FSB is a temporary program to continue UC benefits to claimants who have exhausted their regular entitlement and their Extended Benefit entitlement. Benefits of \$21,874,618 were paid in 1976 under this program which started in February 1975.

Federal Supplemental Benefits - Extended

FSB-E is a temporary program to continue UC benefits to claimants who have exhausted their Federal Supplemental Benefits. Benefits of \$12,607,623 were paid in 1976 under this program which started in April 1975.

Supplemental Unemployment Assistance Program

SUA is a temporary program to pay UC benefits to workers without sufficient covered work to qualify for normal benefits. Benefits of \$3,3,6,346 were paid in 1976.
