Federal Supplemental Benefits - Extended

FSB-E is a temporary program to continue UC benefits to claimants who have exhausted their Federal Supplemental Benefits. Benefits of \$1,974,911 were paid in 1977 under this program which started in April 1975.

Supplemental Unemployment Assistance Program

SUA is a temporary program to pay UC benefits to workers without sufficient covered work to qualify for normal benefits. Benefits of \$3,664,698 were paid in 1977.
