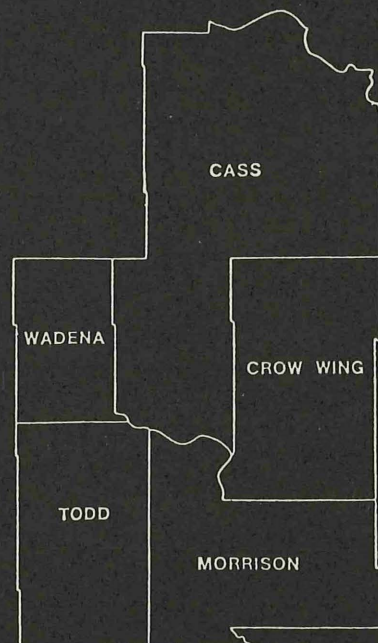

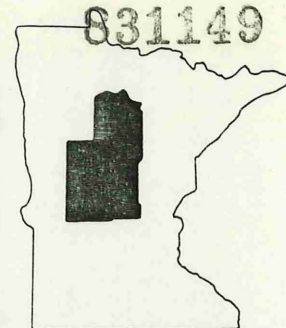

## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

July 1, 1983


Region 5 Regional Development Commission continues to fulfill an important function in addressing needs that cross existing local boundaries. Equally important is the fact that the Commission continues to encourage cooperation and communication between local units of government in addressing important issues.

During fiscal year beginning July 1, 1982 through June 30, 1983, the Commission has made some outstanding contributions for which we can be proud. In May of 1983 the Department of Energy, Planning and Development awarded 45 Community Development Block Grants totaling \$21,845,180. Six of these grants totaling \$2,842,800, or 13%, were awarded to projects within Region 5. Region 5 Staff wrote two of the following applications and provided varying degrees of technical assistance on the remaining four.

## AREA AGENCY ON AGING

The programs of the Region 5 Area Agency on Aging are administered by the Region 5 Regional Development Commission, which is designated as the planning and service area by the Minnesota Board on Aging. The Region 5 Advisory Committee on Aging acts in an advisory capacity to the Area Agency on Aging. The Advisory Committee recommends action on grant applications, plans, and other program activities. During fiscal year 1983, over \$500,000 was granted for the provision of supportive and nutrition services. A listing of services projected for calendar year 1983 is seen below.

Several new activities were concluded during the year. These included the first annual conference entitled, "Be In Charge of Your Own Future", and the development of a detailed Policies and Procedures Manual for administering the programs of the Region 5 Area Agency. Two new programs were also established: an Adult Day Care Project in Crow Wing County, and an Adult Respite Project in Wadena County. The Adult Day Care Project allows for day care outside of an elderly person's home, while the Respite Project allows time off for the elderly person's caregiver. Both projects are designed to keep elderly person in their own home for as long as possible.

In keeping with the Area Plan of the Region 5 Area Agency on Aging, additional nutrition sites were established in Pequot Lakes, Pillager, and two in Wadena. Currently, there are twenty-two nutrition sites within Region 5. During fiscal year 1984, a new three-year Area Plan on Aging will be written to guide the activities of the Region 5 Area Agency on Aging during 1984, 1985, and 1986.





## FIVE WINGS ARTS

The Region 5 Arts Program awarded \$18,450 of grant funds which were received from the State Legislature for the development of arts activities in the Region. In addition, \$4,000 of McKnight Foundation funds were used for capacity building of local arts organizations. The organizations which received state funds during FY83 were:

The Region 5 Arts Program gathers input and advice from the Five Wings Arts Council. The Five Wings Arts Council reviews all applications for both state and private foundation funds, then recommends to the Commission those projects and funding levels which should be funded. The Five Wings Arts Council also assists the Region 5 Arts Program staff in the planning and implementation of special programs and workshops designed to improve the capacity of local arts groups.

The Region 5 Arts Program will have approximately \$15,000 of state funds for granting to local arts groups in fiscal year 1984. Some McKnight Foundation money will also be available.

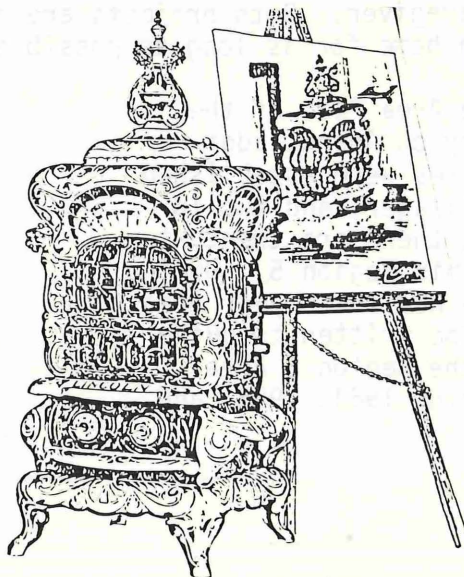

## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

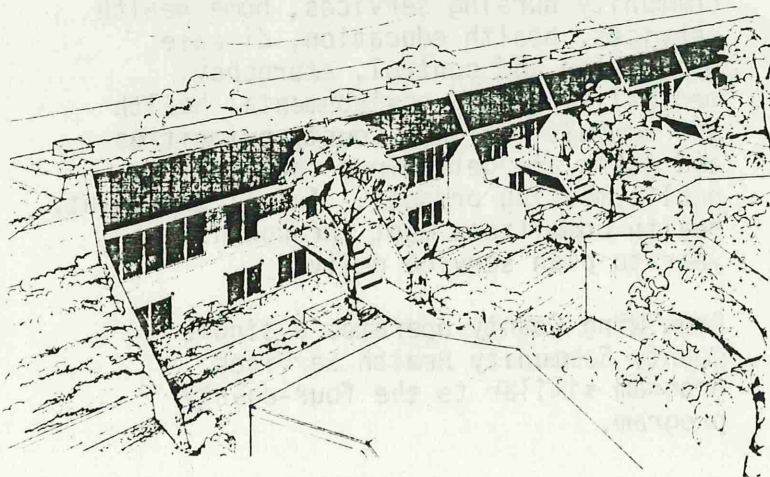
The Commission has continued to place a high priority on providing technical assistance to local units of government. Assistance has been provided to local units in the areas of planning, zoning, subdivision and capital improvements programming. In addition, during the past year Region 5 has initiated a fire mapping program. A list of all current technical assistance projects and their status is shown on the opposite page.

The Community Development Advisory Committee (CDAC) has been active during the past year updating the housing, land use, and overall Economic Development Plan with the Outdoor Recreation Grants Program. Next year, the committee will be active updating the Community Development Investment Strategy.

Several units of government were assisted with the preparation of the Community Development Block Grant applications. Region 5 staff prepared applications for Shingobee Township in Cass County, Morrison County, Todd County and the City of Ironton in Crow Wing County.

The Todd and Morrison County applications were successful and each county was awarded \$300,000 for energy improvements and housing rehabilitation for low and moderate income residents.

The money will be used to provide grants or loans to low and moderate income residents to make necessary improvements. The program is designed to reduce the number of substandard houses in the county and to reduce substandard housing among low and moderate income persons. The grants are being administered by Todd-Morrison Housing and Redevelopment Authority.





## DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

Developmental Disabilities are handicapping conditions which have an onset before the age of twenty-two, which are life-long in duration and which interfere with normal day-to-day activities and employment. Common disabilities include mental retardation, cerebral palsy, epilepsy, autism and accident or disease related handicaps. It is estimated that about 2.75 percent of the population, or about 4,000 people in Region 5, are developmentally disabled.

Depending on the particular disability, the disabled person can face a confusing array of services. During a lifetime, a typical developmentally disabled person may receive special services from their local school system; county social service and health departments; state departments of health, public welfare and vocational rehabilitation and from Federal programs such as Social Security and Legal Services. Special programs also exist for particular groups such as the sight and hearing impaired, the non-ambulatory, the mentally retarded and so forth.

With such a variety of services and agencies, it is not unusual for the disabled person or the parent of a disabled person to feel confused about where to start seeking assistance. Similarly, service providers may feel the need to make connections with other providers in order to make referrals and to prevent wasteful duplication of services. It is the role of the Region 5 Developmental Disabilities Advisory Committee and staff to provide information, promote coordination and cooperation, identify gaps and overlaps in services and to offer technical assistance with new problems and to develop new services. The Region 5 Developmental Disabilities Program helps to unify what otherwise can be a rather fragmented system of services.

During 1983, the Region 5 Developmental Disabilities Program answered approximately 120 requests for technical assistance, which ranged from research on census information to writing bylaws for an organization for the handicapped. Special areas of effort included development of a Products and Services Catalog for regional developmental achievement centers, organizational assistance to parent support groups, publication of a highly successful regional newsletter (DD RESOURCES), proposal development and grant writing and regional coordination of Social Security eligibility appeals.

## COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES

The Cass-Todd-Wadena-Morrison Community Health Services Board Contracts with Region 5 for administrative services to the four-county program. Region 5 provides secretarial services to the Board of Health, Executive Committee, Advisory Committee and Administrative Task Force; compiles the four-county fiscal reports, budget revisions; and provides technical assistance to county public health directors upon request.

The Community Health Services program is funded by the Minnesota Department of Health. Annual plans are submitted to request funds for the following areas: community nursing services, home health services, health education, disease prevention and control, emergency medical services, environmental health and administration. County priorities and goals are determined through the public meeting process. Individual county health committees meet throughout the year to plan service delivery.

Crow Wing County operates a single county Community Health Services program similar to the four-county program.

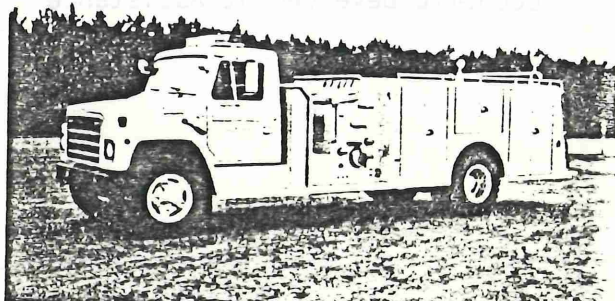

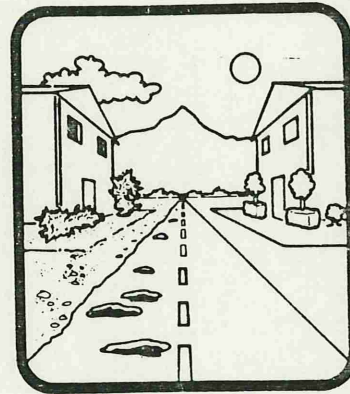




## TRANSPORTATION PLANNING

The Commission, through its Transportation Advisory Committee (TAC), has continued to monitor State and Federal Transportation programs and legislation of regional significance. The Commission has also participated in efforts to improve the major highway transportation links in Region 5.

The Region 5 Transportation Plan was reviewed by the TAC and found to be up to date. An evaluation of the Mn/DOT Regional Development Commission Planning Program was completed. The results indicate that the cooperative planning effort of Mn/DOT, Region 5 Commission and staff, and TAC is currently in place and working efficiently. Regional Transportation planning is essential to both Mn/DOT and the region. Regional transportation planning is part of a process that involves many factors, however, the benefits to the counties are easily identified. Benefits to Mn/DOT will depend on the level of support they can supply for a continued coordinated effort.



### ROAD INCONSISTENCY STUDY

A special study was completed by a consultant under the watchful supervision of the TAC. The study recommends methods for solving problems created by inconsistent road signage, load limits, and road and bridge characteristics which currently exist on the County State Aid Highways (CSAH) and County roads within Region 5. The study has the potential to enhance the safety of transportation and the movement of commodities and people.

CLEARINGHOUSE  
REVIEW



The Region 5 Regional Development Commission in 1975 was designated by the Governor of Minnesota as the "clearinghouse" for the five-county area of Central Minnesota. Regional clearinghouses are required by the Federal Office of Management and Budget under Circular A-95, and are set up to facilitate the coordination of state, regional and local planning and development efforts. As a clearinghouse, the Commission is empowered to review and comment on local project applications requesting federal and state grants and loans.

*The A-95 review process was developed to:*

- a) encourage the coordination of state and federally funded and assisted programs with local and area-wide plans and programs;
- b) eliminate duplication and inefficiencies in proposals;
- c) provide an opportunity to local persons/agencies to review and comment on proposals before they are funded.

*In addition to the authority granted the Commission under Circular A-95, the Commission is also granted the following powers under the Regional Development Act of 1969:*

- a) review and comment on long-term comprehensive plans for local governmental units within the Region;
- b) review and comment on plans of independent boards and commissions having multi-county or multi-community impacts, for conformance with regional plans and policies;
- c) review and comment on applications for federal and state grants or loans made by governmental units, independent commissions, boards or agencies within the region by governmental units, independent commissions, boards or agencies within the region.

Upon receipt of a project notification, the Commission contacts local units of government, agencies and individuals that may be affected by or interested in the project, and requests their comments. Once these comments are received the Commission provides a final review of the project. The project applicant is then responsible for sending the application, along with all comments to the potential federal or state funding agency.

The Regional Clearinghouse Review procedure does not guarantee or deny the funding of a project; rather it provides the potential funding sources with an idea of the impact that the project may have within the region.
