Minnesota Goard of Chiropractic Examiners

COST OF PREPARING THIS REPORT

According to the Laws of 1994, Chapter 559, Section 1 (adding a new statutory section, *Minnesota Statute* 3.197), costs incurred in the preparation of this report must be reported. The Minnesota Board of Chiropractic Examiners (MBCE) estimates the cost of preparing this report to be \$333.

GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

The Minnesota Board of Chiropractic Examiners (MBCE) exists to protect the public's interest through the regulation of chiropractic. Regulation is accomplished through licensure of chiropractors and investigations of complaints against them.

The MBCE administers a licensure examination twice yearly. Prior to being allowed to take the licensure examination, applicants must fulfill requirements put forth in statute and rule. All portions of the examination must be passed by a minimum score of 75% in order for an applicant to be licensed.

The MBCE monitors licensed chiropractors' practice ability by the requirement of continuing professional education for license renewal. Doctors of chiropractic must obtain this education from sponsors approved by the MBCE.

The MBCE investigates consumer complaints. The MBCE currently has three complaint panels comprised of the executive director and two board members each. These panels share the responsibility of reviewing, and when warranted, investigating all written complaints received. If a panel determines that action against a license should be taken, the panel makes that recommendation to the full board.

The MBCE promulgates rules. *Minnesota Statutes* 148.08 empowers the MBCE with the authority to "promulgate rules necessary to administer sections 148.01 to 148.105 to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public, including rules governing the practice of chiropractic and defining any terms ..." The MBCE follows rulemaking procedures as established by the Office of the Attorney General and the Office of Administrative Hearings.

The MBCE registers licensed chiropractors who have formed a professional corporation, perform independent examinations, and/or perform acupuncture.

The MBCE conducts a graduate preceptorship program. This program which allows an intern to practice chiropractic under the direct supervision of a licensed chiropractic physician for one twelve-month period. The program was designed to allow graduates of chiropractic colleges to continue practicing while waiting to take and receive results from the licensing examination.

A seven-member Peer Review Committee appointed by the executive director exists to review cases for determination of whether or not the chiropractor properly utilized services, the chiropractor rendered or ordered appropriate treatment, and the cost of the treatment was unconscionable.

RULES SUMMARY

Recordkeeping - Due to a recurrence of complaints to the MBCE, rules were proposed and adopted establishing minimal recordkeeping standards for doctors of chiropractic. State Register, Monday 21 September 1992, page 597, (proposed)

State Register, Monday, 4 January 1993, page 1711 (adopted)

Testimonial advertising - Conditions under which a doctor of chiropractic may use testimonials in advertising were proposed and adopted.

License renewal penalty fee - The penalty fee assessed licensed doctors of chiropractic who renewed their licenses late was increased from \$10/month to \$150/month. The substantial change was made because the MBCE was experiencing a growing trend of licensees undeterred by the \$10/month penalty and renewing past the deadline.

Change of name and address - A 30 day notification period for a change of name or address by a licensed doctor of chiropractic was proposed and adopted.

Fees - Fees for the late renewal of a corporation, updating an address after the 30 day requirement, and computer lists and labels of licensed doctors of chiropractic were proposed and adopted.

Continuing education - 1) Continuing education requirements for licensed doctors of chiropractic were extended from a 1-year reporting period to a 2-year reporting period.

2) Sponsors of continuing education programs may now apply for sponsorship which would require them to review the programs they offer in order to determine that those programs meet the criteria listed in MBCE rules. Sponsors are responsible for reporting to the MBCE on a timely basis. Criteria for sponsorship revocation was also established. 3) Doctors of chiropractic who develop and teach a program meeting MBCE criteria may receive license renewal continuing education credit.

Infection control continuing education requirements - The MBCE, in conjunction with four other health related licensing boards, proposed and adopted continuing education requirements specifically in the area of bloodborne pathogens infection control.

License renewal and application fees - The MBCE proposed and adopted rules which raised the license renewal and application fees. Steadily increasing attorney general's costs demanded an increase in MBCE revenues.

Advertising free services - Current rules regulating the advertisment of free or discounted services were amended in order to address a recurring complaint filed with the chiropractic board. Patients were being enticed into obtaining care from a doctor of chiropractic due to an advertisement of free or discounted service. However, once in the doctor's office the patient would discover the service advertised was of no benefit to them without another service or services which would be provided only for a fee.

RULES SUMMARY (Cont'd)

Advertising - In order to prevent doctors of chiropractors from misleading the public by "playing down' their credentials in advertisements, a rule was proposed requiring all advertisements to contain the word "chiropractor" or "chiropractic".

Professional designations - Doctors of chiropractic would be required to identify themselves as doctors of chiropractic, chiropractors, D.C.s, or chiropractic physicians.

Examination deadline and retaking examination - Current rules would be amended to more clearly identify the examination deadline and procedures for retaking the examination in the event of a failing score.

Fees - The name of an existing fee was amended from "independent medical examination annual renewal fee" to "independent examination annual renewal fee".

Reports to Board - Attendance reports from continuing education sponsors must be submitted to the board within 21 days, as opposed to a previously required 14 days.

Inactive Retired License - Conditions under which an inactive retired license would not be granted were added to the already existing language. Previously the conditions were listed by reference to another rule, all of which did not pertain to the inactive retired license status.

Voluntarily Retired License - New language establishing in rule an already recognized license status was developed. Doctors of chiropractic have always been allowed to voluntarily retire their licenses without the status established in rule. A difficulty arose when one of those doctors of chiropractic wanted to reinstate their license. No provisions are available. The board finds itself "reinventing the wheel" each time a request for reinstatement is made. The lack of requirements set in rule allows for inconsistency in decision-making.

Preceptorship Training Program - An existing program allowing graduates of chiropractic colleges to practice under a licensed chiropractor was extended from 9 to 12 months. State Register, Monday 31 January 1994, page 1773, (proposed)

DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS TAKEN

There were eight (8) disciplinary actions taken in fiscal year 93. Those actions were:

two (2) probations for unprofessional conduct probation for a scope of practice violation suspension for non-payment of child support two (2) stipulations for recordkeeping violations probation for a felony conviction probation for chemical dependency

There were seven (7) disciplinary actions taken in fiscal year 94. Those actions were:

suspension for chemical dependency four (4) probations for practicing without a license suspension for providing false information to an insurance company reprimand for aiding in unlicensed practice

On August 1, 1993, new legislation went into effect which made public corrective action agreements entered into by a regulatory board and a licensee. Sixteen (16) corrective action agreements have been entered into since that time. Those corrective actions included violations in the areas of:
