#### COMMENTS (Optional)

Expenditures however increased by approximately \$8,000.00 during FY 76 due to increased activity in legal affairs. As with all boards the board of optometry is now on Non-Dedicated Fee Receipts effective with FY 77 and it is anticipated that Fee receipts will remain about the same. However, the last legislative sersion appropriated \$25,00.00 for FY 76 and with the additional legislative mandated costs imposed on this board for hearing officer; State Register; rent; etc. this board will be hard pressed to live within the appropriation.

Due to the additional expenses imposed the budget submitted for the next biennium calls for expenditures equalling the FY 76 disbursements. The next legislative session needs to review the inequities and propose appropriate remedies.
