## INTRODUCTION

The Minnesota Employment and Wages by Economic Region and County is published quarterly by the Research and Statistics Office of the Minnesota Department of Jobs and Training. The data contained in this publication includes two digits of industry detail wherever possible. To avoid violating data privacy laws and to maintain the mandated confidentiality of individual firm data it was necessary to combine industries wherever there are too few firms in an industry cell. For this reason, some counties show less industry detail than others.

The source of the information is data developed and analyzed by the Research and Statistics Office of the Minnesota Department of Jobs and Training. The data is selected from quarterly tax reports submitted by employers covered under the Minnesota unemployment compensation tax law. All individual employer data is confidential. The data selected is reviewed for accuracy and organized in accordance with the U.S. 1987 Standard Industrial Classification Manual. Approximately 97 percent of the total nonagricultural wage and salary employment in Minnesota is included. There are eight categories of workers excluded from coverage under Minnesota State law:

- 1) the self-employed;
- 2) farms with less than four employees in 20 weeks;
- 3) all railroad transportation employment;
- 4) insurance and real estate salespeople who work only on commission basis;
- 5) students working for the school while a full-time student;
- 6) those employed by a church or synagogue for religious work;
- 7) minor children, spouse and parents working for owner of a business;
- 8) elected officials at the Federal, State and Local levels of government.

## TERMS

This section defines a number of key terms necessary to use this data.

The term units refers to the number of plant locations or work sites within the industry and county. For example, there are seven units of the U.S. Post Office in Morrison County.

Monthly employment is reported by job site, not residence of the employees and represents a count of workers on employer payrolls for the week including the 12th of the month.

Average employment is calculated by summing the three monthly figures and dividing by 3. Sub-totals do not necessarily add to totals because of rounding.

Total wages represent wages paid during the entire quarter.

The average weekly wage is calculated by dividing total wages paid by average employment and then dividing again by 13. Average weekly wage figures should be used with caution. Some industries have more temporary or part-time workers than others and this has the effect of lowering the average weekly wage. Also, average weekly wages in some industries may be high because of bonuses paid at the end of a year, or because lower-paid seasonal workers were laid off.

Unallocated employment is listed on page 31. It represents employment of traveling salespeople who have no attachment to a specific work site or those few employers who are not able to report multiple business locations separately.

## THIRD QUARTER 1992 COVERED EMPLOYMENT

### Comparison To Prior Quarter

Propelled by seasonal decreases at the Local Government level as Elementary and Secondary Schools (SIC 8211) closed down for the summer, Minnesota covered employment decreased by 8,915 positions between second and third quarter 1992. (Table 1). The seasonal shift in schools is one of the best established annual variations in Minnesota employment (Figure 1); school employment in third quarter drives both Local Government and Total Government levels. Third quarter decreases in State Government are also education related, with reduced summer activity in colleges and universities. Collectively these changes in Government combined to a net reduction of 15.33% in 1992, continuing a five year history of seasonal reduction in the 14% to 15% range. (Table 2).

Third quarter data (Table 1) confirms other seasonal increases:

- **Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries** gained 3,351 jobs (16.4%).
- **Construction** added 10,943 positions (13.9%).
- **Manufacturing** grew by 8,645 jobs (2.19%), riding the seasonal crest of Food & Kindred Services.
- **Services** gained the most jobs, 13,467 additions (2.46%), with the seasonal components Hotels & Lodging and Amusement & Recreation adding to growth in Business Services and in Health Services

The seasonal swings (Table 2) in **Agriculture** and **Construction** closely match their industry performances between second and third quarters of recent years. **Services** showed improvement over its industry pattern in the similar period of 1991. **Trade**, however, departed from the recent pattern for its industry and grew less than 1%, even with the return of its second to third quarter seasonal component in Eating & Drinking Establishments. **Manufacturing's** second to third quarter rate moved back above 2% after declining in 1991.

Seasonal behavior of another type, this time in the negative direction, was seen in the data for **Transportation, Communications & Public Utilities**. There is an expected seasonal downswing of 2000+ jobs in the passenger transportation segment of Transportation each summer as school bus drivers depart for the summer. Those reductions in 1992 do not alone account for the 2% contraction of this industry, an increase of the smaller percentage loss seen in 1991. Continued volatility in the air transport segment is a non-seasonal factor affecting **Transportation, Communications & Public Utilities**.



Overall, Minnesota third quarter employment experienced its fourth consecutive year of net job contraction. The seasonal employment pattern noted earlier for the schools remained stable. However, weak economic gains in the private sector were insufficient to offset seasonal contraction.

#### Comparison to Prior Year.

A primary economic influence is the slow rebound from the 1991 nationwide business recession. Comparison of third quarter data from prior years makes those effects visible. Table 3 charts third quarter average employment totals from 1985 to 1992. Table 4 converts the 1985 - 1992 data to percentage changes between years.

Comparing second quarter to third quarter shows the seasonal economic influence, a pattern that resembles experience of prior years. To see where the underlying non-seasonal weakness lies, third quarter figures need to be compared to third quarter figures from prior years. The Total State and Total Private numbers from Table 4 are shown in Figure 2, .



The picture conveyed here is consistent with a business recession:

- Employment growth peaks in 1988.
- Employment is still growing in 1989 and 1990, but the rate is slowing.
- Employment growth for the Total State nears zero in 1991; the private sector growth rate is slightly negative at this point.
- Employment growth returns in 1992.

The curve of the line for the private sector shapes the total state curve. The change within the three largest industries - Services, Trade, Manufacturing - follows the same pattern of peak-slow-trough-growth. One possible interpretation here is that the third quarter annual data indicates an end to the recessionary contraction.

### Considerations in Manufacturing

The business recession is not the only long term factor affecting Minnesota employment. There have been great concerns over loss of high-quality, high-pay jobs and growth of lower-quality, lower-pay jobs. Manufacturing has been the traditional source of jobs in the former category. Third quarter data provides some insight into both the recessionary and the long term changes within this sector.

Figure 3 plots employment totals for all Manufacturing between January, 1990 and September, 1992. This plot brackets the period when the third quarter growth line slowed (1990), hit its trough (1991) and then reversed direction (1992).



Since the plot is monthly data, we get a finer look at seasonal and nonseasonal information in the form of actual employment rather than rate changes. As expected, the shape of the curve is seasonal for summer employment: an August peak after a second to third quarter increase. As expected, there is recessionary evidence in the curve: lower peaks and deeper troughs through the end of 1991, with some improvement in 1992. However, there is no evidence of strong post-recessionary recovery in Manufacturing: total third quarter jobs are near the 1988 level, not the 1990 level.

Figure 4 breaks total Manufacturing down to its durable goods and non-durable goods categories.



In this comparison a non-recessionary event is visible. The slope of the non-durable goods line is positive, gaining overall employment. The slope of the durable goods line is negative, losing overall employment, with a slight acceleration of that loss during the recessionary trough. Durable goods is declining as a proportion of Minnesota total Manufacturing, even if the total industry is growing slightly. Non-durable goods is more strongly seasonal than durable goods, with the peak occurring during the third quarter, and fewer year-round jobs compared to durable goods. If this gap continues to narrow, there is a net effect of losing permanent non-seasonal (higher quality) jobs for part-time seasonal (lesser quality) jobs.

The contraction in durable goods manufacturing can best be seen in the Industrial & Commercial Machinery and Computer Equipment sector (Figure 5).



This sector has historically contributed the largest number of jobs in the durable goods area. The pattern seen during the business recession has been one of sustained job loss, bottoming out in third quarter 1991, followed by slight increases through third quarter 1992. The weakness of the third quarter 1992 upswing compared to the steepness of the third quarter 1990 and 1991 downswing argues for permanent job losses in this important sector. None of the other durable goods manufacturing components displayed this job loss pattern; most returned or nearly returned to their 1990 levels in 1992.

The two seasonal components of durable goods manufacturing displayed their own variations (Figure 6).



These are summer seasonal industries that follow events in the construction industry. Note here that third quarter (peak) employment for Lumber & Wood drops in 1991, but then does recover to 1990 levels in third quarter 1992. Stone, Clay, Glass & Concrete appears to be lagging its seasonal companion, and has not fully rebounded by third quarter 1992.

Figure 7 looks at the three largest areas of non-durable goods manufacturing.



This comparison confirms that between second and third quarter Manufacturing rides a seasonal crest in its Food & Kindred component. Additionally, Food & Kindred shows an annual growth between the third quarter peaks, even across the worst recessionary year. Both Printing & Publishing and Paper & Allied Products, on the other hand, appear almost unaffected by seasonal variations and recessionary pressure. One year segments taken from that curve are nearly linear compared to Food & Kindred, indicating stable employment; the flatness of the curve along the 1991 segment does indicate stagnant growth during the worst recessionary year. Compare this experience to similar data from Industrial & Commercial Machinery and Computer Equipment (Figure 5).

## Considerations in Services.

While **Manufacturing** has been in the doldrums, **Services** has continued the expansion that in 1991 pushed it past **Trade** as the largest sector of the Minnesota economy. Additionally, it was the only sector among the "Big Three" (**Services, Trade, Manufacturing**) that did not contract during the 1990 - 1991 recession period. Table 5 shows how the component areas of **Services** behaved in the seasonal period second quarter to third quarter 1992; Table 6 looks at employment growth between third quarter 1991 and third quarter 1992. Both tables provide quarterly average data.

As previously noted, the expected third quarter seasonal increase in **Services** from summer employment in **Hotels and Other Lodging** (9.31% gain) and in **Amusement and Recreation Services** (10.55% gain) did occur. Table 5 and Table 6 also show that **Business Services** and **Health Services** were large contributors in absolute (total jobs) terms. When Table 5 and Table 6 rates are compared,

-- **Amusement and Recreation Services** stands out with high seasonal (10.55%) and annual growth (24.43%). The growth in the gaming industry, especially casino gambling, is a large factor here; continued growth at these rates seems doubtful, because the market will eventually be saturated.

-- **Business Services** is the dominant growth industry performer (14.79%). Included in this area is temporary employment services. Future prospects in this sector are not clear, partly because the widespread use of temporary services and out-source of business services are recent developments. One hypothesis is that use of temporary services will abate if a strong economic recovery takes place and employers return to permanent hiring; a counter argument contends that use of business services has become a recognized method of reducing high overhead from personnel and benefits costs and is therefore a permanent fixture.
