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INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

PURPOSE

This report gives statewide and county data for children in out of home placement for 1993. It responds to a legislative directive that says:

The commissioner of human services shall publish a semiannual report on children in out of home placement. The report shall include, by county and statewide, information on legal status, living arrangement, age, sex, race, accumulated length of time in placement, reason for most recent placement, race of family with whom placed, number of families from the child's own culture in the placement pool during the period for which data is provided, and other demographic information deemed appropriate on all children in out of home placement. The commissioner shall provide the required data for children who entered placement during the previous quarter and for children who are in placement at the end of the quarter. Out of home placement includes placement in any facility by an authorized child placing agency. By December 1, 1989, and by December 1 or each successive year, the commissioner shall publish a report covering the first six months of the calendar year. By June 1, 1990, and by June 1 of each successive year, the commissioner shall publish report covering the last six months of the calendar year. Minnesota Statutes, Section 257.0725.

ORGANIZATION

The report is divided into two parts. The first part shows overall statewide figures for children in out-of-home placements in 1993. It presents tables, charts, and graphs giving actual numbers and percentages for that one year and, in many cases, presents five year trend data covering the period from 1989 through 1993. The second section gives detailed information about out-of-home placements on a county by county basis.

TECHNICAL NOTES

The following notes explain technical terms to help the reader interpret and analyze the data better. Specifically, they review the use of the terms: *unduplicated counts*, *episodes and placements*, *race and ethnicity*, and *living arrangements*.

UNDUPLICATED COUNTS

This report uses the last record for each child in out of home care as its primary source of data. The reasons for using it are to:

- provide unduplicated child counts for the year and
- present data in a way that shows historical information as well as that for a single year.

The annual unduplicated count of children in 1993 consists of two items:

- the sum of children who were still in care from the previous year added to the number who entered care in 1993, and
- the sum of children who left care in 1993 added to the number who remained in care at the end of that year.

Before 1993, a child's *first* record for the year provided the information for the category of those *children entering care*. In 1993, the Department began using the date from the child's *last* record for the year. Thus, a change in reporting methods accounts for the increased difference between the two years. Because a majority of children have only one episode of care, these reporting differences do not result in wide variations among the years.

In describing data on county detail tables, unduplicated numbers of children are listed within each county but not among counties themselves.

Percents may not add to 100% due to rounding.

EPISODES and PLACEMENTS

An episode is the period of continuous care between the date a child enters out-of-home care and the date a child leaves out-of-home care. A child may have one or more placements during each episode of care. This report contains counts of children who have specific numbers of placements during their last episode of care. This report does not have any counts of episodes or placements.

RACE AND ETHNICITY

State-wide tables, trend tables and county detail table 2 in this report combine Hispanic heritage and primary race. The data examines Hispanic heritage and primary race as follows:

- The first category is that of Hispanic heritage. If the answer to the
 question of a child's Hispanic heritage is "yes", the data are reported as
 Hispanic no matter what other racial categories are reported.
- If the answer to the Hispanic Heritage question is "no" or "unknown" the next category is that of the child's primary race. If a child is listed as American Indian and white, the primary race listed for this child would be American Indian. If the child is listed as white and African American, the primary race would be reported as white.

A similar method is used to record the Hispanic heritage or primary race of foster parents to find out if foster children are placed with foster parents of the same heritage or race. If either one or both foster parents answer "yes" to the question of Hispanic heritage, the response listed under the category of a foster parent's race and ethnicity is Hispanic, regardless of what the responses are to questions of race. If the answer is "no" or "unknown" to questions of Hispanic heritage, then the question of race is reviewed. If the primary or secondary race of either or both foster parents matches the primary race of a child, then the report states that the child's race is the "same" as that of foster parents.

County detail tables give information exclusively about primary race in separate tables listed as "a". County detail tables give information exclusively about Hispanic heritage in separate tables listed as "b". This report omits information about which tribe a child may belong to and it does not give information about the ethnic heritage of Asians and/or Pacific Islanders(API).

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

The category of *living arrangement* reported for a child is his or her *last* out of home living arrangement for the year 1993. This category includes all the days of care and placements since the child's last entry into care. This data was recorded differently in the years prior to 1993 because days of care from all periods of care in the report period were included rather than only those from the last entry into care.

Table 3 shows the various living arrangements children had in their last placement while they were in care. The table shows "emergency shelter" as a separate category from "foster family home" although in some cases, foster parents may provide children

with emergency shelter. In this table, emergency shelter provided in foster family homes is listed under "emergency shelter". The term "group homes" includes all facilities that are licensed under Rule 5 and Rule 34 and others that have a capacity of 25 children or less. It also includes group homes licensed under Rule 8 and comparable out-of-state or unlicensed facilities. Chemical dependency treatment facilities, regardless of size, are included under residential facilities. The later have capacities for 25 or more clients.

The breakdown for living arrangements come from federal not state guidelines.




■ ENTERED CARE □ LEFT CARE □ IN CARE AT END

THE NUMBERS OF CHILDREN ENTERING AND LEAVING OUT-OF-HOME CARE CONTINUED TO INCREASE.

- ♦ From 1992 to 1993, the increase in children entering out—of—home care was 7.9 percent.
- ♦ From 1992 to 1993 the number of children leaving out—of—home care increased only 3.9 percent.
- Children entering care have out—numbered children leaving care since 1989.

MORE CHILDREN EXPERIENCED OUT-OF-HOME CARE EACH YEAR IN MINNESOTA.

The total number of children in out—of—home care continued to increase. In 1993, 18,673 children were in out—of—home care, the highest number ever reported. For Minnesota, in the five years from 1989 to 1993, the number grew from 15,044 to 18,673, an increase of 24 percent. The rate of increase slowed from 1992 to 1993.

HALF OF ALL CHILDREN IN CARE LAST LIVED IN FOSTER FAMILY HOMES

- ♦ One out of every two children in out—of—home placement last lived in a foster family home (51 percent).
- ♦ One out of four children (26 percent) had their last or only out—of—home placement in an emergency shelter.
- ◆ One out of five children last lived in either a group home (13 percent) or a residential treatment facility (7 percent).

OF ALL THE CHILDREN WHO LEFT CARE, MORE THAN HALF LEFT WITHIN A MONTH.

- ♦ Fifty—four percent of all children who left care in 1993 did so within one month.
- ♦ Another 22 percent of children spent at least one month in care and left within six months.
- ♦ During 1993 eighty—six percent of all children who left care, left within one year.
- ♦ While the number leaving within one month increased substantially from 1989 to 1993, the number leaving within one year was almost unchanged over the same period.

MOST CHILDREN STILL IN CARE ON THE LAST DAY OF THE YEAR HAD HAD ONLY ONE PLACEMENT.

- ♦ Slightly less than half of children (49 percent) who were in care at the end of 1993 had experienced only one placement.
- ♦ In the five previous years, the proportion of children with one placement varied little (55 percent to 57 percent), with no apparent trend.
- ♦ The proportion of children with three to five placements in care at the end had increased over the last four years.
- ♦ While still less than 500 children, the number with six or more placements has more than doubled since 1989.

THE THREE MAJOR REASONS CHILDREN ENTERED CARE IN 1993 WERE: CHILD CONDITION or CONDUCT (42 percent), CHILD PROTECTION (33 percent), and PARENT CONDITION, CONDUCT or ABSENCE (24 percent).

- In 1993, Child Related Conduct or Condition included: adjudicated delinquent (44 pecent), other reason (41 percent), child disability (8 percent), and status offenses (7 percent).
- ♦ In 1993, Child Protection included protection from: neglect (43 percent); physical abuse (33 percent); other family interaction problems (20 pecent); and sexual abuse (3 percent).
- ♦ In 1993, Parent or Caretaker Conduct, Condition or Absence included: unspecified other (31 percent); illness or disability (27 percent); substance abuse (20 percent); temporary absence (9 percent); inability to cope (5 percent); abandonment (3 percent); hardship or financial hardship (2 percent); incarceration (2 percent) and death (1 percent).

MOST CHILDREN WERE REUNITED WITH PARENTS.

During 1993, almost four out of five children who left care (79 percent) were reunited with their own parents. Another six percent found homes with relatives. Thus, reunification with parents or other relatives was a reality for 85 percent of children who left out—of—home care in 1993. This is an improvement from 1989 when it was reported that 68 percent of children leaving care were reunified with parents and seven percent found homes with non—parental relatives.

THE PROPORTION OF CHILDREN IN OUT-OF-HOME PLACEMENT VARIED BY HISPANIC HERITAGE AND RACE

- ♦ Three percent of children in out—of—home care in 1993 were reported to be Hispanic. Hispanic children accounted for 2 percent of the child population in 1990.
- ♦ Sixty-two percent of children in out-of-home care in 1993 were reported to be white. White children accounted for 90 percent of the 1990 child population.
- ♦ Twenty—one percent of children in out—of—home care in 1993 were reported to be black. Black children accounted for 3 percent of the 1990 child population.
- ♦ Eleven percent of children in out—of—home care in 1993 were reported to be American Indian. American Indian children accounted for 2 percent of the 1990 child population.
- ◆ Two percent of children in out—of—home care in 1993 were reported to be Asian and/or Pacific Islander. Asian and/or Pacific Islander children were 3 percent of the 1990 child population. Some of these children are refugee unancompanied minors who were not available for permanent placement because they are here without parents.

OVER HALF THOSE WHO ENTERED OUT-OF-HOME CARE IN 1993 WERE ADOLESCENTS.

Fifty—three percent of those who entered out—of—home care in 1993 were adolescents from 13 to 19 years old. Twenty—five percent were children under six years of age. Based on the 1990 census, adolescents from 13 to 19 years of age accounted for 32 percent of the population ages 0 to 19 years. Thus it appears that adolescents were over—represented in out—of—home care, while children less than age six were under—represented.

THE NUMBERS OF BOYS AND GIRLS WHO ENTERED OUT-OF-HOME CARE REFLECTED THE NORMAL GENDER DISTRIBUTION OF CHILDREN IN THE POPULATION.

The number of boys entering care in 1993 was 52 pecent and the number of girls was 48 percent. The 1990 census indicated that Minnesota's children with ages from under one year to 16 years were about evenly divided between boys (51 percent) and girls (49 percent).

OF THE CHILDREN WHO LEFT CARE IN 1993, MOST HAD ONLY ONE PLACEMENT IN THEIR LAST EPISODE OF CARE.

- Almost seven out of ten children (69 percent) had only one placement when they left care in 1993.
- The proportion of children who left care after only one placement varied from a high of 74 percent for white children to a low of 57 percent for Black children.
- Less than three percent of any of these groups had six or more placements during their last period of continuous care.
