1. graphs showing the percentile distribution of any designated Profiles variable, and
2. scatter diagrams showing the relationship between any two designated variables.

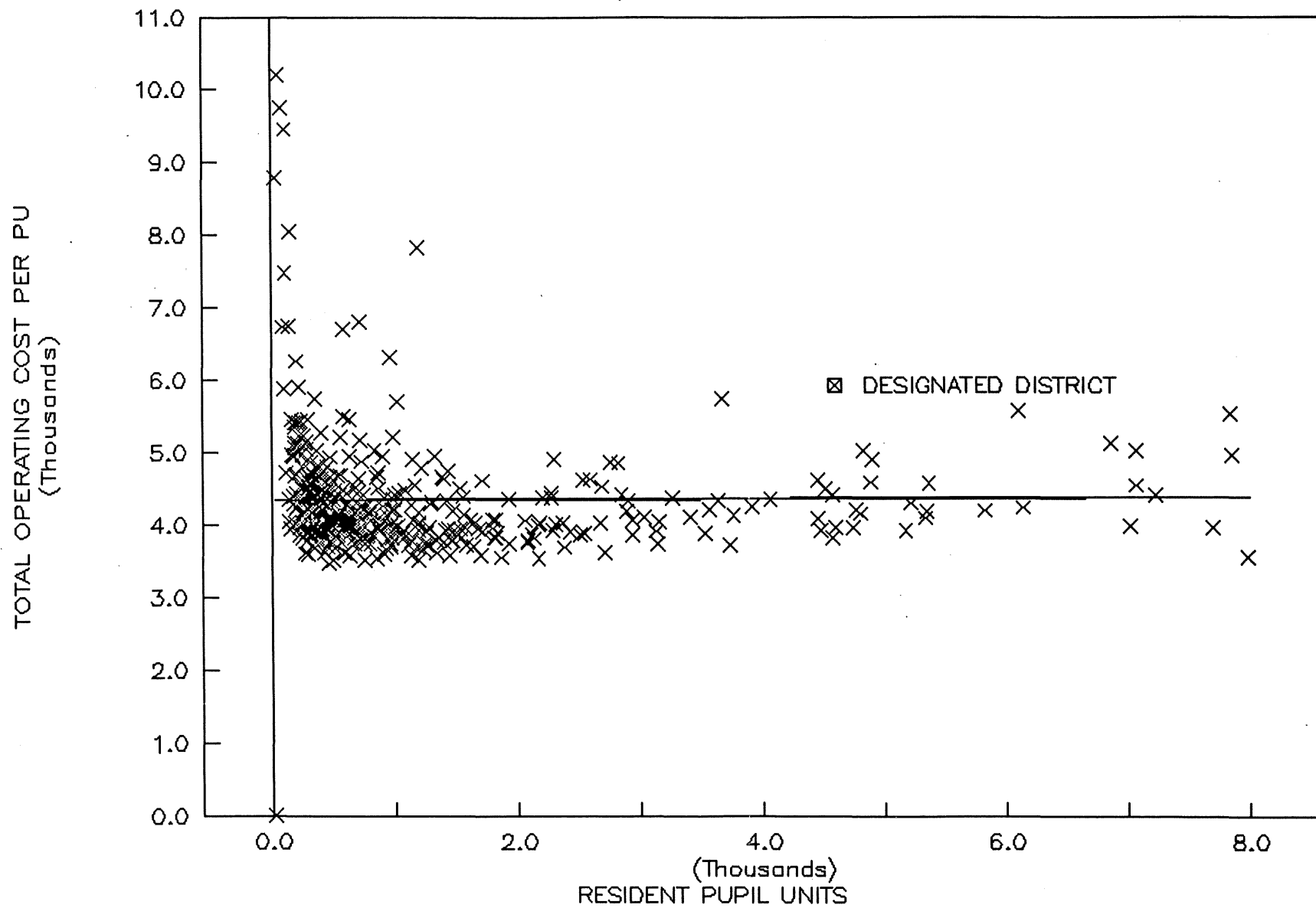

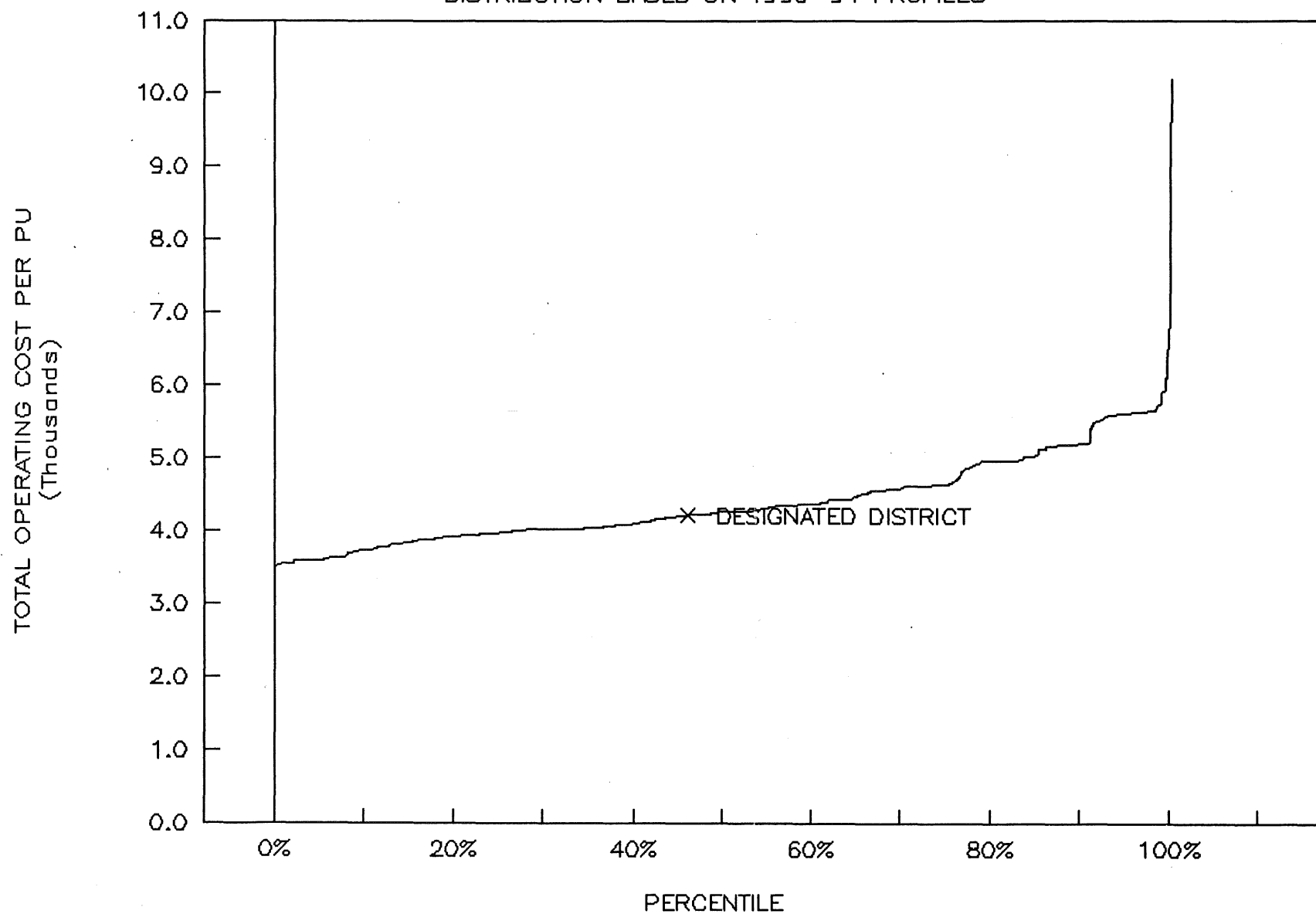
PROFILES 1990-91 SCATTERPLOT

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INTRODUCTION

School District Profiles, 1990-91 represents the 19th consecutive year in which the Minnesota Department of Education has produced a publication of comparative statistics on traditional school districts. It also is the second edition in which financial data for cooperative education units is included. Comparisons of the traditional districts are provided in the areas of enrollments, number of students, expenditures, tax rates, etc. Although some definitions have changed over the years, it is still possible to make reasonable interdistrict comparisons for these districts over a substantial number of years.

The financial data on cooperative education units has been added in order to provide the reader a more comprehensive picture of Minnesota PK-12 expenditures.

Interdistrict Cooperation

Prior to 1979 every school district was required to provide a complete education program for all grades--prekindergarten through 12. However, the 1979 and 1983 Minnesota legislatures enacted laws encouraging school districts to cooperate in the provision of services. For example, one cooperating district might provide all educational services for grades prekindergarten through 6th grade for pupils of both districts. And the other district would educate both districts' 7th through 12th grade

pupils. The districts' staff might also teach in each other's schools. Arrangements of this type have grown significantly since these statutes were enacted. One hundred and twenty-six (126) school districts participated in an Interdistrict Cooperation Agreement and/or Agreement for Secondary Education. Interdistrict Cooperation Agreements allow two or more districts to cooperate in providing services for specific grades; however, only one district may provide service for grades 10, 11, and 12. Agreements for Secondary Education allow districts with fewer than 375 pupils in grades 7-12 to enter into an agreement with another district(s) to provide instruction to its secondary pupils. These cooperating districts are noted in parenthesis after the school name by ICE or ASE, respectively. In 1990-91 the following districts participated in one or more of these arrangements:

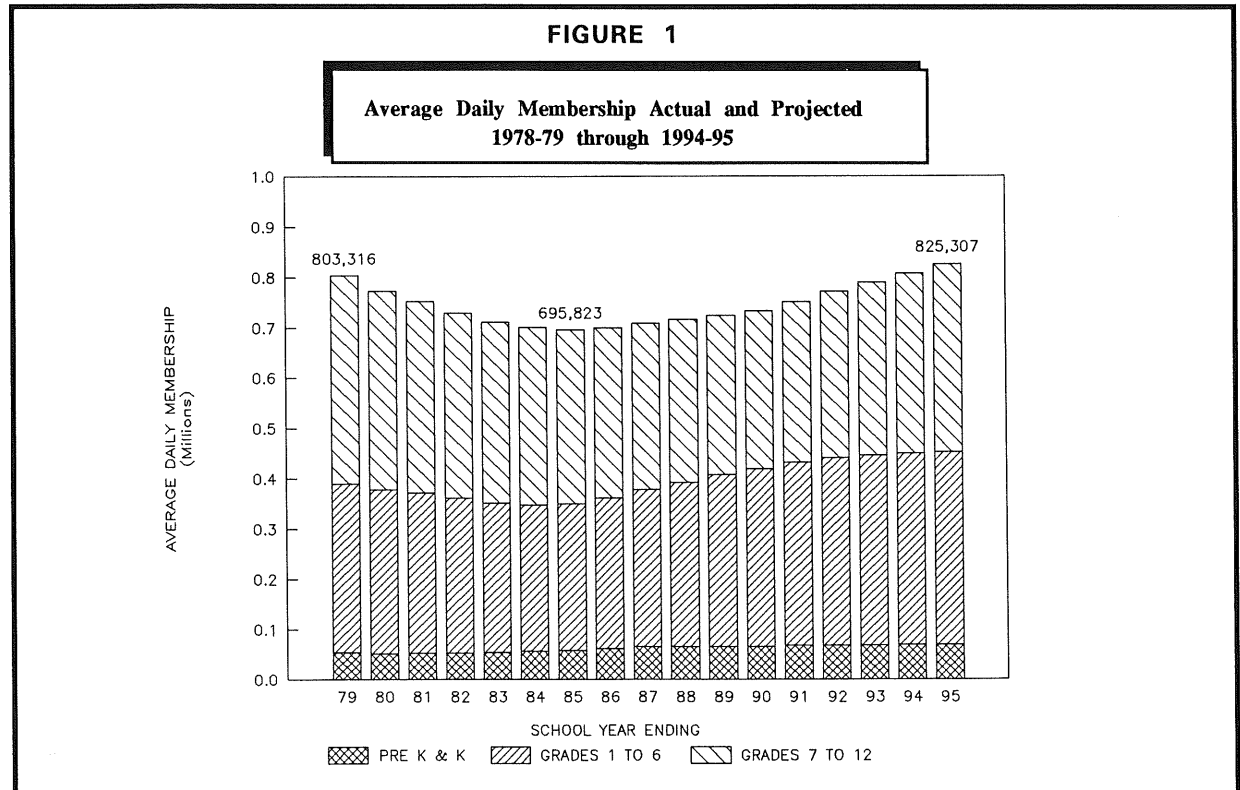

Students

Figure 1 illustrates actual and projected changes in enrollment by grade level. Total enrollments have increased 17,400 or 2.4 percent since 1984-85 -- after more than a decade of declines. Since births are the main driving force behind enrollments, the turnaround first appeared in the elementary grades; secondary enrollments continued to decline until 1990-91. Figure 1 also indicates that total enrollments are projected to continue increasing beyond 1990-91. Table 1 indicates that approximately 70 percent of Minnesota school districts lost enrollment during the past decade even though total state enrollment was almost identical in 1980-81 and 1990-91. Growth in a modest number of large metropolitan school districts was able to counterbalance declines in a larger number of small, outstate districts.

Minnesota school districts continue to vary significantly in the number of pupils which they enroll, as indicated in Table 2. The largest ten percent of the state's districts enroll more than half of all students; the smallest ten percent of districts, fewer than one percent of all students. These percentages have changed very little during the past decade. The enrollment density of school districts also varies tremendously. The highest density districts are almost all in the Twin Cities metropolitan area; conversely, the least dense districts are in the heavily forested northern quarter of the state.



The population of minorities continues to increase, vis-a-vis the white majority, throughout the nation. This is reflected in a growth in the proportion of pupils who are members of a minority group (see Table 3 and Figure 2). However, a number of differences are apparent between Minnesota and the United States as a whole. First, the percentage of minority enrollments in Minnesota is still well below that of the U.S. (7.0 vs. 28.7 percent in 1986-87 -- the last year for which comparisons are available). Secondly, the composition of Minnesota's

minority enrollment is significantly different than that of the U.S. In 1986-87, Blacks constituted over half of all United States minority enrollments (54.3 percent), Hispanics one-third (33.4 percent), Asians (9.4 percent) and Native Americans (2.9 percent), the remainder. In Minnesota these percentages were: Blacks 35.9 percent, Hispanics 11.7 percent, Asians 32.6 percent and Native Americans 20.8 percent. Minnesota's large Asian percentage is the result of an especially significant in-migration of Southeast Asian refugees following the Vietnam

war. Minnesota's proportion of Native Americans has historically been greater than in most states.

Figure 3 indicates the number of students from families who received AFDC payments. The percentage of pupils from these families has increased during most years of the past decade.

Instructional Staff

Teachers, and other professional staff, are the primary resource in PK-12 education; they

Racial/Ethnic Composition of Minnesota's PK-12 Enrollment 1980-81 and 1990-91

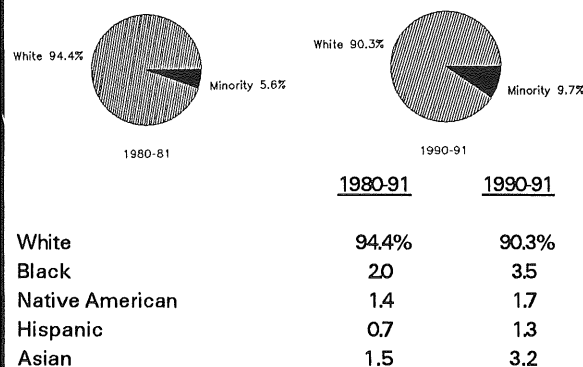
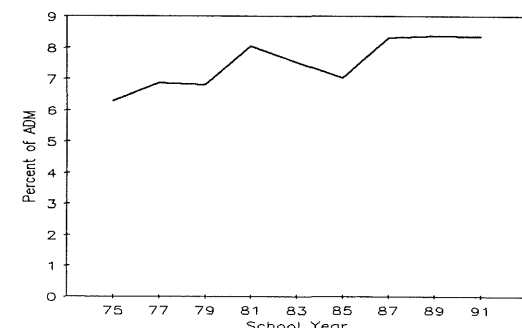

constitute the largest single cost. This cost, in turn, is a function of the number of staff employed and their salaries and benefits. Figure 4 indicates how the number of staff has varied over the decade. It shows that the number hired is not precisely related to the number of pupils educated; the pupil-staff ratio has a tendency to decrease during times of enrollment decline and increase when enrollments grow. The exceptionally high pupil-teacher ratios of the early 80's were the result of budget crises which resulted in an above-average number of layoffs/below average number of new hires.

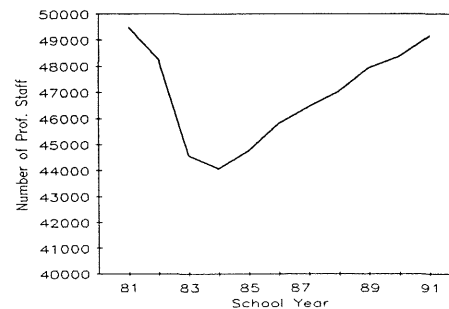
Staff salaries have increased significantly during the past decade as shown in Figure 5. These increases are the result of the size of salaries negotiated and the experience level of districts' staff. During the enrollment declines of the 70's and early 80's few new inexperienced staff were hired. The remaining staff, on average, became older and more experienced which, in turn, resulted in a higher proportion of staff at the upper end of the salary schedules. This aging phenomenon is observable in Figure 6; almost 45 percent of all teachers in 1990-91 were at least 45 years of age versus fewer than 30 percent a decade earlier.

Figure 7 shows the percentage of staff by grade level for 1980-81 and 1990-91. It indicates a redistribution from the secondary to the elementary and middle school levels which parallels the change in grade level distribution of

enrollments during the same period. It also shows an increase in the percentage of special education teachers--a trend of many years.

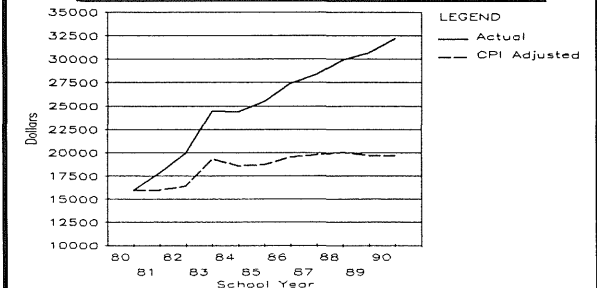
**State Total Professional Staff

1981-82 through 1990-91**

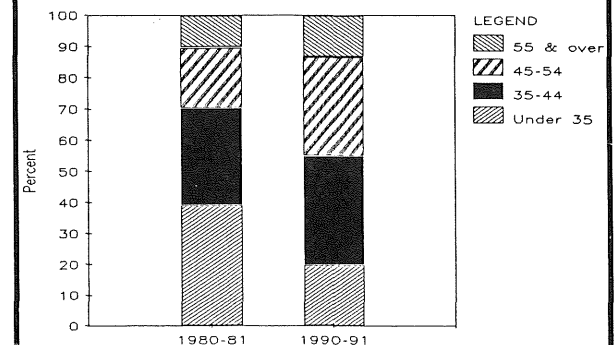

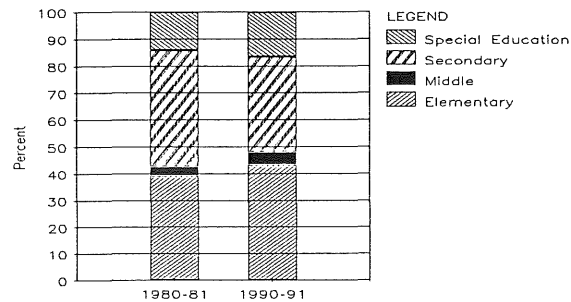
**Age of Classroom Teachers

1980-81 and 1990-91

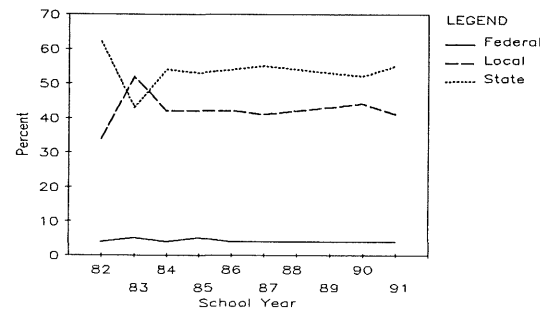

Financial

Revenues: With the exception of the 82-83 budget crisis year, the sources of Minnesota school revenues have been quite constant over the decade as indicated in Figure 8. The state has contributed approximately 53 percent, local property taxes 43 percent and the federal government 4 percent. Minnesota's federal funds percentage, is approximately two-thirds of the United States average; these funds are typically targeted towards specific disadvantaged client populations for which Minnesota's proportions are generally less than in the U.S. as a whole.

Another way of looking at Minnesota's PK-12 revenues is by fund. A fund is a self-contained set of accounts established for the purpose of a specifically defined set of fiscal activities. Table 4 shows the percent of Minnesota school district revenues by the eight UFARS funds for school years 1980-81 and 1990-91. Significant increases in revenue were noted in the Capital Expenditure and Building Construction funds over that period.

Expenditures: As indicated in Figure 9, statewide average operating expenditures have risen dramatically since 1981-82-- by 35.9 percent after taking into account inflation, as represented by the Consumer Price Index (CPI). However,

these expenditures vary significantly from district to district as indicated in Figure 10. The top five percent spending districts expend at least 50.0 percent more than the lowest spending five percent of districts.

Table 5 shows that the distribution of these operating expenditures according to program has also changed over the decade. Instruction has gained vis-a-vis other programs; increases in the number of special education staff combined with increased salaries accounted for some of the redistribution.

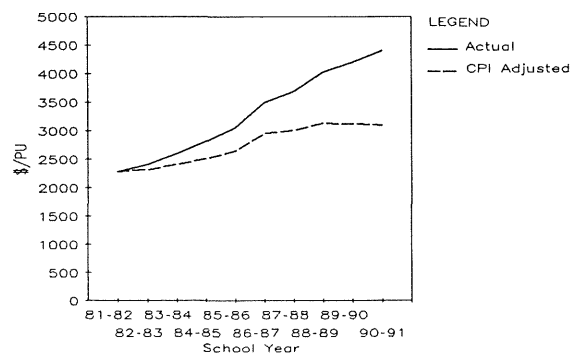

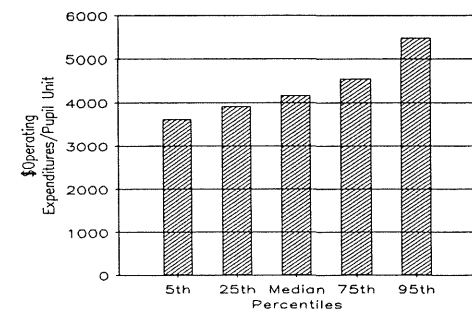
**State Average Operating Expenditures

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Capital Outlay, Building Construction, and Debt Service (columns 31, 32 and 33) can be described as nonoperating expenditures. As indicated in Figure 11, expenditures for these items have also risen dramatically since 1981-82. The state has provided more dollars for capital needs in recent years through equalization of capital expenditure revenue.

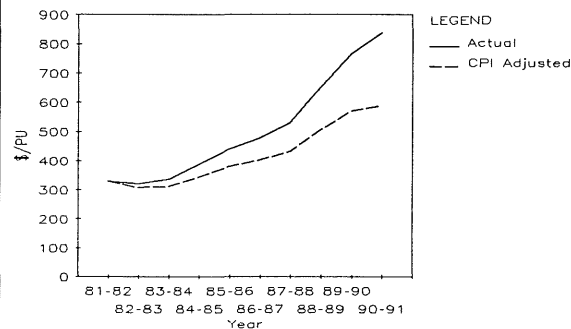

Community education/community service programs have traditionally emphasized recreation, sports, cultural activities and crafts. Beginning with the 1984-85 school year the scope of these programs was expanded with the initiation of the Early Childhood and Family Education Program. This program was designed to improve the parenting skills of parents with pre-school aged children as well as their children's readiness for school. In 1987-88 Community Service was further expanded with the addition of the Youth Development Program. This latter program was designed to recruit and involve school aged youth in various school/community decision-making processes. As a result of these new programs there has been a significant growth in total Community Service Expenditures as indicated in Figure 12.

A school district's undesignated operating funds balance is a measure of the financial status which it has at the end of the school year. It can be either positive or negative. Districts with a negative balance where the magnitude of the deficit is greater than 2.5 percent of their previous year's operating expenditures are in violation of the expenditure limitations specified by Minnesota Statutes. These districts are required to submit a financial report to the Commissioner of Education describing their plans to eliminate

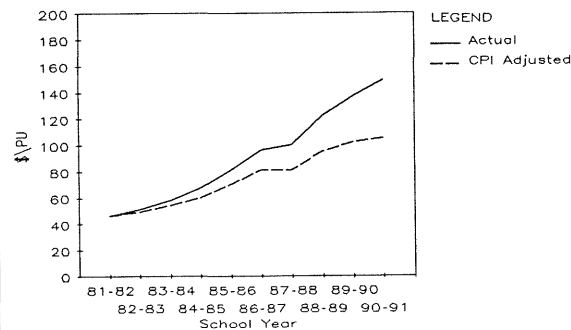

the negative balance. By contrast, districts with net operating fund balances in excess of \$600 per pupil unit will have their general education revenue reduced for the next school year. Figure 13 shows the state average operating funds balance for the years 1981-82 through 1990-91. It has decreased 32.5 percent since 1983-84. Figure 14 shows the number of school districts who were in violation of expenditure limitations since 1984-85. It has increased during most of the period.

A school district's Adjusted Net Tax Capacity per pupil unit is a measure of real and personal property, within the district, which is subject to a local property tax levy. It varies significantly from district to district as indicated in Figure 15. Districts in the fifth percentile have one-seventh or less the property wealth per pupil unit of districts in the 95th percentile. It is this great disparity in the wealth of school districts that has driven education funding lawsuits from the 1970's to the present day. The result has been a national trend towards less reliance on the use of the local property tax to finance PK-12 education.

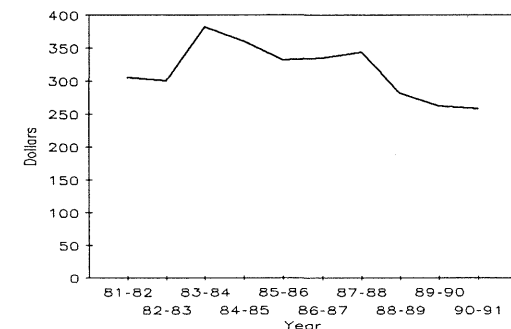
Statewide Average Community Service Expenditures Per Pupil Unit 1981-82 through 1990-91

State Average Operating Funds Balance Per Pupil Unit 1981-82 through 1990-91

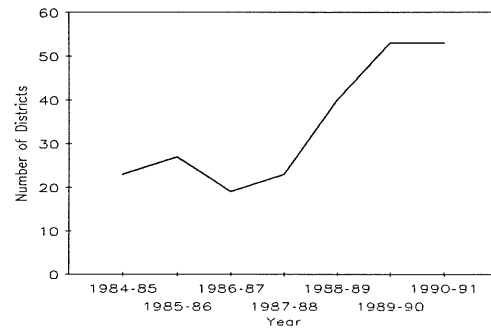

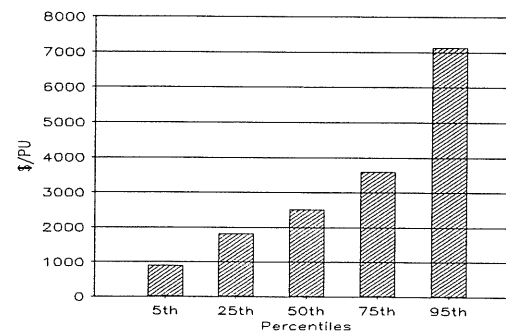
**Number of Districts

The tables on pages 22 through 49 contain 38 separate statistics for each school district, county, and region in the state. Definitions of these 38 statistics are given below. All data are for the 1990-91 school year.¹

1990-91 Resident Average Daily Membership

Average daily membership (ADM) is the average number of pupils in membership during the school year. Pupils need not be in attendance to be counted in ADM, but they must be in membership (i.e., currently enrolled in the district). For example, a pupil who is enrolled for the entire school year counts as 1.0 ADM; a pupil who is enrolled for exactly half the school year counts as 0.5 ADM.

The ADM counts in this report are, more specifically, counts of total resident ADM including all residents who are, a) enrolled in their home district, b) educated in another district to whom tuition is paid, or c) attending another district under the Enrollment Options law. Resident membership includes:

1. **Prekindergarten Handicapped** -- ADM of prekindergarten students enrolled in special education programs.
2. **Kindergarten** -- ADM of students enrolled in kindergarten classes.
3. **Elementary, Grades 1-6** -- ADM of students enrolled in grades 1-6, including students in elementary-level ungraded and special education classes.
4. **Secondary, Grades 7-12** -- ADM of students enrolled in grades 7-12, including students in secondary-level ungraded and special education classes.
5. **Total** -- Total ADM of all district residents, prekindergarten through grade 12; this is the total of columns 1 through 4.

Pupil Data

6. **Percent Minority** -- The percentage of the district's students who are of Native American, Alaskan, Black, Asian, or Hispanic ancestry.
7. **Percent Attendance** -- The average ratio of days attended to days enrolled, for all students in the district.
8. **Percent Transported** -- The number of resident public school students transported to and from school twenty or more days, as a percentage of the district's resident pupils.

Professional Staff

These statistics provide information about each district's professional staff. Staff are counted in full-time equivalents (FTE). For example, a full-time staff member is counted as 1.0 FTE; one employed only half-time is counted as 0.5 FTE. Staff counts include only elementary-secondary personnel; postsecondary personnel are excluded.

9. **Total Staff FTE** -- The total number of licensed professional staff employed by the district, measured in full time equivalents (FTE). This count includes administrators, classroom teachers, and all other licensed professional personnel.
10. **Pupil Staff Ratio** -- The average daily membership of all students (both residents and nonresidents) who were enrolled in the school district, divided by the number of professional staff (column 9).

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Tax Capacity Rates

These figures show the tax burden, expressed as a percent of tax capacity, for school district property taxes payable in 1991. Taxes payable in 1991 provide revenue for the 1991-92 school year.

11. **Auditor Percent** -- The actual school district tax rate as determined by the county auditor. With a rate of 5 percent, a property owner would be taxed \$5 for each \$100 of tax capacity. Because of differences in property assessment levels between counties, comparisons of auditor tax rates among districts may be misleading. This figure includes additional tax rates for special intermediate districts (287, 916 and 917) where they are part of the tax burden.
12. **Equalized Percent** -- This tax rate is computed by multiplying the auditor percent (item 11) by the 1990 market sales ratio. This ratio is equal to the market values, as determined by the local assessor, divided by actual selling prices. For state assessed properties, such as utilities, the ratio is 1.00.

Equalized percents are computed to compensate for varying assessment practices. Thus, when making interdistrict comparisons, these rates provide a more valid comparison.

Pupil Units (Weighted ADM)

13. **Resident Pupil Units** -- This figure is computed by applying weightings to a district's resident average daily membership (as defined above). Each kindergarten ADM counts as 0.5 pupil units; each prekindergarten, kindergarten handicapped, and elementary ADM counts as 1.0 pupil unit; and each secondary ADM counts as 1.35 pupil units. Resident pupil units are used in calculating the district's general education revenue and property tax levy limitations.

14. **Total Pupil Units** -- This is a count of pupil units which adjusts the resident pupil units in column 13 to better reflect the expenditures reported by the school districts. It includes residents attending the home district, resident students tuitioned to other school districts, nonpublic school students being served via a Shared Time program, nonresident students who transfer via one of the attendance options programs, and nonresident students whose tuition is paid by a parent or out-of-state source. Excluded are pupil units which represent that portion of a student's time spent in a Postsecondary Enrollment Options institution.

Revenue Percentages

These three columns show the percentage of each district's revenues from the federal government, the state government, and local and other sources. The percentages are based on all 1990-91 revenue reported by each district, except for proceeds from sales of real property and equipment, insurance recoveries, sales of bonds, loans and interfund transfers.

15. **Federal** -- The percentage of revenues from the federal government, whether paid directly or through another governmental unit.
16. **State** -- The percentage of revenues from the Minnesota State Government.
17. **Local and Other** -- The percentage of revenues from local and other sources. This category includes revenues from property taxes, interest, rent, gifts, tuition, fees, and other revenue not classified as federal or state.

1990-91 Expenditures Per Pupil Unit

Columns 18 through 33 show each district's 1990-91 expenditures in sixteen different categories, divided by total pupils units (column 14). Columns 18 through 30 include all expenditures for the indicated purpose, except capital expenditures.

18. **District and School Administration** -- Expenditures for the school board and for the office of the superintendent, principals, and any other line administrators who supervise staff.
19. **District Support Services** -- Expenditures for central office administration and central office operations not included in district and school administration (see #18). Includes expenditures for business services, data processing, legal services, personnel office, printing, and the school census.
20. **Regular Instruction** -- Expenditures for elementary and secondary classroom instruction, not including vocational instruction (#21) and exceptional instruction (#22), and for cocurricular and extracurricular activities. Includes salaries of teachers, classroom aides, and coaches, and expenditures for classroom supplies and textbooks.
21. **Vocational Instruction** -- Expenditures in secondary schools for instruction that is related to job skills and career exploration. Includes expenditures for home economics, as well as industrial, business, agriculture, and distributive education.
22. **Exceptional Instruction** -- Expenditures for instruction of students who, because of atypical characteristics or conditions, are provided educational programs that are different from regular instructional programs. Includes expenditures for special instruction of students who are emotionally or psychologically handicapped, gifted and talented, or mentally retarded; for students with physical, hearing, speech, and visual impairments; and for students with special learning and behavior problems.
23. **Instructional Support Services** -- Expenditures for activities intended to help teachers provide instruction, not including expenditures for principals or superintendents. Includes expenditures for assistant principals, curriculum development, libraries, media centers, audio-visual support, staff development, and computer assisted instruction.
24. **Pupil Support Services** -- Expenditures for all noninstructional services provided to students, not including transportation and food. Includes expenditures for counseling, guidance, health services, psychological services, and attendance and social work services.
25. **Operations and Maintenance** -- Expenditures for operation, maintenance, and repair of the district's buildings, grounds, and equipment. Includes expenditures for custodians, fuel for buildings, electricity, telephones, and repairs.
26. **Food Service** -- Expenditures for the preparation and serving of meals and snacks to students.
27. **Pupil Transportation** -- Expenditures for transportation of students, including salaries, contracted services, fuel for buses, and other expenditures.
28. **Other Operating Programs²** -- Expenditures for general fund operated programs necessary to a district's operations but not assignable to other programs. These can include federally funded community education services, property and liability premiums, unemployment insurance premiums, principal and interest on noncapital obligations, and nonrecurring costs such as judgements and liens.
29. **Total PK-12 Operating Expenditures** -- The total of the eleven preceding categories of expenditures (columns 18 through 28).

This figure includes all expenditures incurred for the benefit of

elementary and secondary education during the 1990-91 school year, except capital and debt service expenditures.

30. **Community Service** -- Expenditures for recreation, civic activities, adult education, early childhood education, or similar programs which are not conducted primarily for elementary and secondary students, and for noncredit summer school programs.
31. **Capital Outlay** -- All capital expenditures charged to the operating funds plus expenditures charged to the district's capital expenditure fund.
32. **Building Construction** -- All expenditures charged to the district's building construction fund. Expenditures are for major capital projects funded by bond proceeds, state capital loan, state facility grant or the downpayment levy.
33. **Debt Service** -- Expenditures for repayment of long term debt (see #37), including payments of principal and interest on bonds and capital loans.

Other Measures Per Pupil Unit

34. **Operating Funds Balance** -- This figure is a measure of the district's financial condition at the end of the 1990-91 school year, and of how much resources are available to be used in future years. It is equal to the sum of the undesignated balances on June 30, 1991, from the four operating funds (general, food service, pupil transportation, and community service), excluding the amount of statutory operating debt; this balance is then divided by 1990-91 resident pupil units (column 13).

35. **Change in Funds Balance** -- The difference between the district's operating funds balance on June 30, 1991 (see #34 above) and on June 30, 1990, divided by 1990-91 resident pupil units. This is essentially equal to the difference between the district's 1990-91 revenues and expenditures, for the four operating funds combined. Thus, a negative number indicates that the district's expenditures in the operating funds were greater than its revenues.

36. **State and Local Operating Costs** -- This figure, also called adjusted maintenance cost, is often used to compare overall costs of education per pupil unit that is financed through state and local funds. It is computed as follows:

Sum of general, food service and agency fund expenditures,
Plus textbook expenditures from the capital expenditure fund,
Minus transfers between funds,
Minus revenue from the federal government,
Minus revenue from sale of food and materials,
Minus admission fees and gate receipts from school activities,
Minus special education tuition;

This total is then divided by 1990-91 total pupil units (column 14).

37. **Long Term Debt** -- The amount of long term debt outstanding on June 30, 1991, divided by 1990-91 resident pupil units. Long term debt includes bonds and capital, debt service and energy loans from the state.
38. **1990 Adjusted Net Tax Capacity** -- The 1990 adjusted net tax capacity of the district divided by 1990-91 resident pupil units. This figure is an indicator of the district's ability to raise revenue through local property taxes.

Footnotes

¹ There are three exceptions to this general rule. The two tax rate statistics (columns 11 and 12) are for taxes payable in calendar year 1991; these taxes will provide revenue for 1991-92.

Adjusted net tax capacity (column 38) is based on property values in 1990; this figure will be used in computing state aids and tax levy limitations for the 1992-93 school year.

² Most school districts included all expenditures for employee benefits in the same UFARS programs as the employees' salaries. Thus, for example, health insurance for the superintendent is included with "district and school administration" (column 18), and benefits for teachers are included with instructional programs (columns 20, 21 and 22). Other districts incorrectly reported all expenditures for employee benefits separately; for these districts, the expenditures show up in "other operating programs" (column 28). Because of this difference in accounting practices there is significant variation in the amounts reported in column 28.

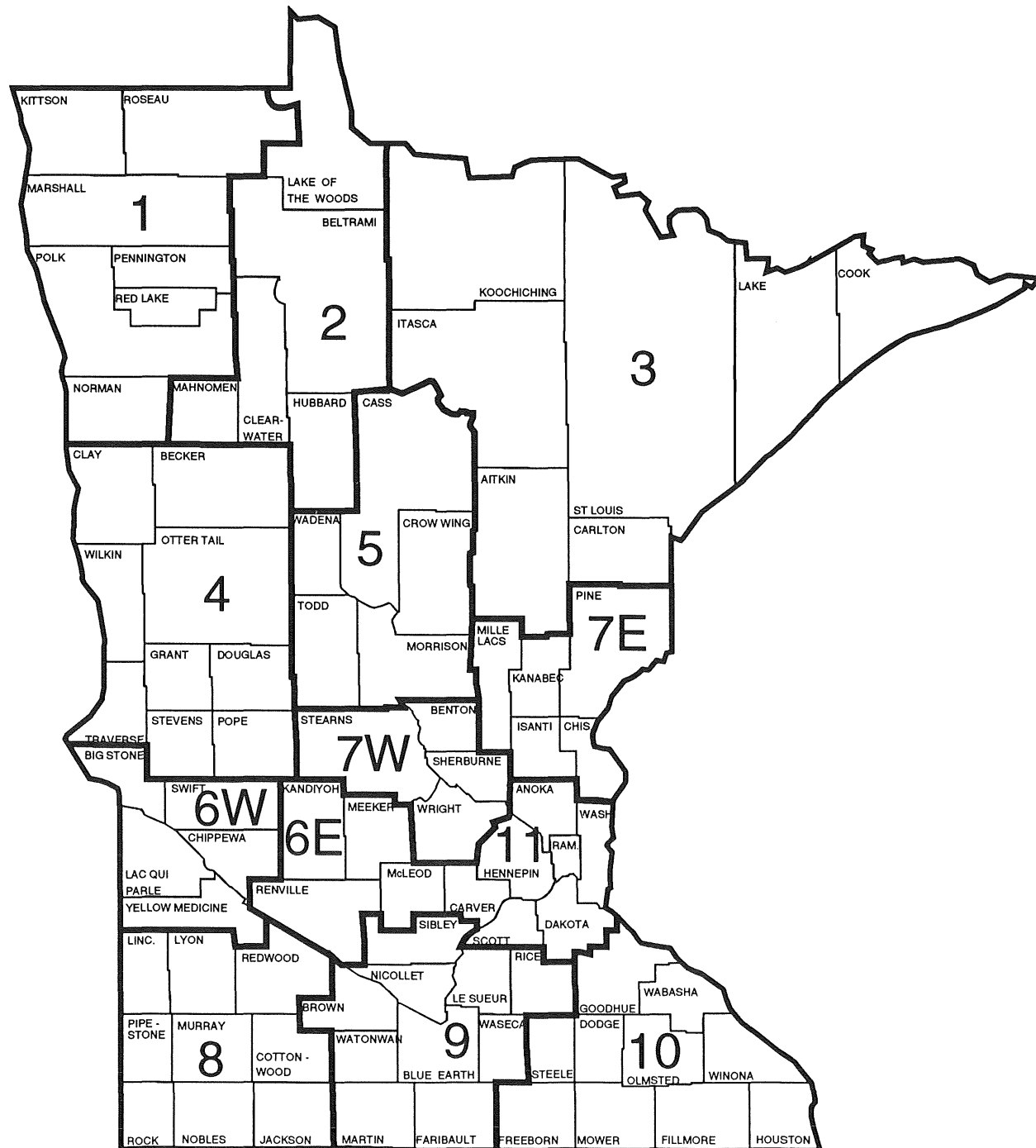

SUMMARY STATISTICS

The table below lists a variety of summary statistics for each of the 38 variables included in this report. The attendant definitions explain the meaning of these statistics.

This table may be used to better understand the distribution of a particular variable among Minnesota school districts. For example, percent attendance (column 7) varies little; ninety percent of the school

districts are within the narrow range of 94.3% (5th percentile) to 97.6% (95th percentile).

The table may also be used to see how an individual school district compares with other districts in the state. Two examples illustrate this use of the data.

1. A district which has total PK-12 operating expenditures (column 29) of \$4,200 per pupil unit

is very near the median value, which is \$4,167. Thus, about half the districts in the state have lower and half have higher expenditures.

2. A district with total average daily membership (column 5) of 300 students is between the 20th and 25th percentiles for this variable. Somewhere between 20 and 25 percent of Minnesota school districts have fewer students than this district.

SUMMARY STATISTICS

Lowest Value - For any specific variable, the lowest value of that variable among all 433 school districts. The table also shows the highest value for each variable.

XXth percentile - For any specific variable, a value chosen such that XX percent of the school districts are below the chosen value. For example, the 10th percentile for total staff (column 9) is 18, this means that ten percent of the school districts have 18 or fewer staff members (FTE). The 25th and 75th percentile are also

called quartiles; the 10th, 20th, 30th,...through 90th percentiles are also called deciles.

Median - For any specific variable, a value chosen such that half of the school districts are below the chosen value, and half are above.

State Total - For variables 1-5 (1990-91 resident average daily membership, 9 (total staff), and 13-14 (pupil units), the state total is simply the sum of the

corresponding value for all 433 districts listed in the report. For all other variables, the state total is computed as the sum of the numerators for all districts, divided by sum of the denominators. For example, State total pupil-staff ratio =

$$\frac{\text{State total of pupils}}{\text{State total of staff}}$$

For these variables, the state total is a form of weighted average.
