PREFACE

The "1995 Municipal State Aid Needs Report" is presented to the Municipal Screening Board for use in making their annual money needs recommendation to the Commissioner of Transportation.

This submittal is required by Mn. Statute 162.13 Sub .3 and is to be made to the commissioner on or before November 1 of each year for his determination.

The money needs data contained in this publication has been compiled from reporting submitted by each individual municipality.

Design is established by State Aid Standards based on traffic, and the money needs are calculated using the unit prices as determined by the Municipal Screening Board at their spring meeting in June, 1995.

The estimated Population data is combined with the Commissioner's final money needs and the result will be used to determine the 1996 allocation which will be reported in the "1996 Municipal State Aid Apportionment Data" to be published in January, 1996.

The 1995 Spring Meeting of the Municipal Screening Board was called to order by Chairman Dave Sonnenberg at 1:10 p.m., Tuesday, June 13, 1995, at Ruttger's Sugar Bay Lodge, Grand Rapids, Minnesota. Chairman Sonnenberg introduced Vice-Chairman Dale Swanson of Willmar; Secretary Brian Bachmeier of Oakdale; Manager of Municipal State Aids Needs Unit Ken Straus, and Director of the Division of State Aid, Pat Murphy.

E. PROCESS DESCRIPTION

Ken Larson described the progress of the morning Municipal Planning Session. He then introduced the Facilitator, Mr. Terry Lemke. Discussion centered on revisiting the following:

Mission ➤ Adjustments
Visions ➤ Adjustments
Communication strategy
Education strategy

As well, it was decided the early planning meetings would continue as part of the Screening Board. Mr. Lemke indicated he would provide a summary to Mr. Kannankutty, and suggested the three-ring binders be updated annually.

F. MINUTES

The October 25, 1994 Fall Meeting of the Municipal State Aid Screening Committee minutes were submitted for approval.

Motion by Larry Anderson, seconded by R. Kannankutty. Motion approved unanimously.

II REVIEW OF MUNICIPAL SCREENING BOARD DATA BOOKLET

- A. <u>Minutes of the Needs Study Subcommittee</u> Sid Williamson, Chairman of the Needs Study Subcommittee, reviewed the minutes and indicated Ken Straus will be reviewing the items discussed at their committee meeting.
- B. <u>Unit Price Study and Recommendation</u>: Members had no questions regarding unit prices.

C. Other Topics:

Ken Straus put forth four (4) issues for discussion:

Bond Account Adjustment:

- 1) A City requires additional projects to cover overhead costs. Generally, the overhead costs are included in the amount that State Aid projects have to be applied against resulting in a direct cost to the City.
- 2) Extending principal payments over a longer period, increases the City's bond account adjustment and needs.
 - A) Complete needs are lost on segments when the project is let without a tie to the principal payment schedule.
 - B) Adjustment is made based on the principal payments that do not have a direct affect on needs.

The committee discussed the possibility of implementing a uniform annual ten percent (10%) reduction for a ten (10) year period and the removal of overhead that projects have to be applied against. Dave Halter questioned why the bond account adjustment is done. Ken indicated that needs are lost sooner when a City uses bonding. It may have made more sense to have a bond account adjustment prior to the 1990 apportionment when a City constructed a roadway, needs were lost forever. Whereas, now full needs are reinstated after twenty (20) years.

Dave Sonnenberg summarized by stating there should be support for reimbursement of bonding costs, as well as support for a 10% bond adjustment over a ten (10) year period.

<u>Combination Routes</u> - The State Aid Division is asking that a moratorium be put on combination routes.

The committee discussed the reasons for the deletion of these routes. Pat Murphy explained that the Counties used to get needs for only the center 24 feet on urban sections. Now they can receive needs for the full width. A joint designation is a relic of the old system.

Motion by Curt Kreklau, seconded by R.Kannankutty to direct Mn/DOT Staff to discourage dual designation and to investigate the ability to eliminate needs since the ability to have combination routes is created by statute. Motion approved unanimously.

This item will be discussed during the Fall Screening Meeting.

Excess Mileage Created by Turnbacks - Ken Straus reviewed two examples of County Road/T.H. Turnbacks which result in excess designated mileage. Generally, the excess mileage is created when turnbacks occur during the course of a year, and is discovered when the certification of mileage is reported at the end of the year.

The Needs Study Subcommittee recommended that once a City is granted Turnback mileage above their 20%, they should not be lost when the exchanges are made. Ken Straus also indicated trunk highways that are exchanged for County State Aid highways will create similar overages.

Discussions then centered on whether or not MSA designations over a County Road that are turned back should be allowed above the 20%. Ken Straus questioned if this should be treated as "no needs" mileage? The Committee summarized by stating that this mileage should not be allowed above the 20%. To avoid this, City's could remove their MSA designation before the County turns it back.

Ken Straus will draft a resolution for action at the Fall Meeting, addressing the turnback issues.

Minutes of the Unencumbered Construction Fund Subcommittee - Advance

Funding: Ken Straus explained the new proposed rules on Unencumbered Advances. The process rules has been modified to allow cities to pass a resolution advancing funds at anytime instead of at the Report of State Aid stage. The Committee does not recommend "after the fact" adjustments (like bonding) for advances. The availability of funds would be 50% of the unencumbered balance as of December 31 of the preceding year. This item was referred to State Aid for Fall resolution action.

<u>Apportionment Rankings -</u> Ken Straus reviewed the spreadsheets. There was no additional discussion.

III ADD ALTERNATES TO PAID ROSTER FOR LAST YEAR REPRESENTATIVES TERM

David Sonnenberg suggested that consideration be given to having the alternates attend two meetings prior to becoming representatives to improve the continuity of the group. There was agreement from the Board. Action will be taken tomorrow. In addition, having the past two President's attending would also be beneficial.

IV LOCAL ROAD RESEARCH BOARD REPRESENTATIVE

Chairman Dick Hansen updated Members on the Local Research Board. he stated the "set aside" went from 1/4 to 1/2%. He reviewed a list of 1995 research projects, noted the biggest expenditures were \$301,000 from the U of M T2 and \$500,000 Mn/DOT Roach Research Project. He also reviewed the list of studies dating back to the 1960's. Larry Reed and Dave Hutton represent the Cities of LRRB - six (6) year appointments. Solicitation for projects will be mailed shortly. Larry Anderson encouraged Engineers to submit projects for consideration.

Briefing of Quality Improvement by Paul Stine from the State Aid Office.

Pat Stein discussed the process the State Aid Office and Federal Aid Office is implementing. Pat Murphy discussed the surveys and questionnaires his office has solicited at the City Engineer's Association meeting in January.

V <u>DISCUSSION/ACTION ON PROPOSALS BEFORE THE BOARD</u>

A. Unit Price:

Motion by Larry Anderson, seconded by John Rodeberg to approve. Motion approved unanimously.

B. Bond Account Adjustments: Larry Anderson stated consideration should be given for existing bonds (only apply to bonds from this date forward).

Motion by R.Kannankutty, seconded by Ken Saffert, to approve deducting the bonding costs from the amount applied against a State Aid project, and with bonding adjustments to needs be a 10 % reduction per year over a ten (10) year period for bonds sold after January 1, 1996. Motion approved unanimously.

C. Excess Mileage Created by Turnbacks: R.Kannankutty suggested this be reviewed in the fall of this year, since we had discussed and acted upon this in 1994. Larry Anderson felt the Cities should not be penalized for taking turnbacks and should be able to keep the extra 20%. Dave Halter suggested Cities be required to re-certify mileage during exchanges so the City can make a determination as part of negotiations. Ken Larson suggested Cities be educated through State Aid workshops on the ramifications of turnback negotiations. Sid Williamson indicated mileage added is diluting the value of miles, which is why the Subcommittee is recommending no change.

Suggested options would be:

- 1) To adjust the system immediately (re-certify);
- 2) To adjust the system over time (growing communities absorb); or
- 3) Perpetuate the turnback adjustment.

Dave Kreager suggested not getting needs for mileage over the 20%. State Aid Staff will develop resolutions for the Fall Meeting consideration. The process

would disclose ramifications if the transfer of 20% is absorbed (adjusted over a period of time).

- **D.** Advance Funding of Unemcumbered Construction Fund State Aid Staff will review Committee recommendations and come back to the Fall Meeting with administrative guidelines.
- E. Alternate Attendance for Last Year of Representatives Terms and Two Past Presidents attend Screening Board at State Aid Expense:

Motion by John Rodeberg, seconded by Dave Halter, to amend the existing Resolutions to accommodate alternate attendance for last year of Representatives Terms and Two Past Presidents to attend Screening Board at State Aid Expense. Motion approved unanimously.

F. <u>Change in Definition of T.H. Turnbacks</u> - Currently, considered turnback if an alternate route is constructed, and must meet State Aid criteria.

It was questioned whether we should consider some turnbacks that were absorbed in 20% basic mileage over the last 35 years.

Pat Murphy stated the Cities have the right to research and plead their case on whether their mileage should be above the 20%.

VI QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

Pat Murphy asked for Quality Improvement Suggestions. He explained changes in the State Aid budgeting: items that used to be in T.H. fund and County/City Administration Fund - if out of Administrative fund only, it is easier and there is more flexibility. He questioned who should review this change. It was determined the Executive or Full Screening Committee would review and present and discuss changes at the Fall Meeting. Dave Halter suggested the Screening Board or Subcommittee of the Board should review this change.

Pat Murphy indicated there was approximately \$5,000,000 in the Administrative Fund. State Aid is using about \$3,000,000 of this amount, with the remaining \$2,000,000 going back to the allocation fund. He stated he would like to avoid micromanaging his department, however wants to be a sounding board for discretionary issues. He stressed that while he was searching for advice and comments, he does not have approval authority.

Life Cycle Costing purpose was two-fold - looking at feasibility of LifeCycle to needs as well as collectively assembling a total state system. A number of members commented on information that would be beneficial from this study. There is an opportunity of coordination from the Pavement Management Program from State Aid. The members supported continuing work on this project, and will report back at the Fall Meeting.

Phase II Financial System, the automation of financial payments and pursuing a paperless system to make various reports to State Aid electronically. There were concerns expressed during the training regarding the added extra step and infrequent use of the State Aid computer and need to continually change the password. It was suggested State Aid take another look at current communication problems before proceeding any further.

VII <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

Ken Straus stated the Mainframe Program is planned to be rewritten and as such, a review of "Need" items should be conducted by the Subcommittee. The Pavement Management Program will be incorporated into this system. The certification of mileage form is also being considered for computerization.

VII <u>CLOSING</u>

Dave Sonnenberg thanked the Screening Board and the Needs Study Subcommittee for their hard work and dedication. Ken Larson commented on how well the meeting was run by the Chairman.

The next meeting will take place October 24 and 25 at Breezy Point. Arrangements will be made for Monday evening to allow for a Planning Meeting on Tuesday morning.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 11:25 a.m.

NEEDS, MILEAGE, AND APPORTIONMENT

The amount to be allocated in 1996 is unknown at this time so an estimated amount of \$ 81,718,700 is used in this report. This a similar amount that was used for the 1995 apportionment. The actual amount will be announced in January 1996 when the Commissioner of Transportation makes a determination of the 1996 apportionment.

The estimated Maintenance and Construction amounts are not computed in this booklet due to the city's option of receiving a minimum of \$1,500 per mile or a percentage up to a maximum of 35% of their total allocation for Maintenance. If a city desires to receive more than the minimum or make a change to their request on file to cover future maintenance, the city has to inform the State Aid Office prior to December 16 of their intention. A memo is sent prior to this date to each city engineer annually informing them of this option.

The continuous increase in M.S.A.S. mileage is due to the increase in the total improved local street mileage of which 20% is allowed for M.S.A. street designation, Trunk and County Turnbacks and the number of cities over 5,000 population.

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Theoretical 1996 M.S.A.S. Population Apportionment

The State Demographer's and Metropolitan Council's 1994 population estimates along with the Federal Census will be used to allocate 50% of the funds in the 1996 apportionment.

The estimate was used to compute the projected population apportionment when the City's population was larger than the 1990 census or special census. The census was used if the estimate indicated a lower population.

Fifty percent of the total sum is distributed on a prorated share that each city population bears to the total population. Each city will earn approximately \$13.77 per capita in apportionment from the 1996 population apportionment distribution. This projection will be somewhat revised when the actual revenue for the 1996 apportionment becomes available or if additional cities should exceed 5,000 population prior to January 1, 1996.

A new statute was passed that allows two or more cities to consolidate by using population estimates instead of a special census. This statute allowed Branch and North Branch to consolidate into North Branch by using the combined estimated population of 5140. North Branch is located approximately 50 miles north of the Twin Cities.

The statute reads as:

The population of a city created by the consolidation of two or more previously incorporated cities shall be determined by the most recent population estimate of the metropolitan Council or state demographer, until the federal decennial census or special census taken after the consolidation.

The City of Glencoe is in the process of taken a special census and is expected to have the census completed before the 1996 apportionment. Glencoe was not included in any of the computation in this booklet but is expected to be included in the January apportionment.

1995 Itemized Tabulation of Needs

The 1995 money needs reflects an increase due to the updating of needs, new designations and increase in some unit prices. See the 1995 June Screening Board minutes or the Resolutions for the 1995 needs unit prices.

The 1995 itemized tabulation of needs on the following page shows all the construction items except the "after the fact needs" used in the Municipal State Aid Needs Study. The tabulation is provided to give each municipality the opportunity to compare their needs of the individual construction items to that of other cities. The cost per mile shown on this report does not include bridges and 18% of the engineering cost applied to the bridges because large bridges in some cities distort the average. The average is a more comparable cost for roadway construction cost per mile without bridges.

The overall average cost per mile is \$539,878. Shoreview has the lowest cost per mile with \$244,170 while Fairmont has the highest cost with \$906,456 per mile.

Six cities which exceed \$800,000 per mile are listed alphabetically as follows: Bloomington, Fairmont, Farmington, Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Savage.

Tentative 1996 Money Needs Apportionment Determination

This tabulation shows each municipality's tentative money needs apportionment based on a projected apportionment amount. The actual amount of the road user fund for distribution to the Municipal State Aid Account will not be available until January 1996.

The 25-year construction needs or money needs shown on this report are those computed from the "1995 Needs Study Update". The adjusted 25 year construction needs are the result of subtracting for the Unencumbered Construction Fund and adding or subtracting for Bond Accounts, adding Non-existing Bridge Adjustments, adding Right-of-Way "After the fact needs", and subtracting for the cost of Bituminous Overlays and Concrete Joint Repairs on segments that receive complete needs. These adjustments to the actual needs are made as directed by the Screening Board Resolutions. This summary provides specific data and shows the impact of the adjustment to each municipality for the Screening Board's use in establishing the 1996 tentative Money Needs Apportionment Determination.

The adjustments are listed individually following the tentative summary of adjustments to the 25 year actual 1995 Money Needs.

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NEEDS ADJUSTMENT FOR APPLE VALLEY

THE 1995 JANUARY APPORTIONMENT BOOKLET DID NOT REFLECT APPLE VALLEY'S TOTAL NET ADJUSTMENTS ON PAGE 22. THE AMOUNT DID NOT INCLUDE \$1,335,554 FOR A BOND ACCOUNT ADJUSTMENT AND A NEGATIVE ADJUSTMENT OF (\$28,835) FOR A BIT. OVERLAY. THIS RESULTED IN A REDUCTION OF \$1.306,719 IN NEEDS AND \$34,244 IN ALLOCATION. THE NEEDS STUDY SUBCOMMITTEE RECOMMENDS THAT A NEEDS ADJUSTMENT BE MADE TO THEIR 1995 MONEY NEEDS AND REFLECTED IN THE 1996 ALLOCATION.

NON-EXISTING BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION

To compensate for not allowing needs for non-existing structures in the 25-year needs study, the Municipal Screening Board passed in the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED:

"The money needs for all "non-existing" bridges and grade separations be removed from the Needs Study until such time that a construction project is awarded. At that time a money needs adjustment shall be made by annually adding the total amount of the structure cost that is eligible for State Aid reimbursement for a 15-year period." This directive to exclude all Federal or State grants.

The unexpended balance of the administration account at the end of the year is transferred back to the state aid fund from which it was obtained for distribution.

RESEARCH ACCOUNT MOTION

Each year the Screening Board, provided for in section 162.13, Subdivision 3, may recommend to the commissioner a sum of money that the commissioner shall set aside from the municipal state aid street fund and credit to a research account. The amount so recommended shall not exceed 1/2 of 1% of the preceding apportionment. Any balance remaining in the research account at the end of the each year from sum set aside for the year immediately previous, shall be transferred to the MSAS fund.

Be it resolved that an amount of \$408,594 (not to exceed 1/2 of 1% of the 1995 M.S.A.S. Apportionment sum of \$81,718,700) shall be set aside from the 1996 Apportionment fund and be credited to the research account.

CURRENT RESOLUTIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL SCREENING BOARD

JUNE 1994

BE IT RESOLVED:

ADMINISTRATION

Appointments to Screening Board - Oct. 1961 (Revised June 1981)

That annually the Commissioner of Mn/DOT will be requested to appoint three (3) new members, upon recommendation of the City Engineers Association of Minnesota, to serve three (3) year terms as voting members of the Municipal Screening Board. These appointees are selected from the Nine Construction Districts together with one representative from each of the three (3) major cities of the first class.

Screening Board Chairman and Vice Chairman - June 1987

That the Chairman and Vice Chairman, nominated annually at the annual meeting of the City Engineers association of Minnesota and subsequently appointed by the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Transportation shall not have a vote in matters before the Screening Board unless they are also the duly appointed Screening Board Representative of a construction District or of a City of the first class.

Screening Board Secretary - Oct. 1961

That annually, the Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Transportation (Mn/DOT) may be requested to appoint a secretary, upon recommendation of the City Engineers' Association of Minnesota, as a non-voting member of the Municipal Screening Board for the purpose of recording all Screening Board actions.

Appointment to the Needs Study Subcommittee - June 1987 (Revised June 1993)

The Screening Board Chairman shall annually appoint one city engineer, who has served on the Screening Board, to serve a three year term on the Needs Study Subcommittee. The appointment shall be made at the annual winter meeting of the City's Engineers Association. The appointed subcommittee person shall serve as chairman of the subcommittee in the third year of the appointment.

Appointment to Unencumbered Construction Funds Subcommittee - Revised June 1979

The Screening Board past Chairman be appointed to serve a three-year term on the Unencumbered Construction Fund Subcommittee. This will continue to maintain an experienced group to follow a program of accomplishments.

Screening Board Alternate Attendance - June 1979

The alternate to a third year member be invited to attend the final meeting. A formal request to the alternates governing body would request that he attend the meetings and the municipality pay for its expenses.

Appearance Screening Board - Oct. 1962 (Revised Oct. 1982)

That any individual or delegation having items of concern regarding the study of State Aid Needs or State Aid Apportionment amounts, and wishing to have consideration given to these items, shall, in a written report, communicate with the State Aid Engineer. The State Aid Engineer with concurrence of the Chairman of the Screening Board shall determine which requests are to be referred to the Screening Board for their consideration. This resolution does not abrogate the right of the Screening Board to call any person or persons before the Board for discussion purposes.

Research Account - Oct. 1961

That an annual resolution be considered for setting aside a reasonable amount of money for the Research Account to continue municipal street research activity.

Soil Type - Oct. 1961

That the soil type classification as approved by the 1961 Municipal Screening Board, for all municipalities under Municipal State Aid be adopted for the 1962 Needs Study and 1963 apportionment on all streets in the respective municipalities. Said classifications are to be continued in use until subsequently amended or revised by Municipal Screening Board action.

Improper Needs Report - Oct. 1961

That the Office of State Aid and the District State Aid Engineer is requested to recommend an adjustment of the Needs Reporting whenever there is a reason to believe that said reports have deviated from accepted standards and to submit their recommendations to the Screening Board, with a copy to the municipality involved, or its engineer.

New Cities Needs - Oct. 1983

Any new city which has determined their eligible mileage, but does not have an approved State Aid System, their money needs will be determined at the cost per mile of the lowest other city.

Construction Cut Off Date - Oct. 1962 (Revised 1967)

That for the purpose of measuring the Needs of the Municipal State Aid Highway System, the annual cut off date for recording construction accomplishments based upon the project award date shall be December 31st of the preceding year.

Construction Accomplishments - Oct. 1988 (Revised June 1993)

When a Municipal State Aid Street is constructed to State Aid Standards, said street shall be considered adequate for a period of 20 years from the date of project letting or encumbrance of force account funds.

If, during the period that complete needs are being received the street is improved with a bituminous overlay, concrete joint repair or is widened, the municipality will continue to receive complete needs but shall have the State Aid cost of the bituminous resurfacing or concrete joint repair or widened construction project plus any items constructed that are included in the needs deducted from its total needs for a period of ten (10) years.

In the event sidewalk or curb and gutter is constructed for the total length of the segment, then those items shall be removed from the needs for a period of 20 years.

If the construction of the Municipal State Aid Street is accomplished with local funds, only the construction needs necessary to bring the roadway up to State Aid Standards will be permitted in subsequent needs for 20 years from the date of the letting or encumbrance of force account funds. At the end of the 20 year period, reinstatement for complete construction needs shall be initiated by the Municipality.

Needs for resurfacing, lighting, and traffic signals shall be allowed on all Municipal State Aid Streets at all times.

That any bridge construction project shall cause the needs of the affected bridge to be removed for a period of 35 years from the project letting date or date of force account agreement. At the end of the 35 year period, needs for complete reconstruction of the bridge will be reinstated in the needs study at the initiative of the Municipal Engineer. If, during the period that complete bridge needs are being received the bridge is improved with a bituminous overlay, the municipality will continue to receive complete needs but shall have the non-local cost of the overlay deducted from its total needs for a period of ten (10) years.

The adjustments above will apply regardless of the source of funding for the road or bridge project. Needs may be granted as an exception to this resolution upon request by the Municipal Engineer and justification to the satisfaction of the State Aid Engineer (e.g., a deficiency due to changing standards, projected traffic, or other verifiable causes).

In the event that a M.S.A.S route earning "After the Fact" needs is removed from the M.S.A. system, then, the "After the Fact" needs shall be removed from the needs study, except if transferred to another state system. No adjustment will be required on needs earned prior to the revocation.

POPULATION APPORTIONMENT - October 1994

Be it resolved that beginning with calendar year 1996, the MSA population apportionment shall be determined using the latest available federal census or population estimates of the State Demographer and/or the Metropolitan Council. However, no population shall be decreased below that of the latest available federal census, and no city will be added to or dropped from the MSA eligible list based on population estimates.

DESIGN

Design Limitation on Non-Existing Streets - Oct. 1965

That non-existing streets shall not have their needs computed on the basis of urban design unless justified to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

Less Than Minimum Width - Oct. 1961 (Revised 1986)

That in the event that a Municipal State Aid Street is constructed with State Aid Funds to a width less than the standard design width as reported in the Needs Study, the total needs shall be taken off such constructed street other than the surface replacement need. Surface replacement and other future needs shall be limited to the constructed width unless exception is justified to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

Greater Than Minimum Width (Revised June 1993)

If a Municipal State Aid Street is constructed to a width wider than required, resurfacing needs will be allowed on the constructed width.

Miscellaneous Limitations - Oct. 1961

That miscellaneous items such as fence removal, bituminous surface removal, manhole adjustment, and relocation of street lights are not permitted in the Municipal State Aid Street Needs Study. The item of retaining walls, however, shall be included in the Needs Study.

MILEAGE

Feb. 1959 (Revised Oct. 1994)

The maximum mileage for Municipal State Aid Street designation shall be 20 percent of the municipality's basic mileage - which is comprised of the total improved streets less Trunk Highway, County State Aid Highways, and any Trunk Highway and/or County Road Turnback designated as excess Municipal State Aid mileage.

Nov. 1965 (Revised 1972, Oct. 1993)

The maximum mileage for Municipal State Aid Street designation shall be based on the Annual Certification of Mileage current as of December 31st of the preceding year. Submittal of a supplementary certification during the year shall not be permitted. Frontage roads which are not designated trunk highway, trunk highway turnback or County State Aid Highway system shall be considered in the computation of the basic street mileage. The total mileage of county roads and local streets on corporate limits shall be included in the municipality's basic street mileage. Mileage which is on the boundary of two adjoining urban municipalities shall be considered as one-half mileage.

(Nov. 1965 - Revised 1969, October 1993, October, 1994)

However, the maximum mileage for State Aid designation may be exceeded to designate trunk highway turnbacks after July 1, 1965 subject to State Aid Operations Rules.

Any net increase in mileage which is caused by turnbacks or jurisdictional exchanges, including County Highways after May 11, 1994, and designated on the Municipal State Aid Street System in accordance with MSA rules and approved by the Office of State Aid, shall be allowed above the municipality's 20% mileage cap. Exchanges which result in net decreases in mileage shall result in the municipality's mileage in excess of 20% being reduced by a like amount. The amount of excess MSA mileage allowed shall be accumulative of all turnbacks and jurisdictional exchanges, including County Highways after May 11, 1994, but shall never be negative. Excess mileage on the MSA system shall accrue needs in accordance with current rules and resolutions.

Oct. 1961 (Revised May 1980, Oct. 1982, Oct. 1983, and June 1993)

All requests for additional mileage or revisions to the Municipal State Aid System must be received by the District State Aid Engineer by March first and a City Council resolution of approved mileage and the Needs Study reporting data must be received by May first, to be included in the current year's Needs Study. Any requests for additional mileage or revisions to the Municipal State Aid Systems received by the District State Aid Engineer after March first will be included in the following year's Needs Study.

One Way Street Mileage - June 1983 (Revised Oct. 1984, Oct. 1993, June 1994)

That any one-way streets added to the Municipal State Aid Street system must be reviewed by the Needs Study Sub-Committee, and approved by the Screening Board before any one-way street can be treated as one-half mileage in the Needs Study.

Treat all one-way streets between 26 feet and 49 feet wide as one-half of the mileage as outlined in Rule 8820.9940 and allow complete needs, except that no more than one parking lane will be eligible to accrue needs. When Trunk Highway or County Highway Turnback is used as part of a one way pair, mileage for certification shall only be included as trunk Highway or County Turnback mileage and not as provided for in the preceding paragraph.

STRUCTURES

Bridge Costs - Oct. 1961 (Revised Annually)

That for the study of needs on the Municipal State Aid Street System, bridge costs shall be computed as follows:

Bridges 0 to 149 Ft.	\$ 55.00 Sq. Ft.
Bridges 150 to 499 Ft.	55.00 Sq. Ft.
Bridges 500 & Over	55.00 Sq. Ft.

"The money needs for all "non-existing" bridges and grade separations be removed from the Needs Study until such time that a construction project is awarded. At that time a money needs adjustment shall be made by annually adding the total amount of the structure cost that is eligible for State Aid reimbursement for a 15-year period." This directive to exclude all Federal or State grants.

Bridge Width & Costs - (Revised Annually)

That after conferring with the Bridge Section of Mn/DOT and using the criteria as set forth by this Department as to the standard design for railroad structures, that the following costs based on number of tracks be used for the Needs Study:

NEEDS ADJUSTMENTS

Bond Adjustment - Oct. 1961 (Revised 1976, 1979)

That a separate annual adjustment shall be made in total money Needs of a municipality that has sold and issued bonds pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 162.18, for use on State Aid projects.

That this adjustment, which covers the amortization period, and which annually reflects the net unamortized bonded debt shall be accomplished by adding said net unamortized amount to the computed money needs of the municipality.

For the purpose of this adjustment, the net unamortized bonded debt shall be the total unamortized bonded indebtedness less the unexpended bond amount as of December 31st of the preceding year.

That for the purpose of this separate annual adjustment, the unamortized balance of the St. Paul Bond Account, as authorized in 1953, 2nd United Improvement Program, and as authorized in 1946, Capital Approach Improvement Bonds, shall be considered in the same manner as those bonds sold and issued pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Section 162.18.

"Bond account money spent off State Aid System would not be eligible for Bond Account Adjustment. This action would not be retroactive, but would be in effect for the remaining term of the Bond issue."

<u>Unencumbered Construction Fund Balance Adjustment</u> - Oct. 1961 (Revised October 1991)

That for the determination of Apportionment Needs, the amount of the unencumbered construction fund balance as of September 1st of the current year shall be deducted from the 25-year total Needs of each individual municipality.

Projects that have been received before September 1st by the District State Aid Engineer for payment shall be considered as being encumbered and the construction balances shall be so adjusted.

Right of Way - Oct. 1965 (Revised June 1986)

The Right of Way needs shall be included in the apportionment needs based on the unit price per mile, until such time that the right of way is acquired and the actual cost established. At that time a money needs adjustment shall be made by annually adding the local cost (which is the total cost less county or trunk highway participation) for a 15-year period. Only right of way acquisition costs that are eligible for State-Aid reimbursement shall be included in the right-of-way money needs adjustment. This Directive to exclude all Federal or State grants. Right-of-way projects that are funded with State Aid Funds will be compiled by the State Aid Office. When "After the Fact" needs are requested for right-of-way projects that have been funded with local funds, but qualify for State Aid reimbursement, documentation (copies of warrants and description of acquisition) must be submitted to the State Aid Office.

Trunk Highway Turnback - Oct. 1967 (Revised June 1989)

That any trunk highway turnback which reverts directly to the municipality and becomes part of the State Aid Street system shall not have its construction needs considered in the money needs apportionment determination as long as the former trunk highway is fully eligible for 100 percent construction payment from the Municipal Turnback Account. During this time of eligibility, financial aid for the additional maintenance obligation, of the municipality imposed by the turnback shall be computed on the basis of the current year's apportionment data and shall be accomplished in the following manner.

Initial Turnback Maintenance Adjustment - Fractional Year Reimbursement:

The initial turnback adjustment when for less than 12 full months shall provide partial maintenance cost reimbursement by adding said initial adjustment to the money needs which will produce approximately 1/12 of \$7,200 per mile in apportionment funds for each month or part of a month that the municipality had maintenance responsibility during the initial year.

To provide an advance payment for the coming year's additional maintenance obligation, a needs adjustment per mile shall be added to the annual money needs. This needs adjustment per mile shall produce sufficient apportionment funds so that at least \$7,200 in apportionment shall be earned for each mile of trunk highway turnback on Municipal State Aid Street System.

Turnback adjustments shall terminate at the end of the calendar year during which a construction contract has been awarded that fulfills the Municipal Turnback Account Payment provisions; and the resurfacing needs for the awarded project shall be included in the Needs Study for the next apportionment.

TRAFFIC - June 1971

Traffic Limitation on Non-Existing Streets - Oct. 1965

That non-existing street shall not have their needs computed on a traffic count of more than 4,999 vehicles per day unless justified to the satisfaction of the Commissioner.

Traffic Manual - Oct. 1962

That for the 1965 and all future Municipal State Aid Street Needs Studies, the Needs Study procedure shall utilize traffic data developed according to the Traffic Estimating Manual - M.S.A.S. #5-892.700. This manual shall be prepared and kept current under the direction of the Screening Board regarding methods of counting traffic and computing average daily traffic. The manner and scope of reporting is detailed in the above mentioned manual.

<u>Traffic Counting</u> - Sept. 1973 (Revised June 1987)

That future traffic data for State Aid Needs Studies be developed as follows:

- 1. The municipalities in the metropolitan area cooperate with the State by agreeing to participate in counting traffic every two years.
- 2. The cities in the outstate area may have their traffic counted for a nominal fee and maps prepared by State forces every four years, or may elect to continue the present procedure of taking their own counts and preparing their own traffic maps at four year intervals.
- 3. Some deviations from the present four-year counting cycle shall be permitted during the interim period of conversion to counting by State forces in the outstate area.
