Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover both FY 87 and FY 88 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

In this biennium the trend of increasing numbers of compliants, begun in the FY 83-84 biennium, continued unabated. It became clear that the Board's goal of promoting public awareness of the rights of consumers of psychological services, implemented by the rules adopted in 1982, has become realized. The number of written, jurisdictional complaints received by the Board in this biennium was 189, an increase of 67 over the FY 85-86 biennium.

This large number of complaints resulted in a heavy work load for Board members serving on ethics panels, the Executive Director, and the Attorney General's staff. Every effort was made to ensure disciplinary action in cases which were jurisdictional and substantive.

The heavy load of complaints, coupled with a steadily increasing number of applications to sit for examination, necessitated the addition of a full-time, Clerk-Typist III to the staff, primarily to assist in complaint processing and management of finances. The staff numbers three in addition to the Director, one of whom is half-time. The increase in operating costs which resulted from adding to the staff, coupled with higher Attorney General's costs due to the heavier complaint load, required the Board to raise exam, licensure, renewal, and late renewal fees. These became effective on July 1, 1988.

The Board began a massive overhaul of portions of its rules, particularly in the areas of Rules of Conduct, education requirements, and test procedures. The final draft of the proposed rules was not completed until after June 30, 1988, and will, therefore, be included in the next biennial report. In May, 1986, the Board raised the passing score on the objective part of the examination from 60% to 70% in an effort to ensure that the public is served by practitioners with an adequate theoretical foundation in psychology.

Several Board members participated in national forums directed toward improving regulatory boards' performance in their role of protecting the public from unethical and unprofessional conduct.

THOSE ADOPTED.

Fee Increase

On January 8, 1988, the Board of Psychology passed a resolution to adopt fee increases without a public hearing. The proposed fee increases were published in the State Register on April 11, 1988, Vol. 12, Number 41, page 2250. A copy of the fee rule as proposed is shown below.

Rule as Proposed

7200.6100 FEES.

Fees for licensure of psychologists are as follows:

- A. The fee for application for admission to examination is \$115 \$150.
- B. The fee for application for licensure is \$125 \$170.
- C. The fee for renewal of license is \$150 \$170.
- D. The fee for late renewal of license is \$75 \$150.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This rule is effective July 1, 1988.

On May 13, 1988, the Board passed a resolution adopting the rule amendment which provided fee increases. The adopted rule notice was published in the State Register on June 27, 1988, Vol. 12, Number 52, page 2789, and became effective July 1, 1988.

The Board was also ready to propose substantive amendments to the rules, affecting education requirements, supervised employment, termination for non-payment of renewal fees, and the Rules of Conduct. However, difficulty in preparing the Statement of Need and Reasonableness in time for publishing with the fee amendment delayed the process, and the motion proposing the rule amendments was not made until after the end of FY 1988. Details of this proposal will be included in the next biennial report.

Explanation of PASSED/NOT PASSED Columns on preceding pages:

Because of the change in procedures resulting from the Rules adopted in August, 1982, applicants may sit for the objective examination immediately after obtaining the degree upon which licensure is to be based. As a result, for many applicants it will be two years or more after sitting for the examination before they have completed the required two years of full-time (or equivalent part-time) employment and may then apply for licensure.

As a result, the LIC/REGIS and NOT LIC/REGIS columns become essentially meaningless. What is important is data on how many will be eligible for licensure because of having passed the objective examination. Consequently, LIC/REGIS has been changed to PASSED and NOT LIC/REGIS has been changed to NOT PASSED. Any applicant who has passed the objective part of the examination is eligible for licensure as soon as employment requirements have been met.

A separate table indicates the overall pass/fail and licensure numbers for each fiscal year since the Board was created.

On an informal basis, the health-related licensing boards exchange information regarding the disciplinary function of the boards. On a formal basis, the attorneys in the Health Law Division of the Attorney General's office coordinate their efforts and the investigative process when more than one board licenses the individual who is the subject of investigation. Currently the Psychology Board and the Medical Examiners Board are cooperating regarding serious charges against an individual.

The Board of Psychology also has a policy of working closely with the Human Services Department when the allegations involve medical assistance irregularities or claims for reimbursement for services outside the practitioner's competence.

The Board of Psychology regularly forwards results of disciplinary action to the American Association of State Psychology Boards, which in turn disseminates the information to all other state boards. When the disciplinary action results from extremely serious unethical conduct, the other state psychology boards are notified directly.

Other information which may be of use in reviewing the Board's activities is a summary of numbers of persons licensed in each fiscal year since the Board was created, together with the numbers of persons whose licensure status changed through death, suspension, termination, or licensure at another level. This table is attached, as is the table showing distribution of psychologists in the various economic development regions.

Approximately 170 licensees live outside of Minnesota. Presumably each has either licensure or certification in the state of residence.

The Board does not keep a record of certifications of Minnesota licensure to other states.


