## TTEN A: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 75 and FY 76 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

PY 75. The Board of Chiropractic Examiners exists to serve the public by qualifying licensed practitioners, thru State and National Board examinations, by written, oral, and practical. Verification of character reference, college transcripts and other credentials are required from each candidate for application.

To regulate qualified chiropractors in the State of Minnesota, minimum standards of proficiency are met by attending Board approved continuing educational seminars annually before issuance of license renewal.

Informing the Attorney General's office of all complaints and refer those not in the Boards jurisdiction of ethics or peer-review for further evaluation.

To request from and provide other Chiropractic State boards with information concerning board policy, procedures and status of licensee. To inform Chiropractic colleges of examination requirements and dates.

To inform State and Federal agencies of all new licensees.

Approximately, 40 examinations are given annually. 600 renewal licenses are issued. 27 existing professional corporations are issued renewal certificates and 10 new professional corporations were certified.

In about 50 complaints by telephone, approximately 35 become formal complaints and are investigated each year, with about 4 citations with possible revocation of license.




