I believe you will find that my experience on governance boards, in University of Minnesota student activities and as a professional educator have prepared me well for the position of Student Regent of the University of Minnesota. Throughout my adult life I have been active in many governance boards and activities. As an undergraduate at the University of Minnesota I served as Chair, or on the Executive committee, of many boards including the Minnesota Union Coordinating Board, the College of Agriculture Student Board, Agricultural Ambassadors, and the St. Paul Student Center Board of Governors. As a graduate student I have been involved in the Minnesota Student Association and as Student Representative to the Board of Regents. Outside of my activities as a student I have been involved in numerous activities such as Secretary of the Minnesota International Four-H Youth Exchange Alumni Association.

Of all my experiences, the one that has provided me the most personal insight into governance occurred during my tenure as Chair of the St. Paul Student Center Board of Governors. That year a constitutional crisis arose due to an administrative restructuring proposal. Because the constitution of the Student Center Board had been approved by the Board of Regents, the Student Center Board and I challenged University Administration to find a solution that would achieve what they wanted yet not violate the constitution of the Student Center Board. For eight months I interacted with the President, several Vice Presidents and Deans, Regents and chairs of many student groups to bring the issue to resolution. As a result of those efforts, an all twin cities campus task force was appointed. I supported the administrative proposal to address the problem via a task force by participating as a member of that group. This experience taught me the value and true meaning of public and representative governance.

Because of these and other experiences I have had with the University of Minnesota, I believe you will find that I am able to understand many perspectives on the difficult and complex issues that face the University as a whole currently. I have lived and worked in rural Minnesota with the University's Minnesota Extension Service as a County Extension Agent near two of the coordinate campuses and have visited the other campuses; I have lived, worked, and attended the University in the twin cities; and I have had an opportunity to become involved with the current issues that face the University through my involvement as Student Representative to the Board of Regents and in the Minnesota Student Association. These experiences have given me not only an understanding of the issue facing the whole University, but they have also given me an appreciation of the role that each of the campuses plays in its' respective region of the State.

In addition to my experiences with the University of Minnesota, I have had a number of other experiences that I believe qualify me to be Student Regent of the University of Minnesota. The most significant of those experiences is the opportunity I had to live in another part of the world for eight months. I was the United States International Four-H Youth Exchange Delegate to New Zealand form September, 1986 to April, 1987. This international experience helped me develop the ability to understand and value many perspectives on an issue and it reinforced my belief that education is the key to solving many of the world's problems.

My experiences with governing boards, University of Minnesota student activities and professional experience has fostered in me not only a deep respect and love for the University, but also a sense of great hope for the future of the institution. I am familiar with the responsibilities of the Regents first hand and believe I am prepared to meet the expectations of the Regent Candidate Advisory Council, the University of Minnesota and the citizens of the State of Minnesota. I would like very much to put my skills to work for the people of 11.XI.88 Minnesota as a Regent of the University of Minnesota.



I believe there are three areas which allow me to express my qualifications for Student Regent: my motivation, my experiences, and my leadership.

First and foremost, I wish to be a Student Regent because I wish to serve the students and the University of Minnesota. When I came to the University three years ago, one of my goals was to be an active member in the University community. This thought came from my belief that all people should return at least a little bit to the community in which they live. Thus, I do not see the Student Regent position as a stepping stone to other positions, rather as a chance to give something back to the University.

Second, my experiences at the University have given me the background I need to be a good Student Regent. For the past three years, from Secretary of the Minneapolis Freshman Council, to Coordinator of the University Course Information Project, to Chair of the Student Representatives to the Board of Regents, I have shown my abilities to represent students effectively without losing sight of the whole University. I have represented increasingly larger groups, from freshmen on the Minneapolis campus, to all the students throughout the entire University system. In the past year, as Chair of the Student Representatives, I have tried my best to represent the many views of students. At times this has been hard, but I believe that the students, Regents, and administrators from the different campuses who are involved in governance, will say I have been fair and effective.

As Chair, I have had a chance to observe and watch the Regents interact within the state. From these observations, I have drawn my own conclusions about the role of a Regent. I believe there are two statements which should typify any Regent: personal integrity and reflective leadership.

Personal integrity means trust and credibility. As a Student Regent, having personal integrity leads to trust and credibility among the students. Trust and credibility is earned by actively listening, talking, and relating to students. I have actively worked this year to increase the communication between the student representatives and the student body, and between the student body and the decision makers. With the help of the other student representatives, we have been effective in re-establishing the credibility of the student representatives in the eyes of the University community; The student representatives have gone from a group whose future was questionable to being a group that is an integral part of the interaction between Regents and administrators.

Reflective leadership is leading by example, out of one's values and beliefs, and, at the same time, being just in one's decisions. Reflection is more than weighing a decision; it is carefully thinking through ideas on the long and short range effects of any idea. Reflective leadership is not just telling someone what to do; it is also helping them do it. An example of how I have acted out of reflective leadership is as subchair of the Student Service Fee Committee. As subchair, I deal with one of the three main groupings of student-funded programs at the Twin Cities Campus. One of the main areas with which I work is the three student centers. The subcommittee reviews the budgets of the student programs and allocates money accordingly. For the past two years, I have worked with the student centers to improve their budget system and increase their responsibility for fulfilling student needs. My style of leadership has not been to tell the centers how to budget or do it for them, but to show them how to master the process themselves. Again, I have not accomplished these changes alone; I have worked with other students and administrators to produce better services for students.

Lastly, underlying these beliefs in personal integrity and reflective leadership, is a desire to improve the student experience throughout the entire University system. I am deeply committed to improving both in and out of classroom experiences in the Minnesota higher education system.

Because all of the experience gained in the governance process has been with Not-for-Profit and governamental agencies, serving as a Regent would be an extension of that experience. For eight years, fourteen citizens from around the United States, selected from sixty-four nominations, served as a peer Review Panel to assess the Nuclear Waste Isolation Policy of the Department of Energy. The panel was charged with the responsibility of reviewing the policy to guarantee that the public interests and needs were met. The panel served in this capacity for eight years until the site was chosen for the nation's first Nuclear repository.

At the community level, governance skills were utilized to make fair, important allocations of United Way Funds, often in short supply and needs in greater numbers than resources. These skills were called upon when serving on the Allocation Panel of the Fund.

At the international level, governance skills, tact, and diplomacy were essential in dealing with issues that affect large numbers of people, especially women and girls. For ten years these skills were utilized in a project, sponsored by the United States Department of State and the American Association of University Women, which brought ten women African educators each year to the United States for advanced study. As Chair of the Educational Foundation Program Committee of the American Association of University, these skills were especially useful when awards were made annually to approximately thirty-five women from countries around the world; the foundation continues to exert a world leadership role in women's education.

Present activities include serving on the Board of Directors of Virginia Gildersleeve International Fund for Women, a program designed primarily to assist women and children in the developing world.

The experiences gained from governance responsibilities at the community, state, national, and international levels should be excellent preparation for serving as a Regent of the University of Minnesota, a university that serves well the citizens of Minnesota and has played a leadership role in preparing others for leadership roles at the national and international levels. A notable example of this leadership role is illustrated by Dr. Norman Borlaug, a former faculty member at the University of Minnesota, who won the Nobel Prize in 1970 for his pioneering work in increasing world food supplies.

A demonstrated interest in the University of Minnesota and higher education combined with decades of experience as a member of the governing boards of several corporations, educational institutions and not-for-profit organizations have equipped me with skills and an understanding of educational governance that I think could be particularly helpful for the University of Minnesota's Board of Regents at this point in the institution's history.

As the attached record shows, I have been primarily involved in research and development throughout my entire career at 3M, with an eight-year term of business management to give me experience in that area as well. As is true in most major corporations, management of research and development requires association with institutions of higher learning. This occurs through the process of recruiting people for the corporation from those institutions and also being involved with the research programs in the institutions which are of interest to the corporation. In a company as diverse as 3M, this has required contact with people in all kinds of engineering, all of the sciences and business management in institutions worldwide, including the historically black engineering schools. Since 3M spends nearly 25% of its research and development budget outside the United States, I have had the opportunity to initiate visits with universities throughout Europe, Canada and Japan. Through those associations, I feel I have gained a good perspective of the needs of universities with respect to finding a proper balance between teaching, research and service to the community.

A university's service to the community has been most recently quantified as its ability to transfer technology to the community. Technology, in its broadest sense, includes engineering, science, business know how, agriculture, medical knowledge and a whole host of other areas. Since 45% of 3M business is outside the United States, the company has a wide knowledge of how to transfer technology and know how to its operating subsidiaries outside the United States. My experience with 3M has given me a broad background by providing the opportunity to run a profitable and growing business and through the administration of the 16th largest research and development budget in the U.S.

I have earnestly considered the importance of a Regent's position for the University of Minnesota and how my experience might mesh with the criteria established. My most valuable contribution would be the practical knowledge and know-how harvested from my cumulative, diverse and multi-level leadership activities in public service.

I consider my career to be that of a volunteer activist and the following history indicates patterns of my involvement and growth.

My fifteen years of public affairs participation were sparked by a challenge from two University sociology professors in an outstate forum and began when I organized a small group study of the power structure of my community, using the academic model they recommended.

Later, I was elected Mayor of Olivia three times. In addition to some local government appointments, I had experience from ten years of more traditional volunteer work and leadership in arts, educational and human services organizations. To develop the broader perspectives, connections and information base needed to realize the potential of my new job and to enhance mayoral skills, I aligned myself with related county, regional, state and national organizations. A number of these working memberships expanded into board/officer positions, the most visible of which was President of the Minnesota Mayors Association in 1982. After six years, I chose not to seek reelection so I could make a bid for County Commissioner, where I was defeated.

At this point I began focusing on the University in an advisory capacity to the Minnesota Extension Service, which I continue to do in a variety of roles. This increases my awareness of exciting potential for University outreach to all parts of the state. A 1985 appointment by then Vice-President Richard Sauer, enables me to serve as a Minnesota representative to the Council for Agricultural Research, Extension and Teaching (CARET). It is a citizen arm of the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC). In this capacity I have lobbied yearly for federal funding for the University of Minnesota.

I believe the most important experiences, learned skills and qualities I would transfer to the Board of Regents are:

- * Seasoned in doing business publicly and doing public business, with an acute awareness of how this differs from private business/boards
- * A clear operating understanding of board responsibilities for making policy, how this differs from administration/management responsibilities and the quagmires generated by either rubber-stamping or interference
- * Competence in governance with numerous participants, skill in decision making and problem solving with others, and mindful of the dynamics and challenge created by conflicting agendas
- * A political but non-partisan approach: experience with being lobbied and lobbying on local, state and federal levels
- * University of Minnesota consumer and contributor viewpoints; familiarity with the Land Grant (outreach) philosophy and system, in Minnesota and nationally.
- * A rural grass-roots, but non-parochial, orientation; broad understanding of the agricultural/rural economy, lifestyles and values and their relationship to Minnesota's metro-trends
- * Base experience as an independent, small town business person
- * Multi-disciplinary range of experiences and interests
- * A positive, supportive but questioning method of operation
- * A practical visionary perspective
- * Proven ability to learn the parameters, subtities and substance of a new position/organization and to develop expanded and appropriate support networks
- * An adequate, flexible time schedule, good health and stamina as required to make the necessary commitment. I would be willing to furnish more information upon request and have asked co-workers (both staff and board members) to critique my board performance in direct letters to you.

I perceive my experience, willingness and enthusiasm as a fair tuition for a newly stimulating and challenging level of education, which Regent duties would become for me.

A. PERSONAL

Appointment as a Regent of the University of Minnesota would give me the opportunity to repay to the University and to the State an enormous debt I owe to each of them. This State and this University have long been models for the nation.

My ten years as a college president in Minnesota and my fifteen years spent as a foundation executive in Minnesota have, I believe, made me sensitive to the legitimate expectations of the University's several constituencies (faculty, students, alumni, benefactors, the taxpayers of the state, and the general public) and to how these expectations can be equitably balanced.

B. PROFESSIONAL/EXPERIENTIAL

My seven year term on the board of the Minnesota Community College system, and two years as its chairman, gave me valuable experience in the working of a publicly accountable statewide board and with the delicate task of balancing the different interests of 18 separate faculties, student bodies and regional expectations. This experience of a collegial style of administration would be, I believe, invaluable for me as a Regent.

C. COMMITMENT

At the founding of this nation Thomas Jefferson reminded our citzenry that the American experiment in democratic self-governance would fail, unless it were based on a firm foundation of high quality education for every citizen to whom the franchise of voting is given. My adult life, as a college professor, college president, attorney, and foundation executive, has been committed to the premise that education of our citizenry is the bedrock of our pluralistic democratic system of governance.

In my view the University of Minnesota is the keystone of the educational system, both public and private, of this entire state. Our University is an engine which supplies energy to the entire network of schools, colleges, and universities across the state.

The health, prestige and effectiveness of the University depend on the level of trust and mutual respect which prevails among its Regents, administration, faculty, students, and the general public. I am firmly committed to doing all in my power to build and to maintain these bonds of mutual trust, respect and cooperation.

The common good of the State of Minnesota and of the University's several constituencies transcends the separate and discrete concerns of all lesser entities within the state. If chosen to serve on the Board of Regents I would pledge my best efforts to be a conscientious and energetic member of the Board and to focus my energy and attention on the agenda and objectives determined by the consensus of the entire Board. I have no personal or private commitment which would in any way compete with my total dedication to serving the best interests of the University and of the State of Minnesota.

My qualifications as candidate for the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota rest on academic and professional credentials, professional experience, and the pattern of associations and interests that I have built, particularly during my seven-year tenure at the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis--first as director of research for that institution and currently as president of the Bank. I would also add that there are striking similarities between some of the challenges confronted by the Federal Reserve System and those faced by the University of Minnesota.

Subsequent to my graduate education, I have remained involved in education and scholarship as an adjunct faculty member at several major universities, and have worked with academics in the development of research programs and in the application of research to public policy issues. As president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Minneapolis, I am charged with responsibility for articulating the Federal Reserve System's objectives to diverse constituencies with conflicting interests in a six-state region; the need for the Fed to carry out its responsibilities without deference to special interests or political priorities goes to the fundamental purpose of the central bank.

Since becoming president of the Bank, I serve as chief executive of a \$37 million dollar business that provides services to financial institutions; participate as a policymaker in formulating the Federal Reserve's national monetary policy; oversee the efficient operation of a complex physical plant with highly technical data processing and communication systems; act as the principal regulator of Ninth District state member banks and the District's bank holding companies; and serve as a spokesperson for Fed policies and actions in this District.

The Federal Reserve System's relationship with Congress is analogous to the University's relationship with the Legislature. The independence of both the Federal Reserve and the University is critical to their ability to meet the purposes intended by their creators. Nonetheless, both institutions must have a strong commitment to public accountability and responsibility if they are to be worthy of the public trust they hold. For the managers of both institutions, this independence—with—accountability places the highest priority on effective expense management and strategic allocation of resources. The Federal Reserve, also like the University, is a collegial institution. Decisions are most often reached through a consensus building process wherein active, articulate debate and good faith respect for the final outcome are critical to achievement of broad objectives serving multiple constituencies.
