1. ABA BANKING JOURNAL. Journal of the American Banking Association. Monthly.

Major publication in the banking field containing feature articles on every aspect of finance and banking. Contains announcements and association news. Report on state and federal legislation and related actions. Calendar.

SUB: FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

2. AFL-CIO AMERICAN FEDERATIONIST. American Federation of Labor and Congress of Industrial Organizations. Monthly.

The official publication of the AFL-CIO. Articles deal with topics of interest to members. Recent articles covered bargaining issues, health insurance, as well as discussions of solar energy education, and the American Nazi party. Issues contain book reviews.

SUB: LABOR

3. ACROSS THE BOARD. The Conference Board. Monthly.

Contains multi-disciplinary articles with business orientation. Recent issues have included articles entitled, "Should Scientists Play God?," "...But How About Equal Pay For Equal Work? Should Housepainters Make More Than Nurses?," "Fewer People Are Murdered In All Of Japan Each Year Than In New York City. The Reasons Are Rich In Irony," "Energy In Transition," and "A Debate On Social Security 2." Recurrent features: Consumers, Book Reviews, Commentary, and Letters.

4. AERO SUN-TIMES. Alternative Energy Resources Organization. Monthly.

An informal journal covering subjects relating to all aspects of energy conservation. Lately articles on weather, railroads, alcohol fuels, and ozone have appeared. Regular features include events, book reviews, "Down On The Farm," and "Energy Frontline."

 AGENDA: A JOURNAL OF HISPANIC ISSUES. National Council of La Raza. Bi-monthly.

This is the bi-monthly magazine of La Raza, which presents it "as a forum for issues particularly affecting Hispanic Americans."

Recent articles: "Cubans Turn To The U. S. For Refuge," "Hispanics In Engineering - A Status Report," and "The Literature Of Mexico."

Regularly contains articles on the arts, business, and a calendar of events. Articles are presented in Spanish as well as in English.

 ALTERNATIVE SOURCES OF ENERGY. Alternative Sources of Energy, Inc. Milaca, MN. Bi-monthly.

ASE is a forum for the discussion of alternative technologies in the areas of energy, agriculture, architecture, transportation, and communications. In recent months, feature articles have included discussions of window insulation, solar hot water, and underground buildings. Readers are encouraged to contribute and freely exchange information. Recurrent features: book reviews, notes on purchase of equipment, questions and answers. Also includes notices of classes, seminars, and conferences.

7. AMERICAN BAR ASSOCIATION JOURNAL. American Bar Association. Monthly.

Regular features include editorials, a poll of members of the legal community on various topics, review of legislation affecting attorneys, and book reviews. Articles cover a broad range of legal and law-related topics - recent examples include "Lawyers, Law and Baseball," "Uniform Condominium Act," and "Can The ERA Be Saved?"

SUB: LAW & LEGAL PROFESSION

8. AMERICAN DEMOGRAPHICS. American Demographics, Inc. Monthly.

Most articles describe the potential effects of demographic changes on problems, programs, and policies; others deal with statistical measurement and methodology. Topics covered recently include the growing power of women, the changing composition of urban population, apportionment, and characteristics of criminal victims. Regular departments; essays, books, and an index.

SUB: DEMOGRAPHICS PLANNING STATISTICS

9. AMERICAN EDUCATION. U. S. Education Department. 10 times a year.

Reflects the federal interest in all levels of education. Typical issues contained articles on student loans, educational television, special education, and federal funding of community colleges. Each issue contains "Statistic Of The Month," e. g. "Selected Characteristics Of Student Aid Recipients, 1976-77."

10. AMERICAN JOURNAL OF PUBLIC HEALTH. American Public Health Association. Monthly.

Issues contain editorials on topics of interest to members such as extending life expectancy, child care, venereal disease, and health care consumers. Most articles elaborate on some aspect of an editorial topic. Recurrent feature: book reviews.

11. AMERICAN LEGION MAGAZINE. American Legion. Monthly.

Many articles on military history, issues, and personalities. Emphasis on problems particular to veterans. Recent issues have contained features on career education and resources as well as program and policy statements of the Legion and summaries of news items of concern to members. The magazine often contains a section in which Congressmen present pros and cons of issues such as "Should The District Of Columbia Have Full Representation," or "Should The Federal Government Make Retribution To Crime Victims." Also material on topics of general interest: water, energy, etc.

12. AMERICAN LIBRARIES. American Library Association. 11 times a year.

Contains library news and articles on policy, programs, personalities, administration, and finance.

SUB: LIBRARY & INFORMATION SCIENCES

13. ARBITRATION JOURNAL. American Arbitration Association. Quarterly.

Material designed to promote "the resolution of disputes of all kinds through the use of arbitration, mediation, democratic elections and other voluntary methods." Articles have included "Recent Trends In Resolving Interpersonal, Community and Environmental Disputes," "Arbitrating Sex Harassment Cases," "The Influence Of Labor-Management Relations On The Settlement Of Agricultural Disputes." Regular features: "Library Acquisitions," "Review Of Court Decisions," "Book Review," and "Editorial Comment."

PUBLIC EMPLOYEES

 ARCHITECTURE MINNESOTA. Minnesota Society of the American Institute of Architects. Bi-monthly.

Articles on a variety of architectural, building, and design topics. Recent issues contain discussions of a gasohol plant in Minnesota, construction forecasts, and approaches to renovation in Minneapolis. Recurrent features: book reviews and society news.

15. ASSESSORS JOURNAL. International Association of Assessing Officers. Quarterly.

Articles directed toward assessing practices and the promotion of justice and equity in the distribution of the tax burden. Most articles deal with property taxation and assessment administration and are technical in nature.

16. THE ATLANTIC. Atlantic Monthly Company. Monthly.

A popular general interest magazine.

17. BENCH AND BAR. Minnesota Bar Association. Monthly.

Official publication of the Minnesota Bar Association. Includes feature articles on some aspect of current Minnesota law or legislation. Contains association news and events, continuing legal education course information, and summaries of decisions. Topical articles such as state benefits for crime victims, patient costs, or alcohol, death and young drivers are covered in the General Practice Section.

SUB: LAW & LEGAL PROFESSION

18. BETTER ROADS: THE NEWS MAGAZINE FOR GOVERNMENT ROAD & STREET OFFICIALS, ENGINEERS & CONTRACTORS. William O. Dannhausen, editor. Monthly.

Articles on all aspects of road construction, maintenance, funding, legislation, and regulation.

SUB: HIGHWAYS & ROADS

19. BUILDING OFFICIAL AND CODE ADMINISTRATOR: THE VOICE OF CODE IN ENFORCEMENT.
Building Officials and Code Administrators International. Monthly.

A forum for the expression of views and presentation of information on building codes and their administration, construction techniques, and standards, etc. A recent report dealt with the relationship of building codes to housing costs and made specific recommendations to HUD regarding code requirements, housing standards, wind loads, regionwide enforcement. Handling of some material is rather technical. Information of federal and state legislation and regulations as well as association news.

SUB: CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY HOUSING

20. BULLETIN OF THE ATOMIC SCIENTISTS: A Magazine of Science and Public Affairs. Education Foundation for Nuclear Science. Monthly.

Primary concern is the maintenance of international peace and attainment of nuclear non-proliferation. Articles also deal with energy, genetics, climate, disease, nutrition, or almost any scientific or technical topic having public policy implications.

SUB: POWER RESOURCES

21. BUSINESS WEEK. McGraw-Hill. Weekly.

A popular general interest magazine.

SUB: BUSINESS & COMMERCE

22. CPI DETAILED REPORT. U. S. Department of Labor. Bureau of Labor Statistics. Monthly.

A report on consumer price movements including statistical tables and technical notes. Tables include: Consumer Price Index by expenditure categories and for selected areas. Issues contain explanatory and technical notes on the recent Consumer Price Index revision.

SUB: ECONOMIC CONDITIONS -- STATISTICS

23. CUED COMMENTARY. National Council for Urban Economic Development. Quarterly.

CUED links public and private efforts in local assistance, communications, pragmatic research and professional interchange in this field.

Commentary carries articles on issues which have impact on the economic development of cities, for instance, the environment vs. development controversy, historic preservation, neighborhood revitalization, taxation, etc. Also lists CUED publications.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

24. CALIFORNIA JOURNAL. California Center for Research and Education in Government. Monthly.

The major journal of California politics and public policy describes itself as "a non-partisan, non-ideological analysis of California government and politics established in 1970 and published monthly by the California Center for Research and Education in Government." Recent articles: "Transportation 1990," "Policing The Police," and "The Changing Face Of Farming." Regular features include "Perspective From Washington," "Newsmakers," "Signed" (a summary of recently enacted legislation), and editorials. Indexed quarterly with annual cumulations.

SUB: LEGISLATURES STATE GOVERNMENT

25. CHANGE: The Magazine of Learning. Council on Learning. Monthly.

Deals with the problems, personalities, programs, and plans relating to all aspects of higher education. All articles pertain in some way to post-secondary education, but many have broader appeal. Topics covered recently include Proposition 13, academic tenure, student finance. Recurrent features: editorials, science policy, Washington, and book reviews.

 THE CHRISTIAN CENTURY: An Ecumenical Weekly. Christian Century Foundation. Weekly.

> Articles concern the church and society & recently much about the 'new evangelical right" and the separation of church and state. Book and film reviews.

27. CHRONICLE OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Chronicle of Higher Education, Inc. Weekly.

Concerned with every aspect of higher education, this publication contains excellent statistical material and much on state problems and policies, legislation, and rules affecting higher education. Recent features have included "On Campus, The Biggest Drug Is Alcohol," "Comparative Statistics," "The Wealth And Taxes In 50 States," and "Increased State Support For Higher Education."

SUB: EDUCATION -- HIGHER

28. CHURCH AND STATE. Americans United for Separation of Church and State.

Monthly.

An independent, interfaith journal intended to provide "coverage and analysis of developments, legislation, litigation trends, and books affecting our most basic liberty." Editorial policy defending and advancing liberty and church-state separation. Contains material not available elsewhere.

SUB: CHURCH & STATE CIVIL RIGHTS

CIVIL RIGHTS DIGEST see PERSPECTIVES: A CIVIL RIGHTS QUARTERLY.

29. COMMERCIAL WEST: The Magazine of Banking and Business. Financial Communications, Inc., Edina, MN. Semi-monthly.

Each issue contains only a few short articles. Recent titles have included: "Iowa Business Trends," "Inflation Still The Greatest Threat To The Free Enterprise System," and "It Ain't Actuarially So." Recurrent features: "Bank Notes," "ADA News," "Insurance News," "Bonds And Municipal Finance."

SUB: BUSINESS & COMMERCE FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

30. COMMON CAUSE. Common Cause. Bi-monthly.

A publication of the well-known "Citizen lobby organization" contains articles and information on federal, state, and local political issues, and government policies and practices. Attention is also given to select legislation and regulatory practices. Regular features include: "Feedback," "Viewpoint," selected Senate and House votes, "In The States," and "Tracking Common Cause Issues." Continues Frontline and In Common.

SUB: POLITICS

31. COMMONSENSE: A Republican Journal of Thought and Opinion. Republican National Committee. Quarterly.

This journal was first published in summer 1978. Articles in the initial volume include Bob Packwood on tuition tax credits, James Buckley on federalism, Laurence Silberman on sunset laws and Michael Novak on the Republican party and "ordinary people." Book reviews.

32. COMPACT. Education Commission of the States. Quarterly.

News and feature articles on issues and personalities involved at all levels of education. Contributions by elected officials, educators, and public administrators. Recent articles have included "Competency Based Education," "Declining Enrollments," and "Taking Stock In California: Proposition 13." Also includes book reviews and Commission news.

Recent issues covered airline desegregation, welfare reform, the beverage container problem, mandatory retirement age, and national health insurance. Contributors are Congressmen and representatives of groups affected by the controversies.

 CONGRESSIONAL QUARTERLY WEEKLY REPORT. Congressional Quarterly, Inc. Weekly.

Well-known comprehensive and dependable periodical. Examines issues before Congress as well as providing election analysis and political coverage. Recent topics have included discussion of the reorganization plan, health care costs, urban economic developments, arms control, voting studies, conservative coalition's strength and an entire issue presented profiles on new members. Excellent statistics and tables. Recurrent features: roll call votes. Often includes material on executive programs and personalities.

SUB: FEDERAL GOVERNMENT LEGISLATION PUBLIC AFFAIRS

35. CONSERVATIONIST. New York State Department of Environmental Conservation. Bi-monthly.

This periodical is designed to inform the general public on various topics of environmental concern. Contains short articles and many photographs and drawings of wildlife. Recent issues included: "An Update On Waterfowl Management In NYS," "Deer: Farmer's Friend Or Foe?," and "Land Access For Hunting." Recurrent features: column answering readers' inquiries, book reviews and an earth almanac.

SUB: ENVIRONMENT

36. CONSUMER REPORTS. Consumers Union. Monthly.

The well-known periodical that tells you how good the tuna is or which battery booster cables to purchase, also addresses consumer issues, including mortgage rates, mail fraud, insurance costs, the medical profession, unnecessary surgery, drug use, and abuse.

37. CORPORATE REPORT. Dorn Corporation. Monthly.

Each issue contains articles featuring individuals, industries, issues and events of interest to members of the Midwest business community.

38. CORRECTIONS MAGAZINE. Bi-monthly.

A bi-monthly publication devoted to the "changing prison system." Recently articles included "Community Correction," "Should Women Guards Work In Prisons For Men," and "Brubaker': Making A Myth Out Of A Mortal Man." Regular features: "Letters," "News Briefs," "Upcoming Events," and "Resource Guide."

SUB: CRIME & CRIMINALS LAW ENFORCEMENT

39. CREDIT. National Consumer Finance Association. Bi-monthly.

Contains feature articles relating to new developments, legislation, and other topics in the area of consumer finance. Recent issues included: "FTC Preempts State Law," "Revolving Credit Works In Arizona - Unique Delivery System Provides Fast Convenient Service," and "Why Have A Written Report? Effective Reporting Improves Communication." Recurrent features: calendar of events and a news summary.

SUB: CONSUMER AFFAIRS FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

40. DATA USER NEWS. U. S. Department of Commerce. Bureau of the Census. Monthly.

A newsletter for users of Census Bureau statistics. Includes highlights, changes, and explanations of census data. Lists selected new publications by the Census Bureau.

SUB: DEMOGRAPHICS STATISTICS

41. DISCOVER: The News Magazine of Science. Time, Inc. Monthly.

A new (1980) periodical designed to acquaint to "educated laymen" with developments and trends in the sciences. Topics treated recently include: hurricanes, mental illness, "creationism," solar astronomy, senility, and computer graphics. Regular features include: letters, news briefs, "People," opinion, and book reviews.

SUB: SCIENCE & TECHNOLOGY

Feature articles often deal with legislative, legal, or regulatory aspects of engineering and construction operations and projects. Much material on transportation systems, utilities, and energy.

51. ENVIRONMENT. Helen Dwight Reed Educational Foundation and Scientist's Institute for Public Information. Monthly.
