Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 79 and FY 80 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

279 licenses were granted during this biennium; 139 were at the Consulting Psychologist level and 140 were at the Psychologist level. Four examinations were held at which 306 persons were examined. 28 Licensed Psychologists were licensed as Licensed Consulting Psychologists with waiver of examination based on prior examination for the lower level of licensure. These candidates had met upper level requirements on the prior examination. Biennial licenses were renewed for 620 Consulting Psychologists and 231 Psychologists.

Public hearing was held on an amendment to Board rules on examinations. This amendment was adopted by Board action on October 6, 1979. Further work was done on revision of rules covering waivers, employment, collaboration and ethics. These are being scheduled for public hearing in the fall of 1980. Proposed rules on continuing education requirements for relicensure have undergone five revisions during this period.

Disciplinary activity has required considerable time - Board, administrative and legal. Licenses of two individuals were suspended indefinitely. One contested case required many informal conferences in addition to the formal hearing. Only one hearing on suspension of licenses based on non-payment of renewal fee was held. This has resulted in over 50 non-renewed licensees remaining on the Board listing of licensees.

> Activity has continued to increase during this biennium. Verification of licensure to insurance companies has tripled. We now average 30 such requests a week.

Verification of licensure to other states has increased slightly. During the past biennium 21 such requests have been handled.

Telephone requests from the public for information on the educational qualifications and competencies of licensees increased during this time. During early 1980 an average of 10 inquiries a week were received. Frequency had decreased to 2 or 3 a week by the end of the fiscal year.

The major increase in telephone inquiries has related to licensing requirements. Probably due to third party reimbursement for services, inquiries from degreed individuals in other human service occupations, i.e., social workers, psychiatric nurses, marriage & family counselors, has escalated to a current average of 15 such inquiries a week.
