The Local Government Information Network (LOGIN) is a computer database developed under the auspices of Control Data Corporation which provided "practical information that can help local governments to lower costs and improve performance by using a particular policy, program, professional expert or service product." Section I of this bibliography provides a brief sampling of the projects described in the LOGIN database relating to economic development techniques currently being tried by local governments throughout the world.

In the interest of space and time, only a brief sample of the large number of projects available is provided here. In searching the database, the Legislative Reference Library found that limiting the data search to items updated since January 1981 produced the following numbers of items:

Wisconsin has had to tighten up its very libreral law which allows all its incorporated communities to set up TAX INCREMENT FINANCING districts because of several problems and abuses. Summarized from planning.

The project summarized in this paper, "THE JOB GENERATION PROCESS." represents an effort to understand and to bridge the gap between micro- and macro-analysis in order to develop economic policies that will generate jobs for the people and places that need them without causing inflation. The database for this research, information on 5.6 million business establishments (about 82% of all private sector employment in the U.S.), records for the years 1969, 1972, 1974, and 1976, each firm's size, age, corporate affiliation, location, and sales. By aggregating establishments in any given place, this research makes possible detailed descriptions of how economic change occurs in that locale. This brief summary highlights the major findings of the work, which was organized into three broad categories: 1) components of change. 2) job generation, and 3) interregional control. Summarizing the initial data analysis, the author finds that few of the net new jobs generated in the U.S. economy are generated by the larger, known corporations, but rather by small, independent, volatile firms. The implications of this finding for economic development policy and administration are discussed.

A report, "JOB CREATION IN CITIES," reviews the broad patterns of the job generation process revealed by analysis of data of 5.6 million business establishments, then examines how the process works within metropolitan areas. It examines, specifically, neighborhood phenomena within metropolitan areas and the case of minority-owned enterprise. The metropolitan areas selected for this micro view are: Boston, Worcester, Hartford, New Haven, Rochester, Dayton, Baltimore, Charlotte (NC), Greenville (SC), and Houston. Components of employment change are tabulated for these areas, with central city/suburban breakouts, along with computations of the aggregate annual employment gain and loss rates and business establishment death rates. In addition, 10 classes of metropolitan area neighborhoods are defined and similar data are aggregated into these neighborhood categories. Describing the picture the emerges, Birch observes, "The larger, frequesntly manufacturing-oriented businesses are expanding their employment base in economically prosperous, growing areas and are, at the margin, abandoning the older areas as sites to do business...the older areas...are relying heavily on smaller businesses, predominantly in the trade and service sectors, to take up the slack floor space vactated by the larger companies and to keep the job base somewhat stable. " Extensive appendices provide detailed data developed for these and other analyses.


