

# Summary of the Report on Certain State Police Aid Reimbursement Practices

## Legislative Mandate

Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 38 requires the Commissioner of Revenue and the Executive Director of the Public Employees Retirement Association to prepare a joint report and submit the report to the Chair of the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement on or before November 1, 1996.

The joint report is to contain:

- (1) the number of salaried firefighters for whom the employer contribution to the Public Employees Police and Fire Plan was reimbursed in 1995 in the state police aid program;
- (2) the employing units involved; and
- (3) the amount of 1995 state police aid involved for each employing unit.

## Sources of Data

Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 37 required the Commissioner of Revenue to obtain additional information from counties and municipalities for the purpose of the joint report. The counties and municipalities were required to certify this information as a condition of receiving state police aid in 1996. All of the counties and municipalities required to certify this information did so. A copy of the form (Form PA-2) and cover letter used by the Department of Revenue to collect this data is included with the joint report.

The information required to be reported on the Form PA-2 included:

- (1) the number of licensed peace officers employed by the municipality or county that were covered by the police and fire plan of PERA for calendar year 1995;
- (2) the covered payroll of peace officers included in item (1) above for calendar year 1995;
- (3) the amount of employer contributions to the police and fire plan of PERA made by the municipality or county on behalf of the peace officers included in (1) above for calendar year 1995;
- (4) the number of firefighters employed by the municipality or county that were covered by the police and fire plan of PERA for calendar year 1995;

- (5) the covered payroll of firefighters included in item (4) above for calendar year 1995; and
- (6) the amount of employer contributions to the police and fire plan of PERA made by the municipality or county on behalf of the firefighters included in (4) above for calendar year 1995.

The joint report also contains information developed by the Public Employees Retirement Association from its own sources, including a special reporting form submitted to PERA by municipalities. A copy of a sample reporting form and the letter from PERA requesting the reporting form is included with the joint report.

### Summary of Joint Report

The enclosed Report 1 table shows some of the 1995 data collected by the Department of Revenue and the Public Employees Retirement Association for those municipalities which have both peace officers and salaried firefighters, and relates this information to the 1995 state peace officer aid.

For the data reported to the Department of Revenue, Report 1 shows for each of these municipalities: (1) number of peace officers, (2) municipal contributions to PERA on behalf of peace officers, (3) calendar year 1995 state peace officer aid, (4) peace officer aid in excess of the municipal contribution (3 - 2), (5) number of salaried firefighters, (6) municipal contributions to PERA on behalf of firefighters, and (7) 1995 peace officer aid available for firefighters (the same as (4)).

For the data reported to PERA, Report 1 shows for each of these municipalities: (1) Police and Fire Fund retirement obligation for the municipality, (2) calendar year 1995 state peace officer aid, (3) amount of peace officer aid in excess of the total retirement obligation (2 - 1), (4) number of peace officers, and (5) number of firefighters.

The enclosed Report 2 table shows salary data for peace officers and firefighters for those municipalities which have both peace officers and salaried firefighters.

For the data reported to the Department of Revenue, Report 2 shows for each of these municipalities: (1) number of peace officers, (2) total peace officer payroll, (3) total employer contributions to PERA for peace officers, (4) number of salaried firefighters, (5) total payroll for salaried firefighters, (6) total employer contributions to PERA for firefighters, (7) total employer contributions to PERA for both peace officers and firefighters (3 + 6), and (8) total payroll of peace officers and salaried firefighters (2 + 5).

For the data reported to PERA, Report 2 shows for each of these municipalities: (1) Police and Fire Fund retirement obligation for the municipality, (2) total salary based on the Police and Fire Fund retirement obligation, (3) number of peace officers, and (4) number of firefighters.

The enclosed **Report 3** compares some of the data reported to the Department of Revenue with the comparable data reported to the Public Employees Retirement Association for those municipalities which have both peace officers and salaried firefighters. The data compared is (1, 5, 9) number of peace officers, (2, 6, 10) number of firefighters, (3, 7, 11) total numbers of peace officers and firefighters, and (4, 8, 12) total Police and Fire Fund retirement obligation.

The enclosed **Report 4** is a report prepared by the Public Employees Retirement Association comparing their retirement obligation data with calculated data based on the special reports submitted to PERA by cities. The report is only for those municipalities which have both peace officers and salaried firefighters. The state peace officer aid data in this report (column D) is the 1996 state peace officer aid.

RE: CERTIFICATION OF PEACE OFFICERS AND FIREFIGHTERS  
COVERED BY THE POLICE AND FIRE PLAN OF PERA

Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 37 requires municipalities and counties to provide the information requested on the enclosed Certification of Peace Officers and Firefighters Covered by the Police and Fire Plan of PERA for the Calendar Year Ending December 31, 1995 (Form PA-2).

The enclosed Form PA-2 must be completed and returned to the Department of Revenue on or before June 15, 1996. You will not be eligible to receive state peace officer aid until a correctly completed copy of this form has been returned to our office. Please note that the Form PA-2 must be signed by either the municipal clerk (for municipal police departments) or the county auditor (for county sheriffs' departments), or appropriate public safety district official, whichever applies to your department. If the form is not signed and dated by the appropriate authority, the form will be returned to you.

The Form PA-2 applies only to those peace officers and salaried firefighters on whose behalf a contribution was made by the municipality or county to the police and fire fund of PERA during calendar year 1995. The Form PA-2 must be completed and returned by all municipalities and counties that have applied to receive 1996 state peace officer aid. Instructions for completing the Form PA-2 are also enclosed.


The information reported on the Form PA-2 will be compiled and forwarded to the Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement. The information will be used to study the use of peace officer state aid to fund the employer contribution to the police and fire fund of PERA.

This is a one-time certification. Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 37 does not require an annual certification to be made in 1997 and subsequent years.

The completed Form PA-2, signed and dated, should be returned to the Department of Revenue, Property Tax Division, Mail Station 3340, St. Paul, Minnesota 55146-3340. Again, the form must be returned by June 15, 1996.

## **PERA NEEDS YOUR HELP**

Legislation enacted this spring requires PERA and the Department of Revenue to prepare a report to the Legislature by October 1996. This report must include the actual employer contributions paid by cities to the Public Employees Retirement Association Police and Fire (PERA P&F) Plan on behalf of police officers and fire fighters covered by that pension plan. Since our present membership data base does not include a position code, we have no way of differentiating between police or fire positions held by each member of the P&F Plan.

The employer contributions paid to the PERA P&F Plan affect the calculation of excess Police State Aid. This aid, funded through the automobile insurance premium sur charge, is intended to help cities cover the pension costs of their police personnel only. As a result of the way employer pension contributions are recorded in the P&F Plan, PERA reports all employer contributions paid to that plan in a calendar year to the Department of Revenue. It is this total sum for each city that is used to determine if the city is receiving more Police State Aid than what is needed to cover the city's pension costs. Since the employer contributions paid on behalf of fire fighters is included in the information recorded by PERA, cities are receiving Police State Aid to offset both their fire and police employer contributions.

The Legislative Commission on Pensions and Retirement wants to assess the impact of taking employer contributions paid to the PERA P&F Plan on behalf of fire fighters out of the overall equation. In order to do so, we must give them information on the total calendar year employer contributions paid on behalf of police officers and those paid on behalf of fire fighters. Once collected, we will maintain a record of the information we are requesting on the enclosed form. As PERA redesigns its data bases, a position code will be included in each member's individual record for future reference or studies of this type.

The enclosed form lists the names of individuals reported by your city as members of the PERA P&F Plan. Please indicate by each of their names whether they are associated with the fire department or the police department of your city. To help us more easily determine the employer contribution paid on behalf of each individual, please also provide us with the individual's 1995 calendar year PERA-eligible salary. We appreciate your prompt response and ask that you return the completed form to PERA by June 5, 1996.

Recently, in conjunction with the Public Employees Retirement Association (PERA), on November 1, 1996, the Department of Revenue provided the Commission with information for calendar year 1995 on the count of police officers, the count of firefighters, and the cumulative annual salaries for each group. The information represented data that was collected by the Department of Revenue from the various police state aid recipients under the requirements of Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 37.

The information actually reported to the Commission on November 1, 1996, was restricted to those police state aid recipients that employ both police officers and salaried firefighters with Public Employee Police and Fire Fund (PERA-P&F) pension coverage. While that information was very pertinent and helpful, it does not represent the full amount of data collected by the Department of Revenue under Laws 1996, Chapter 390, Section 37. The information on the count of police officers and their cumulative annual salaries for police state aid recipients that do not employ salaried firefighters with PERA-P&F pension coverage may also be pertinent in any Commission examination of the police state aid program, the collection of excess police state aid, and the appropriate use for police state aid allocations.

At your earliest convenience, please provide the Commission with the data on the member of police officers and their cumulative annual salaries for all police state aid recipients not included in the October 31, 1996, report. Please provide the information in a computer-readable format as well as a hard copy format.
