Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 81 and FY 82 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

FY81 The Board of Chiropractic Examiners exists under Chapter 148.01 - 148.10 to serve the public by qualifying licensed practitioners through state and national board examinations by written, oral and practical demonstration to prove their competency. Verification of character references, college transcripts and other credential are required from each candidate with application before examination.

To regulate qualified chiropractors in the State of Minnesota, minimum standards of proficiency are met by attending Board-approved continuing educational seminars annually before issuance of license renewal. Twenty hours of continuing education was required for 1980 license renewal which includes three hours of x-ray safety, or interpretation and/or pathology.

The Board informs the attorney general's office of all complaints implying violation of Chapter 148.01 - 148.10 and refer those not in the Board's jurisdiction of ethics or peer-review for further evaluation to the proper agency.

The Board requests from and provides other chiropractic boards with information concerning Board policy, procedures and status of licensee.

The Board informs chiropractic colleges of examination requirements and dates.

The Board informs state and federal agencies of all new licensees.

Approximately 111 examinations were given annually.

1048 renewal licenses were issued.

79 existing professional corporations were issued renewal certificates and 20 new professional corporations were certified.

In about 100 complaints by telephone, approximately 50 become formal complaints of which those under jurisdiction of the Board are investigated each year, with about 4 citations with possible revocation of license.

CONTINUING EDUCATION RULES: 7 MCAR S2.005 - B - Continuing Education:

(Adopted December 19, 1979)

In order to assure consumers of receiving optimum quality chiropractic health care, Minnesota-licensed chiropractors are required to accrue 20 hours of Board approved continuing education each year for license renewal. Three (3) of those hours must be in x-ray safety, interpretation or technique.

Licensees are exempt for the calendar year in which they were license. During the first calendar year following, they shall attend 10 hrs. (also including the 3 hrs. in x-ray) and 5 hrs. added each following year.

The Board may approve classes by A.C.A., I.C.A., C.C.A., any chiropractic college or state association and any organization who submits the required information to the Board not less than 90 days prior to the program date, according to the criteria listed in the rules.

For proof of attendance, licensee is required to submit before January 1, of each year the name, date and subject, name of sponsor, number of class hours attended and his name, signature and current address to the Board. Falsification of written evidence will be deemed as "unprofessional conduct." Failure to comply could result in revocation, suspension, conditioning, limiting of license, public reprimand, censure or probation.

Reinstatement conditions and deferrment possibilities are also listed in the rules.

The Proposed Rules were published in the July 23, 1979 State Register.

The Adoption of the Rules were published in the December 19, 1979 State Register.


