A. GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

The Minnesota Board of Chiropractic Examiners (MBCE) continues to be located at 2700 University Avenue West - Suite 20, St. Paul, MN 55114

On February 12, 1990, Joel B. Wulff, DC, was established the Executive Director of the MBCE. Restructuring has resulted in the establishment of five positions at the agency. The staff structure is as indicated in the following chart:



The MBCE is continuing to impose its efficiency through implementation of computerized data storage and processing. The new computer will replace Central Licensing services by the date Central Licensing services cease to be available.

A new law was drafted and presented to the Legislature and signed on May 8, 1990. This law regulates chiropractors providing Independent Medical Examinations of chiropractic patients.

The MBCE is to ensure qualified and competent Doctors of Chiropractic practicing in Minnesota. In order to meet this objective, the MBCE's activities also involve: testing applicants for licensure; licensing applicants who meet all requirements; renewing registration of existing licensees; processing complaints; approving programs for continuing education; registering professional corporations; and peer review. 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Ligense Renewal Fee Increase: Raise the annual license renewal fee to \$150 from \$100. (Effective September 10, 1990)

Adjustive Definitions: Defines what the chiropractic adjustment is and who is qualified to perform it.

Acupuncture Registration: Set standards and guidelines for chiropractors utilizing acupuncture in their practices.

Automatic Termination of License upon Failure to Renew: Elimination of a formal hearing to remove the license of a licensee who has failed to notify the Board of discontinuation of practice.

"Free" Services Advertising: Set requirements and patients' rights when free services are offered by chiropractors.

Board Fees: Set all Board fees in rule to maintain consistency.

Graduate Preceptorship Program: Internship program for graduates of chiropractic colleges who are awaiting the licensure examination. This program will allow interns to utilize what they have learned in college and help facilitate their ability to pass the licensing examination.

Inactive License Status: Inactive status would allow a chiropractor to remain current in licensure status by paying a lower license renewal fee; however, inactive status means that the chiropractor cannot practice in Minnesota until the license has been reinstated to a full license.

Independent Medical Examiners' Registration: Because of legislation passed during the 1990 session, the Board must register "IME's" who are performing independent medical examinations under MS 65B. Therefore, the Board is proposing rules to register the chiropractors who would be doing these examinations.

Nonstandard Methods Permitted: Set guidelines for chiropractors who are using nonstandard methods of practice.

Rehabilitave Services: Clarifying when rehabilitative services can be performed in relation to when a chiropractic adjustment is rendered.

Sexual Abuse Recognition Continuing Education: Continuing education requirement to learn all aspects of recognizing, reporting, and preventing abuse.
