RE: Report On Penalty Assessments under M.S. 609.3241

The Supreme Court was requested to report concerning the use of money collected since fiscal year 1995 from penalty assessments under Minnesota Statutes 609.3241 and used for the purposes described in Minnesota statutes 626.558.

Attached you will find a report of the amounts collected and retained at the county level from 1995 through 1998. Hennepin and Ramsey Counties are the only counties retaining funds for this purpose. This report indicates a total of \$43,188 retained in 1998 by the counties for purposes described by Minnesota Statutes 626.558.

In Ramsey County the monies have been turned over to the county Human Services Department and used in 1998 to support a contract with an organization called Face to Face which provides services to homeless youth, who are at high risk for prostitution.

In Hennepin County the money is turned over to the Community Services Department to fund intervention programs including child protection assessments and emergency shelter activities.
