I. INTRODUCTION

I. INTRODUCTION

In December, 1974, the Minnesota Judicial Council's Select Committee on the Judicial System engaged Arthur Young & Company to assist the Select Committee in its effort to study and improve the judicial system in the State of Minnesota. Specifically, we were asked to perform a study of certain financial aspects of the operations of the State's court system. The agreed upon objectives of the study were to:

- . Estimate the revenues to and expenditures by the various counties for the operations of the District, County and Municipal Courts in the State. This estimate is meant to serve as a basis for the development of future operational budgets.
- Recommend a uniform reporting format which could be used by the District and County Courts to transmit annual financial information to the state level, while the fiscal responsibility remains at the county level.

This report represents the results of our study and we feel accomplishes those objectives. It is comprised of two sections, dealing with the separate objectives in turn.

II. ESTIMATED REVENUE AND EXPENDITURES

Approach

General Summary

We determined that the best estimate of the finances involved in the operation of the court system would result from obtaining actual financial data from the counties for the year ending December 31, 1974. To accomplish this, we developed a Financial Information Questionnaire which we distributed to Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in each of the 87 counties.

The questionnaire requested detailed information on the receipts and expenditures of the District and County Court¹ systems in each of the counties for the year ending December 31, 1974.

The returned questionnaires were reviewed for reporting inconsistencies or irregularities which were then resolved through telephone communications with the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators who completed them. Time and budget constraints did not allow us to verify the accuracy of the information reported by the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators. We have relied upon them to have obtained accurate information from their financial records and to have reported it in the manner requested.

Questionnaire Development

The questionnaire we developed was very specific in the manner in which it requested the information to be reported. This was for two reasons:

¹In Hennepin and Ramsey Counties, information was requested on the District, Municipal and Probate Court systems.

No uniform, state-wide definition existed specifying what operations were to be included in the "court system." The operations which one county considered as part of its court system were not necessarily those that another county included. Specifically, the treatment of such expenditure items as legal defense of indigents, court services, and bailiffs' and matrons' salaries varied significantly.

To merely request that the various counties provide us with summary financial information on the court systems as they defined them would have resulted in uncomparable data being reported from one county to the next. It would have been easier to ask for information in this fashion, and it would certainly have been easier for the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators to provide it, but the resulting information would have been subject to greater uncertainty.

. We wanted financial information reported in a manner which would be of greatest use to the Select Committee, the Chief Justice and the State Court Administrator as a management tool. Summary financial information on the operations of the courts at the county level would be of some benefit to this objective, but far greater benefit would result from a knowledge of the detailed figures comprising the summary data.

In developing our questionnaire, we identified all receipt and expenditure categories which appeared relevant to the court system. This was accomplished by reviewing the revenue and

expenditure reports of the Hennepin and Ramsey Counties' court systems and consulting with District Court Administrators, Ruth S. Eppeland and A. Milton Johnson, concerning their knowledge of the operations of the courts in the smaller counties.

The resulting list of receipt and expenditure categories was then formulated into the Financial Information Questionnaire. Prior to its distribution, the questionnaire was reviewed by Mr. Austin Anderson, Project Director for the Select Committee; Mr. Richard E. Klein, State Court Administrator; and Mr. Milton Wideen, Director of County Audits for the Office of State Auditor.

The Financial Information Questionnaire is shown as Appendix A of this report.

Questionnaire Distribution

The questionnaire was distributed on a test basis to the Clerks of Court in Judicial Districts 5 and 8 to gauge its data gathering effectiveness prior to distribution to all counties throughout the State. With minimal modification based on the above, it was formally distributed to the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in each of the 87 counties on January 31, 1975.

On-Site Visitations

On-site visitations were made to the offices of the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in the Hennepin County District and Municipal Courts and the Ramsey County District and Municipal Courts. This was done in order to more fully explain the purpose of the questionnaire to insure the accuracy of the data reported from these statistically significant counties.

Data Presentation

Exhibits I through XI summarize the financial data reported by the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators on the operations of the courts in the various counties during 1974. In several counties, the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators were unable to provide us with the actual revenue and expense figures for 1974, and were forced to make year-end estimates based on previous year or incomplete 1974 activity. In addition, the Clerks of Court of St. Louis and Crow Wing did not respond to our questionnaire and no information is reported for these two counties.

For ease of understanding, we chose to display the information in summary fashion rather than to show detailed line entries for each of the categories for which information was reported in the Financial Information Questionnaire (Appendix A). The purpose of collecting the information was to determine estimates of the overall revenues and expenditures of the total court systems. We feel the presentation of the information in a detailed fashion is unnecessary for this purpose and would serve only to confuse interpretation of the data.

If knowledge of the detailed information reported by the 87 counties for each of the categories shown on the Financial Information Questionnaire is desired, copies of the worksheets summarizing this information by county can be obtained from the Select Committee Staff Office.

Revenue And Expenditure Categories

The revenue and expenditure categories used in Exhibits I through XI are defined below in the order in which they appear in the exhibits:

District Court Revenue:

 Fees (Case Related) - This category includes total fees received by District Court for such case-related services as:

- Filing of papers pertinent to civil cases (including any amount designated to the Law Library Fund).
- Filing of appeals.
- Issuance of subpoenas.
- Issuance of certified copies of court documents.
- Performance of judgment searches and issuance of certificates.
- NOTE: Fees received for the performance of judgment searches were reported separately by some counties. We do not know if those counties which did not report them separately did so because they did not collect the fees or because their record systems did not permit them to separate this information.
- . Fines And Forfeitures This category includes:
 - Total fine payments received by District Court (including any amount designated to the Sheriff's Contingency Fund).
 - Total bail forfeited to District Court.
- Fees (Noncase Related) This category includes the total fee payments received in District Court for such noncase-related services as:
 - Issuance of marriage licenses.
 - Issuance of certified copies of vital records (marriage, birth and death certificates).
 - Issuance of driver's licenses. Only that portion retained by the county is included.
 - Recording for public record such items as business name, notarial commissions, pro-fessional certificates, etc.
 - Issuance of U.S. Passports (only that portion retained by the county is included).

- Other Receipts This category includes total payments received by District Court for reasons not specified in any of the above categories. Among these receipts are:
 - Payments received for providing legal defense of indigents.

County Court Revenue:

- Fees (Case Related) This category includes total fee payments received by County Court for:
 - Filing of papers pertinent to civil cases (including any amount designated to the Law Library Fund).
 - Filing of probate matters.
 - Filing of conciliation claims and counterclaims.
 - Filing of appeals.
 - Issuance of subpoenas.
 - Issuance of certified copies of court documents (civil, criminal, conciliation, juvenile, probate).
 - Performance of judgment searches and issuances of certificates.
 - Adoption fees.
 - Fines And Forfeitures (County's Share Only) -This category includes the <u>county's share</u> of fine payments and bail/bond forfeitures received in County Court for cases involving:
 - Criminal violations. This would also include any fines imposed by Juvenile Court and any amounts received designated to the Sheriff's Contingency Fund.

- Traffic violations (moving and parking). This would also include any court cost payments received pursuant to M.S. Section 487.31.
- Ordinance violations.
- Game and fish violations.
- Watercraft violations.
- NOTE: Only that portion of total fines and forfeitures received in County Court which is retained by the county is included in this category. The amounts received in County Court which are in turn passed through to state agencies or municipal governments are excluded.
 - Other Receipts This category includes total payments received by County Court for reasons not specified in any of the above categories. Among these receipts are:
 - Payments received for providing legal defense to indigents.
 - Payments received for performing medical or psychiatric examinations in conjunction with legal proceedings.

Expenditures - District And County Courts (Combined):

- <u>NOTE</u>: District and County Court expenditure information is presented as combined totals due to the inability of many of the counties to segregate the information by court.
 - Salaries And Fees This includes total salaries and fees paid by the county to full and parttime District and County Court personnel in the following position categories:
 - Judges. This includes County Court Judges in 85 counties, and Municipal and Probate Court Judges in Hennepin and Ramsey Counties.

Supplemental salary payments made to District Court Judges by Hennepin and Ramsey Counties are also included as are payments made by any of the counties to retired judges or their families.

- Parajudicial. This includes Court Referees, Hearing Officers, Judicial Officers (M.S. Section 487.08); Court Commissioners (M.S. Section 489.01; and Law Clerks who act as legal researchers for judges.
- Reporters. This includes both District and County Court Reporters and free-lance contractors employed to provide court reporting services.
- Administrative and clerical. This includes the Clerk of Court, Court Administrator, Court Deputies, and any other office or clerical personnel comprising the staff of either the Clerk of Court or Court Administrator.
- Fringe Benefits This includes total fringe benefits paid by the court to District and County Court Judges, Reporters, Parajudicial, and Administrative and Clerical personnel, as defined above. Fringe benefits include such items as the county's contributions to FICA, PERA, and health and life insurance plans.
- NOTE: The financial data reported on the questionnaire varied significantly from county to county for this category. It appears that many counties maintain records of fringe benefit payments only for the aggregate of all county employees and were unable to report this information for the court employees alone. It seems likely that in numerous counties the expenditures reported for this category are incomplete.
 - <u>Operational Expenses</u> This category encompasses total other fees and expenses paid by the county for operation of District and

County Courts. This includes, but is not limited to, expenditures for the following reasons:

- Juror fees and expenses.
- Witness fees and expenses.
- Travel, lodging and subsistence allowances paid court personnel.
- Communications expenses (telephone, telegraph, postage).
- Equipment rentals.
- Printing and binding of forms and documents.
- Office supplies.
- Subscriptions and dues.
- Expenses related to attendance of conferences and seminars by court personnel.
- Bond premiums for court personnel.
- <u>Capital Outlay</u> This comprises total expenditures made by the county for the purchase of capital items including:
 - Equipment.
 - Furniture and fixtures.
 - Facilities and/or improvements thereto.
 - Law Library books.
- Facilities Rental Expense This includes total expenditures made by the county to private firms or other government agencies for rental of facilities used in the operation of the court system.
- <u>NOTE</u>: These expenditures do not represent the facilities use costs of the District and County Court systems. They are only those

amounts paid as rents for those counties that rent facilities. Because most counties do not rent court system facilities and allocations of the cost to the county of owning those facilities are not readily determinable, the facilities rental expenditures are shown as a separate category from Operational Expenses to preserve comparability of the data from county to county.

- <u>Utilities Expense</u> This includes total expenditures made by the county to provide utility services to the District and County Court system.
- NOTE: Many of the counties were unable to report this expense separately for the court system due to the fact that records were only maintained for the county as a whole. For those counties that were able to report, the information is presented in this separate category to preserve comparability of the data from county to county.
 - Repair And Maintenance Expense This includes total expenditures made by the county for repair and maintenance of buildings, furniture and equipment used in the operation of the court system. Custodial service expenses are included in this category.
- NOTE: Many of the counties were unable to report this expense separately for the court system due to the fact that records were only maintained for the county as a whole. For those counties that were able to report, the information is presented in the separate category to preserve comparability of the data from county to county.
 - Bailiffs And Matrons-Salaries And Fees This category includes total salaries, fringe benefits and fees paid by county to provide

bailiffs and matrons during District and County Court proceedings.

- Legal Defense Of Indigents-Total Expenses -This category includes total expenditures made by the county in order to provide legal defense for indigents in cases heard in both District and County Court. These expenditures include:
 - Salaries and fringe benefits paid to the Public Defender and staff.
 - Other expenses paid in conjunction with proper operation of Public Defender's Office.
 - Fees and expenses paid to court-appointed attorneys (in lieu of Public Defender).
 - Any other expenses incurred in providing legal defense of indigents. Costs of preparation of transcripts would be one such expense.
- <u>Court Services-Total Expenses</u> This category includes total salaries, fringe benefits, fees and/or expenses paid by the county in order to provide court-ordered services or reports to District and County Court. These services include probation services, presentence investigations, medical examinations, divorce counseling, diversion programs, juvenile and domestic histories, psychiatric reports, interpreting services.
- NOTE: The figures reported for this category varied significantly from county to county. We do not know if this variance is due to expenditure variations or reporting variations by the Clerks of Court and/or Court

Administrators. Since many of these expenditures are not considered part of the court system's budget in the county, it seems quite possible that the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators did not report them. It appears likely that in various counties the expenditures reported for this category are incomplete.

State Of Minnesota Expenditures For District <u>Court Judges</u> - This category represents total expenditures made by the State to District Court Judges. These expenditures include salaries, fringe benefits, FICA contributions by the State, and judges' expenses reimbursed by the State.

NOTE: These figures were obtained from records of the State Court Administrator's Office.

Exhibits

Exhibits I through XI, which appear on the following pages, present the county revenue and expenditure for the court systems in Minnesota for 1974. As has been previously stated, the information presented represents that reported by the various Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators via the Financial Information Questionnaire. The figures have not been verified, and we express no opinion concerning the degree to which they fairly present operations of the Minnesota court system. They are meant to represent estimates of the revenues and expenditures associated with the operations of the State's court systems.

Exhibit I displays the county revenue and expenditures for the court systems included in the ten judicial districts, as well as the state-wide total. A line category showing the State expenditures for the ten District Courts is also displayed below the county totals. Exhibits II through XI depict the county revenues and expenditures for the courts in the counties comprising each of the ten judicial districts and the district totals.

III. FINANCIAL REPORTING FORM

To satisfy the objective of recommending a uniform financial reporting format, we have developed a financial information reporting form to be utilized by the Minnesota court system. The form will provide a uniform means of reporting financial information on the operations of the county level courts to the state level. We recommend that it be prepared and submitted annually by the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in the various counties and that they work closely with their County Auditors in obtaining the requested information.

The form is intended primarily to obtain information on the county revenues and expenditures of the courts. In addition, it will allow the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators to provide information on the municipal and state revenue which results from District and County Court receipts. This is the portion of fines and fees received at the county level but which is passed through to the municipalities and the state.

The form was designed to be compatible with the county financial record systems for the courts, as recommended by the Office of the State Auditor (formerly the Department of Public Examiner).² It also is similar to the reporting formats required by the Statewide Accounting System as described in the <u>Accounting</u> <u>Procedures Statewide Accounting Manual</u>. This would facilitate the conversion of the courts to that system should this ever become necessary.

We have made provisions for separate data to be reported for District Court and County Court, if possible. We recommend that this not be insisted upon for all expenditure categories, as it may not be possible in certain counties without significant modifications to their bookkeeping system. We have made provisions whereby a combined total for both courts could alternatively be reported.

An explanation of the Financial Reporting Form precedes the presentation of the form in this report. This explanation is intended to be distributed to the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators along with the form. Its primary purpose is to explain the form to them and to aid them in properly completing the form.

MINNESOTA COURT SYSTEM FINANCIAL REPORTING FORM EXPLANATION

The Financial Reporting Form has been designed as a means of allowing the Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in 87 counties to report annual financial information to the State Court Administrator on a uniform basis.

The form is comprised of three sections or "statements." They are entitled "Statement Of Revenue For District Court," "Statement Of Revenue For County Court" and "Statement Of Expenditures For District And County Courts."

Although the latter two statements refer only to "County Court," they are also applicable for use in reporting revenue and expenditure information for the Municipal and Probate Courts which exist in Hennepin and Ramsey Counties. The Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators of the Probate and Municipal Courts should consider any reference to "County Court" as being a reference to their respective court.

On the following pages you will find, sections of the reporting form with definitions inserted after each revenue or expenditure category, specifying the information to be reported in each category. At the end of each large section, i.e., "Statement Of Revenue For District Court," "Statement Of Revenue For County Court" and "Statement Of Expenditures For District And County Courts," is a completed sample of that section. A blank reporting form is then provided for your use as a worksheet for your county.

The "Statement Of Revenue For District Court" provides a format for reporting county revenue resulting from receipts of the District Court during the year. It should be noted that it is to be a report of county revenue from District Court receipts, <u>not</u> of District Court receipts. The distinction is that some funds received by the District Court are not county revenue. For example, bail posted in District Court is a receipt of the court, but it is not considered county revenue unless or until it is forfeited. On Line 5, only the amount forfeited to the county is to be reported. Likewise, the total fees received for driver's licenses and U.S. Passports are not all county revenue, only a portion of it is. On Lines 10 and 11, however, we do request that the total amount of these fees received be reported in the space provided in addition to that portion of it which is revenue to the county.

The revenue categories are grouped into two sections, those which are related to District Court cases and those which are not. These revenue categories are defined below. In all definitions, the term "District Court" refers only to the District Court for the county preparing the report.

District Court Revenue -Case Related

1 Civil Division Fees

<u>Civil Division Fees</u> include all fees collected by District Court in conjunction with civil court actions. Such fees include but are not limited to filing fees, subpoena fees, and fees for certified copies of case documents.

2 Law Library Fees

Law Library Fees include all fees collected by District Court for credit to the county's Law Library Fund, if such a fund has been established by the county.

3 Judgment Search Fees

Judgment Search Fees include all fees collected by District Court for performance of judgment searches and the issuance of certificates thereto. \$_____

4 Court Fines

<u>Court Fines</u> represent all fines collected by District Court. These fines include any amounts received which are applied to the Sheriff's Contingency Fund and any bail funds which are applied as payments against fines imposed by the court.

5 Bail Forfeitures (Amount forfeited only)

> Bail Forfeitures include that amount of total bail deposits in District Court which is forfeited to the county because of the defendant's failure to appear or because of his abandonment of the funds, according to M.S. Section 487.32.

6 Legal Service Fees

Legal Service Fees include the total amount of fees collected by District Court to defray the county's expenses of providing legal services to indigent defendants. 7 Other Case Related Revenue (Specify)

This statement provides a format for reporting county expenditures for the operation of the District and County Courts during the year. For each of the expenditure categories identified, space is provided to report that portion which is applicable to District Court operations, that portion which is applicable to County Court operations, and the combined total. The allocation of the combined total between the respective District and County Court shares need only be reported if the information is readily available from the county's financial records. When it is not available, it is only necessary to provide information for the combined total.

The expenditure categories are grouped into four of the major object classifications prescribed for the counties' financial record maintenance by the Office of the State Auditor: "Personal Services," "Other Services And Charges," "Supplies" and "Capital Outlay."

PERSONAL SERVICES

<u>Personal Services</u> categorizes those expenditures paid to and for county employees as compensation for the services they perform. These include salaries and wages, employment costs and fringe benefits.

Salaries And Wages

Salaries And Wages include total gross salaries and wages paid by the county to regular and temporary employees of the County and District Courts. Court employee position categories are specified in (43) through (51). The total amounts paid to all individuals classified by these position categories are to be reported. These amounts should represent the particular county's share of salaries and wages paid. For example, in a multi-county judicial district, the amount reported for court reporters in (45) under District Court (Column 1) should represent only that portion of the total court reporters' salaries which is the expense of the particular county submitting the report. If one county in the district pays the salary and is reimbursed by the other counties comprising the district, the correct amount for that county to report would be only its proportionate share of the total salary. Judicial Officers And Court Referees who are salaried, county employees. If these individuals are paid on a fee basis, the payment should be reported in Line 64.

45 Court Reporters

<u>Court Reporters</u> in County and District Courts who are salaried employees paid by the county. If free-lance reporters paid on a fee basis are used, the amount paid should be reported in Line 60.

46 Clerk Of Court Or Court Administrator

<u>Clerk Of Court Or Court Administrator</u> if the latter is the chief administrative officer of the court system in the county.

Public Defender And Staff Personnel includes all salaried employees of the Public Defender's Office. These salaries need only be reported if the Public Defender's Office is considered part of the court system's budget. Fees charged by courtappointed attorneys who are not salaried employees of the county should be reported in Line 61.

50 Court Services Personnel (If part of court budget)

Court Services Personnel includes any salaried employee of the county who provides such services as probation, pre-sentence investigation, medical examinations, divorce counseling, diversion programs, juvenile and domestic histories, psychiatric reports, foreign language interpretations, etc. These salaries need only be reported if the individuals performing them are considered "court personnel" and are part of the court budget of the county.

INTRODUCTION

These questionnaires are being sent to Clerks of Court and/or Court Administrators in each county in Minnesota. The aggregate of data provided through the questionnaire will thus furnish us with an estimate of the financial operations of the total court system in Minnesota.

Questionnaires requesting financial information have undoubtedly been received by you in prior years. The information which resulted from these questionnaires has been of limited usefulness, however, because the composition of much of the data reported was unknown. The reporting systems utilized by the various counties were dissimilar, having been developed independently, and it was not clear if comparable data were reported from county to county.

The questionnaire we are asking you to complete is more specific in the manner in which it categorizes information to be reported. It will, therefore, provide well-defined information which will be of much greater use to us in making decisions aimed at improving the functioning of the court system in the state.

More detailed information may be requested than you are accustomed to reporting, or information may be requested on activities which your county does not classify as part of the court budget (e.g.: Public Defender's Office Expenses). Every effort should, nonetheless, be made to obtain the information in the detail and form requested, even if you do not consider it part of the court's operation. This will probably require that you consult your County Auditor (or other County official) to assist you in gathering the appropriate information.

If you find that the information is not obtainable in the detail or form requested, show what is available and indicate the discrepancies. If no information is available or if the category is not applicable to the court system in your county, please so indicate. Understand that this questionnaire attempts to account for all situations which may exist in the various counties throughout the state. Not all categories will apply to every county. We realize that the detailed nature of this questionnaire will probably require much effort on your part to provide the information as requested. We feel, however, that this information is essential for our study purposes. The contribution you can make will be of lasting benefit to our court system and is in the best interest of us all. 


