INTRODUCTION

Minnesota requests an annual inventory of county social service agencies' substitute and adoptive care caseloads to obtain counts of children at a point in time (usually December 31) and unduplicated counts of children served during the report period (usually the calendar year). This information is used to fulfill both federal and state reporting requirements.

This report and the corresponding executive summary were prepared to meet the state reporting requirements under Minnesota Statutes 257.071 and 257.355 for calendar year 1986. The federal report requested by Public Law 96-272, section 427 was prepared and submitted to the American Public Welfare Association (APWA) as Minnesota's substitute & adoptive care portion of the Voluntary and Cooperative Information System (VCIS) in September 1987.

DEFINITIONS

ADOPTIVE CARE: Adoptive care includes finalized adoptions, children in non-final adoptive homes, adoption placements, adoption disruptions and adoption subsidies. Of these finalized adoptions and children in non-final adoptive homes are subsets of substitute care children leaving care and in care at the report period end respectively.

FOSTER CARE: Foster care is the subset of substitute care children with the living arrangement of foster family home.

REPORT PERIOD: The report period for this report is calendar year 1986.

SUBSTITUTE CARE: Substitute care includes children entering 24 hour care, children leaving 24 hour care and children in 24 hour care at the end of the report period.

SPECIAL NEEDS: Include older age child, minority heritage child and sibling groups to be placed together as well as child disability.

SUBSTITUTE CARE CASELOAD: Either the sum of children carried over from the prior year plus children entering care during the year OR the sum of children in care at the end of the year plus children leaving care during the year. Any difference in these two sums indicates an error in data.

WAITING CHILDREN: Substitute care children free for adoption, with a goal of adoption who have not yet been placed in an adoptive home.

WHITE/OTHER: When the race breakdown includes White/Other this count has been generated by subtracting children reported on the separate Black and Indian inventories from children reported on the total inventory. This includes children with race unknown as well as Asian and Hispanic children who are not Black. Otherwise "White" is Caucasian non Hispanic children and "Other race" is other non white children.

SUBSTITUTE AND ADOPTIVE CARE CASELOADS - 1986

Indian children in care were distributed through out more of Minnesota than Black children. Of the 85 counties that submitted inventories 59 had one or more Indian children in care at some time during the year compared to 30 with one or more Black children. More than 9 out of 10 black children in care (92.4%) were in the seven metro counties compared to less than half the Indian children (46.9%).

Only 13% of retarded children in care at sometime during the year entered care during the year, while over half of other children entered care during the year. Only 22% of retarded children in care at sometime during the year left care during the year while 49% to 55% of other children left care during the year.

The median age for the 1986 substitute care year end caseload was 14+ years. Median ages for selected subgroups are listed below from oldest to youngest without regard to race or disability.

Black or Indian children were almost always younger than white/other* children. Among all the groups for which median age was calculated Black children with finalized adoptions were the youngest at just 9 months. Among all the groups for which median age was calculate MR children leaving care during 1986 were the oldest at 18 years 3 months. Retarded children were usually older than NON retarded children. * (See definition page v.)

Days in care per child increased with age regardless of race or disability. Among children with age known the highest number of days in care per child occurred among retarded children age 12 and older. At each age the highest days in care per child was reported for retarded children for both children in care 12/31/86 and children leaving care in 1986. At every age level and even for age unknown Black children averaged the least days per child leaving care in 1986. Among children in care 12/31/86 the least days in care per child varied by race and disability.

CHILDREN ENTERING SUBSTITUTE CARE DURING - 1986



The most frequently reported reason for entering care in 1986 for retarded children was child conduct/condition at 65%. Protection was next most frequent at 23%.








More MR children aged out (46%) than left care for any other reason. Reunification was the primary reason other children left care. Only 28% of retarded children were reunified. Indian children leaving substitute care in 1986 were most likely to be reunified while retarded children were least likely to be reunified.


All Black and Indian children with adoptions finalized reported for 1986 were under age 12 while 12% of the White/other children with adoption finalizations reported were age 12 or older. Black children with adoption finalizations reported for 1986 were even younger than Indian children with adoption finalizations reported for 1986. Children awaiting adoption placement were older than children with adoptions finalized.

Black under age 5 . . . finalized - 91% . . . waiting - 17% Indian under age 5 . . finalized - 40% . . . waiting - 15%

None of the Black and Indian children with adoption finalizations reported for 1986 had 1 or more special needs compared to over half the White/other children (53%).



CHILDREN IN SUBSTITUTE CARE 12/31/86

Reunification was the goal for only 19% of MR children in care 12/31/86 compared to more than 6 out of 10 other children. Reunification was the goal for more than 7 out of 10 Indian children in care 12/31/86 compared to 55% of Black children and 54% of White/other children.

Long term care was the goal for over half of retarded children compared to about 2 out of 10 other children.

While three fourths of Indian children in care 12/31/86 were under court order only 65% or 64% of Black and White/other children were under court order. Only 3 out of 10 MR children in care 12/31/86 were there by court order compared to 7 out of 10 children who were not MR.

Court ordered placement is the most frequent legal status except for mentally retarded children.




Looking at percents of children for whom living arrangement was known on these inventories differences in percents in foster family homes begin to appear. Looking at percents of days in care these differences become clearer. Black and Indian children in care 12/31/86 had a larger share of days of care in foster family homes than White/other children. MR children accounted for less than half of days of care in foster family homes while Non MR children accounted for two thirds.



For all living arrangements retarded children had the highest days in care per child. Black children averaged the least days in care per child in non-final adoptive homes, group homes and emergency shelters. NON retarded children averaged the least days in care per child in foster family homes and unknown living arrangements. Indian children averaged the least days in care per child in child care facilities (institutions) and other living arrangements. White/other children never averaged the highest or lowest days in care per child.

Among children in care 12/31/86 child conduct/condition was the reason for substitute care placement for almost twice as large a proportion of retarded children as total children. Child conduct/condition was the reason for placement for comparatively few Black and Indian children. This data is quite complete with reason for placement not reported for less than two percent of children in care 12/31/86.











MR CHILDREN WAITING LONGEST OF CHILDREN WAITING ON 12/31/86







GENERAL COMMENTS

- 1. Two counties (Douglas & Fillmore did not submit any inventories for 1986.
- Fillmore, however submitted the report <u>Minority Children in Foster Family Homes only by Race of the Foster Parent(s)</u>.

 Several counties with minority children in their caseloads submitted inventories, but did not submit the separate report <u>Minority Children in Foster Family Homes only by Race</u> of the Foster Parent(s).
- Race and/or disability data in the total inventory does not always exactly match corresponding information in one or more of the separate inventories (Black, Indian, or Retarded). Some counties with children in one or more of these categories on the total inventory did not submit the required separate inventories. Rarely, but sometimes, counties may submit a separate inventory even though they have no children in the corresponding category on the total inventory.
- 4. Some information is not reported by all counties. The computer system (CSIS) that serves most of Minnesota's 87 counties has not yet been programmed to retrieve this information, although the data is collected at each county. Such items were reported by at most only the 19 Minnesota counties not using CSIS.
- Special needs include older age child, minority race child, and sibling group to be placed together as well as child disability, however at the CSIS counties and possibly some non-CSIS counties as well as special needs status is a separate "Yes/No" question. This results in some children with one or more disabilities having no special needs.

GENERAL COMMENTS REGARDING SUBSTITUTE CARE DATA IN THE ANNUAL SUBSTITUTE AND ADOPTIVE CARE REPORT

1. Only county data is included although some licensed private child caring/child placing agencies and some Indian agencies provide comparable services in Minnesota.

GENERAL COMMENTS REGARDING ADOPTION DATA IN THE ANNUAL SUBSTITUTE AND ADOPTIVE CARE REPORT

- While only county data is included in this report other State reports and the State Agency adoption subsystem include adoption information from the licensed private child caring/child placing agencies which provide adoption services in Minnesota. This results in substantially lower counts, especially for adoptions of <u>foreign born</u> children.
- 2. Adoption data in this report excludes stepparent adoptions Note: Stepparent adoptions represent a large portion of total adoptions in Minnesota.
- Adoption data in this report excludes any other adoptions taking place without prior substitute care at the reporting county. Note: Because adoptive home non-finalized is a reported substitute care living arrangement this difference may be minimal. Because the instruction to count only adoptions of prior substitute care children may be interpreted as "omit children in non-final adoptive homes if there was no prior substitute care", it is most likely that relative adoptions are undercounted in this report.
- 4. Because data for this report is generated from the sum of aggregate data from the counties rather than a child specific state wide information system for substitute care, both under and over counts are possible:
 - * Over counting when children move from substitute or adoptive care in one county to another.
 - * Under counting, especially for adoptions when substitute care is in a different county from final adoption.
 - * Under counting for adoptions when substitute care results in a private agency adoption placement.
- County specific data in this report may also differ from the adoption subsystem data because the State adoption subsystem identifies several agencies involved with each adoption while the substitute and adoptive care reporting subsystem identifies only one.
- Racial data (i.e. counts by race and separate inventories for Black and Indian children) may differ from the adoption subsystem data because the State adoption subsystem identifies up to four races per child while the substitute and adoptive care reporting subsystem identifies only one.
- 7. Because data from this report and the new State adoption subsystem data have not been compared systematically, the magnitude and in some instances the direction of these differences is unknown. Other major or minor differences are also possible.

METHODOLOGY

DATA FOR THIS REPORT CAME PRIMARILY FROM TWO SOURCES:

CSIS counties submitted data diskettes with the required aggregate data to Computer Systems Support. These diskettes were combined by Computer Systems Support into four inventory files which were transmitted to Minnesota Department of Administration InterTech Division. Data in the resulting mainframe files was copied to tape, edited, sorted and combined into SAS data sets via TSO (time sharing option) by DHS Social Service Division, Research and Planning staff.

Non-CSIS counties submitted up to four 20 page paper reports. Date from these reports was entered on key disk tapes for submission to the main frame at Department of Administration InterTech Division. Data was copied to tape, edited, and manipulated for combination with CSIS data via TSO by DHS Social Service Division, Research and Planning staff.

The merged data was stored in SAS data sets and used to create several reports including county specific data kept on file in DHS Social Service Division, Research and Planning. The mainframe data was downloaded to DHS personal computers creating LOTUS print and work files to create this and related reports.

All 87 counties were requested to submit two additional paper reports. Both reports were loaded into Dbase files on Social Service Research and Planning personal computers.

- 1. SPECIAL RACE REPORT: Race and Relationship data is summarized in this report. Race data is much more complete than relationship data. Throughout this report and the Executive Summary, 1986 inventory data and the special report data especially regarding race are compare.
- 2. COST REPORT: County costs to produce the Annual Report and to maintain the data (whether automated or manual) used to produce these annual reports was reported by many counties. The cost data was used in preparing estimates of costs to enhance the substitute and adoptive care reporting system, and in preparing some fiscal notes for the Legislature. This cost data does not appear in the Executive Summary or the Annual State Report.

LACK OF CONSISTENCY IN DISABILITY IS ILLUSTRATED BY THE FOLLOWING:

Negative counts for not retarded are enclosed in () where ever they occur. For these few counts the count of children from the inventory of retarded children reported to be retarded exceeds the number of children reported to be retarded on the total inventory.

All counts where less than 100% of children on the inventory of retarded children are shown have the disability of mental retardation.

All other counts where the number of children reported to have the disability of mental retardation differs from the corresponding count of children from the inventory of retarded children. Note: More counts differ than match.

ADOPTION COUNTS INCONSISTENCY IS ILLUSTRATED BY THE FOLLOWING:

Counts of children leaving care due to adoption finalization do not match separate counts of adoption finalizations.

Counts of children in care 12/31/86 with a living arrangement of Non-final adoptive home do not match separate counts of children in Non-final adoptive homes 12/31/86. These do agree more often the finalization counts above.

Adoption subsidy counts are much lower than those kept in the State Office. Other adoptive care counts also do not match state adoption counts. Adoption counts in this report are based on county of financial responsibility and are reported only by the 87 Minnesota counties. The adoption subsystem counts are reported by private agencies as well as public and even include non-agency placements and petitions. Until the Substitute and Adoptive Care Report includes at least one of the agencies (placing agency, supervising agency, county of location) reported in the adoption subsystem or until the adoption subsystem includes county of financial responsibility the differences cannot be fully explained.
