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GENERAL STATEMENT

This report contains a series of tables showing CETA program activities for fiscal year 1980. There are three tables for each CETA program - program expenditures, performance of CETA services, and characteristics of the clients served by the ten (10) prime sponsors.

Most of the data in this report was derived from copies of the Department of Labor (DOL) reports submitted by CETA prime sponsors for the period of October 1, 1979 through September 30, 1980. Data is reported on a cumulative basis.

Some of the characteristics of CETA participants represent a combination of items reported on the DOL form, "Quarterly Summary of Participant Characteristics".

There are a few caveats for those reading this report. First, all data is cumulative, unless otherwise specified. Second, caution should be exercised in drawing specific conclusions based on information in this report. Additional demographic labor market and program design information should be considered in evaluating the effectiveness of all or any part of the program. Specific concerns and questions should be directed to the individual CETA prime sponsor (see Appendix A).

MINNESOTA SUMMARY

General

Minnesota prime sponsors provided services to 54,448 total participants^{1/} during fiscal year (FY) 1980. Of these participants, 15,050 were carried over from the previous fiscal year, 1979. Total expenditures exceeded \$81.1 million in FY 1980. This is an average cost of \$1,260 per participant served. Administrative expenditures accounted for an additional \$231 per participant.

The number of people who used CETA services were down in comparison with the previous fiscal year. This is shown in Chart #1 below. Total participants declined by 12.1 percent in FY 1980 from the 61,970 participants in FY 1979 and expenditures decreased by 20.6 percent.

Chart #1 also shows the changes in individual programs for the fourth quarters of FY 1979 and FY 1980. Note the sharp decline in participants and expenditures for Title VI in FY '80 where most public service employment occurs.

^{1/}The total participant figure overstates the actual number of people in all programs. CETA clients can transfer from one program to another within the same prime sponsor. Therefore, some individuals are counted two or more times as participants. In order to arrive at a more "unique" count of individuals in CETA, the number of Transfers From Other Subparts (5,667), a category of Total Participants, is subtracted out. Hence, an estimated 48,781 (54,448 - 5,667) individuals received CETA services in the State.

^{2/}Title I did not exist in the first half of FY 1979. Instead, total expenditures for each CETA title included its respective administrative costs. However, we subtracted out these costs and transferred them to Title I in order to compare them with FY '80 expenditures.

FY 1980 Allocations

Less money was allocated in FY 1980 than in the previous two fiscal years. Total allocations for Minnesota Title I Prime Sponsors were \$73.4 million in FY 1980, a 35 percent decline in allocations from FY 1979 and 37.4 percent from FY 1978. A table of allocations for fiscal years 1974 through 1981 can be found on page 69.

Minnesota - U.S. Comparison

1. Economic Climate

While fewer people participated in CETA programs in FY 1980, the nation and the State experienced greater unemployment and a more expanded labor force in FY 1980 than in FY 1979.

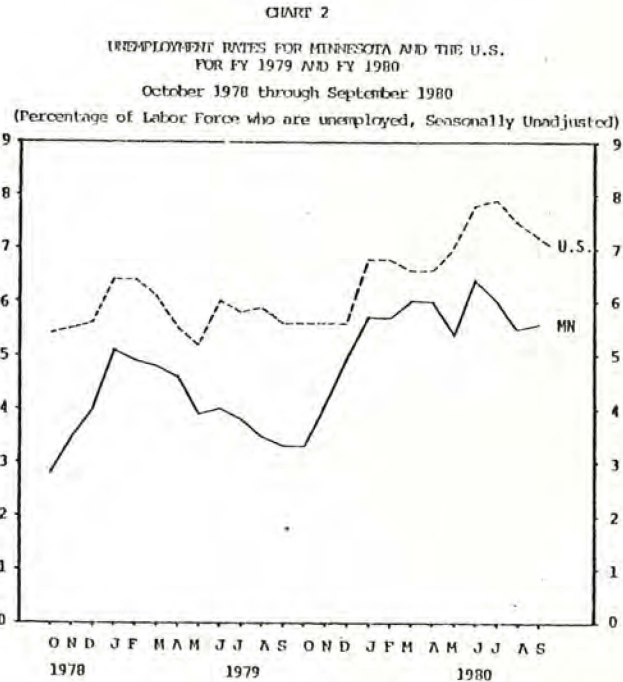
Chart #2 illustrates the pattern of unemployment rates for Minnesota and the U.S. over a 24 month period, October 1978 through September 1980.

In the period of October 1979 to September 1980, the rates of unemployment for the U.S. ranged from a low of 5.6 percent in October to a high of 7.9 percent in July 1980. During these same months in FY 1979, the unemployment rates were 5.4 percent and 5.8 percent, respectively. However, unemployment peaked at 6.4 percent during January and February 1979.

In Minnesota, FY 1980 opened with a low unemployment rate of 3.3 percent in October 1979 and climbed to a high of 6.4 percent in June 1980. For these same months in FY 1979, the rates of unemployment were 2.8 percent and 4 percent, respectively. Peak unemployment occurred during January 1979 at 5.1 percent.

One reason for the increase in unemployment in FY 1980 was that more people were in the labor force. Nationwide, there were about 2 million more people in the labor force in FY 1980 than in FY 1979. This same trend also happened in Minnesota as there were more than 70,000 people in the labor force in FY '80 than in FY '79.

2. Program Performance

In the last few years, CETA programs have been increasingly challenged by private and public sector people. In response to this challenge, federal authorities are in the process of developing performance standards to measure the costs and effectiveness of these programs.

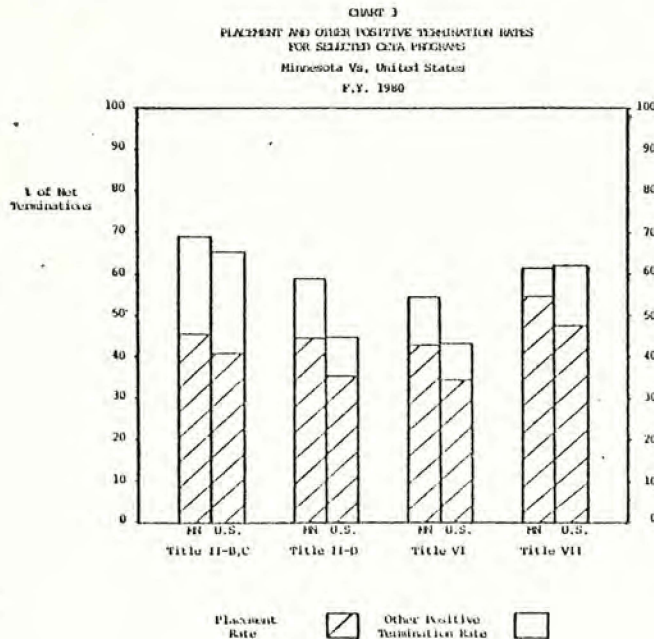
The following section focuses upon some performance standards that have been proposed and a Minnesota - U.S. comparison. Discussion follows on this comparison for Placement and Other Positive Termination Rates, Cost Per Participant, and Before Participation in CETA and Upon Entering Employment Wage Rates for people who terminate from CETA.

Placement - Other Positive Termination Rates

A higher proportion of people in the non-Youth and non-Title III programs were placed in unsubsidized jobs in Minnesota than in the same programs throughout the U.S. Aggregating data of Titles II-B,C; II-D; VI and VII, roughly 45 percent of the people who terminated from CETA programs in Minnesota received employment. This compares with the 39 percent placement rate nationwide for the same programs.

Chart #3 exhibits the State - National comparison of placement and other positive rates^{3/} for individual programs. Not only did State prime sponsors achieve higher placement rates in each program, but they also had higher other positive rates in all programs, except Title VII, than their national counterparts.

Cost Per Participant

For all programs, including Youth and Title III, cost per participant was 39 percent lower in Minnesota than for the same programs nationwide. The average cost per participant was \$1,260 in Minnesota in comparison with \$2,058 for the U.S. This is shown in Chart #4.

On a program by program basis, the only programs where average cost in the State exceeded that for the nation were Title III, STIP-Upgrade and Title VII.

Average Hourly Wage Before CETA and Upon Entering Employment

On the average, Minnesota participants who entered employment through CETA programs tended to have higher pre-CETA and post-CETA wages^{4/} than the participants throughout the nation. In Chart #5, the wage differentials are quite evident when comparing programs in the State with their national counterparts. The greatest difference in average pre-CETA wages is in Title IV where Minnesotans average 73¢ an hour more than in the same program nationwide. Similarly, the biggest difference in average entered employment wages was in Title III programs.

In terms of actual dollar increases, Minnesotans received larger monetary gains in Titles II-D, III, and VI than those who entered employment in those programs in the nation.

However, if one were to look at the rate of increase of average Before CETA and Entered Employment wages, only Minnesota Title III programs showed the higher level of percentage growth in wages.

One should keep in mind that these wages are only averages and that wage differentials between State and national may reflect the differences in economic climate and business of CETA programs.

3. Participant Characteristics

In most programs, CETA participants in Minnesota tended to be more educated and a higher proportion received public assistance than their national counterparts during FY 1980. Furthermore, handicapped persons appear to be more representative in most programs in the State than for those for the nation. A comparison of participant characteristics for Minnesota and the U.S. is displayed in Chart #6 on pages 8 and 9.

Methodology for Average Hourly Wage of Terminees Placed, Before Participation in CETA and Upon Entering Employment.

This information is taken from the Quarterly Summary of Participant Characteristics report. Average hourly was determined by assigning a specific value to each wage range. The specific values and their respective wage ranges are as follows:

The wage values of \$3.00 and \$6.50 were arbitrarily assigned. The other values were midpoints of the report's wage ranges.

The number of Entered Employment for each wage range was multiplied by each assigned value. These products were totalled and divided by the number who entered employment.

This procedure was used for both Minnesota and U.S. reports.

PROGRAM INTRODUCTION

The following report shows the activities of each CETA prime sponsor for fiscal year 1980. There are four tables for each program: program status, financial activity, financial status and characteristics of participants.

Tables 1 through 4 contain summaries of cumulative State totals for the ten (10) CETA prime sponsors only (Minnesota Migrant Council, Native American Prime Sponsors, and Special Grants are not included in this report). These tables show the statewide level of CETA services and expenditures for the FY '80 program. All data exhibited in these tables compare the number of participants enrolled in statewide programs and indicate the expenditures of all titles combined. The components of all programs are shown in percentages. The components in the Summary of Participant Characteristics table do not add across or down because a participant can be enrolled in more than one program. Furthermore, the reader may find that there is a difference in Total Expenditures for All Programs in Tables 2 and 3. Table 2, Financial Status Report, excludes Title I, Administrative Cost Pool.

Table 5 displays the administrative cost pool under Title I. The staff salaries and other administrative expenses of all programs are consolidated into one statement for each prime sponsor.

Title II-B,C program data are contained in Tables 6 through 9. Title II-B,C programs are used for a variety of employment and training programs or services. These services include recruitment, orientation, counseling, testing, placement, classroom instruction, institution and on-the-job training in the private sector, allowances for persons in training and supportive services.

Tables 10 through 13 detail individual prime sponsor's enrollment and expenditures for their Title II-D programs. Title II-D provides for transitional public service employment programs in areas with an unemployment rate of 6.5 percent or higher for three (3) consecutive months. These programs may be used to create jobs in state, county, or city governmental agencies or with non-profit organizations.

Tables 14 through 25 reflect Title III programs conducted by prime sponsors to serve special target groups. These programs include the Skills Training Improvement Program (STIP), both basic and upgrade, and Help Through Industry Retraining and Employment (HIRE), which are funded under the Special National Programs.

Title IV Youth Programs are found in Tables 26 through 41. The Title IV programs consist of the Youth Employment and Training Programs (YETP), both regular and exemplary, and Youth Community Conservation Improvement Programs (YCCIP), funded under the Youth Employment Demonstration Projects Act. The Summer Youth Employment Programs (SYEP) is also a Title IV program.

Tables 42 through 45 are the participants and expenditures for Title VI. Similar to Title II-D, it is locally administered and provides for emergency public employment programs in areas of high unemployment. The primary differences between Title II-D and Title VI are that some jobs under Title VI are in projects which last for only one year and do not require an employing agency to provide permanent unsubsidized employment.

The Title VII program is shown in Tables 46 through 49. Title VII is the Private Sector Initiative Program for the economically disadvantaged.

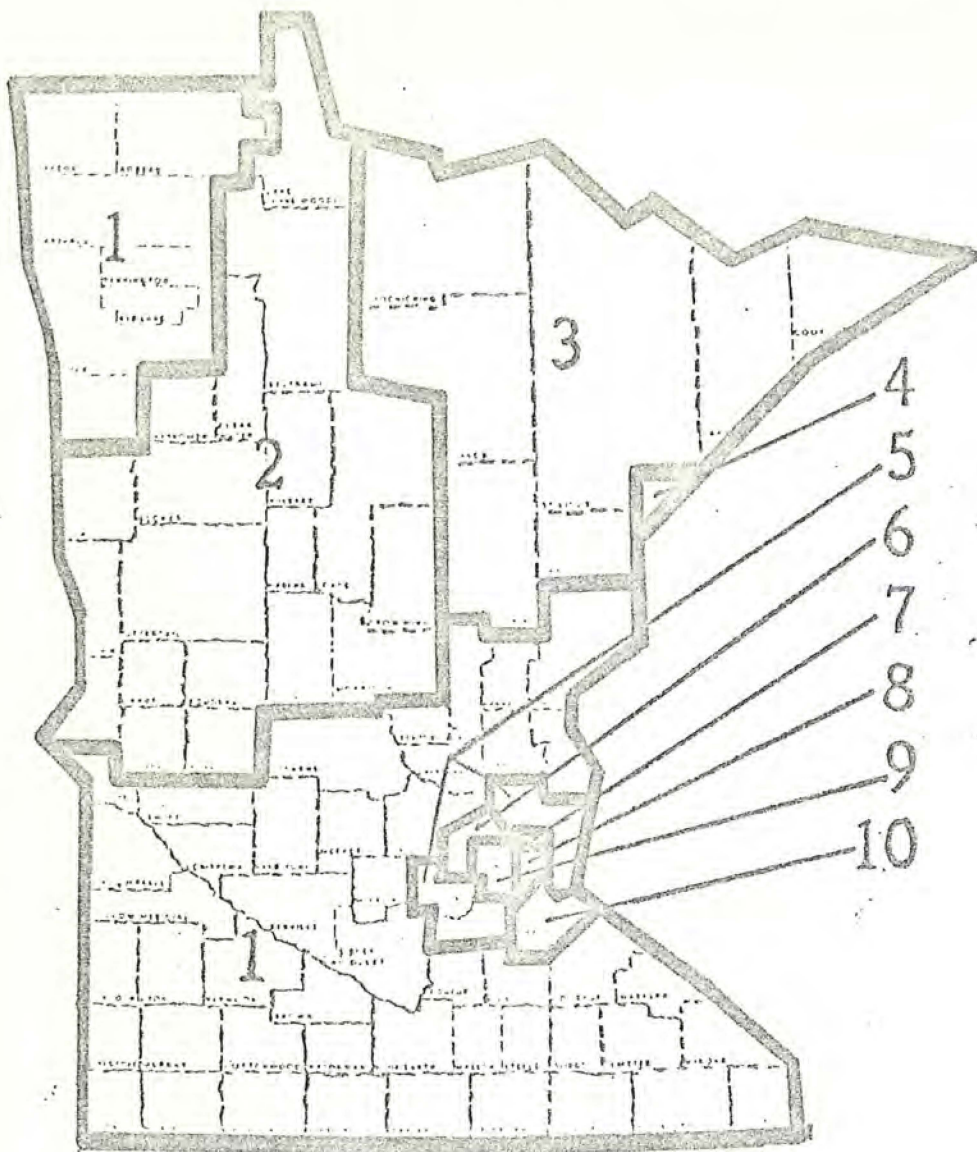

APPENDIX B

SECTION I

Title I, Administrative Provisions -- Organizational and general provisions applicable to the entire act, including the eligibility criteria for state and local prime sponsors, the planning and approval process, and the authorization of appropriations for fiscal years 1979 through 1982.

Title II, Comprehensive Employment and Training Services -- Comprehensive work and training activities contained previously in Title I: institutional, on-the-job training, work experience, job search assistance, and supportive services. Except for the upgrading and retraining components, prime sponsors' work and training programs must be limited to economically disadvantaged persons who are unemployed, underemployed, or in school. This Title also contains a separate counterstructural public service employment program, with new jobholders limited to those unemployed 15 or more weeks or on welfare and who have family income at or below 70 percent of the BLS lower living standard budget. PSE participants may remain in jobs no more than 78 weeks (up to 12 months waiver for areas with 7 percent or higher unemployment) in any five-year period.

Title III, Special National Programs and Activities -- Special target group programs are administered from national office for Indians and other Native Americans, migrant and seasonal farmworkers, ex-offenders, older workers, displaced homemakers, women, and handicapped. Welfare reform demonstration projects are included. Continues programs or research and development, technical assistance, and labor market information.

Title IV, Youth Programs -- Continues the Job Corps, the summer youth employment and Demonstration Projects Act of 1977. The new programs are authorized only through Fiscal Year 1980 because of demonstration aspects.

Title V, National Commission for Employment Policy -- Continues the national commission with a change in name and membership, reducing Cabinet participation.

Title VI, Public Service Employment Program -- Provides for a counter-cyclical PSE program and authorized funding of jobs sufficient to employ 20 percent of the number of unemployed in excess of 4 percent; when national unemployment rate reaches 7 percent, jobs are authorized for 25 percent of the number in excess of 4 percent. New PSE jobholders must be unemployed for 10 of last 12 weeks, have family income at or below the BLS lower living standard budget, and are subject to the same participation limits as in Title II PSE.

Title VII, Private Sector Initiative Program (PSIP) -- This program is supplementary to Title II programs. It develops greater involvement of the private sector and establishes Private Industry Councils (PIC's) with representatives from industry, business, organized labor, community-based organizations, and educational institutions. These groups will participate with prime sponsors in the development of on-the-job training arrangements and other initiatives.

Title VIII, Youth Adult Conservation Corps -- Continues through fiscal year 1982 without substantial change. The year-round corps is open to both disadvantaged and nondisadvantaged youth, 16 to 23 years of age for conservation work in national parks and forests.

SECTION II

- A) Title II - Parts A,B,C: 85% of the available funds are allocated as follows:
- 50% - Based on the FY'78 Title I allocations;
 - 37.5% - Based on relative number of unemployed in the prime sponsor jurisdiction as compared to the nation;
 - 12.5% - Based on the relative number of adults living below low-income level in the prime sponsor jurisdiction as compared to the nation.
- B) Title II - Part D: 85% of the available funds are allocated as follows:
- 25% - Based on the relative number of unemployed persons in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total number of unemployed in the nation;
 - 25% - Based on the relative excess number of unemployed persons (number over 4.5%) in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total such unemployed in the nation;
 - 25% - Based on the number of unemployed persons living in areas of substantial unemployment (number over 6.5%) in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the number of unemployed persons in such areas in the nation;
 - 25% - Based on the relative number of low-income adults in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared with the total of the low income adults in the nation.
- C) Title IV - Youth Community Conservation and Improvement Projects (YCCIP):
- 75% of available funds is allocated among prime sponsor jurisdictions on the basis of the relative number of unemployed persons in each prime sponsor jurisdiction as compared to the nation.
- D) Title IV - Youth Employment and Training Program (YETP):
- 75% of available funds is allocated to prime sponsors as follows:
- 37.5% - Based on the relative number of unemployed persons in each prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total number of unemployed in the nation;

37.5% - Based on the relative number of unemployed living in areas of substantial unemployment in each prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total of such persons in the nation;

25.0% - Based on the relative number of persons living below low-income level in each prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the number in the nation.

E) Title VI: - 85% of the available funds are allocated as follows:

50% - Based on the relative number of unemployed persons in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total number of unemployed in the nation;

25% - Based on the number of unemployed persons living in areas of substantial unemployment (number of 6.5%) in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the number of unemployed persons in such areas in the nation;

25% - Based on the relative excess number of unemployed persons (number over 4.5%) in the prime sponsor jurisdiction compared to the total such unemployed in the nation.

F) Title VII: 95% of the available funds are allocated as follows:

50% - Based on the FY'78 Title I allocations;

37.5% - Based on relative number of unemployed in the prime sponsor jurisdiction as compared to the nation;

12.5% - Based on the relative number of adults living below low-income level in the prime sponsor jurisdiction as compared to the nation.
