




The Arrowhead Regional Development Commission traces its beginnings to the Arrowhead Economic Development District, officially recognized by the US Secretary of Commerce on June 20, 1967. The District was made up of Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake and St. Louis Counties.




From that time to the present, the Commission has grown with a singular purpose...to serve the people of the Arrowhead Region, helping them achieve their goals in the areas of

## **Board of Directors**

## Introduction

The Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) has been striving to meet the employment, environmental and social needs of the people in Northeastern Minnesota for nearly a decade.

This effort was made possible by the passage of enabling legislation by the federal and state governments in the late 1960's, permitting the creation of regional development commissions.

The people of the Arrowhead Region were among the first in the country to realize the benefits of the new laws, and as a result the Counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake and St. Louis established an organization which would serve their unique area.

The Arrowhead Region makes up a quarter of Minnesota's total area-19,496 square miles. That's bigger than the combined area of Connecticut, Delaware, Maryland, Rhode Island and Washington, D.C., yet it contains only 8.6 percent of the state's population—estimated at 342,200 on July 1, 1977.


Historically, the economy of Northeastern Minnesota has been dependent on its natural resources. Voyageur fur traders were followed by railroaders, lumberjacks and miners.

While the Region's economy is still heavily dependent on its forest industries and mining, service industries are quickly becoming a third significant factor. Education, health care and tourism are all major contributors to the present economic base. In years to come, many see the utilization of the Region's vast peat reserves and the mining of copper/nickel as additional contributors to the economy.

The Region's three iron ranges supply two-thirds of the nation's supply of that raw material and that tonnage combined with huge amounts of grain from throughout the midwest helps Duluth maintain its ranking among the top ten ports in the country in terms of cargo volume.

Tourists are drawn to the Region by year-around recreational and sight-seeing areas including the North Shore of Lake Superior, the Voyageurs National Park, the Chippewa and Superior National Forests and the nationally renowned Boundary Waters Canoe Area.

Two four-year post-secondary schools, numerous vocational-technical





schools and a number of community colleges underscore the desire of the people throughout the Region to improve their education.

Additionally, the establishment of a medical school and the continuous expansion and upgrading of hospitals and clinics have made Duluth in particular a health care center for an area far beyond the confines of the Arrowhead Region.

There are more than 300 units of local government within the Arrowhead Region. Each of them in dealing with similar problems must coordinate activities with a multitude of state and federal agencies.

Elected officials representing communities large and small, county governments and school districts and volunteers with expertise in various areas of special interest make up the Arrowhead Regional Development Commission.






Commission members serve with more than 300 other elected, appointed and volunteer members of 16 advisory committees on a monthly basis to assure a constant flow of public participation in the policy making process of ARDC.

Public meetings and hearings are also scheduled throughout the Region as part of ARDC's program planning effort.

The many programs in which the Commission and its professional planning staff have been engaged during the past year are described in the following pages of this report.

A special section of this report, entitled Project Notification and Review System (PNRS), provides information on specific plans and projects reviewed by ARDC in 1978. The Regional Development Act gave ARDC the added responsibility of reviewing and commenting on all project proposals involving state and federal funds in the Region. The purpose of this process is to again provide a forum for the people of the Region through their representatives to comment on the impact of each other's activities and to coordinate them for the greatest overall benefit.

Through public meetings, advisory committees and the participation of the Region's elected representatives, ARDC continues to function with the goal of being responsive to the needs of Northeastern Minnesota's residents and to meet those needs in the most efficient manner.



### CRDG

In 1977 ARDC embarked on a two-year effort to prepare a Comprehensive Regional Development Guide. Rather than a new or innovative program, this effort more appropriately represented an orchestration of all existing regional planning components. The resulting Comprehensive Plan for the sevencounty Arrowhead Region is intended to

serve a myriad of purposes.

Generally stated, the CRDG will provide an overall identification of where the Region wants to go and how it plans to get there. More specifically, the Guide is being prepared to provide useful guidelines and decision-making considerations which local governments can utilize in addressing the major issues and problems they confront on a daily basis. The guide will also serve as a mechanism for communicating to State and Federal agencies the goals designed to meet the unique needs of the Arrowhead Region. This communication is essential to ensure consistency between Regional goals and State or Federal actions within the Region.

The production of the CRDG has been divided into two phases. Phase I is a compilation and refinement of Regional Goals and Policies, while Phase II will represent an identification of needs and problems which are preventing achievement of desired conditions in the Region, with implementation strategies developed to address prior-

ity issues.

Phase I of the process is nearing completion after a coordinated and concerted effort on the part of all ARDC Advisory Committees, and initial review and comment by all relevent State agencies. Presently a brochure is being prepared for general distribution throughout the Region explaining the CRDG and describing the development process. It is intended that the brochure will serve as an invitation to public information meetings planned for early 1979. These meetings will be held in each county, with a final and more formal hearing to be conducted at the ARDC offices.


Once public input is compiled and discussed by each committee, the final version of Phase I, upon approval by the Commission, will undergo a required 60 day review by the State Planning Agency. Having incorporated comments of that and other State agencies, the Commission will adopt a final statement of Regional Goals and Policies.

Concurrent with the finalization of Phase I will be the majority of groundwork and development of Phase II. Following the establishment of the initial Goals and Policies, each committee began the process of identifying and prioritizing needs and problems related to achieving those Goals and Policies, establishing measurable objectives for priority needs and problems, and determining appropriate impelmentation strategies designed to accomplish the objectives.

The end product of all this effort will be a comprehensive document which, through periodic updating, will represent a unified approach to all ARDC planning efforts and programs. It will also provide a framework for informed and consistent decision making on the part of the local units of government, public agencies, and interest groups which comprise the

Arrowhead Commission.





## Human Resources Coordination

Since 1974, the ARDC Human Resources Coordinating Committee (HRCC) has reviewed and coordinated activities to enhance the delivery of human services to the residents of the Arrowhead Region.

Chaired by Commissioner Walter Brink of Grand Rapids, the eighteen member committee continued in 1978 to provide a regional forum for the discussion of significant social issues and to direct ARDC staff involvement in several major projects.

The need for regional emergency medical services planning, for example, was investigated by a special task force of the HRCC in 1978. The result was the formulation of the ARDC Emergency Medical Services Advisory Committee and the initiation of regional EMS coordination and planning.

The HRCC also produced a listing of goals and policies for the delivery of human services in the Region for inclusion in the Comprehensive Regional Development Guide. This document will serve as a basis for the review of human services proposals and plans, and will provide direction for future human resources development. Further refinement of this Comprehensive Guide is projected during 1979.


## Aging

The ARDC Arrowhead Planning Program on Aging completed its sixth year of operation in 1978. With each passing year changes have taken place to strengthen the Program and its positive impact on the lives of the Region's older population. 1978 was no exception as the ARDC through its Program on Aging became involved, for the first time, in recommending \$95,714 in available funds for multipurpose senior centers in the Region, and in sponsoring the Region's first Conference on Aging. These activities were undertaken in addition to the numerous other responsibilities of the Program.

To understand the functions of the Program, it is important to note that in 1973 ARDC was designated by the Minnesota Board on Aging (MBA) as the official Area Agency on Aging (AAA) for the Arrowhead Region. This was done under the authority of the federal Older Americans Act. ARDC's primary role as an AAA is to plan,

coordinate, advocate and pool resources to provide for a comprehensive social service delivery system to those people age 60 and over in the Arrowhead Region. In fulfilling its responsibilities, ARDC has been involved in researching the needs and problems of the elderly; developing an annual plan on aging; providing information and technical assistance to local government and service agencies; and granting and monitoring nearly \$300,000 in Older American Act Title III funds for social service programs for senior citizens.

A very important component of the Program is the ARDC Advisory Committee on Aging. Senior citizens make up over half of the Committee, which represents such interests as private and public service agencies, minority and low income citizens, Councils on Aging and the general public. The Committee meets monthly and in 1978 had responsibility for a number of functions including development of the Annual Plan of Aging, advising the ARDC on aging issues and recommending Title III grants for social services to the elderly. In addition, the Committee co-sponsored eight open meetings throughout the Region to hear first-hand from senior citizens, service providers, public officials and other interested meetings interested people what they believe to be the needs and problems of the elderly within the Arrowhead Region. Over 300 people attended these meetings and gave testimony on senior citizen concerns and issues.

As noted earlier, the ARDC became involved for the first time in 1978 in recommending funds for the renovation and alteration of multi-purpose senior citizen centers through a regional allocation of funds under Title V of the Older Americans Act. Limited funds and numerous applicants made this a difficult job for ARDC and its Advisory Committee on Aging. receiving the funds from the Minnesota Board on Aging, based on recommendations by ARDC, include the Cook County Council on Aging, Aurora Senior Citizens Club, Hoyt Lakes Senior Citizens Club, Gilbert Senior Citizens Club, City of Chisholm, Orr Area Senior Citizens Club, and the City of Hibbing.

Another first for the Planning Program on Aging in 1978 was the sponsorship of a Regional Conference on Aging in September. The Conference was attended by over 300 people including senior citizens, people working in the field of aging, public officials and the interested public. It's purpose was to draw attention to the needs, potentials and problems of the elderly in the Arrowhead Region. Conference highlights included speeches by Minnesota Governor Rudy Perpich and Federal Council on Aging Vice-Chairman James Sykes of Madison, Wisconsin. The response by participants was so highly positive that another regional Conference on Aging is being planned for 1979.

The Regional Conference on Aging was just one component of ARDC's effort in 1978 to provide training opportunities for people in the Region involved in senior citizen services and programs. Under Title IV-A of the Older Americans Act, ARDC received funds to sponsor three other training sessions covering such topics as programming and management training for senior citizen center staff and board members; program and management skills for Title III and Title VII project staff; and committee effectiveness training.

As in past years, ARDC's Area Planning Program on Aging has continued its involvement with MBA funded Title VII congregate nutrition programs throughout the Region. addition to providing training assistance to the multi-regional project of the Minnesota Chippewa Tribe, the Program has responsibility for monitoring, reviewing and providing technical assistance to two other Title VII Nutrition Projects in the Region. Those two projects, operated by the Duluth Community Action Program and the Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency, consist of 24 congregate meal sites located throughout the Arrowhead. Currently, ARDC and the MBA have joint responsibility for site visits and projects reviews, although this arrangement will be changing due, in part, to the 1978 reauthorization of the Older Americans Act by Congress. Through this reauthorization, Congress has emphasized the need for greater coordination in the administration of social services for older persons at the regional level. cordingly, among other changes, the responsibility for administering and funding nutrition projects, as well as renovation projects for multi-purpose senior centers, will soon shift from the Minnesota Board on Aging to the ARDC, as is currently done under Title III.



### Arts


1978 was the first year of full regional arts council status and activity directed by the ARDC Arts Advisory Committee. For fiscal year 1979, the Minnesota State Arts Board (MSAB) has allocated \$57,485 to the region, and the Committee made recommendations to fund \$26,107 in project grants to non-profit, tax-exempt organizations during the latter half of



calendar year 1978 with the remainder to be distributed early in 1979. The following list is a summary of those initial FY 1979 grants to various arts

Detailed information on each of these grants is available through the ARDC Arts Committee.

Apart from grantmaking, the Committee applied for and received an additional regional special projects grant of \$7,240 from MSAB. These funds are being used over a twelve month period to conduct a series of public information meetings throughout the Region and to provide workshop assistance in identified arts needs. Arts councils in Cook County and Two Harbors have been initiated through the project. Technical assistance publications on arts topics suggested through the meetings are also under development.

The Committee also continues to publish its quarterly newsletter, Arrowhead Arts, which serves the Region as a prime arts communications tool. Additionally, exhibitions of the work of many regional artists have been displayed each month in the ARDC offices and the staff has provided extensive arts information services at the request of arts organizations, individual artists, school systems and the general public through the year.





### Criminal Justice

The Criminal Justice program was established by ARDC in 1970 and has existed under the provisions of the Federal Omnibus Crime Control Act since 1973. The program operates through the Criminal Justice Committee and the Juvenile Justice Subcommittee, which are responsible for developing an annual Criminal Justice Plan and distributing Law Enforcement Assistance Administration (LEAA) monies throughout the Arrowhead Region.

In 1977 the Minnesota State legislature passed a bill establishing the Crime Control Planning Board which is the state agency responsible for coordinating Criminal Justice planning in Minnesota. The Crime Control Planning Board replaced the former Governor's Commission on Crime Prevention and Control (GCCPC). The state law also included a mandate for strong, coordinated Criminal Justice planning at the regional level. In addition to awarding LEAA monies in the region, the Criminal Justice program must also be responsible for the administration of grants, project monitoring and fiscal compliance with state and federal requirements.


Since the Criminal Justice program was extablished it has reviewed and supported the development of over 6 million dollars in new Criminal Justice programs for the Region, including the Northeast Regional Corrections Center, the Arrowhead Juvenile Center, a Law Enforcement Communication System, major remodeling of the St. Louis County Jail and the development of a Youth Shelter program in Carlton County.

One of the major activities of the Criminal Justice program in 1978 was the development of the Criminal Justice portion of the Comprehensive Regional Development Guide (CRDG) which includes 23 goals and 63 policies. The Committee and a Planning Subcommittee will continue the process, including a needs assessment and the establishment of objectives and an implementation strategy for 1980.

Technical Assistance was provided to many communities and agencies in the region in 1978, including a management study of the Two Harbors Police Department; and the Eveleth, Gilbert and Virginia Police Consolidation project. The Criminal Justice program also assisted St. Louis County in the renovation of the jail; Carlton County in the development of a Crisis Shelter for juveniles; Arrowhead Regional Corrections, Ely and Koochiching County in the development of programs and grants.



# Developmental Disabilities

It is estimated that over 4 percent of the population of the Arrowhead Region is developmentally disabled. That translates into roughly 13,400 people in the seven county area who are disabled by mental retardation, cerebral palsy, autism and epilepsy.

Since its initial association with ARDC in 1976, the 24 member Arrowhead Regional Developmental Disabilities Council has planned and coordinated at the local level in order to develop a continuum of services for the developmentally disabled citizens of the region.

The responsibilities of the DD Council include:

Serving as a public forum where service providers, consumers, and their representatives, and other citizens communicate, plan and work together.


2. Serving as an information clearing house on available resources in the region for the developmentally disabled as well as providing technical assistance to those attempting to tap those resources.

3. Serving as a community resource to document and provide accurate information on the needs and potentials of individuals with developmental disabilities.

4. Serving as an advocate for individuals with developmental disabilities by speaking and acting on their behalf.

On the broader level, the Council provides a mechanism for the State Council to secure information about local needs and resources for comprehensive state-wide planning. The Regional Council ultimately has the responsibility to work toward influencing legislation, appropriations, policies and programs on regional, state and national levels that affect services for developmentally disabled individuals within the region.

During 1978 the Regional DD Council, chaired by Ms. Barbara Goman, received two financial grants from the Governor's Planning Council on Developmental Disabilities. In addition to the funds received for the purpose of supporting the overall activities of the Council, a special grant of \$16,000 was received to enhance employment oppportunities for the Region's developmentally disabled work



This one year program consisforce. ted of an initial survey to determine the attitudes and hiring practices of employers in regard to developmentally disabled workers; an intensive public information campaign highlighted by verbal presentations to employer groups, a mass media blitz and by the distribution of informational materials to all small business employers in the region; and, finally, a post survey to measure changes in employer attitudes and hiring practices and to assess the effectiveness of the informational activities. The information acquired from the study will be distributed nationally and will provide the basis for the development of a regional plan to improve the employment potential for developmentally disabled citizens. Results of the survey and a report on the entire project are now available at the ARDC offices.

Current plans and activities of the DD Council include the development of a 1979 Regional Plan on Developmental Disabilities, coordination of Early and Periodic Screening programs in the Region, on-going public information efforts, publication of a regional newsletter on developmental disabilities and an inventory of services available to the developmental disabled population of the region.

## Emergency Medical Services

In June of 1978, after nine months of study, the Emergency Medical Services Task Force of the ARDC Human Coordinating Resources Committee issued a report on the state of emergency medical services in the Arrowhead Region. The Task Force recom-mended that a permanent Emergency Medical Services Committee be established at ARDC and that available funding for the implementation of a regional EMS system be pursued. In the report the Task Force noted:
"There is a need to upgrade and stabilize fundamental emergency medical services in the region. Beyond sta-bilization the lack of a coordinated regional emergency health care system hinders substantial reductions in deaths due to trauma, burns, cardiac, poison, neonatal, spinal cord and behavioral disorders."

As a direct result of the Task Force findings an eighteen member Arrowhead Emergency Medical Services Committee was created at ARDC and met for the first time on September 28, 1978 in Duluth. Membership on the Committee, which is chaired by St. Louis County Commissioner Ed Hoff, includes representatives from the regional medical and hospital associations, the seven county health boards, the nursing association, public and private ambulance providers, consumers and fire and police departments. Funding to support project planning for the period from July 1, 1978 through June 30, 1979 has been provided by contributions from each of the seven county health boards and by a \$9,948 grant from the Charles K. Blandin Foundation.


During 1979, the EMS Committee will assess the need for improving emergency medical services in the Region and, based upon this information, will develop a regional EMS systems plan addressing the following essential components:

- 1. Provision of Manpower
- 2. Training of Personal
- 3. Communications
- 4. Transportation
- 5. Emergency Facilities
- 6. Critical Care Units
- 7. Use of Public Safety Agencies
- 8. Consumer Participation
- 9. Accessibility to Care 10. Transfer of Patients

- 11. Standard Medical Record-keeping
- 12. Consumer Information and Education
- 13. Independent Review and Evaluation
- 14. Disaster Linkage
- 15. Mutual Aid Agreements

It is also likely that the Committee will apply for available federal funding to meet the costs of implementing the plan.

Based on various prototypes in other regions of the country, it is now quite apparent that significant improvements in emergency and critical care of all types of emergency patients can be realized. This can be accomplished if a sound integration of all essential components of an EMS system are logically structured and directed towards delivering ideal care to "real" patients in need. In 1979, and during subsequent years, the ARDC EMS Committee will strive to develop such a system and in so doing reduce the number of people who die and are disabled as a result of medical emergencies in the Arrowhead Region.



# Information Systems


1978 was a landmark year for ARDC's Information Systems. The Client Record System, which was developed in 1976 and began operating in 1977, completed a year of successful operation. The three initial users (Human Development Center, Range Mental Health Center, and Northland Mental Health Center) have been using the information for meeting reporting requirements and monitoring their client caseload. Questions such as: "How many clients were served last year?", "What type of services were being used most often?", and others are easily being answered.

The Development of two other systems was also completed. These systems, a Staff Effort (time management system) and a General Ledger (financial reporting system) were designed to be either integrated with the Client Record System or used by themselves. They give the user the option of defining many of the data items used and increase the data processing services ARDC can provide.

To make these systems more accessable to agencies in the region, ARDC has received funding from the Intergovernmental Information Systems Advisory Council (IISAC) to cover the costs of incorporating new users. Both Family Service of Duluth and The Center on Alcohol and Drug Problems will be using the client record system by January and even more users are expected during 1979.

Other developments to expand the Information Systems are presently being explored. These include accounts receivable and payable (with automatic billing and checkwriting) and on-line capabilities (to enable users to enter and retrieve their own data). Inclusion of those capabilities would create a complete informational package, something unique in regional systems.

As an outgrowth of the Mental Health Information System, ARDC was brought together with the Community Action Programs agencies. There are 26 similar agencies across the state and their need for reliable data concerning clients could be met with computerized information. The ARDC Systems staff, with experience in regional processing and development of client record systems, will play an instrumental part in developing a




system that may be utilized state-wide.

ARDC is currently developing an Offender Tracking System for Arrowhead Regional Corrections. This system tracks a client's progress through the Corrections program from admission to termination. Caseloads of probation officers and Northeast Regional Corrections Center (NERCC) caseworkers are monitored. An inquiry system with statistical capabilities is provided, allowing management to assess the effectiveness of many aspects of the Corrections Program.

With the growing need for information, ARDC is playing a vital role in offering services to the human resource agencies in the Arrowhead Region. The collection of reliable data that is compatible and accessible is critical to any meaningful local, regional, or state planning. Information Systems at ARDC provides a means to achieve this objective.

# Physical Planning



## Air Quality

In 1977, Congress amended the 1970 Clean Air Act calling for a national goal of healthy air nationwide by December 1982. The new amendments set stricter clean air planning requirements and toughened enforcement provisions. Each state is required to identify all areas that meet air quality standards, and those that do not, for five major air pollutants. In addition, each state must develop or up-date a State Air Quality Implementation Plan by July 1979.

As a result of the new amendments, several areas in the Arrowhead Region were identified as not meeting minimum air quality standards. Two major areas include the Duluth metropolitan area and the Iron Range. During the latter part of 1978, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) has been in the process of developing alternative implementation strategies to minimize air pollution and comply with new standards for the two areas. Because of the potential environmental and economic implications associated with the Clean Air Act requirements, ARDC established an Ad Hoc Advisory Committee on the Iron Range.

The Advisory Committee was set up to insure that public input would be incorporated into MPCA's planning process and also to provide a source of feedback to the ARDC Board in developing recommendations to MPCA. The committee included representatives from industry, labor, business, local government and environmental public interests. It is hoped that the Committee, in conjunction with MPCA, will be able to develop an acceptable implementation strategy for meeting air quality standards by July 1979.

## Coastal Zone Management

Our nation's coastal areas have come under considerable scrutiny as development pressures are evolving and competition increases for use of coastal land and water resources. This awareness points out a basic need to coordinate the variety of existing and potential multiple uses of the coastal environment.

The North Shore of Lake Superior, from Duluth to the Canadian border, is Minnesota's major coastline. The North Shore represents some of the

state's most spectacular scenery and is characterized as an eminent national, state and local natural resource area. Because of these obvious amenities, and the national trend toward development and use of coastal environs, increasing resource preservation and development pressures are emphasizing the need for careful long range planning for the North Shore.

In 1972 Congress passed the Coastal Zone Management Act, which provides funds to coastal states (including those bordering the Great Lakes) to prepare and implement a management plan for the use of coastal land and water resources. As part of the Coastal Zone Management Act, Congress outlined five major national policy declarations which define the purpose and intent of the legislation.

- 1. Preserve, protect, develop, and where possible, to restore or enhance the resources of the nation's coastal zone for this and succeeding generations;
- 2. Encourage and assist the states to exercise effectively their responsibilities in the coastal zone through the development and implementation of management programs to achieve wise use of the land and water resources of the coastal zone giving full consideration to ecological, cultural, historic, and aesthetic values as well as to needs for economic development;
- 3. For all federal agencies engaged in programs affecting the coastal zone to cooperate and participate with state and local governments and regional agencies in effectuating the purposes of this act;
- 4. To encourage the participation of the public, of federal, state and local governments and regional agencies in the development of coastal zone management programs; and
- 5. To encourage cooperation among the various state and regional agencies, including establishment of interstate and regional agreements, cooperative procedures, and joint action, particularly regarding environmental programs.

Recognizing that this legislation could assist in maintaining the quality of Minnesota's North Shore area, the State Planning Agency (SPA), in 1974, initiated Minnesota's Coastal

Zone Management (CZM) Program. ARDC's role in the program has been to assist SPA in the completion of several planning work elements, provide technical assistance to local North Shore governmental units, encourage and foster public participation and involvement in the planning process and to serve as a forum where local governments and state and federal agencies can cooperatively discuss issues pertinent to the coastal area.

Several other groups have played a major role in the CZM Program including the Coastal Zone Management Policy Advisory Committee (CZM-PAC) and three Citizen Advisory Committees from St. Louis, Lake and Cook Counties. The CZM-PAC, which has been meeting regularly since May, 1976, is comprised of the directors of six state agencies and seven representatives of local units of government along the North Shore.

The four year CZM planning process culminated in 1978 with the release of the Public Hearing Draft CZM Plan in February. The plan was a second draft containing major revisions of a first draft plan reviewed by the Policy Advisory Committee in October, 1977. Public informational meetings and formal public hearings were held along the North Shore and in St. Paul during March and April 1978. The public hearing record and general comments received in the form of letters to the Governor, SPA and the hearing examiner were largely in opposition to the CZM Plan.

As a result of sentiments expressed at the public hearings and the Governor's concerns, the CZM-PAC took a course of action requesting that alternatives be examined to redesign the Minnesota CZM program. These alternatives were discussed and considered:

1) to revise the second draft plan for resubmittal, 2) to develop a "state only" program which would largely affect state agencies with very limited local involvement, and 3) to design a "segmented" planning program.


ARDC examined all of these alternatives and designed and prepared a "segmented" planning proposal calling for a strong local/regional planning role. The proposal was patterned after the successful Duluth Harbor Planning Program and allowed several things to happen. First, it provided for the City of Duluth to proceed in the implementation of a locally prepared and approved Harbor Plan. Duluth would have to prepare a CZM Compliance document to become elegible

CZMimplementation grants. Secondly, the proposal called for St. Louis, Lake and Cook Counties to establish a planning process similar to the Harbor Study in which a North Shore Comprehensive Plan would be prepared through a North Shore committee structure. Following preparation and local government approval of the North Shore Plan, a decision would have to be made in terms of whether or not to proceed and develop a CZM compliance document to implement the North Shore Plan. In addition to the North Shore planning process, resources would be made available to the three counties and municipalities to conduct independent county land use planning programs and develop state mandated municipal shoreland management provisions.

Through the "segmented" planning proposal, Duluth could begin implementing a Harbor Plan which it prepared, approved and wants to implement; North Shore governments could prepare a North Shore Plan and have the resources available to complete individual county and municipal planning programs; and in the final analysis, collectively make a decision whether or not to pursue CZM as a plan implementation alternative.

The "segmented" planning proposal was accepted by the Policy Advisory Committee in June, subject to individual county board review and support. Opposition to the proposal was voiced by Lake and Cook Counties, while the City of Duluth and St. Louis County supported the approach. In conjunction with actions taken by the counties and the City of Duluth, ARDC went on record supporting existing available alternatives for coastal zone planning and requested the Governor to proceed with the program.

The Governor has corresponded with the federal Office of Coastal Zone Management and requested funding for Duluth to proceed with implementation of the Harbor Plan, and further that no commitments be made as to when and if further coastal planning would be pursued in Lake and Cook Counties. Because of the legalities of this request, OCZM had not responded at the time this report was written.



## Economic Planning

ARDC began a partial break with traditional economic development planning in 1978. Historically, regional development commissions have emphasized a liason role between governmental units. That role has entailed assistance to a municipality or county applying to a state or federal agency for funds to build facilities that will hopefully attract industry. While ARDC has played, and will continue to play, a catalyst role in securing funding; a new role has been initiated.

This new role involves dealing directly with the job creators...private industry. The ARDC staff has begun to work with the Economic Development Administration (EDA) Business Development Program, in which private companies can receive federally guaranteed loans to expand or start a business. ARDC can offer only advice or technical assistance on these loans. There is no official role for RDC's in the process.

ARDC has also established ties with the Minnesota Department of Economic Development to more effectively use the Area Redevelopment Administration's feasibility study program. This program provides loans for private individuals seeking to start a business. These loans can be used for conducting feasibility studies to determine the advisability of new business or industrial ventures. Once again, ARDC plays an assistance role...bringing potential applicants in contact with the program, as happened with a trucking terminal idea in International Falls, a potential wood products industry for Grand Marais and several others throughout the Region.

Also in 1978, ARDC took a role in dealing with one of the nation's most critical problems...Energy. Through a grant from the EDA, ARDC has begun a project to help local units of government use energy resources more wisely. The project staff offers assistance to cities between 1,000 and 5,000 population. (The 5,000 person limit is established because the Minnesota Energy Agency has a program for cities over 5,000.) This assistance will include providing information from all available sources, helping in conducting energy of technical audits, noticeadvancements in the field of energy and the assessment of the energy impact of any proposed new construction.

While these new roles have begun, ARDC has not abandoned its traditional functions. The Economic Policy Committee continues to update the Overall Economic Development Guide for the Arrowhead Region to keep up with changes in the economy of the region.

EDA funding for projects in the region has not been neglected either. Four projects were approved for funding in 1978: an energy related remodling of the Aitkin County Courthouse (\$35,000); the expansion of the Reservation Lake (\$808,000); a new road to the Aitkin Industrial Industrial Park (\$275,000) and a market and feasibility study to determine the future of the United States Hockey Hall of Fame in Eveleth (\$20,000). Several other projects are now under consideration by EDA, the Upper Great Lakes Regional Commission and the Minnesota Department of Economic Development and additional funding is expected to further fuel the economic development of the Arrowhead Region.

# Environmental Permit Center

One of the most often heard complaints about government is related to the burgeoning controls and increasing procedural hoops that one must grapple with when contemplating some development action.

In an effort to reduce this complaint, at least with regard to activities as they take place in Minnesota, the Arrowhead Regional Development Commission, under contract with the Minnesota Environmental Quality Board (EQB) of the State Planning Agency established a Regional Environmental Permit Information Center. The Center was set up at ARDC's Duluth office to assist the public in understanding and complying with the requirements of Minnesota's environmental permit programs. The dissemination of environmental permit information serves to reinforce ARDC's mission to serve as a Regional forum where local governments, public and private interests, and citizens can come together to insure orderly and harmonious economic, cultural, social, physical and governmental development in the Arrowhead Region.


Under the contract with the EQB, state environmental permit information supplied by the EQB and local information gathered by ARDC is maintained on file at ARDC. ARDC was responsible for publicizing the Center's services, supplying the permit information and assisting people by both referring them to appropriate agencies and personnel administering various environmental permits in the state and responding to questions and problems as appropriate.

The Environmental Permit Information Center was publicized in ARDC's newsletter The Arrowhead Report in an effort to promote its availability to the public. News releases on the Information Center were also prepared and distributed to the media throughout the Region. ARDC efforts, along with those of the Environmental Quality Board, provided formal contact with the public on this program.

During the first six months of operation, approximately twenty-five people contacted the Center. The majority of the information requests were directed at the State environmental review process and how it affected the individual or a proposed project.

The Center is administered by a single staff person at ARDC. Once the

filing system was operational, the center was relatively easy to administer. The center served two primary functions; first, it provided a needed service to Arrowhead Region interests; and second, it made available, in a central location, a comprehensive permit profile which was found to be a very useful reference resource for ARDC staff. ARDC hopes to maintain the service pending fiscal constraints.



## Forestry

The forests of Minnesota provide major benefits to the economy and aesthetic quality to the Arrowhead Region and the entire state. The Arrowhead Region, which is 80 percent forested, contains more than half of all commercial forest land in Minnesota. Forestry is currently Minnesota's third largest industry and accounts for more than one-third of all manufacturing employment in the Arrowhead Region.

In recognition of the economic importance of the Region's forests, an ARDC Forestry Committee has been meeting regularly since 1974. The Committee is composed of interested private citizens and representatives of government agencies and private industry. The Forestry Committee provides a monthly forum for individuals

with a broad range of backgrounds to discuss their common interests and concerns regarding the Region's forest resources.

The primary function of the Forestry Committee is to advise the ARDC Board of Directors on forestry related A significant forest rematters. source analysis was completed by the Forestry Committee in 1978 with the publication of a report titled Arrowhead Region Timber Resources 1978. The report was developed jointly by staff from ARDC, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, and the US Forest Service's Division of State and It assessed the Private Forestry. impact of the forest industry on the economy of the Arrowhead Region and the supply and demand for the Region's timber resources.

The report also included application of a transport model to the Region's forest resources and an identification of major markets for wood resources found within the Region. Information found within the report provides timber resources data which can be used in economic development decisions, land use planning and other related planning activities.

A logical focus for further research based on the Timber Resources Report would be an assessment of the economic and technological feasibility of converting non-industrial wood resources into a large scale alternative source of energy.

Three primary areas addressed by the Forestry Committee during 1978 were national forest planning, state policy related to forest management and state and national legislative developments. The Committee also participated in the review of a foreign based forest engineering consultant's assessment of forestry in Minnesota, the impending closure of the US Air Force Finland Radar Base, a proposed symposium on increased use of hardwoods by industry and environmental issues.

## Housing

The ARDC Housing Advisory Committee (HAC) is involved in the formulation of regional policies relative to providing a variety of housing types to meet the needs of people in the Arrowhead Region. The 21 members of the HAC represent seven counties, various Housing and Redevelopment Authorities (HRAs), lending institutions, target population groups and others.

The primary activity of the HAC in

1978 has been the development of the Comprehensive Regional Development Guide (CRDG) as it relates to housing issues. The CRDG defines the regional goals and policies for new housing construction, existing housing, equal opportunity, environmental protection, historic preservation and intergovernmental cooperation.

Eighteen basic need categories were also identified which should be met in order to achieve housing adequacy consistent with the goals and policies of the CRDG. Some of the identified needs are:

-Planning and Project Development Capability

-Property Acquisition

-New Housing Construction

-Mortgage Funding

-Housing Assistance

-Rehabilitation of Existing
Housing

-Intergovernmental Coordination

-Public Facilities Improvement

-Energy Conservation

Resources which can be utilized by local units of government in relation to various strategies were also identified. Some often used sources are:

-HUD Community Development Block Grants

-Tax Increment Financing

-Minnesota Housing Finance Agency (MHFA)

-Farmers Home Administration

-MHFA Home Improvement Program

-CAP Agencies and Staff

-ARDC Staff

In related housing activities, state and federal housing agencies allocated funds to the Region in 1978 to assist in improving housing conditions. Rent subsidized housing for low and moderate income families was supplied through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Section 8 and Leased Housing Programs. Additional mortgage funds were supplied through the Minnesota Housing Finance Agency and the Farmers Home Administration.

One very important project which is expected to start in 1979 is the development of an Areawide Housing Opportunity Plan (AHOP). This plan will provide a wider geographical choice of housing opportunities for lower income people outside areas and jurisdictions containing undue concentrations of low-income and minority households. This will be a highly cooperative effort between local units of government and ARDC. Upon approval of the AHOP by HUD, the Arrowhead Region will become eligible for special allocations of Community Development Block Grant funds.

# Information Systems

One of the fastest growing areas of activity at ARDC in the past few years has been the Information Systems section. The acquisition of a computer terminal in 1974 made a wealth of information available, and a great deal of time has been spent developing an "in-house" capability to collect and process data for use by the Commission staff and other government and private users.

Several of ARDC's Information Systems projects involve the area of human services and are outlined in the Human Resources section of this report. Others more closely related to land use planning and the storage and retrieval of general planning information, are described here.

One example of computer information which has proven to be invaluable to the planning process of many local units of government is the data collected by the Minnesota Land Manage-(MLMIS). InformationService This information has been developed to such an extent that computer maps can now be made of the entire Region which provide information on 25 different variables including land use, soils, forest cover, ownership, zoning, geology, roads and water. All or any combination of these variables can be mapped for each forty acre parcel of land, resulting in a wealth of information available for local land use planning puposes.

Utilization of this capability has made it possible for ARDC staff members to undertake the Arrowhead Perspectives project which is described in greater detail in the Land Use section of this report.

Passage of legislation in 1977 requiring a standard building permit application throughout the state was a step toward implementing another system useful to local planning efforts. That is the Land Use Permit Information System developed by ARDC to store data collected by county zoning officials from building and land use permit applications. It includes such information as geographic location, type of construction, cost and value of construction and zoning classification. ARDC will work with the Minnesota Department of Administration to develop plans to implement the system state-wide by maintaining current permit information and combining it

with data collected by MLMIS. This will allow ARDC to provide more complete reports to county officials throughout the Region.

In 1977 the Intergovernmental Information Systems Advisory Council (IISAC) provided funding for a detailed study of municipal financial requirements in the Region and the feasability of implementing a cost effective financial system in support of those functions. The study, including a survey of 22 Regional cities, was completed in 1978 with the publication of A Municipal Financial System Report and development of a batch General Ledger System which incorporates the State of Minnesota's recommended standard chart of accounts.

Discussions have been held between ARDC and various levels of local government, including the City of Duluth and Koochiching County, in an effort to determine how the General Ledger System can be implemented.

Many other sources of data are available to ARDC computer users including the Minnesota Analysis and Planning System (MAPS). From MAPS a user may obtain data already collected by the US Census, the Minnesota Department of Taxation, the Bureau of Economic Analysis, Department of Commerce, and the Department of Education, among others. Easily accessible information such as this is an important tool for local decision makers and ARDC encourages the use of its computer facilities by any interested local unit of government in the Region.

### Land Use

During 1978 ARDC's Land Resources and Transportation Advisory Committee (LRTAC) continued to provide a forum for the variety of matters concerning land use or related issues. A partial list of LRTAC activities throughout the year includes:

- -Development of a Comprehensive Regional Development Guide (CRDG)
- -Identification and prioritization of regionally significant outdoor recreation sites
- -Prioritization of LAWCON/State Natural Resources outdoor recreation project grant applications
- -Review and Prioritization of Land Use Planning Grant Applications
- -Coastal Zone Management
- -RARE II process
- -MN/DOT State Transportation plan


### -Iron Range Transit Plan -Solid Waste Plan Amendments

Chaired by Aitkin County Commissioner, Michael Zilverberg, LRTAC is made up of representatives of the Region's counties and municipalities; transportation, environmental quality, forestry and agricultural interests; zoning administrators and various public agencies.

#### LAND USE GUIDE

According to requirements of the Department of Housing and Urban Devel-opment, ARDC completed a Land Use Guide Plan in March of 1978. The Regional Land Use Guide identifies the mission, role and responsibilities of ARDC in resolving land use questions.

Specific sections of the Guide Plan identify the purpose and use of the document, goals and policies, problems and needs; and the objectives and implementation strategies. This last section of the document describes in detail what the Commission, through LRTAC, intends to accomplish; the objectives that address the priority needs and problems; and becomes the Commission's guide for utilization of staff and financial resources. Following a public review process the Regional Land Use Plan will be incorporated into ARDC's CRDG.



#### REGIONAL PERSPECTIVES

In other activities ARDC continued work on the Regional Perspectives project. This project was originally funded by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources and the State Planning Agency (SPA). The goal of the project is to acquaint and provide decision makers in each of the seven

counties of the Arrowhead with a resource profile of their county. These resource profiles contain approximately 20 different physical resource data elements such as soils, land use, forest cover, gravel deposits, peat deposits and relief. This is part of the computerized data base prepared by the Minnesota Land Management Information System (MLMIS) available through SPA. Introductory brochures which introduce the project and describe the process with a color example of one of the variables were produced in November 1978, and it is expected that the resource profiles should by completed by March of 1979.

ARDC's technical assistance efforts in 1977 continued, as in previous years, to provide help to the local units of government in various land use related issues. ARDC staff members attended numerous meetings to assist county and municipal planning commissions with their land use planning and implementation programs.

### HEALTH CODE COMPLIANCE

The Health Boards of Itasca and Cook Counties contracted with ARDC to assist in the development of Health Codes identifying two major areas of concern: Administration and inspection authority for Solid Waste; and on-site sewage systems. The results of these contracts proved very beneficial for each county involved. Both counties developed a better understanding of their role and responsibilities in the administration and enforcement of the codes. New staff has been hired in both counties to administer the Health Codes.

### VOYAGEUR PLANNING AREA

The ARDC has continued to provide technical assistance to the Communities of Island View, Ranier, Littlefork, Northome, Orr and Cook in the Voyageur Planning Area. All of these communities are finalizing local planning programs begun under the Sub-Regional Planning Program for the Voyageur Planning Area. The Cities of Cook, Orr, Ranier and Island View have adopted Zoning Ordinances to implement land plans. The Cities of Littlefork and Northome will be holding public hearings on Zoning Ordinances and are expected to adopt these implementation measures in the early part of 1979. Throughout 1978, ARDC has been assisting these communities in administering their ordinances and planning programs.

ARDC has also been providing Koochiching and St. Louis Counties with technical assistance for their planning programs in the Voyageur Planning Area. This has been addressed on an "as requested" basis by the respective counties.

#### KOOCHICHING COUNTY LAND USE GUIDE

The Koochiching County Land Use Guide Plan was prepared in 1978 at the request of the Koochiching County Board of Commissioners. The program was funded through the Land Use Planning Grant Program of SPA. It was prepared to address major development options for the Fringe Area of Koochiching County adjacent to International Falls, South International Falls and along the Highway 11 East corridor entrance to Voyageurs National Park.

The plan provides a detailed analysis of the area and is being utilized to guide future development. Guidelines for coordinating land use demands between Koochiching County and local municipalities were also devel-The plan identified public service improvements which will be necessary to meet future development as well as projected time schedules for accomodating these development needs. Moreover, specific recommendations for changes and additions to land use controls and implementation measures were also proposed.


The Koochiching County Board of Commissioners adopted the Plan in September of 1978. The process for implementing the Plan is now being developed.

PEAT STUDY

ARDC has continued to assist the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) in completing its Peat Study Program. Phase II of the Program was started during 1977-1978. The program is intended to provide an in-depth understanding of social, economic and environmental impacts of potential major developments of Minnesota's peat resources. The DNR is expected to provide a preliminary report of findings and recommendations to the 1979 session of the Minnesota Legislature. A more detailed report of the results of the Peat Study Program will be prepared in the summer of 1979.

ARDC has dual participation in the DNR Program. Chairman Nesbitt serves as ARDC's representative on the State Peat Advisory Committee. The committee assists the DNR in formulation and development of recommendations based on the information gathered from the various elements of the Peat Study Program. ARDC, under contract with the DNR, has also provided technical information to the socio-economic studies being under-taken as part of the Peat Study Work Program. The information is used as a basis for measuring the socio-economic impacts of a variety of potential peat developments which the DNR is evaluating.

The final results of the program will assist the Legislature in reviewing and amending, if necessary, current State Peat Development Policies. It will also provide information to the DNR which will be used to conduct further research to better evaluate peat development proposals and leasing requests.



With funding made available by SPA, ARDC and the East Range Land Use Advisory Board prepared a land use alternatives plan for communities of the Eastern Messabi Range. This is an adjunct to the Messabi Intergovernmental Project conducted by ARDC in 1977. The document prepared for Virginia, Eveleth, Gilbert, Mt. Iron and Fayal and Wouri townships represents a comprehensive informational tool to be used by local units of government as a guide for future land use decision making.

#### COMMUNITY PLANNING

In the early fall of 1978 the city of Chisholm contracted with ARDC to provide planning services for two specific problem areas affecting the city—1) Rerouting of Highway 169, and 2) Flooding problems associated with Longyear Creek. ARDC will be examining both of these "site specific" problems over a nine-month period and will prepare plans to address these land use issues. Since mid-September 1978, ARDC has met with the planning commission and city council, reviewed the planning process, completed an assessment of problems and issues, conducted public information meetings, prepared a draft goals and policies statement and completed preliminary resource inventory work.

Under contractural agreement, ARDC began assisting the City of Tower in developing a detailed comprehensive plan and Capital Improvements Program. Specifically, the planning program is to initiate a planning commission; identify land use constraints and conflicts and the city's priorities; develop an ordinance that includes zoning for shoreland and floodplains; and investigate disposal alternatives for 5,000 acres of city-owned land outside the municipal boundaries. The program will be completed in late 1979.

The City of Barnum, also contracted with ARDC to develop a comprehensive plan for that community. The planning process identifies community goals, policies and capital improvements goals, as well as land use alternatives. Specific issues discussed in the plan include: transportation, housing, population projections, open space and recreation. Zoning and subdivision ordinances were developed and adopted by the community.

These community planning projects were made possible by funds provided by the SPA under the Land Use Planning Grant Program.

## Water Quality

In 1972, with the passage of the Water Pollution Control Act Amendments, (Public Law 92-500), a national goal of restoring and maintaining the "chemical, physical and biological integrity of the nation's waters" was set. Since passage of the Amendments, planning for water pollution control has increased greatly nation-wide. Section 208 of the Law provides for state and area-wide planning which will result in water quality programs designed to help state and local officials make informed decisions and implement plans for water pollution control.

The law gave the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) responsibility for conducting and coordinating a statewide Water Quality Management Program. To achieve active citizen participation in the planning process, the MPCA has worked through each regional development commission to establish committees at the regional level.

An ARDC Regional Water Quality Management Planning Advisory Committee has been meeting since 1976. fourteen members on the committee, chaired by Loren Rutter of Kinney, represent numerous interests around the Region. The committee is responsible for providing recommendations on the control of "non-point" sources of water pollution in the Arrowhead Region and for coordinating local citizen participation in the "208" Program. ("Non-Point" pollution sources are those where waters wash off land or seep through soil into the ground water.)

During 1978 the Committee reviewed and developed comments on a series of MPCA documents on several non-point sources of pollution, including the following:

-Highway Snow and Ice Control Chemicals: Their Effect on Water Quality in Minnesota-Package I and II

-Urban Runoff-Package I
-Residual Wastes Package (dealt with "...solid, liquid, or sludge substances from man's activities in the urban, agricultural, industrial and mining environment remaining after collection and

necessary treatment of the wastes has taken place.")

The Committee also reviewed and commented on two other documents. They were "The Sources" Red-Rainy River Basin Committee's Subregional Plans for this river basin which is located in the northern reaches of the Arrowhead Region, and a Minnesota Water Planning Board report which prepared legislation to permit the formation and financing of districts in the state for Rural Water Supply Systems.

The Committee addressed many additional issues and will continue to function into 1979 when a Section 208 plan for all of Minnesota is scheduled for completion by the MPCA. It will also retain its role of advisor to the ARDC Board of Directors, the State Water Quality Task Force and the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency.

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## **Transportation**

In 1978 ARDC significantly expanded its transportation planning efforts. Areas of involvement included transit planning on the Iron Range, participation in the State Transportation Planning Process, and initiation of a regional transportation pilot program with the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MN/DOT).

The Iron Range Transit Planning Project, which began in December of 1977, was completed in the final quarter of 1978. This project and the final Iron Range Transit Plan were completed with the assistance of the Iron Range Transit Advisory Committee (IRTAC) chaired by St. Louis County Commissioner Ed Hoff and made up of individuals representing Iron Range communities, townships, transit operators and the general citizenry.

The year-long transit planning study, which was supported by grant funds from MN/DOT, was aimed at an intensive examination of needs and potential for new or expanded transit services on the Iron Range. In addition to documenting transit service needs in the area, the Transit Plan



also defined priorities for transit development and provided recommendations for implemention of transit services.

Major recommendations of the plan included the establishment of a general public awareness program, incentives to promote increased carpooling for work trips and development of vanpool demonstration projects on the Iron Range during 1979. In addition, the Plan provides for expansion of services for the elderly and handicapped, expansion of local bus services in Hibbing and Virginia and designation of an agency to more effectively coordinate transit services in the area and thereby improve allocation of existing transit resources.

Another major transportation project in which ARDC was involved in 1978 was continuation of the State Transportation Plan development process directed by MN/DOT. The mechanism for this involvement was ARDC's Transportation Advisory Task Force, comprised of individuals throughout the Region representing both public and private interests in all transportation modes. This Committee was chaired by Warren Youngdahl of Marcell.

The primary responsibilities of the Task Force included development of criteria for establishing priorities on Regional transportation projects and making numerous policy recommendations to MN/DOT for inclusion in the statewide Plan. The Task Force also provided input into the draft Plan and reviewed the final State Transporta-

tion Plan which was completed in July

of 1978.

Perhaps the most significant development in 1978 in the area of transportation planning occured in November with the application for grant funds from MN/DOT to conduct a nine-month regional transportation planning pilot program. This program is aimed at improving the tools for regional transportation planning and will enable development of a transportation plan for this region. More importantly, this pilot program will establish a framework for use of regional plans by MN/DOT and is intended to be transferable for use by other regions in the state.

ARDC is working closely with MN/DOT and the State Planning Agency on this planning project. The program is designed to include considerable public involvement and ARDC's Transportation Advisory Committee will also play an important role in providing guidance to the planning process.


### Recreation

The natural resource amenities of the Arrowhead Region have made the area a prime location for the promotion and development of varied recreational opportunities. During 1978, Northeastern Minnesota was faced with a number of controversial recreation land use and resource management issues. Examples included management of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area, Voyageurs National Park Master Planning, iventory and designation of wilderness areas under the RARE II program, State Park acquisition and development, the wild and scenic rivers programs, and other recreation concerns. Because of ARDC's role and responsibilities, the Commission addressed these issues from an area-wide planning perspective and worked to insure that sound recreation opportunities were not disregarded.

In addition to major recreation planning and management controversies, ARDC continued to play a role in the provision of the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LAWCON)/State Natural recreation grants, the Resources identification and prioritization of regionally significant outdoor recreation sites, participation in the State Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan development process and generally assisted local units of government with on-going recreation planning programs and the preparation of grant applications. Many of these activities are a continuation of efforts initiated in 1977.

Management of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area proved to be one of the most volatile resource use issues in the Arrowhead Region. Local, State and National implications were cited as the issue moved through the Congressional process. ARDC's involvement was largely to examine the con-cerns expressed, evaluate and discuss the long-range area-wide impacts and generate a policy position. Through the Commission's advisoru committee framework the BWCA and other major recreational issues were examined and policy recommendations prepared for the Board and Commission. In the final analysis, ARDC supported the multiple use bill of Congressman Oberstar and generally opposed direct state and federal intervention in local land resource planning.

## Metropolitan Planning



## Metropolitan Interstate Committee

The Metropolitan Interstate Committee (MIC) was created in July, 1975 as a committee of ARDC and the Northwest Regional Planning Commission (NWRPC) in Wisconsin. There are seventeen elected officials and representatives on MIC from Duluth-Superior area. The Minnesota area includes Hermantown, Proctor, and seven townships (Midway, Solway, Grand Lake, Canosia, Rice, Lakewood and Duluth) as well as the City of Duluth.

The Committee meets monthly focusing on land use and transportation issues of the Duluth-Superior Metropolitan Area. It directs the work of a staff of seven plus consul-

tants.

Key measures of MIC performance are:

-responsiveness to <u>key metropolitan</u> <u>issues</u>

-community involvement in its decisionmaking, and

-technical capabilities

-<u>effectiveness</u> in getting its proposals implemented and in maintaining area eligibility for state and federal funds.


### KEY METROPOLITAN ISSUES

During 1978 MIC was involved in many major metropolitan issues. Those issues and the MIC role in each are summarized below.

Harbor Square Regional Shopping Center-The issue is whether a new major shopping center should be located in downtown Duluth or in a suburban location in either Duluth or Hermantown. MIC developed a comprehensive technical analysis of the relative advantages and disadvantages of Harbor Square vs. the suburban locations.

<u>Duluth-Superior Harbor-Conflicting</u> interests--environment, development, shipping, recreation--in one of the top environmental areas of the Midwest and one of the nation's top ten seaports had to be addressed. MIC has prepared a detailed land use plan for the harbor area.

AMTRAK-Local, state and national officials wanted to know if passenger rail service should be continued. MIC gathered information for the decision



makers, helped develop a local policy on continued service and advised state and federal officials of the local position.

Suburban Development-The issue is how to respond to conflicting land use in suburban and semirural areas. This development has accounted for 40 percent of the net metro housing increase in past years. MIC has assisted area towns prepare and implement local comprehensive plans. A sixth such MIC assisted plan was adopted by the town of Rice Lake this year.

Arrowhead Bridge-Local officials wanted to develop support and lobbying necessary to obtain federal funding for the bridge replacement. MIC provided a continuing forum for discussing local support for the project and supplied basic information on the need for the new facility.

Transportation of the Elderly and Handicapped-There is a need for providing this service in a responsive yet cost effective manner. MIC prepared such a plan and took positions on federal regulations which guide service providers such as the Duluth Transit Authority (DTA).



### COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Community involvement in decision making at the metropolitan level, especially for long range programs, is a primary goal of MIC. In response to this challenge, MIC employs a range of techniques to make sure that its recommendations are based not only on technical evaluations but also on the knowledge and desires of the community.

Community Surveys-MIC utilizes a series survey to obtain input from a large number and cross section of community residents. Small sample surveys were used to determine transportation system management issues (800 households contacted) and shopping habits and preferences (1,200 households). A survey of 1,100 AMTRAK riders was conducted. Results of a community attitude survey were used in formulating the Comprehensive Plan adopted by Rice Lake Township.

Workshops—Several workshops were conducted as part of the Harbor Plan. The objective was to bring together various interest groups to discuss their differences. One addressed Water Recreation. Another concerned the draft Harbor Plan. Other workshops in 1978 were conducted on air quality and the Shopping Center Analysis report.

of the harbor plan was preceded by

public meetings in both Duluth and Superior with the plan commissions, port boards and city councils. The Elderly and Handicapped Transportation planning process involved numerous groups which include providers and users of these services. The process to review transit goals included meeting with over 30 civic groups. The Rice Lake Comprehensive Plan was developed with input from the Rice Lake Planning Commission and Town Board.

Board.
A key MIC goal was to work with citizen groups appointed by the cities and towns. The Duluth Transit Authority and local plan commissions are examples.

Public Meetings and Hearings—As they near completion, all MIC projects involving policy undergo meetings and hearings for a final opportunity for public comments. Wherever possible this process is conducted by the implementation agency involved. Rice Lake, for example, conducted the hearings on its Plan. The DTA conducted hearings on the MIC proposed route and schedule changes.

In addition to these techniques, the local news media is informed, at key points, of all MIC processes, meetings, etc. Newsletters of ARDC and NWRPC carry MIC stories to several thousand people, draft reports are distributed to affected groups and agencies.

The technical capability of MIC includes its staff of seven plus the other resources of ARDC and NWRPC. These are supplemented by contracting with university specialists and private consultants.

Transit planning is a continuing effort of MIC. The MIC transit planning effort has worked closely with DTA making significant improvements in the delivery of mass transportation services to the community.

One ongoing transit technical evaluation is that of AEROBUS, a high speed transit system which shows potential for this area.

Land use planning capabilities of MIC have led to successful completion of the Harbor Plan and six local Plans, the most recent being for Rice Lake.

Two years of field research were recently completed to give insight into the environmental importance of the harbor. This work was conducted by the University of Minnesota-Duluth and the University of Wisconsin-Superior. The results systematically document the fact that the harbor is one of the most significant wildlife areas in the Midwest. The results have enabled MIC to plan for enhancement of this attribute as well as for the economic, transportation and recreation demands on the harbor.



The <u>Duluth Regional Shopping Center Analysis</u> contains detailed market, fiscal impact, transportation, energy, public utilities and environmental analysis. For example, fiscal impacts of the alternative sites are projected for a period of 20 years for Duluth, Hermantown, St. Louis County and the State of Minnesota.

The capabilities of MIC are supplemented by the Harbor Technical Advisory Committee and the Transportation

Advisory Committee.

Cooperation between co-equal, independent units of government is often difficult because of varying interests. The state line bisecting the Duluth-Superior community makes cooperation especially difficult.

The MIC Harbor Plan is an excellent example of intercity and interstate cooperation. It has been endorsed by both cities, both ports and both re-

gional commissions.

AMTRAK is another example of local unanimity. Resolutions of support have come from both Duluth and Superior, St. Louis and Douglas Counties, ARDC and NWRPC.

The elderly and handicapped transportation planning process is an example of an even more ambitious attempt to obtain cooperation. If successful, it will eventually bring local government and private services into a coordinated delivery system. The potential reward is great: three times the service at no added cost.

times the service at no added cost.

The last measurement poses the biggest question. Can MIC be effective without major direct impelmentation power or authority? During 1978 a number of issues MIC has been involved in have moved toward reality.

-1978 DTA Routes and Schedules were implemeted largely as recommended by MIC. Cost Savings: \$100,000

per year.

-AMTRAK service has been extended through June 1979 and will eventually be added to the national system. Discussions of marketing and improved managements, which were early MIC recommendations, are underway.

-Rice Lake has adopted its Plan, a new zoning ordinance and a new

zoning map.

-Harbor Plan implementation began while the plan was in preparation with project planning, bird colony relocation, land aquisition for conservation and development, title searches on Hearding Island ownership, and negotiations with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to allow for inwater disposal of some dredge spoils.

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# WATER QUALITY MANAGEMENT PLANNING ADVISORY COMMITTEE

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# Project Notification

ARDC has served as the clearing-house for state and federal funding applications within the seven county Arrowhead Region since receiving that designation from the Governor of Minnesota in 1970. Designation of regional clearinghouses was required by Circular A-95 of the Federal Office of Management and Budget to facilitate the coordination of state, regional and local planning and development efforts. The clearinghouse designation requires and empowers ARDC to review and comment on project applications for federal grants and loans.

The Regional Development Act of 1969 gave ARDC the following responsibilities in addition to those established by Circular A-95:

- -review and comment on long-term comprehensive plans of local governmental units within the Region;
- -review and comment on plans of independent boards and commissions having multi-county or multi-community impacts, for conformance with regional plans and policies and
- -review and comment on applications for federal and state grants or loans made by governmental units, independent commissions, boards or agencies within the Region.

The procedure utilized by ARDC in

carrying out its review function is referred to as the Project Notification and Review System (PNRS).

Upon receipt of a project notification, ARDC contacts local units of government, agencies and individuals that may be affected by or interested in the project and requests their comments. After a reasonable period for response, ARDC provides a final review of the project. The project applicant is then responsible for sending the application, along with all comments, to the appropriate federal or state funding agency.

The PNRS procedure does not guarantee or deny the funding of a project. Rather, it provides the potential funding sources with an idea of the impact that the project may have within the Region.

Listed on the following pages are all proposed projects and plans received for review by ARDC in 1978. The list does not attempt to indicate which of the projects were eventually funded. Also, please note that most project applicants requested funding from more than one source (i.e. federal or state agency, local governmental unit or private sources). The primary sources are listed under "Agency Applying To."

A key to agency abbreviations and the total financial assistance requested from each funding agency in 1978 is shown at the end of the chronological listing of individual projects.

The Arrowhead Region has largely a natural resource based economy which relies on land, water, timber and minerals to maintain a viable economy and a good quality of life for its people.

In the past three decades there have been strong initiatives by the Federal and State governments to restrict or regulate the use of large portions of Northeastern Minnesota. With our economy based primarily on natural resources, it becomes increasingly important that ARDC vigorously monitor Federal and State land use actions that effect the development and conscientious use of those resources.

Currently, approximately half of the region is owned or controlled by the Federal or State governments. Decisions made at those levels have a significant impact not only on the economic stability of the region, but on the overall well being of the citizens of the area. Therefore, ARDC, consistent with its charge in the Regional Development Act, will exercise its responsibility in conducting and coordinating comprehensive land use planning in the Region. We shall expect Federal and State agencies to cooperate fully with ARDC to insure coordinated goal setting and policy development consistent with the best interests of the people in the region.

Arrowhead fully intends to exercise its responsibilities under Minnesota law through a commitment to broad participation by the public in all land use decisions. Further, Arrowhead will practice and promote a program of deliberate long term evaluation of project proposals that may have an imact on major land use issues.

ARDC will continue to encourage and foster an open decision making process that insures timely opportunity for all voices to be heard, with decisions openly arrived at through public debate.
