e state of Minnesota offers a riety of horseback riding oppor-

southwestern Minnesota there tly rolling hills covered with

prairie grasses and wildflowers and wooded ravines.

Southeastern Minnesota offers more rugged ridges and valleys, hardwood forests and many streams.

The *central* part of the state has many hills and lakes with a diversity of prairie, hardwood forests and pines.

Northwestern Minnesota's Red River Valley was formerly the lake bottom of Glacial Lake Agassiz, and is consequently very flat. To the east of this flat land is a series of rolling hills.

Northeastern Minnesota is famous for its birch, pine and spruce forests and the rugged North Shore of Lake Superior.

Beyond the geographical features of the state, public trails also vary in the kinds of facilities and services that they have to offer horseback riders.

USING THIS GUIDA

The Department of Natural Resources administers nearly one thousand miles of horse trails. The trails in this guide are managed by the DNR's Division of Forestry, Division of Parks and Recreation an the Trails and Waterways Unit. Trails are all signed for horse riders.

Parking is understood as space sufficient for a truck and horse trailer.

Parking is usually located at the frailhead. Drinking water is available from hand pumps, faucets or fountains. Toilets may be pit toilets, including portable toilets, or may be flush toilets.

Campsites listed in this guide are those which are usually separate from vehicle camping areas. They are usually rustic, or primitive sites that are adapted for use with horses. In some instances these campsites are also at the designated parking sites. Shelters, may be simple enclosures along the trail to protect people from wind and rain, or in some state parks they are modern trail centers with a variety of facilities.

Water for your horses is available in a variety of places on our trails. In addition to hand pumps, water may be obtained from streams, rivers and lakes.

Hitching posts, corrals, ramps and picket lines (cables about 7 feet off the ground between poles) are some of the special adaptations made at various facilities specifically for horseback riders.

This guide was designed to be a starting point in planning your horseback riding trip. You will need a highway map, trail map and county maps and topographic maps may also be helpful. All horse trails are marked.

The map shows approximate location for the horseback riding trails. The table gives the total mileage, locations, facilities and services available. It also gives a brief description of the area and relevant history. In many cases you do not have to travel the entire length of the trails, access points allow you to design your own trip.

State Forest Horse Trails

State forests provide a variety of primitive trail and camping opportunities for horseback riders. The State Forest areas listed all include parking areas and trails that are marked for horseback riding. Most provide vault toilets and other facilities to accommodate horses and their riders. There are five primitive, drive-in campgrounds developed for the special needs of horseback riders. In addition, overnight camping is permitted within the trailhead parking areas at the other eight areas. There are over 190 miles of marked trails divided between the thirteen areas.

An entrance fee or a trail use fee is not charged in State Forests. A camping fee is charged at some of the more developed campgrounds. A special permit, available by calling the office listed for each facility, is required for large groups using the trails and camping facilities. Riders should note that all state forest trails are open for other uses. Signs and trail maps will indicate the other uses of individual trails. Riders should stay on the marked horse trails to avoid damage to roads, trails and resources needed for other uses. Rules that apply to these facilities and trail maps are available from the DNR Information Center in St. Paul and some Forestry offices.

State Trails


This unit provides a variety of contrasting horse trail opportunities. In general, few facilities have been developed for the specific needs of equestrians. Many of our horse trails are on former railroad rights-of-way where bicycling and hiking are the marked uses of the main treadway, but where horseback riding is the marked use for the treadway that parallels it. These parallel treadways have a sod surface. On other trails, a single treadway, with a sod surface, exists for all summer users, including horseback riding.

If you are on the lower sod side paths or on a main treadway which is sodded, please observe the signs which designate horse paths. Respect for the signing and for other users will result in a safer, more enjoyable experience for all trail users.

State Park Horse Trails

Minnesota State Parks provide some of the most interesting and scenic riding available anywhere. Twenty state parks provide over 260 miles of horseback riding trails. Special campgrounds are available in sixteen of the parks. Horse trails are generally open in early May through the first snowfall of autumn. Check at the park entrance for updated trail information. There is no horse rental at any of the Minnesota State Parks.

Horse trail conditions vary from park to park. Some may have earthen paths, others mowed grass and some may have crushed limestone or woodchips. Camping facilities for horseback riders also vary. Generally, these campgrounds include picnic tables, fire rings, water, vault toilets and horse tethering areas. Only a few have flush toilets or shower facilities. There is a nominal daily entrance fee charged at all Minnesota State Parks, or an annual permit is good at all 64 state parks for the entire year. There is also an additional camping fee for those wishing to stay overnight.



HORSEBACK RIDING RULES, ETIQUETTE AND SAFETY

To Prevent Erosion & Preserve Your Natural Resources:

- * Always stay on marked horse trail
- * Call ahead for trail conditions.
- * Avoid riding during muddy seasons.
- * Please use switchbacks and do not make shortcuts.
- * At stream crossings, ford only at designated area.

To Keep Minnesota Trail Areas Clean & Beautiful:

- * Harness animals away from trees.
- * Do not cut living trees.
- * Pack out all litter from trail areas.
- * Clean up manure and hay before leaving your campsite.

For Safety:

- * Avoid riding on roads.
- * When meeting hikers or bicy-

- clists, you should rein in and allow room to pass.
- * Recognize that some people are unfamiliar with or afraid of horses
- * Be careful with campfires. Clear an area around your fire ring.
 Use cookstoves when possible.
- * Routinely check your horse for ticks, consider using a wipe-on insecticide.
- * Water your horse only at freeflowing water sources, thus avoiding stagnant water.

For An Enjoyable Trip:

- * Keep your group size small.
- * Carry drinking water while riding.
- * Domestic pets (dogs) must be leashed at all times.


