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MOTORCYCLE AND ATV USE

General Policy

The following is general information about ATV and motorcycle use in State Forests. The general policy for state forest lands is that state forest roads and trails are open to motorcycle and ATV use unless posted to prohibit motorized vehicles. Please look at the listings by area for more specific information. Forest roads are also open to other vehicles (such as logging trucks) and other forest users (hikers, hunters, horses, etc.). No trails have been signed or developed specifically for motorcycles and ATV's. ATV and motorcycle use is being studied at this time and Areas will be closed if significant environmental damage or user conflict occurs because of this use.

Competitive ATV and motorcycle events are allowed only by Special Permit from the Area Forest Supervisor. The sponsor and the Area Forest Supervisor must agree on permitted routes and conditions.

In most state forests land ownership is a mixture of state, county, federal and private lands. Use of county or federal lands is governed by rules and regulations of that agency. Use of private lands is governed by the state trespass law and other applicable laws. Most state forest lands are not signed or identified in any way.

Use of public road rights-of-way managed by a federal, state, county, or township road authority is governed by the motor vehicle statutes. (State forest roads are not by definition a public road.)

All ATV's using public road right of way and public lands and waters under the jurisdiction of the Commissioner of Natural Resources must be registered. Motorcycles are currently not required to register to use state forest roads and trails, but are required to be licensed as a highway vehicle to use public roads.

Persons aged 12 to 16 years may operate an ATV with a valid ATV Safety Certificate and must be supervised by a person 18 years of age or older who possess a valid drivers license. The All-Terrain Vehicle Safety Certificate is valid for engine size 90cc or less.

Persons under 18 operating an ATV must wear a helmet. ATV's and motorcycles are prohibited from using grant in aid ski and snowmobile trails unless the sponsor or owner of the land permits this use during the snowfree months.

Operating Guidelines

Within a State Forest a person shall not operate an ATV or motorcycle:

- On forest roads, trails or lands and areas posted against such use or operation.
- At a speed greater than is reasonable and proper, or in a careless, reckless or negligent manner or in willful or wanton disregard for the rights of any person or property.
- In a manner so as to leave behind litter or other debris.
- While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance.
- Unless there is visible evidence of a road or trail. (Unrestricted cross-country travel or off trail scrambling is not permitted.)
- To obstruct traffic by unnecessary parking or stopping.
- In or upon private property without the oral or written permission of the owner of the land.
- On State, County or Township roads unless the motor-vehicle is licensed for highway operation or registered as an ATV and operated in accordance with applicable rules and laws.
- When requested by hand, voice, emergency light, siren or audible signal by a law enforcement officer to stop.
- In a tree nursery or tree plantation in a manner which damages or destroys growing stock.
- In a manner which results in rutting, erosion or otherwise damages the road, trail, vegetation/or state property.

#### Equipment

A person shall not operate an ATV or motorcycle unless equipped with:

- A braking system.
- A throttle so designed that when the pressure used to advance the throttle is removed, the engine speed will immediately and automatically return to idle.
- A spark arrestor type muffler in good working order.
- Without a headlight and taillight lighted at all times, if operated between sunset and sunrise.
- Without a functioning stoplight, if so equipped.

#### Other Applicable Laws

It is unlawful to:

- Remove or mutilate any notice or sign posted on state or private lands.
- To drive a motorcycle or ATV on a maintained and groomed snowmobile trail between December 1 and April 1.
- To mutilate, damage, destroy or remove any shelter, comfort station, or other state facility.
- To drive an ATV or motorcycle on state grant-in-aid-trails unless they are designated by the sponsor or owner for such use during the snowfree months.

ALL other applicable state land use rules will also be enforced.

### Penalty

Any person who violates any of these guidelines or laws maybe guilty of a misdemeanor and/or subject to removal from the forest area and to appropriate legal action.

### ATV Rules

Rules are currently being developed for ATV use of state lands. ATV and motorcycle use may become more restrictive as a result of these rules.

### General Information

The following is general information by Forestry Administrative Area. If you are unsure of where you can use your ATV, please call ahead for further information. ATV and motorcycle use is being studied during the State Forest Area Unit Planning process. As these plans are completed ATV and motorcycle use may become more restrictive in a specific area. The following information refers to use only during the snowfree months. Use during the winter is more restrictive.

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There are approximately 750 miles of forest road available in this Region for riding motorcycles or ATV's. No special trail maps are available. The following is general information regarding ATV and motorcycle use by Forest Area in this Region:

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State Forests - Buena Vista, Mississippi Headwaters, White Earth, Paul Bunyan (North Unit), and Welsh Lake.

State forest roads and trails shown on the Buena Vista and Paul Bunyan State Forest Trail maps are open to use during the snow-free months unless posted otherwise. No maps are available for the Mississippi Headwaters, White Earth and Welsh Lake State Forests. Use of state forest roads and trails in the White Earth State Forest is permitted during the snowfree months unless posted closed. Forest roads and trails are also open to many other uses. Roads and trails traverse various soil conditions including swamps which may limit ATV and motorcycle use.

State Forests - Lost River, Beltrami Island (West Part).

All state forest roads and trails shown on the Beltrami Island State Forest Trail map are open to use during the snow free months unless posted otherwise except that the trail south of Cash's Corner along the Moose River Flood control project and other grants-in-aid trails near Fourtown are closed to such use. Forest roads and trails are also open to many other uses. Roads and trails traverse various soil conditions including swamps which may limit ATV and motorcycle use.

State Forests - Beltrami Island (East Part), Pine Island (N.W. Part)

All state forest roads and trails shown on the Beltrami Island State Forest Trail map are open to use during the snowfree months unless posted otherwise except that the trail south of Cash's Corner along the Moose River Flood control project and other grants-in-aid trails near Fourtown are closed to such use. No maps are available for the Pine Island State Forest. Forest roads are also open to many other uses. Road and trails traverse various soil conditions including swamps which may limit ATV and motorcycle use.

A Plan is being prepared for the Baudette Area which will address all forms of forest management including ATV use. Changes in the Areas ATV and motorcycle policy may result.

State Forests - Pine Island, Red Lake, Blackduck, Big Fork, Buena Vista, Bowstring

No maps are available for the Pine Island, Red Lake, Blackduck, Bigfork and Bowstring State Forests. A map is available for the

Buena Vista State Forest. ATV's and motorcycles are permitted to use state forest roads and trails during the snowfree months unless posted closed. Forest roads and trails are open to many other uses and traverse various soil conditions which may limit use.

State Forests - White Earth, Two Inlets, Smoky Hills, Paul Bunyan, Badoura.

All state forest roads and trails are designated for multiple use during the snowfree months. Grant in aid trails, gated roads and trails and other areas posted to prohibit motorized vehicles are off-limits. Roads and trails receive a great deal of use from vehicles, horses, hikers and logging trucks. Be considerate of others. Watch out for other vehicles and trucks.

Maps are available for the Paul Bunyan, Two Inlets and Smoky Hills State Forests. All state forest roads and trails shown on these maps are open to use during the snowfree months unless gated or posted otherwise. Badoura State Forest has no roads or trails available for use. No maps are available for the White Earth State Forest. State forest roads and trails in this forest are open during the snowfree months unless gated or posted closed.

Roads and trails traverse various soil conditions including swamps which may limit ATV and motorcycle use.

There are approximately 550 miles of forest road available in this Region for riding motorcycles and ATV's. No special trail maps are available. The following is general information regarding ATV and motorcycle use by Forest Area in this Region.

State Forests - Cloquet Valley (West Part), White Face River, Fond du Lac.

All state forest roads and trails are open during the snowfree months unless gated or posted otherwise. Grant in aid snowmobile trails and the Fond du Lac Ski Touring Trail are closed to ATV and motorcycle use. Maps are available for the

Fond du Lac and Cloquet Valley State Forests (Taft Area) and generally state forest roads and trails shown on these maps are open to use. The Lake Williams Trail south of Cotton is also generally open. Varying soil conditions and swamps may limit ATV use. Watch out for logging trucks and other users. Use of groomed snowmobile trails during the winter months is prohibited.

State Forests - Golden Anniversary, Battleground, Bowstring, Big Fork, Pine Island, Koochiching, George Washington.

State forest roads in this area are open to ATV use. Trails are generally posted motorized vehicles prohibited or gated. Use of ski touring and hiking trails, hunter-walking trails and the Taconite State Trail is prohibited. Use of grant-in-aid trails is prohibited unless specifically allowed by the sponsor or property owner.

No maps are available for this Area.

State Forests - George Washington, Sturgeon River.

State forest roads in this Area are open to ATV and motorcycle use. Trails are generally posted motorized vehicles prohibited or gated. Use of grant in aid trails, ski trails and the Taconite State Trail is prohibited except that grant-in-aid trails may be used if permitted by the sponsor or property owner.

A Plan will be prepared for the Hibbing Area in the next two years which will address all forms of forest management including ATV and motorcycle use.

State Forests - Sturgeon River, Kabetogama, Bear Island.

All state forest roads in this Area are open to use unless gated or posted closed. Grant in aid trails, the Ash River Ski Touring and Hiking Trail, and the Tower to International Falls and Taconite State Trails are closed to ATV's and motorcycles.

Maps are available for the Kabetogama and Bear Island State Forests. Soil Condition and terrain may limit ATV use. Mixed land ownership also complicates the availability of Areas for ATV use.

State Forests - Cloquet Valley (East Part), Finland, Pat Bayle, Grand Portage.

In general, all state forest roads and trails are open during the snowfree months unless gated or posted otherwise. Grant in aid trails and the North Shore State Trail are closed to ATV's, motorcycles and other motorized uses. State Forest trail maps are available for the Cloquet Valley, Finland and Grand Portage State Forests. No maps are available for the Pat Bayle State Forest. Varying soil conditions, swamps and terrain may limit use. Mixed ownership may also be a problem due to varying regulations. Logging trucks and other vehicles and users should be expected when using these areas.

State Forests - Pine Island, Koochiching, Smoky Bear.

No maps are available. ATV's and motorcycles may use state forest roads or trails unless posted closed. Varying soil conditions makes much of this Area unsuitable for use. Timber harvesting is a major activity with heavy logging truck traffic. A plan is being prepared for the Littlefork Area that will address all forms of forest management including ATV use. Changes in Area ATV policy may result.

State land ownership in Region III is more dispersed than the northern two Regions and state forest lands are more heavily used for a number of different activities. Use of ATV's in this Region is generally more restrictive or closed altogether in some Areas.

State forest roads and trails in the Pillsbury State Forest are closed to use by ATV's and motorcycles. Only a few logging trails are open. A photocopy map is available from the Area Forest Supervisor which shows these logging roads. These logging roads may be used by other vehicles and users also. The logging roads open to use are not marked or signed in any way. ATV's and motorcycles are prohibited from using snowmobile, ski and horse trails shown on the Pillsbury State Forest trail maps. They are also prohibited from using the Beauty Lake and Pillager State Forest roads.

No riding opportunities are available in the Crow Wing State Forest.

State Forests - Lyons, Huntersville, Foot Hills, Land O'Lakes, Emily, Remer.

State forest roads in this Area are open to use unless posted closed. Most trails are posted to prohibit motorized use. ATV's and motorcycles are prohibited from using grant in aid trails.

No maps are available except for the Land O'Lakes State Forest - Ben Draper trail upon which ATV use is permitted. Varying terrain and wet soil conditions may make portions of this trail unsuitable for ATV use. Mixed land ownership may also create problems.

State Forests - Hill River, Savanna, Solanna, Wealthwood.

State forest roads in this Area are open to ATV and motorcycle use unless posted closed. A listing of area roads is available from the Area Forest Supervisor. ATV's and motorcycles are prohibited from using the Remote Lake Management Unit of the Savanna State Forest; the Moose Willow Wildlife Management Area - Hill River State Forest; and all grant in aid trails. Maps are available for the Hill River and Savanna State Forests. Varying terrain and wet soil conditions may make roads and trails in this area unsuitable for ATV use. Mixed land ownership may also be a problem due to varying regulations. State forest roads are open to a variety of other users.

State Forests - Nemadji, General Andrews, D.A.R. Snake River, St. Croix  
Chengwatana, Rum River.

The Moose Lake Area has recently completed it's long range management plan which includes provision for ATV use. ATV and motorcycle use in this Area is restricted to the snowfree months and to specific trails in the Nemadji, St. Croix and General Andrews State Forests. No riding opportunities are currently provided in the D.A.R., Snake River, Rum River, and Chengwatana State Forests. An ATV trail is being developed in the Chengwatana State Forest by volunteers and will be opened for summer use when work is complete.

The General Andrews trail system is 10 miles in length and follows the same route as the unit snowmobile trail. A map highlighting the trail that is open to ATV use is available. Grants-in-aid trails shown on this map are off limits.

The St. Croix State Forest trail system is 14 miles in length and is located east of the Tamarack River. A map highlighting the trail route which is open to ATV use during the snowfree months is available. Grants-in-aid trails and the Minnesota Wisconsin Boundary trail which are shown on this map are closed to use by motorized vehicles.

The Nemadji State Forest trail system is about 15 miles in length and is located in the northwest corner of the forest. A map highlighting the trails open to these uses during the snowfree months is available. Grants-in-aid trails and unhighlighted portions of the Minnesota Wisconsin Boundary trails are off limits to ATV's and motorcycles. Varying soil conditions may make portions of these trails unsuitable for ATV use.

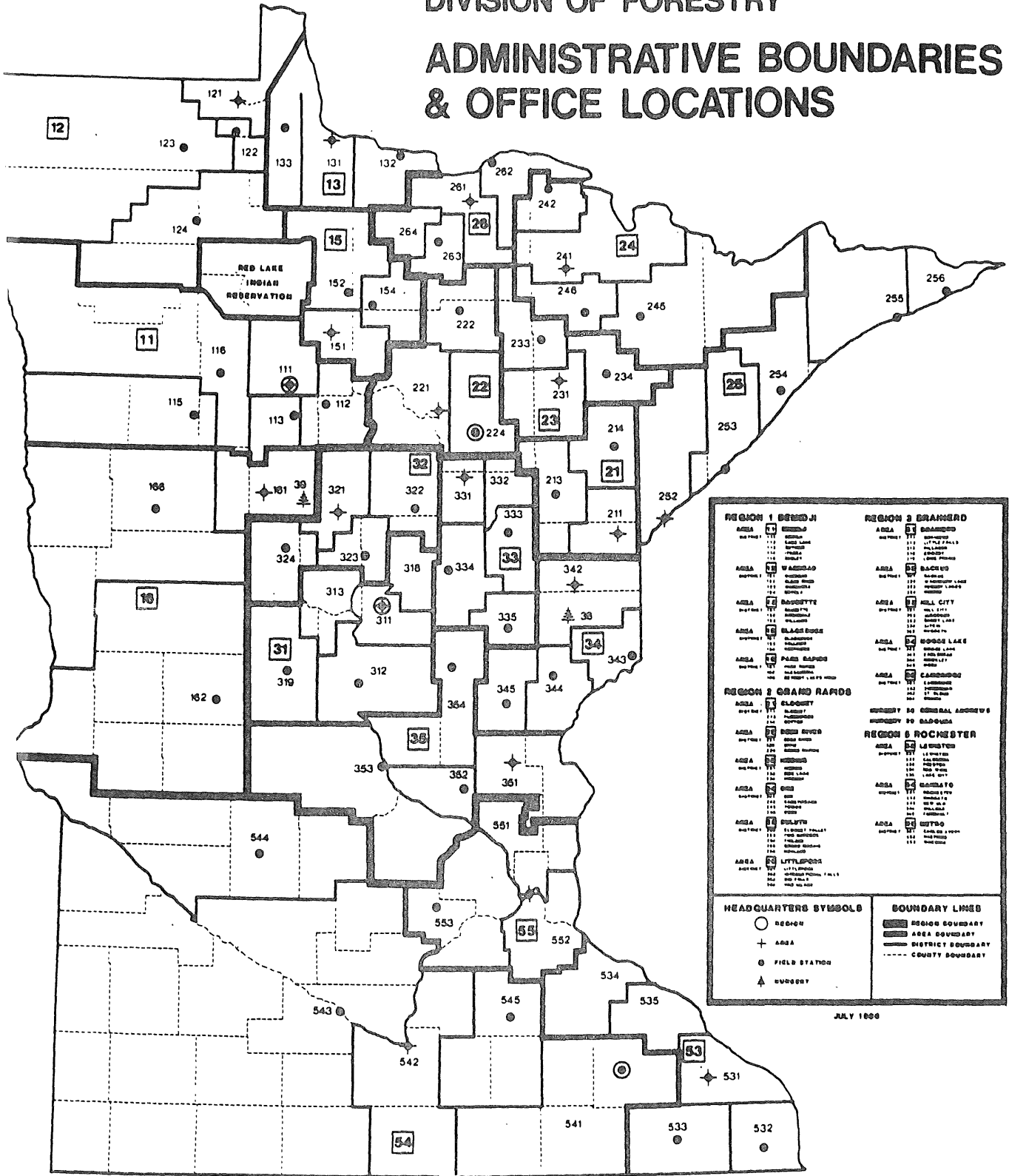
