

I. Introduction

The Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC) has collected probation data from Minnesota counties on an annual basis since the early 1980's. The reporting of entries, removals, year-end populations, and distribution by race and gender has remained essentially unchanged since the 1984 survey. Throughout these years, one purpose of the Minnesota Probation Survey has been to collect data requested by the Bureau of the Census (and more recently, the Bureau of Justice Statistics [BJS]) regarding Minnesota probationers. The organization of the Minnesota questionnaire and its definition of "probationer" is patterned after that used by the federal questionnaire.

In addition to meeting federal reporting requirements, the findings of the probation survey are used by the Minnesota Department of Corrections, other state agencies, the Minnesota Legislature, and county probation offices for management and policy-making purposes.

An objective of this year's study was to obtain a more complete, consistent, and detailed accounting of all Minnesota probationers. Three steps were taken to meet this goal:

- Definitions and instructions were simplified and clarified. For instance, questions asking for "caseload" figures were rephrased to make it clear we were interested in the number of **individuals** under probation supervision. Also, more specific instructions were provided for counting probationers in potential "gray areas" such as diversion programs and stays of imposition.
- Adult state agents received the questionnaire for the first time since the 1989 survey. Summary data regarding probationers supervised by adult state agents was included in previous years' probation reports, but this survey marks the first collection of detailed probation data from felony agents, by county, in four years.
- A new question was added to the survey this year: offense category. Obtaining the distribution of probationers by their most serious offense gives us a better understanding of the probation population, and also allows us to more fully answer the Bureau of Justice Statistics survey.

II. Methodology

The 1993 probation survey instructions and questionnaire are shown in Figures 1 and 2. The instructions provided the definition of "probationer" used in the study. The crux of the definition was "those who have been placed under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court-order—regardless of whether they have been convicted." Individuals on supervised release or parole from state prisons were **not** included.

Questionnaires were mailed on January 21, 1994 to the following:

Community Corrections Act (CCA) directors—to collect data on all probationers in their counties

Department of Corrections district supervisors—for reporting probationers supervised by adult state agents in each county under their supervision

County probation offices in non-CCA counties—for reporting all probationers under their supervision (generally juveniles and adult non-felons)

Thus one survey was printed and mailed for each CCA county, while two surveys were printed and mailed for each non-CCA county (one to collect adult state agent data, and the other to obtain the "county agent" data). Each survey was preprinted with the county name and number, the contact person's name, and a code identifying the office/agent type. On CCA county questionnaires, the 1992 year-end population figures they provided on their 1992 probation survey were also pre-printed in the blanks for question 1.

Thanks to the hard work of the probation agents, data processing personnel, and administrators in the counties, as well as the valuable assistance provided by the DOC district supervisors, a complete accounting of Minnesota's December 31, 1993 probation population was obtained from all counties.

Several counties remarked on the difficulty of providing a precise accounting of offense category data (question 7). The CSTS caseload management software used in about half of Minnesota's counties can readily generate reports detailing the total number of offenses of a probation population, but is not presently designed to generate an offense report counting each probationer only once, for their most serious offense. Nonetheless, each county answered this question to the best of their ability. Several counties who estimated their answers indicated that they would be able to answer the question more precisely in the 1994 survey.

For the first time in several years, the survey collected data on probationers supervised by adult state agents. Consequently, the adult state agents could not turn to their 1992 survey to get their 1992 year-end populations, to complete question 1 on the 1993 survey. Furthermore, felony agent assignments have tended to be district-oriented rather than county-oriented. Thus adult state agents were exempted from answering questions 1-3 for this year only. Additionally, four non-CCA counties changed their data management practices during 1993, in consultation with the DOC, and found that they could not answer questions 1-3 using their new system. They were also exempted from answering these questions for this year only, since their difficulty was partially attributable to a DOC oversight in designing their new data management system.

Instructions for Completing the 1993 Probation Survey

This annual study is conducted in order to provide caseload information to probation policymakers in the Department of Corrections, Minnesota counties, and other government agencies/units. In order to obtain information regarding all 1993 probationers, this questionnaire is being mailed to:

- Community Corrections Directors, to collect all CCA-county probation information
- Department of Corrections District Supervisors, to collect data on all probationers supervised by adult state agents
- County Probation Offices in non-CCA counties, to collect data on all probationers except those supervised by adult state agents

One questionnaire is enclosed for each county in which your office provides probation services. Please answer the questions for all cases under your supervision.

Please use the following definition of "probationer" as you complete the questionnaire (derived from the Census Bureau's probation survey):

Probationers are those who have been placed under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court order—regardless of whether they have been convicted.

"Diversion program" cases and "stay of imposition" cases should be included if you are supervising the individual.

Exclude persons on "bench probation," "court probation," or "summary probation," who have not been placed under the supervision of a probation agency.

For interstate compacts include those probationers who are sent to your state from another state for supervision, but exclude those whom you send to another state.

For question 7 (offense categories), a probationer being supervised due to more than one offense should only be counted once (not as many times as he/she has offenses). Report the most serious offense for which the individual was under supervision on 12/31/93. Likewise, for all other questions be sure to report the number of **people**, not the number of offenses or open files.

CCA counties will note that the "1992 year-end population" figures you reported on line 4 of last year's survey have been entered on line 1 of the enclosed questionnaire(s).

III. Findings

This chapter provides an analysis of the 1993 probation survey data. Comparisons are also made to probation data from previous years.

A. Overview

Appendix A presents the data reported by the counties on their questionnaires. One set of data is shown for each county; in the case of non-CCA counties, this was obtained by adding the numbers provided on the state agent and county agent questionnaires. Following the county data, various aggregations of the data are presented:

- by agent type (adult state agents, CCA agents, contract agents, and non-CCA county agents)
- by CCA status (CCA counties, non-CCA counties)
- by membership in the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Area, consisting of Hennepin, Ramsey, Anoka, Washington, Dakota, Scott, and Carver Counties (metro, non-metro)

as well as a summary of all probationers statewide.

Appendix A is organized so that all information regarding a county can be viewed without flipping pages. The reader will observe that the column headings correspond to questions 1 through 7 on the questionnaire. The first columns report the December 31, 1992 and December 31, 1993 population, as well as movements (entries and removals) during 1993. After establishing the December 31, 1993 population, the remaining columns show its distribution by gender, race, and offense category.

The December 31, 1992 figures shown in Appendix A are those numbers reported in question 1 of this year's questionnaire. In several cases these numbers differ from the year-end counts reported by the same counties on the 1992 questionnaire; this discrepancy will be discussed later in this section.

Appendix A shows that on December 31, 1993, there were 74,186 adults and 14,822 juveniles under probation supervision in Minnesota. For reasons described in the previous chapter, the December 31, 1992 population and/or 1993 entries and exits were omitted by most adult state agents and a few county agents. The Appendix A statewide totals for these three columns are based only on the data that was provided, and thus those totals are inaccurate. Using the 1992 probation survey report as our source of December 31, 1992 probationer population data, we arrive at the following comparison:

While a 7.1% increase in adult probation population is comparable to population increases observed in previous years, the 31.5% twelve-month increase in juvenile probation population is

unprecedented. In fact, the actual increase in juveniles under probation supervision is smaller than this.

The intents of the changes in this year's questionnaire were solely to make clearer the definition of "probationer" that had been used over the past ten years, and to collect offense information. However, based on the more detailed instructions, on this year's questionnaire several counties started counting individuals under their supervision whom in past years they would not have considered "probationers." Many of these counties worked backward, using their new understanding of "probationer," and reported December 31, 1992 counts considerably higher than what they reported on last year's survey. It appears that some other counties, who are also now including probationer types they previously would have excluded, left their December 31, 1992 counts the same as they reported on last year's survey, but in order to reconcile this formula:

$$12/31/92 \text{ population} + 1993 \text{ entries} - 1993 \text{ removals} = 12/31/93 \text{ population}$$

they reported more 1993 entries than they actually had during the year.

It appears that even the addition of the offense category question indirectly caused counties to count probationers differently than they had in past years. Whereas in past years counties might have provided the data each year using an established routine, the increased data manipulation required this year's request for additional information resulted in some counties "discovering" probation cases that would have been overlooked in past years. Thus the data does not clearly show the extent to which the increase in probationer population during 1993 is due to 1993 entries exceeding removals, and to what extent it is due to counties applying a broader definition of "probationer."

In any event, the data shows that 89,008 individuals were under the supervision of Minnesota probation agencies on December 31, 1993. This means that approximately one out of every 42 Minnesotans age 12 or older were on probation on that day. By comparing the number of juvenile probationers to Minnesota's age 12-17 population, and the number of adult probationers to the state's age 18 and older population, it is found that one out of 26 juveniles, and one out of 45 adults statewide were on probation at year-end. The Bureau of Justice Statistics reports that as of December 31, 1990 (the most recent nationwide per-capita probation data available), only eight states and the District of Columbia had more adult probationers per 100,000 adult population than Minnesota. A later section of this chapter presents data on probationers per capita for each Minnesota county.

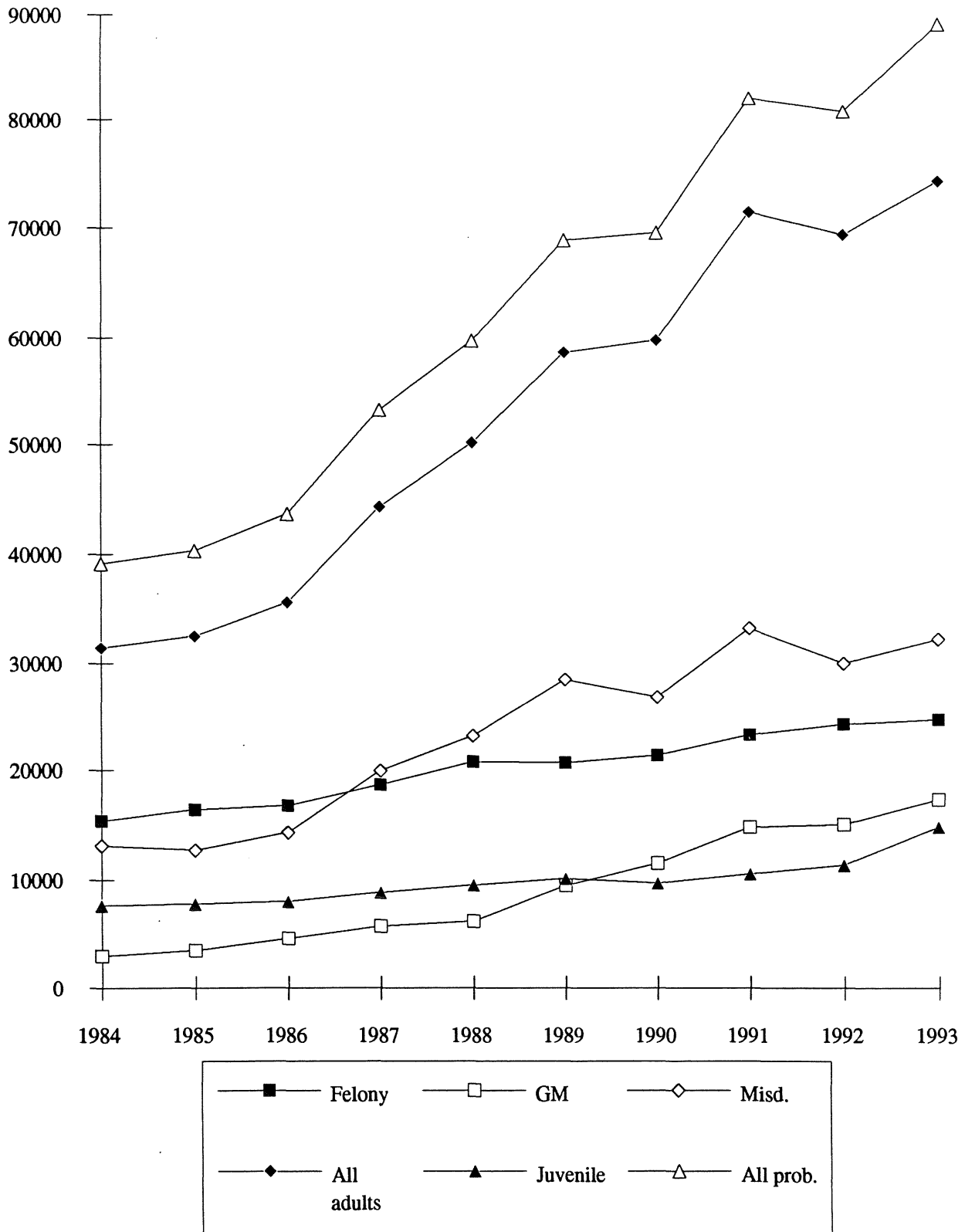
B. Minnesota probationer population, 1984-1993

Figure 3 shows the growth in Minnesota's probation population over the past nine years. These numbers were obtained from the probation surveys conducted over these years, supplemented with annual statewide counts of felony probationers supervised by state agents. The 1984 through 1992 probation surveys obtained nearly a 100% response rate from the counties. In the three instances where a populous county failed to submit probation data over this span, I estimated the missing numbers (using the county's population data from the previous and following years), so that Figure 1 represents a complete accounting of the Minnesota year-end probation population for each year from 1984 through 1993. With the exception of a slight dip in 1992, adult probation populations always increased from one year to the next. In fact, the adult probationer population more than doubled during the seven-year period from December 31, 1986 (35,642) to December 31, 1993 (74,186). The adult inmate population in Minnesota's state correctional facilities increased by about 80% during this period.

Figure 3 shows that the sharpest population increase is in gross misdemeanants, who have

increased more than five-fold from 1984 (3012) to 1993 (17,265). The least increase has been in felony probationers, whose numbers have increased about 60% from 1984 to 1993. It should be noted that the designation of an offense as a felony, gross misdemeanor, or misdemeanor, is not always clear-cut. Thus the plot of the total adult probationer population over the years provides another useful perspective.

Disregarding the 1993 data for a moment, the juvenile probationer population also increased steadily (except in 1990) over this period, but at a slower rate. As mentioned earlier, the large increase in juvenile probationers in 1993 seems largely attributable to counties (correctly) using a more inclusive definition of "probationer" in completing this year's survey. For instance, Hennepin County, who had reported 1554 juvenile probationers as their December 31, 1992 population on last year's survey, reported 2744 juvenile probationers under supervision on December 31, 1993. They noted that in the past they were only counting "traditional cases," while this year they included "observation cases" that were on court-ordered probation, resulting in a near-doubling of their juvenile population figure. It is probable that this year counties were also including juvenile "diversion program" cases under their supervision, due to the more explicit instructions, while they may have excluded them in past years. After correcting for differing practices in including or excluding juvenile probationers, the 1993 juvenile probation population probably increased at a rate similar to the eight-percent annual increases of the prior two years.

C. Minnesota probationer demographics, 1985-1993

A common element of the probation survey over the years has been the reporting of the gender and race distribution of the year-end population. The gender of the population will be reported from 1985 to the present, as 1985 marks the first year in which this data was reported for a clear majority of probationers. Race data will be reported from 1986 to the present, since that was the first year of substantially complete race data for all four offense levels—adult felony, adult gross misdemeanor, adult misdemeanor, and juvenile. The 1993 data used in this section is given in Appendix A. This appendix also provides the breakdown of demographic data on a by-county basis, for the reader interested in examining this level of detail.

Probationers supervised by adult state agents are included only in the demographic data for 1989 and 1993 (since these are the only years within this span in which adult state agents participated in the survey). However, since county-supervised felony cases outnumbered state felony cases by ratios of two-or three-to-one over these years, the findings presented in this section should not be substantially distorted by the missing data. With the exception of adult state agent cases, race and gender were reported for virtually 100% of the probationer population from 1987 to the present.

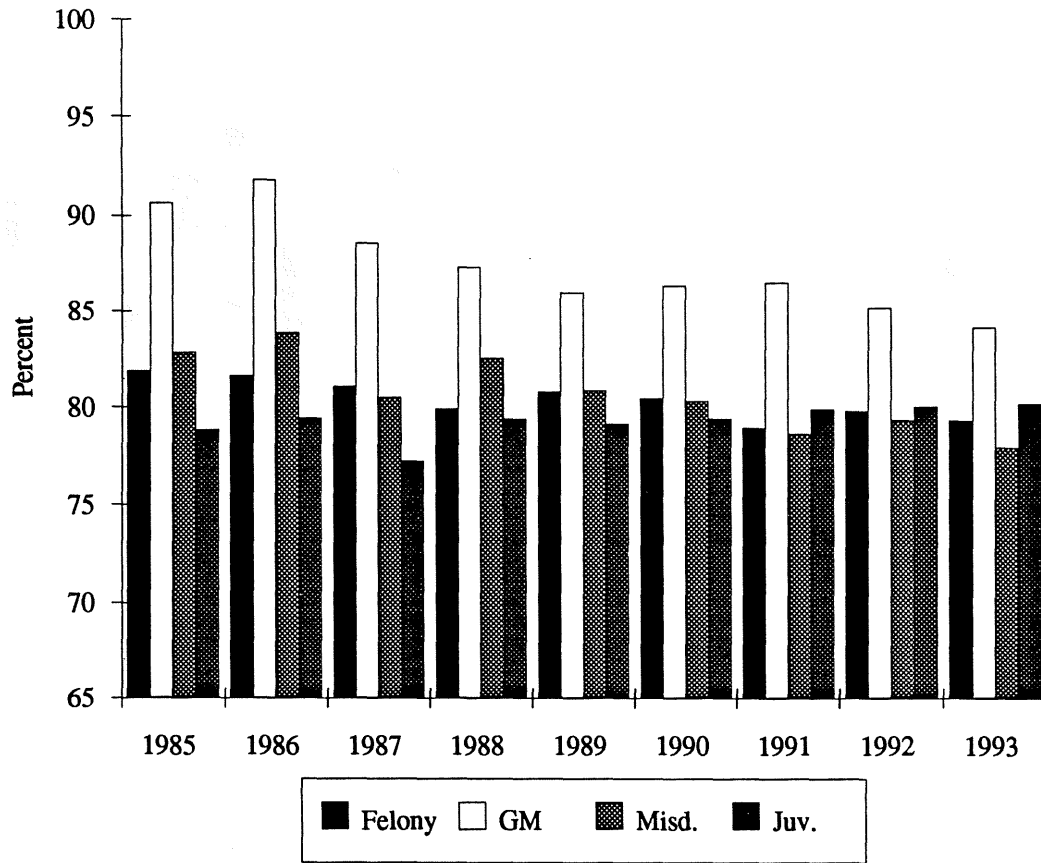
The composition of the felony, misdemeanor, and juvenile probationer population by gender has remained quite constant over the years, at about 80% male, as shown in Figure 4. The gross misdemeanor population was about 90% male in 1985 and 1986, and still is the most heavily male segment of the probationer population, but female gross misdemeanants have been increasing, to about 16% in 1993.

Figure 5 shows that probationers at all offense levels have been predominantly white from 1986 to the present, but that the proportion of minority probationers has increased over this time. For the past four years, the proportion of white felons on probation has held constant at about 73%; this is a decline from levels around 80% in earlier years. At present, white gross misdemeanants, misdemeanants, and juveniles constitute approximately 80% of the probationers at each offense level; in each case this percentage has declined about eight to ten points from that of 1986.

The percentage of black felony probationers has held fairly constant at 17-19% over the past four

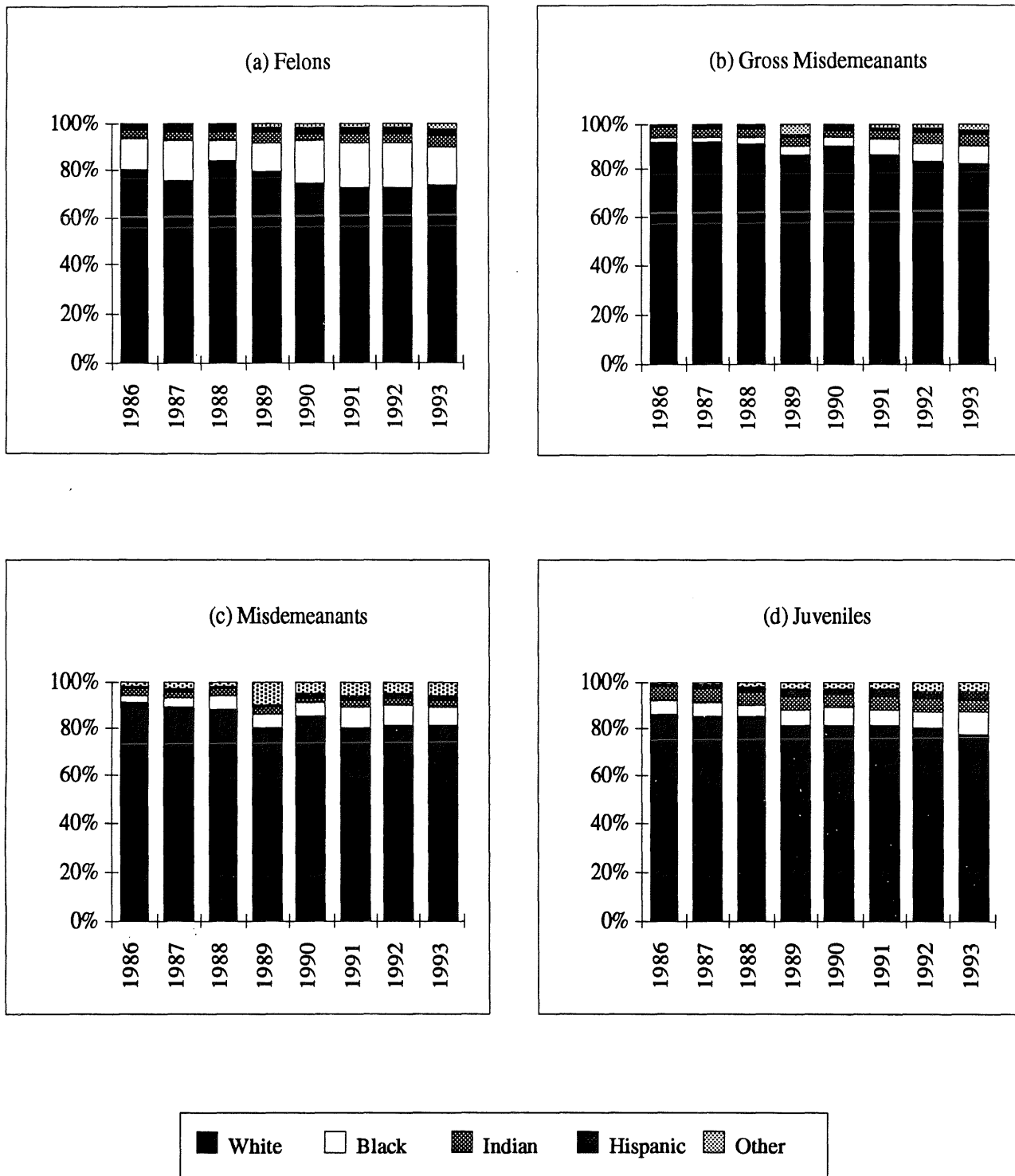
Percentage of male probationers by offense level, 1985–1993

years, and has not changed greatly over the duration of the study. (The data used to plot these graphs was taken from the previous years' probation survey reports. The sharp decline in black felony probationers in 1988, as shown in Figure 5(a), is due to that year's report showing only 221 black felons for Hennepin County, as compared to 1242 in 1987 and 1482 in 1989. Almost certainly this indicates a data quality problem, rather than an actual fluctuation in the racial distribution of probationers.) There has been a sharp increase in the percentage of black gross misdemeanants and misdemeanants, and a gradual increase in black juveniles, over the period shown in the graph.

The proportion of Indian probationers has held quite constant over the years at all offense levels, but Hispanics have represented a growing percentage of the probationer population over the years. The "other/unknown" category has also shown some growth over the years. It has been an oversight for the probation survey to never have provided an "Asian or Pacific Islander" category; this will be corrected in the 1994 survey. (It should be noted that the majority of the 10% "other/unknown" misdemeanor probationers in 1989 are of "unknown" race, as in that year three populous counties lapsed in their reporting, by putting a large proportion of their probationers into this racial category. This circumstance, as well as the dubious 1988 data on black felons and other "gray areas" involved in the collection and reporting of probation data, points to the need for the reader to read the data for their general trends, and not take any one number as being perfectly accurate.)

The 1993 year-end population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities displays some notably different characteristics from the felony probation population. Slightly over 95% of adult inmates are male, and their racial distribution is 52.6% white, 33.4% black, 7.6% American Indian, 4.9% Hispanic, and 1.5% other.

D. Probationer distribution by agent type

The table below shows the distribution of December 31, 1993 probationers by agent type by offense level. Note that the first three data columns include only probationers processed in adult court; all juveniles are reported in the fourth data column. (Once again, this data can be found in Appendix A in summary form, as well as by county.)

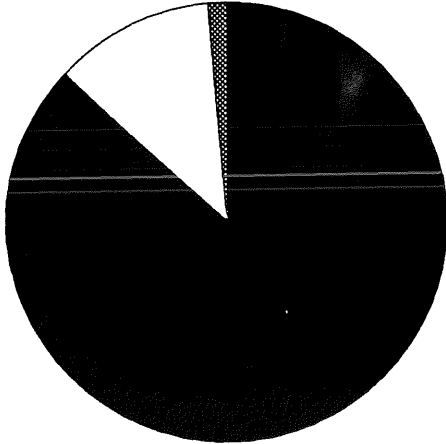

Figure 6 uses these numbers to present the probation population served by each agent type. As might be expected of "felony agents," about seven-eighths of the probationers under the supervision of adult state agents are felons, with nearly all of the remainder being gross misdemeanants. Among probationers supervised by agents in CCA counties, about 30% are felons, 20% are gross misdemeanants, 37% are misdemeanants, and 13% are juveniles. Contract agents (DOC employees providing non-felon probation services in non-CCA counties) had a caseload consisting of approximately 44% juveniles, 34% misdemeanants, and 21% gross

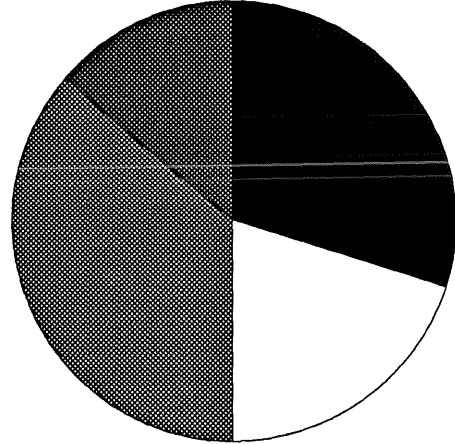

December 31, 1993 probationers by agent type by offense level

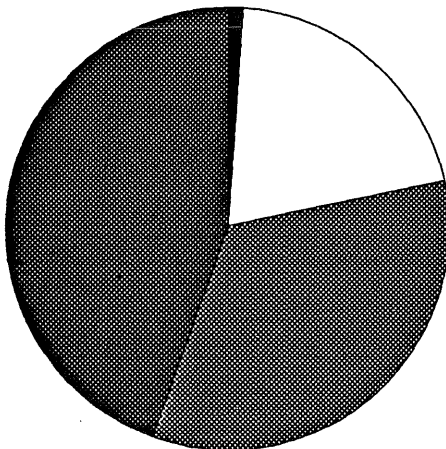
(a) Adult state agents



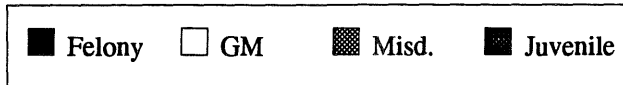
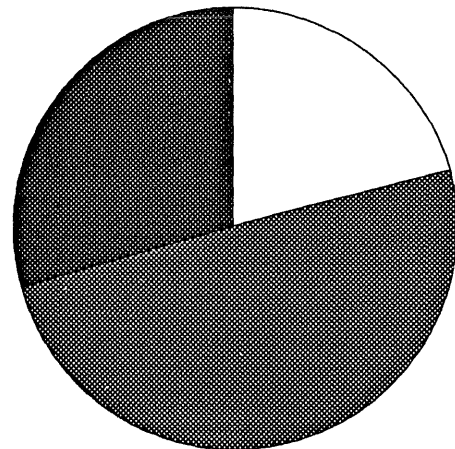
(b) CCA agents

misdemeanants. Probation agents employed by non-CCA counties served a caseload of which about half were misdemeanants and 30% were juveniles, with the remainder (20%) being gross misdemeanants.

Figure 7 looks at the data in the above table from the other perspective; that is, how are cases at each offense level distributed among the agent types? CCA counties are found to be supervising about three-fourths of the statewide felony probationer population, with the adult state agents being responsible for the remainder. CCA counties supervise about 70% of the gross misdemeanor and misdemeanor probationers in the state, and about 55% of the juvenile probationers.

It should be noted that numbers reported by some Department of Corrections contract agents on the probation survey differed from the numbers reported via the Prober caseload management software for the same reporting period. The discrepancy of 740 was largely isolated to a few agents, and was due to their not reporting on the probation survey individuals in various categories of "administrative" supervision (including community service, fines, and restitution cases). Prober counts these cases. The probation survey instructions and Prober instructions will be clarified and synchronized so that in the future, the data from these two sources will be in closer agreement.

E. 1993 probationer offenses

For the first time, this year's Minnesota Probation Survey included the reporting of each probationer's most serious offense. The offense categories used in the questionnaire were derived from the Minnesota Offense Code general index categories, with the main differences being the creation of separate categories for DWI and juvenile status offenses, due to the high occurrence of these offenses in the probationer population. In future years, this data will be examined longitudinally, to explore trends regarding the offenses for which individuals are under probation supervision.

The national probation survey from the Bureau of Justice Statistics asks for the number of DWI probationers, so the addition of the offense category question allows us to provide this information to the BJS. The most serious offense of each probationer is also a useful descriptive characteristic of an offender (or an offender population). Probationers commonly are under supervision for more than one offense, but survey respondents were directed to count each individual exactly once, according to their most serious offense. Since many counties were not accustomed to reporting offense data in this way, the counties made their best effort to answer the question, but acknowledged in many cases that their data was based on various assumptions and estimation techniques. Several of these counties expressed their belief that they would be able to provide more precise numbers for this question on next year's survey. Thus, this data represents a first step in the collection of probationer offense data, which should provide useful insights this year (provided that the reader does not take this data as a strict, precise accounting), and lay the foundation for better data in the future.

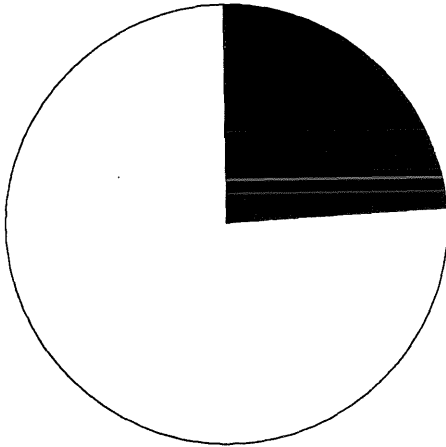
Appendix A provides the numbers of probationers in each offense category (i.e., arson, assault, burglary, etc.) by offense level (felony, gross misdemeanor, etc.) by county, and also provides summary data by agent type, county type, and statewide. A more concise summary of the offense data is provided in Appendix B. In Appendix B, the 28 offense categories have been collapsed into six "offense types," plus an "other" category. For instance, assault, criminal sexual conduct, homicide, kidnapping, and robbery together comprise the "person" offense type in Appendix B. "Other" offenses, as used in Appendix B and Figure 8, include several survey categories that do not fit the major offense types (e.g., crimes against administration of justice, escape/flight, obscenity) as well as the survey's "other" category.

Figure 8 shows the types of offenses which constitute the probationer population at each offense level. About half of Minnesota's felony probationers were under supervision for a property

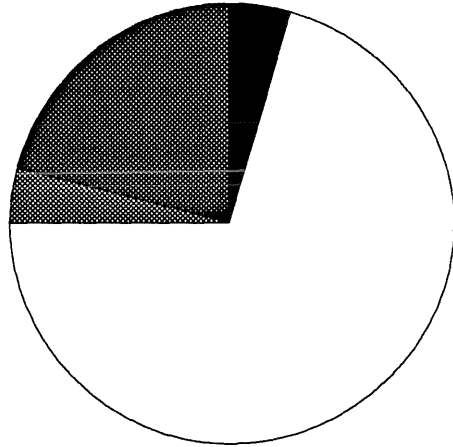

December 31, 1993 probationers by offense level by agent type

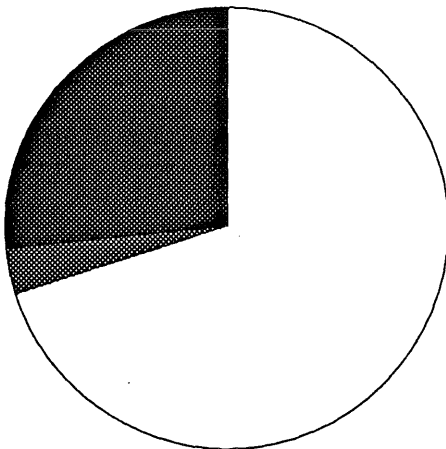
(a) Felony



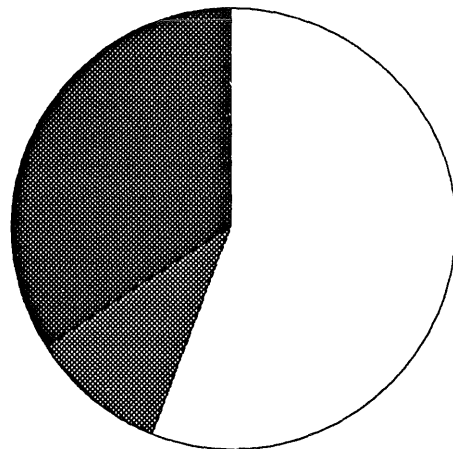
(b) Gross misdemeanor

(d) Juvenile

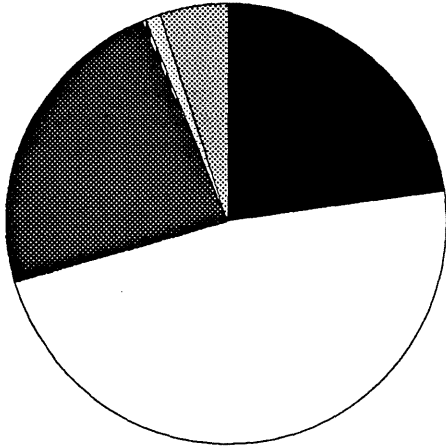

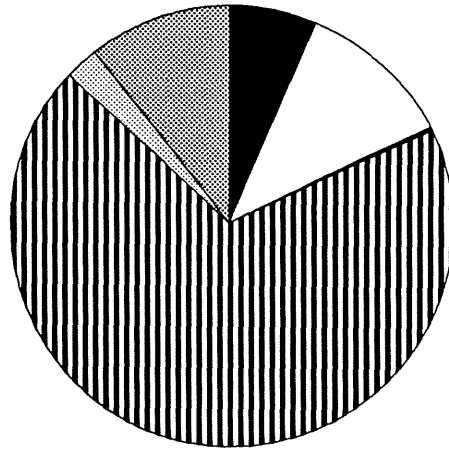

December 31, 1993 probationers by offense level by offense type

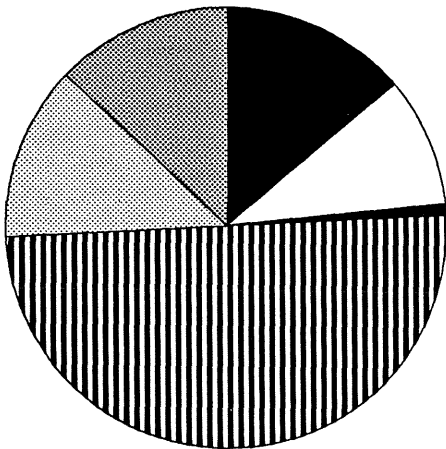
(a) Felony



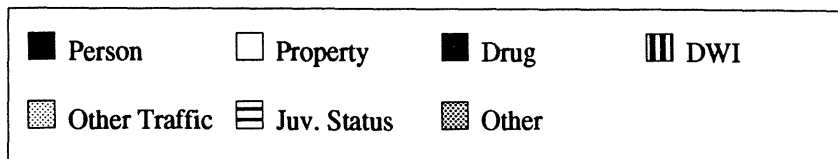
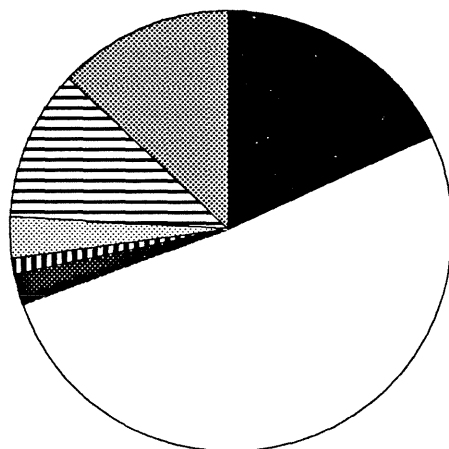
(b) Gross Misdemeanor

offense, with most of the remaining felons divided quite evenly between person offenders and drug offenders. In comparison, the 1993 year-end adult population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities included 61% person offenders, 23% property offenders, and 11% drug offenders.

Two-thirds of the gross misdemeanants were DWI cases; another ten percent were property offenders. Half of the misdemeanants were under supervision for a DWI as their most serious offense, with the next largest slices representing person offenders, non-DWI traffic offenders, and "other" offenders. The most serious offense of half of the juveniles was a property offense, with person offenses and juvenile status offenses being the next most common specific offense types.

Table 1 shows the number of adult probationers per 1000 adults (age 18 and older) for each county, as well as on a summary level. The adult county populations were obtained using 1990 U.S. Census data and 1995 projections from the state demographer's office. 1994 county populations were computed from these two data sources by assuming linear population change from 1990 to 1995; i.e., the 1994 county population was obtained by adding 20% of the 1990 population and 80% of the 1995 population. In the table, counties are listed in descending order of their per-thousand adult probationer population.

The ten counties with the highest proportion of their adult population on probation consist of seven contiguous counties immediately to the north and east of Ramsey and Hennepin Counties, plus three counties bordering on Hennepin County to the south and west. Those counties with the smallest proportion of their adult population under probation supervision include five counties in

the northwest corner of the state. The table shows that while 22 of 1000 adults statewide are on probation, the median county figure is 16 per 1000. This difference between the mean and the median is due to the more populous counties tending to have higher proportions of their adult populations on probation. Another way of looking at the 22/1000 probationer ratio is to say that approximately one out of 45 adults in Minnesota were under probation supervision on December 31, 1993.

Table 2 shows the corresponding juvenile probationer data. In this table, the juvenile probationer population in each county is compared to the (projected) 1994 population of 12- through 17-year-olds in that county, and expressed on a per-thousand basis. The ten counties with the highest proportion of their juvenile population on probation are scattered throughout the southern two-thirds of the state. The counties with the lowest use of juvenile probation are also scattered throughout the state. However, there are cases of counties in the lowest ten in juvenile probation usage being adjacent to counties in the "top ten."

The statewide mean of 39 juveniles on probation per 1000 is nearly twice the proportion of adults on probation. Non-CCA counties are making greater use of juvenile probation, as indicated by their statewide average of 47 juveniles on probation per 1000, as compared to 34 per 1000 in CCA counties. Meeker, Mille Lacs, and Carver Counties lead the list, with one juvenile in ten under probation supervision.

IV. Next steps

The Department of Corrections intends to conduct the probation survey again next year, and in succeeding years, in order to provide probation data to federal authorities, as well as to provide management data to probation policymakers at the state and county level. Our intention is to deliver the survey no later than December 31, 1993, so that counties can more easily complete the survey based on that day's probationer population, and so the data can be returned more quickly.

The DOC intends to use essentially the same questionnaire for the 1994 survey. While the instructions will be enhanced to address questions raised this year by survey respondents, our intention is to keep definitions and questions essentially unchanged, so that comparable data can be collected and tracked over the years.

While several counties noted their difficulties in providing offense data based on the number of probationers (as opposed to reporting the total number of offenses), the DOC is committed to retaining the same question format, so that we may provide appropriate data to the BJS, collect data which can be compared to the 1993 offense data, and maintain consistency in question format for the sake of counties who have expended considerable resources to report the data in the one-offense-per-probationer format. The DOC is willing to work with counties and software developers to make the reporting of offense data more efficient and accurate.

The assistance of district supervisors was invaluable in collecting all 1993 probation data. Giving them an expanded role in the data collection process next year may further promote prompt and accurate reporting.

The collection and reporting of complete, precise statewide probation data is hampered due to differing means of managing probation data among Minnesota counties. For instance, some counties use Minnesota Offense Codes to classify offenses, other counties use Uniform Offense Codes, others use derivatives of these codes, while other counties categorize offenses based neither on MOC's nor UOC's. Common ground regarding other aspects of automated data management seems equally far away. Nonetheless, it may be beneficial to work toward a day when all counties will be able to provide their probation data at the individual level in a consistent way, on a diskette or using other electronic means. Then we would be able to interpret the data consistently statewide, ease the reporting burden for probation offices, and answer questions we cannot answer using our current method of aggregate reporting.

Appendix A

1993 Probation Survey Data by County

This appendix presents the data collected by the 1993 probation survey. One set of data is presented for each county; in the case of non-CCA counties, this represents the combination of the data reported on the adult state agent questionnaire and the county agent questionnaire for that county. Summaries of the data by agent type, by county type (CCA/non-CCA; metro/non-metro), and statewide follow the individual county data.

The table columns correspond to the survey questions (see Figure 2). The shaded column, corresponding to question 4, gives the county's December 31, 1993 probation population at each offense level. The remaining columns break down this year-end population according to gender, race, and offense category.

As is explained in the report, adult state agents generally did not provide answers to questions 1-3b (pertaining to 1992 year-end population, and 1993 entries and removals), and a few non-CCA county agents also omitted these numbers. This data is believed to have other flaws as well. Thus the first four columns, which correspond to these questions, are inaccurate for the majority of counties, as well as in the summary data. The 1992 probation survey provides a better source of 1992 year-end probationer populations.

The reader should also be aware that the "offense category" data is imprecise. This is partially due to several counties having estimated their figures, and also due to ambiguities that can arise in assigning a probationer with more than one offense to a single offense category.

Appendix B

December 31, 1993 Probationers by County by Offense Level by Offense Type

This appendix presents a summary of the "offense category" data reported on the 1993 probation survey. The 27 offense categories of the questionnaire are collapsed into seven "offense types": person, property, drug, DWI, other traffic, juvenile status offenses, and other. For instance, assault, criminal sexual conduct, homicide, kidnapping, and robbery together comprise the "person" offense type. Following the arrangement of Appendix A, one set of data is presented per county, followed by summaries for various agent and county types, and statewide totals.

For each offense level (felony, gross misdemeanor, etc.), the number (n) of probationers in each offense type is given, as well as percentages showing each offense type's contribution to the total probation population at that offense level. For instance, Aitkin County's felony probationers are shown to include 29% person offenders, 52% property offenders, 5% drug offenders, and 13% other offenders. Figure 8 (page 17) provides a graphical summary of the statewide data shown on page B-16.

This year's questionnaire included the first collection of offense data in the history of the probation survey. Since counties were not forewarned that this data would be collected, they encountered some difficulties in providing this data, and in some cases the figures provided represent their best estimates. However, we expect that on the 1994 survey all counties will be reporting hard data.
