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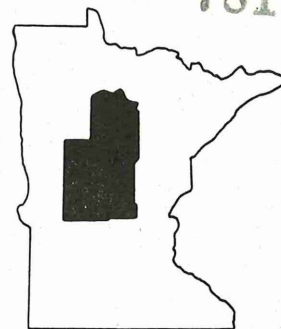

ANNUAL REPORT

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THE REGION

Region 5 consists of the five counties of Cass, Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd and Wadena in North Central Minnesota. It is approximately 100 miles from north to south and 55 miles from east to west. Population in 1970 was estimated at 114,000. Major employment opportunities are related to agriculture and tourism.

THE COMMISSION

The Region 5 Regional Development Commission was established, pursuant to the Regional Development Act, in July 1973 by act of then Governor Anderson following passage of resolutions from units of government representing a majority of the population of the five county region. Commission membership is composed of representatives of counties, municipalities, townships, school boards, public interest groups, and the Leech Lake Indian Reservation. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The Commission has always placed a high priority on the provision of technical assistance to local units of government. This type of service is particularly important in Region 5 which is characterized by small municipalities, 65 in all, which lack the professional resources to undertake many tasks important to them.

The assistance is distributed evenly and fairly to all the member units of government of the region which request it. Information on the types of assistance available forwarded to the heads of each local government in the region. Assistance programs which demand prolonged efforts by the Commission staff on behalf of individual local governments are evaluated prior to implementation to determine need and local contribution to the effort. Response to such requests will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.

This program has been well-received by participating local governments.

GRANT PROGRAMS OPERATED BY THE COMMISSION

The following grants were made by the Commission during 1977 for services to older persons under Title III of the Older Americans Act.

COMMISSION AGENDA - 1977

Regional Comprehensive Planning

1977 was marked by a firm commitment to prepare a regional comprehensive development plan. Encouraged by a substantial grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA) the Commission is committed to formulating regional policies to deal, in a comprehensive manner, with development issues within the region. With the EDA-funded economic development planning program as the core, the Commission intends to assemble all the elements of a comprehensive plan using its various single-purpose planning programs as major building blocks:

- manpower
- land use and water quality
- housing
- transportation and transit
- public safety
- aging
- arts

The regional comprehensive plan is scheduled for completion in June 1978.

Intergovernmental Cooperation

The Commission continued to provide a framework for intergovernment cooperation, involving increased contact and cooperation among local, state, and federal governments, as well as numerous independent agencies. Formal agreements were concluded with the U.S. Economic Development Administration at the federal level, and with the Pollution Control Agency, the Department of Natural Resources, the Governor's Citizen Council on Aging, the Crime Control Board, the Department of Transportation, the Housing Finance Agency, and the State Planning Agency at the state level. Agreements were also concluded with the Rural Minnesota Concentrated Employment Program and the Central Minnesota Health Systems Agency.

The effect of these agreements has been to provide for extensive involvement on the part of local units of government in a number of key state programs, and to provide for increased coordination among these programs with the Commission as the framework.

REGIONAL PLANS COMPLETED

During 1977 the Commission completed the following regional plans:

- Overall Economic Development Program: sets economic development priorities for the region;
- Manpower Plan: sets priorities for the allocation of funds available to the Concentrated Employment Program on the basis of an analysis of unemployment problems in the region;
- Land Use Plan: provides an analysis of land use trends and problems, and proposes regional policies to guide the use of land in the region;
- Housing Plan: presents a housing needs analysis and an allocation plan for federal and state housing programs available to the region;
- Public Safety Plan: identifies public safety issues for the region and proposes steps to increase cooperation among all units of government in dealing with this critical issue; and
- Aging Plan: identifies needs of the elderly in the region and sets priorities to guide the allocation of grants available to the region for aging programs.

The Commission also prepared Community Health Services Plans to enable Cass, Morrison, Todd and Wadena Counties to establish a Community Health Services Program as a requirement for a receipt of state supporting funds for community health projects.

STUDIES COMPLETED

Greater Brainerd Area Growth Study: Analyzed growth trends in the townships surrounding the City of Brainerd; the study was requested by the City and these townships to be used as a basis for the consideration of an orderly annexation strategy.

Todd and Morrison Counties Transit Plan: analyzed rural and municipal transit needs in the two counties on the basis of demographic and economic analysis and a public opinion survey, and proposed a transit system to meet these needs.

SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS

Establishment of Tri-Regional Area Agency on Aging

The Region 5 Commission provided the impetus for the development of the Tri-Regional Area Agency on Aging. The cooperative venture with Region 5, East Central Regional Development Commission and Catholic Charities of the Diocese of St. Cloud is serving as the model for other multi-Regional area agencies in Minnesota. Region 5 serves as the lead agency in the area agency handling the fiscal and administrative affairs of the agency. Region 5 has also provided Technical Assistance to the cooperative regions in the development of their aging program.

Remote Sensing

The problem of obtaining useful land use and water quality information for an area the size of Region 5 (approximately 6,000 square miles) can be both expensive and time consuming. The Region 5 Regional Development Commission solves this problem by utilizing LANDSAT digital data to provide a synoptic view of land and water resources within the region. The advantages of using LANDSAT to acquire, analyze and display regional land use/water quality data are: (1) lower cost, (2) objectivity, (3) short analysis time, (4) uniformity in data quality, (5) versatility in displaying classification results and (6) a data base for future land use monitoring and updating.

The information acquired through LANDSAT is not the sole basis for the land use plan, but a component of the data base. The LANDSAT data enhances the additional land use information as well as possessing the capability to be immediately utilized by resource managers.

Woodrow Township Ordinance

The Woodrow Town Board requested assistance from the Region 5 Regional Development Commission to develop land use controls that would help preserve the unique and environmentally sensitive areas of the township from harmful and haphazard development. The Commission worked closely with the land use task force during the summer and fall to complete a land use plan, water quality data (utilizing LANDSAT digital data) zoning ordinance, shoreland regulations, and individual sewage treatment regulations.

Adoption of the OEDP

Each of the county boards by February 1977 selected members to serve on County O.E.D.P. Committees. These committees met to initiate the O.E.D.P. process by determining specific needs of each county as well as general regional concerns.

In June of 1977, two members from each county committee and one Region 5 Commission member were selected to serve on the Regional O.E.D.P. Advisory Task Force. The first meeting of this group was held July 7, 1977 which was the beginning of a process that combined the county needs developing regional concerns and growth centers. This process was highlighted by the meeting of October 18, 1977 in which all comments and proposed changes were offered by the County O.E.D.P. Committees and County Boards.

At the December 1, 1977 regular meeting of the Region 5 Regional Development Commission the members unanimously moved to adopt the O.E.D.P. Plan. The priorities set forth in the plan are as follows:

Crow Wing River Housing Services Corporation

Crow Wing River Housing Services is a non-profit entity established by the Regional Commission to provide a delivery service for the Minnesota Housing Finance Agencies Home Improvement Grant Program. The Corporation secured a contract to deliver the grant program under sub-contract with the Community Action Agencies in four of the Region's five counties. The total grant funds allocated for the counties was \$274,000. The Corporation was able to rehabilitate 106 homes -- 70 projects were for Senior Citizens over 62 years of age.

VI. REGIONAL CLEARINGHOUSE REVIEW

The Region 5 Regional Development Commission in 1975 was designated by the Governor of Minnesota as the "clearinghouse" for the five county area of Central Minnesota. Regional clearinghouses are required by the Federal Office of Management and Budget under Circular A-95, and are set up to facilitate the coordination of state, regional and local planning and development efforts. As a clearinghouse, the Commission is empowered to review and comment on local project applications requesting, federal grants and loans.

In addition to the authority granted the Commission under Circular A-95, the Commission is also granted the following powers under the Regional Development Act of 1969:

- (a) review and comment on long-term comprehensive plans of local governmental units within the Region
- (b) review and comment on plans of independent boards and commissions having multi-county or multi-community impacts, for conformance with regional plans and policies
- (c) review and comment on applications for federal and state grants or loans made by governmental units, independent commissions, boards or agencies within the Region by governmental units, independent commissions, boards or agencies within the Region

The procedure utilized by the Commission in carrying out its review function is referred to as the Regional Clearinghouse Review. On the following pages is a listing of all projects reviewed by the Commission during 1977 through the Regional Clearinghouse Review procedure.

Upon receipt of a project notification, the Commission contacts local units of government, agencies and individuals that may be affected by or interested in the project, and requests their comments. Once these comments are received, the Commission provides a final review of the project. The project applicant is then responsible for sending the application, along with all comments, to the potential federal or state funding agency.

The Regional Clearinghouse Review procedure does not guarantee or deny the funding of a project; rather, it provides the potential funding sources with an idea of the impact that the project may have within the Region.
