Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 85 and FY 86 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

In both FY 85 and FY 86 the trend of increasing numbers of complaints, begun in the previous biennium, continued unabated. It became clear that the Board's goal of promoting public awareness of the rights of consumers of psychological services was becoming realized.

Several factors contributed to the increase in numbers of complaints: the Board's Rules of Conduct, adopted in FY 83, require licensees to report other licensees to the Board in certain cases and to publicize the client bill of rights their own areas of competence; the work of the Sex Exploitation Task Force, which resulted in needed legislation; and hearings on the issue of sexual exploitation of clients held by legislative committees.

The significantly larger number of complaints resulted in a heavy work load for Board members serving on Ethics Panels, the Executive Director, and the Attorney General's staff. Every effort was made to ensure disciplinary action in cases which were jurisdictional and substantive.

The biennium also saw a large increase in the number of persons sitting for the objective examination. Also, the ever increasing number of licensees made the renewal process more time-consuming. The work-load became sufficiently burdensome to request a half-time clerk-typist, a position which was filled on an emergency basis in December, 1985, and with a permanent employee in March, 1986.

The Board began massive overhaul of portions of its rules, particularly the Rules of Conduct, education requirements, and test procedures, and in May, 1986, changed its cut score on the objective examination from 60% to 70%, all in an effort to ensure that the public is served by adequately trained and ethical practitioners.

Several Board members participated in committees and task forces in Minnesota directed toward improving mental health care and ethical practice, while others participated in national forums directed toward improving regulatory boards' performance.

Early in calendar 1985 the health-related licensure boards had to seek new quarters because of the Health Department's need for more space for its staff complement. On January 4, 1986, the boards moved to their present location in a renovated older building. The move, of course, resulted in higher rent, moving costs, etc., which in turn resulted in an LAC request to increase the budget accordingly, and fees were raised to cover the added costs.

Clause f: Brief summary of Board Rules Proposed or Adopted During
THIS REPORTING PERIOD, FY 85 AND FY 86. GIVE APPROPRIATE
CITATIONS TO THE STATE REGISTER AND PUBLISHED RULES FOR
THOSE ADOPTED.

On April 12, 1985, the Board of Psychology adopted a new rule, Rule pt. 7200.1700, which excluded certain majors from being accepted as "majors in psychology". The rule part was published in Vol.9, #46, pp 2474-2475, May 13, 1986, of the State Register. Following notice of final adoption of the rule part in the State Register, Vol. 10, #8, p. 477, August 19, 1985, the rule part became effective September 1, 1985.

The rule part reads as follows:

7200.1700 DEGREE MAJORS IN OTHER PROFESSIONS. A degree major in any profession listed in Minnesota Statutes, section 148.97, subdivision 3, is not a major in psychology as defined in parts 7200.1300, item C and 7200.1400, item C. This provision applies to applications for admission to examination received after September 1, 1985.

Minn. Stat. S 148.97, subd. 3 reads as follows:

Subd. 3. (1) Nothing in Laws 1973, Chapter 685 shall be construed to limit the professional pursuits consistent with their training and code of ethics of professions such as teachers in recognized public and private schools, clergymen, physiciana, social workers, alcohol or drug counselors, or optometrists or attorneys. However, in such performance any title used must be in accord with section 148.96.

Due to the health-related licensing boards being forced to relocate away from the Health Department Building, a budget increase request was necessitated to cover the cost of moving, increased rent, etc. A fee increase was adopted on November 8, 1985, published in the State Register, Vol. 10, #14, pp 752-753, September 30, 1985. Notice of the final adoption of the fee increase appeared in the State Register, Vol. 10, #23, p. 1266, December 2, 1985. The fees became effective December 7, 1985.

Fees were increased as follows:

Examination application: from \$100 to \$115. Licensure Application: from \$ 75 to \$125. Licensure Renewal: from \$110 to \$150.

Explanation of NOT LIC column on preceding pages:

Because of the change in procedures resulting from the Rules adopted in August, 1982, applicants may sit for the objective examination immediately after obtaining the degree upon which licensure is to be based. As a result, for many applicants it will be two tears or more after sitting for the objective examination before they have completed the required two years of full-time (or equivalent part-time) employment and may then apply for licensure.

The column marked "NOT LIC" represents applicants who have not yet applied for licensure as well as those who have failed the examination. In other words, it includes all applicants who have not TO DATE completed the licensure application procedure.

Licensure data pertaining to applicants examined in FY 83 and FY 84 has been included in this report, updated to include those who were licensed prior to 6/30/86, in order to give a more complete picture of what is happening in the licensure process. The figures for those fiscal years can be compared with the figures submitted in the preceding report.

A separate table indicates the overall fail numbers and licensure numbers for each fiscal year since the Board was created.

On an informal basis, the health-related licensing boards exchange information regarding the disciplinary function of the boards. On a formal basis, the attorneys in the Health Law Division of the Attorney General's office coordinate their efforts and the investigative process when more than one board licenses the individual who is the subject of investigation. Currently the Psychology Board and the Medical Examiners Board are cooperating regarding serious charges against an individual.

The Board of Psychology also has a policy of working closely with the Human Services Department when the allegations involve medical assistance irregularities or claims for reimbursement for services outside the practitioner's competence.

The Board of Psychology regularly forwards results of disciplinary action to the American Association of State Psychology Boards, which in turn disseminates the information to all other state boards. When the disciplinary action results from extremely serious unethical conduct, the other state psychology boards are notified directly.


