Final Report to Legislature

Pursuant to our mandate under the merger of the State Planning Agency, Crime Control Planning Board, Minnesota Energy Agency and the Department of Economic Development to create the Minnesota Department of Energy, Planning and Development (DEPD), I am providing you with this material on the status of the merger.

As you are aware, the DEPD was established by the Legislature in July, 1981 and organized October 5, 1981. The merger is complete on March 1, 1982 with the incorporation of the Energy Agency into the department. Much of our early efforts were spent in creating effective organizational structure while reducing our staff by approximately 180 positions. This has been accomplished and work programs have been prepared that maximize the use of staff from all divisions to address key issues.

Since the October 5 organization, we have provided the legislature with our Work Program (September 1, 1981), Energy Policy Directions Report (December 7, 1981), and drafts of legislation to execute the recommendations contained in that report. Several bills that would implement the recommendations are progressing through the legislature at this time. I feel confident that the work that we will produce during this biennium will be very useful to the legislature and the citizens of this state.

Enclosed, for your information, is the current DEPD organizational chart, as well as tables identifying the number of state and federal positions and the amount of state and federal funds that are assigned to the department. The period of time that these tables cover are the state fiscal years of 1980 through 1983.

The organization of this new department has been a real challenge and I find that my executive group has provided excellent leadership to our staff in the implementation, and where necessary, modification of programs. In addition, the professional and clerical staff have shown a tremendous spirit of understanding and cooperation in these very difficult times. All employees of this department attest to the long tradition in Minnesota of dedicated public service.


