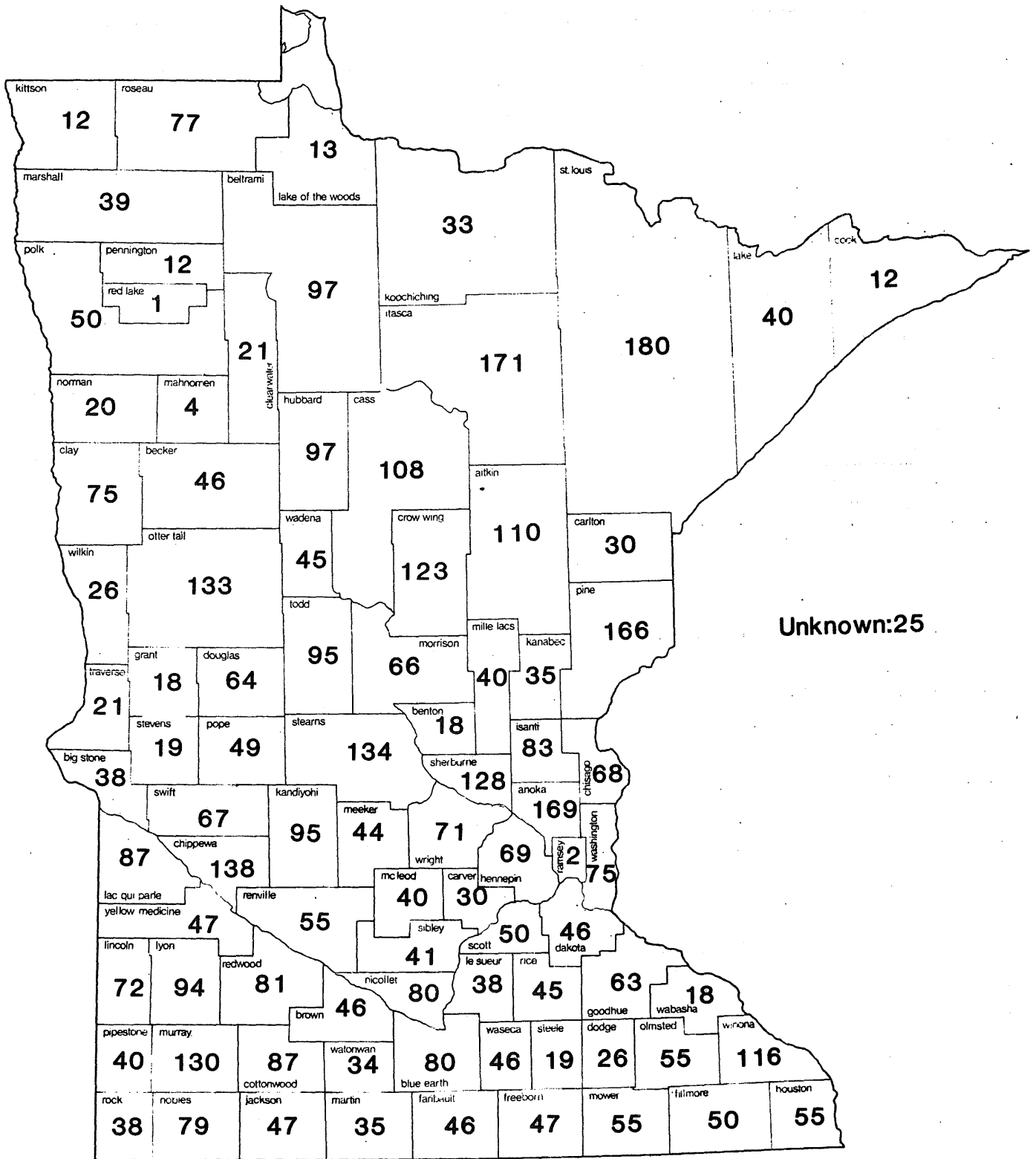


Figure 1. Archery deer harvest by county, 1981.

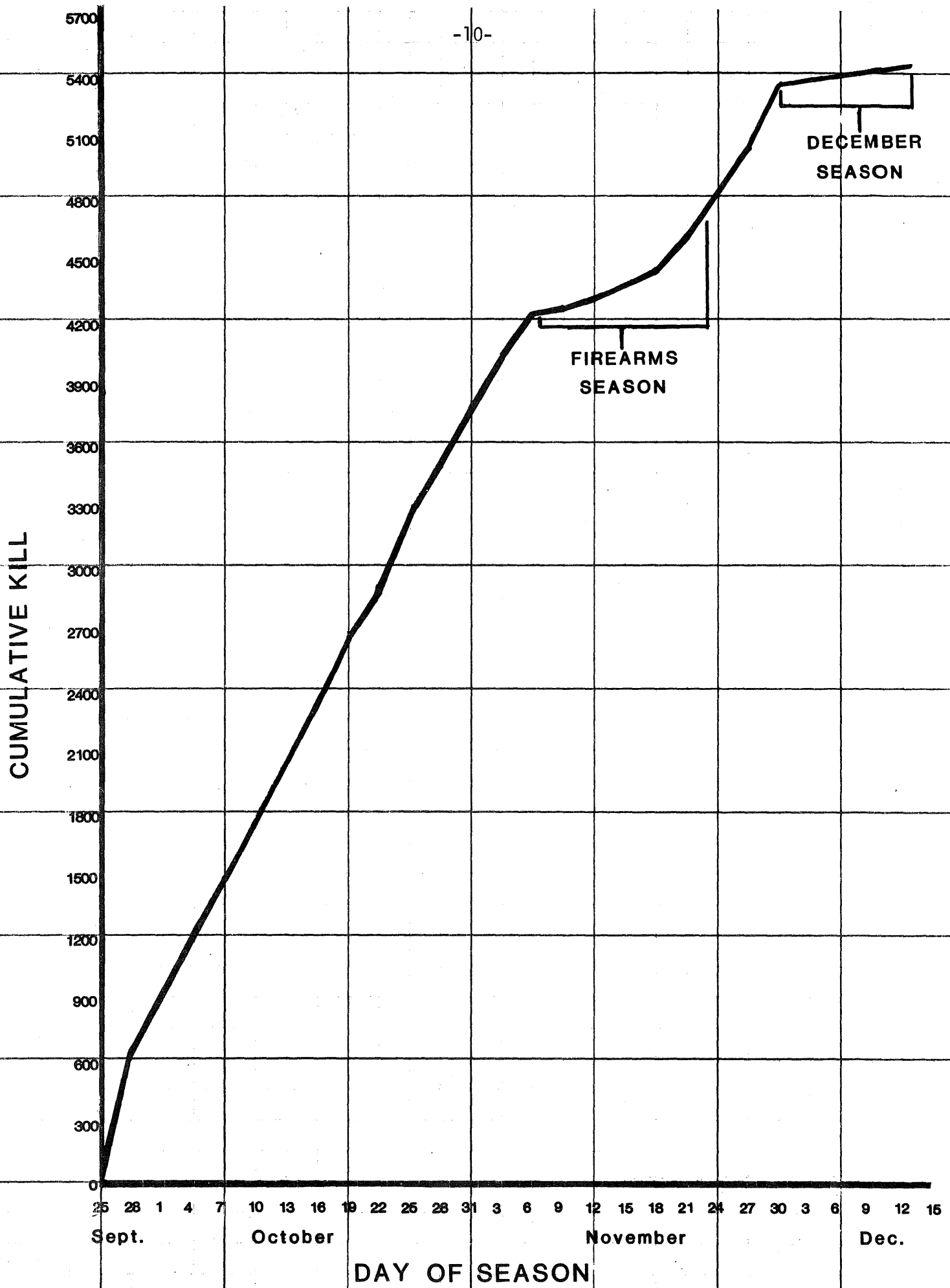


Figure 2. Cumulative archery deer kill by date, 1981.

# BOW & ARROW DEER SEASON

## SHOOTING HOURS – Sunrise to sunset

**NOTE:** All licensed big game hunters who are hunting with bow and arrow shall have their bows unstrung or cased during the time they are licensed to take big game while in the field between one-half hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise.

**Statewide . . . . . Sept. 26 - Nov. 30, either sex, except that:**  
1) only legal bucks may be taken within a firearms zone when there is an open firearms season therein; 2) bow and arrow hunting is prohibited in firearms Zone 5 during the firearms deer season; 3) bow hunting is prohibited in Lac Qui Parle WMA, Talcot Lack WMA, and Walnut Lake WMA after November 27, 1981.

That part of Zone 1 south of U.S. Hwy. 2 and that part of Zone 3 in Southeastern

Minnesota see boundary description panel 12 . . . . .

Dec. 1 to Dec. 13, either sex

**NOTE:** Where an area is closed to firearms hunting within a firearms zone that is open, bow and arrow hunters are still limited to bucks only hunting within the area closed to firearms.

## BOW KILL REGISTRATION

**your deer will be illegal unless registered**

**Bow and Arrow Hunters:** Deer must be registered with a Conservation Officer or other authorized agent within 48 hours after being taken. No part of the deer carcass except entrails shall be removed until after the animal has been registered.

## BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION FOR THE DECEMBER BOW AND ARROW SEASON

That portion of firearms deer zone 1 lying south of U.S. Hwy. 2 and that portion of deer firearms zone 3 lying south of the following described line:

Beginning on State Trunk Highway 70 on the east boundary of the state; thence along STH 70 to STH 65; thence along STH 65 to STH 23; thence along STH 23 to U.S. Hwy. 169; thence along U.S. Hwy. 169 to STH 27; thence along STH 27 to STH 25; thence along STH 25 to County State Aid Highway (CSAH) 48 Morrison County; thence along CSAH 48 to STH 371; thence along STH 371 to U.S. Hwy. 10; thence along U.S. Hwy. 10 to the west bank of the Mississippi River north of Little Falls.

## SPECIAL MUZZLELOADER SEASON

NOVEMBER 28 through DECEMBER 13, 1981 — sunrise to sunset

— Antlerless deer and legal bucks may be taken by hunters who have selected this option at the time of license purchase.

— The Special Muzzleloader Season is open only on public land within the boundaries of the following listed areas. Any inholding of private land within areas opened for this special season are closed by law.

**Lac qui Parle WMA** in Big Stone, Chippewa, Lac qui Parle and Swift Counties except Rosemoen Island and the area posted No Trespass from September 20 to December 1 are not open to muzzleloader deer hunting at any time. The federal Waterfowl Production Area located in Sec. 4, Township 119N, Range 43W is included in the open area. Permits will be issued for two separate hunt periods. Two hundred (200) permits will be issued for Nov. 28 - Dec. 4, inclusive, and 200 permits will be issued for Dec. 5 - Dec. 13, inclusive. Applications should be addressed to Special Deer Hunt, Lac qui Parle WMA, Watson 56295. Those muzzleloader hunters going into the refuge portion of the Lac qui Parle WMA must register at the headquarters prior to hunting.

**Lake Shetek State Park** in Murray County. Permits will be issued for two separate periods. Ten (10) permits will be issued for Nov. 28 - Dec. 4, inclusive, and 10 permits will be issued for Dec. 5 - Dec. 13, inclusive. Applications should be addressed to Special Deer Hunt, Lake Shetek State Park, Rt. 1, Currie 56123. Permittees must register at park office before hunting.

**Talcot Lake WMA** in Cottonwood and Murray Counties. Permits will be issued for two separate periods.
