review, amendment, adoption and enforcement of Rules and Statutes. This is accomplished through the inspection and licensing of barber shops and schools; and through the examining and licensing of instructors, apprentices and registered barbers. Under the direction of four (4) Board members, appointed by the Governor, the staff performs the daily operational duties including: inspections, record maintenance, communications, personnel, accounts payable and accounts receivable, composing and validating the school curriculums and the various levels of examinations and preparing guidelines for apprenticeship programs. The Board has all licensing records on a personal computer system and all licenses are issued by this system. The Board holds licensing examinations quarterly, with two additional exams if applicants warrant. The Board meets on a monthly basis for their meetings. All complaints received are processed in accordance with MSA 214.10, appointing a designee to the Complaint Committee to assist in processing and resolving all complaints expediently and economically.

(For example): In what other states do your licensees hold licenses? Number of Minnesota licenses verified/certified to other states? Number of inspections? Comparisons with past Biennial Reports.

The Board does not maintain records relative to what other states Minnesota licensees hold licenses in. In FY 01 there were 205 registered barbers who lived in another state but renewed their Minnesota licenses. In FY 02 there were 3 apprentices and 201 registered barbers who lived in another state and renewed their Minnesota licenses.

In FY 01 and 02 the Board sent 25 license certifications to 11 states.

FY 97 - 98 there were 2,580 shop inspections and 1,242 violations.

FY 99 - 00 there were 2,287 shop inspections and 997 violations.

FY 97 - 98 there were 8 school inspections compared to 14 for this reporting period.

FY 99 - 00 there were 9 school inspections compared to 14 for this reporting period.
