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PSYCHOLOGY BOARD

Clause a: GENERAL STATEMENT OF BOARD ACTIVITIES

This description should cover <u>both</u> FY 97 and FY 98 and include any changes (additions/deletions) in activities between those years.

At the end of the last biennium, the Board had begun the process of rule writing to raise fees to a level which would eliminate the accumulated deficit and provide sufficient revenue to support the future operation of the Board. The fee rules were adopted in two parts.

On August 16, 1996, the Board adopted the fee rules for a special assessment of \$90 for each licensee licensed before September 20, 1996. The special fee was to be sent to the Board on or before March 31, 1997. According to the rule, an \$80 late fee was to be assessed. The balance of that fee rule raised the fee for admission to the national examination to \$100, raised the licensure and renewal fee for licensure as a licensed psychologist to \$375 per biennium, raised the late fees for late renewal of any license to one-half the renewal fee, raised the licensure and renewal fees for licensed psychological practitioner to \$250 per biennium, established fees for application to the professional responsibility examination, for application to convert from master's to doctoral level licensure, and for application for guest licensure. These rules became effective in November, 1996.

The other part of the fee rules established a \$65 per activity fee for the approval of continuing education activities submitted by sponsors. This rule became effective in January, 1997.

Parts of the bill that the Board worked on during the 1996 legislative session, went into effect on August 1, 1996. The sections that were signed into law on April 2, 1996, were listed in the report for the last biennium.

Effective November 1, 1996, the Board offices were moved from its previous location to a new address. The Board of Psychology's offices are housed in the same building as all of the other health Boards in the state. The new address and phone number are:

During the 1997 legislative session, the Board sponsored two bills and collaborated with a professional association on another. The bill which resulted from the collaborative effort changed the licensure requirement for post-degree supervised professional employment from two years to one year. This bill became effective on May 7, 1997. Besides the obvious benefit of the change for doctoral-prepared applicants for licensure, the new law was particularly beneficial in licensing some master's-prepared licensees who may not have completed post-degree employment before the deadline set in the grandparenting law.

The same bill created licensure for volunteer practice for former licensees who are completely retired from the practice of psychology, have no unresolved disciplinary actions in any jurisdiction, and have held a credential to practice psychology at least 15 years in any jurisdiction. Rules will be written to implement this section. In addition, the bill made the following changes; placed in statute the existing practice of allowing individuals whose licensure is based on the equivalent of a master's degree in a doctoral program to use the designation "M.Eq." to identify the educational status on which their licensure is based, along with their level of licensure; added the term "psychological practitioner" to the list of protected titles, thus restricting its use to licensees of the Board, except as exempted for educational and government institutions; and added a provision in law allowing former licensees who completely retire from the practice of psychology to represent themselves as psychologists or psychological practitioners, as long as they do not represent themselves as current licensees of the Board. These additional provisions of the bill became effective on August 1, 1997.

Another so-called "housekeeping" bill, which went into effect on August 1, 1997, contained provisions that makes the language in similar lists of requirements parallel, grammatically speaking, corrected the language in the section allowing licensed psychological practitioners to request a change in their supervision requirements after two years of practice by correctly terming the request a "variance" request, rather than a "waiver" request, and changed the headnote of one section of existing law to be more descriptive of the section's actual content.

A final bill introduced during the 1997 legislative session, did not pass. It contained some language which would have allowed the Board access to certain court records resulting from criminal investigations and adjudications, civil commitment proceedings, and malpractice litigations, would have made the unlicensed practice of psychology a gross misdemeanor instead of a misdemeanor, and would have placed into the Psychology Practice Act good faith immunity for persons reporting to the Board violations of the Act and for persons cooperating with Board investigations. The bill would have also given immunity to the Board, its staff, individuals investigating alleged violations of the Act, and consultants to the Board.

During the Spring and Summer of 1997, the Board underwent a regularly scheduled periodic audit by legislative auditors. The audit made one suggestion having to do with internal operating procedures, one suggestion having to do with computer security, and a final suggestion regarding the collection of the fees charged by the national examination service. The latter suggestion resulted in legislation being sponsored by the group of health-licensing Boards establishing a special account for handling those fees.

In Fiscal Year 1998, the Board authorized its Rules Committee to rewrite all of the Board's rules. The Rules Committee received approval from the Board to assemble a Public Advisory Committee (PAC) to assist with the process by providing to the Committee input on the rules as they are written; this feedback is then taken under advisement by the Rules Committee. The process is expected to be completed during the next biennium.

As the end of Fiscal Year 1998, the Board had collected sufficient revenue to cover its deficit.
