Simultaneously, the approval of the three professional nursing programs operated by the colleges in the consortium was terminated due to voluntary closure of the three individual programs.

Five surveys of professional and practical nursing programs were completed during FY 89 and seven during FY 90 for the purpose of determining compliance with administrative rules.

3. NURSING ASSISTANT ACTIVITIES

The Board has implemented portions of Public Law 100-203 (called OBRA '87) pertaining to nursing assistant training, competency evaluation programs and a registry of nursing assistants who work in long term care facilities. Authorization for these activities is provided under contract with the

Minnesota Department of Health and Minnesota Statutes section 144A.61. As a result, the Board has established curriculum standards, standards for the competency evaluation program, training program standards, and Train-the-Trainer standards.

During FY 89 and 90 two nursing assistant curricula and 44 training programs were approved. The training programs are located in the following settings:

4. PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING

The Minnesota Department of Health transferred to the Board the records of 10,013 registered nurses who had been granted public health certificates. The Board of Nursing began registering public health nurses in February, 1990 using the same procedures previously used by the Department of Health.

From February 1, 1990 to June 30, 1990, the Board registered 155 public health nurses.

- e. Reason for Disposition: Seriousness of the nurse's behavior and her inability to establish and maintain personal and professional boundaries.

- a. Allegation: A female licensed practical nurse employed by a temporary staff agency sent a letter with "sexual implications" to the 13 year old brother of a home care patient.
- b. Investigation: Nurse admitted inappropriate behavior towards brother of patient and inability to maintain personal and professional boundaries.

- d. Disposition: Written warning to the nurse.
- e. Reason for Disposition: Nurse received therapy and moved out-of-state.

 - a. Allegation: A male registered nurse performed fellatio on a hospitalized male patient and on another occasion inappropriately touched a male patient in the genital area with his hands and a stethoscope.
 - b. Investigation was inconclusive. Nurse denied inappropriate touching of patients.

 - d. Disposition: Written warning to the nurse.
 - e. Reason for Disposition: Insufficient evidence that inappropriate behavior actually occurred.

- 12.a. Allegation: A male registered nurse gave a female hospitalized patient a "total body rubdown." In addition, he allegedly gave a backrub and foot massage to another female patient who was not assigned to his care.
 - b. Investigation substantiated the allegations.
 - c. Board activities: Board Review Panel.
 - d. Disposition: Consent Order of Reprimand and Conditional License.
 - e. Reason for Disposition: The seriousness of the allegations and the nurse's lack of knowledge regarding personal and professional boundaries.
- 13.a. Allegation: A female hospitalized patient claimed that a male registered nurse sexually assaulted her.
 - b. Investigation did not substantiate the allegations.
 - c. Board activities: Review of written response from the nurse and other information.
 - d. Disposition: Case dismissed.
 - e. Reason for Disposition: Allegation determined to be false.
- 14.a. Allegation: A female registered nurse engaged in a personal relationship with a male psychiatric patient hospitalized for chemical dependency treatment and married him three months after the patient's discharge.
 - b. Investigation substantiated the allegations.
 - c. Board activities: Investigation; Board Review Panel.
 - d. Disposition: Consent Order of Conditional License.
 - e. Reason for Disposition: The nature of the allegations and the nurse's inability to recognize appropriate personal and professional boundaries.
