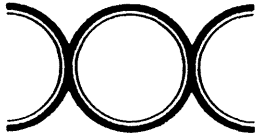

I am pleased to present the 1994 Probation Survey. This is the fifteenth year that the Department of Corrections has published this report. Last year the scope and depth of the information gathered was greatly expanded. That work was of significant influence to the work of the Probation Standards Task Force. The recommendation of the task force on the extent of caseload crowding relied heavily on the 1993 Probation Survey.

There is still much that can be done to make this survey even more accurately reflect the work that is expected of and being done by probation officers and corrections agents throughout Minnesota. We welcome your suggestions on ways in which the survey can be made a more useful tool for you.

As always, we are appreciative to those of you who helped in collecting the data, your promptness in responding to our requests and for your cooperation with the department's Information Technology and Research Unit. I am especially appreciative of the efforts of Gene Larimore, Director, and Mark Evenson, Research Analyst.

With an increase of more than 8,300 persons being placed under supervision by the courts in 1994, already overworked agents have an enormous amount of additional work. We are hopeful that help is on the way as the 1995 Legislature considers the probation workload reduction appropriation which has resulted from the combined efforts of the Probation Standards Task Force, the leadership of the Commissioner and the willingness of the Governor to address this problem by including substantial dollars in his budget.

## I. Introduction

The Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC) has collected probation data from Minnesota counties on an annual basis since the early 1980's. The reporting of entries, removals, year-end populations, and distribution by race and gender has remained largely unchanged since the 1984 survey. Throughout these years, one purpose of the Minnesota Probation Survey has been to collect data requested by the Bureau of the Census and the Bureau of Justice Statistics regarding Minnesota probationers. The organization of the Minnesota questionnaire and its definition of "probationer" is patterned after that used by the federal questionnaire.

In addition to meeting federal reporting requirements, the findings of the probation survey are used by the Minnesota Department of Corrections, other state agencies, the Minnesota Legislature, county probation offices, and other parties for management and policy-making purposes. For example, the Probation Standards Task Force has used the survey's findings in developing standards for probation officer caseloads, and computing the number of agents that would be needed to supervise the probation population if the caseload standards were adopted.

The responsibilities of "probation officers" can include supervision of individuals on supervised release, parole, intensive community supervision, and diversion cases, not just probationers. This year's report, for the first time, includes a profile of these other contributors to the community supervision workload. Recognizing that diversion cases can contribute to the total workload, last year's probation survey instructions specified that diversion cases should be reported along with probationers. This year's questionnaire differentiated between probationers and diversion cases by providing separate columns for reporting on diversion cases. The DOC's Corrections Management Information System (CMIS) maintains information on individuals on supervised release, intensive community supervision, or parole from state correctional facilities, so the survey did not collect information from the counties regarding releasees. The information on releasees included in this report was obtained from CMIS.



## **II. Methodology**

This chapter describes the content of the probation survey, and how the probation survey data was collected. Issues that arose in the course of this year's data collection are also addressed.

### **A. Survey design**

The 1994 probation survey instructions and questionnaire are shown in Appendix A. Throughout the years, the essential definition of "probationer" has been "those who have been placed under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court-order—regardless of whether they have been convicted." However, clarifications and changes have been made in the detailed instructions in the past two years, to ensure we collect the data needed for reporting and management purposes, and to promote more consistent interpretations of the instructions by all counties. For instance, prior to the 1993 survey respondents were told to exclude "cases for whom an agent is only monitoring compliance with a sanction such as a fine or restitution." However, the Bureau of Justice Statistics directs us to report on all probationers, including those in "paper" or "administrative" classifications, so the Minnesota survey's instructions were changed to include these cases. The reporting of diversion cases was added for the first time in the 1993 survey, and handled distinctly from probationers in the 1994 survey.

### **B. Survey administration**

Questionnaires were mailed on January 13, 1995 to the following:

Community Corrections Act (CCA) directors—to collect data on all probationers in their counties.

Department of Corrections district supervisors—for reporting probationers supervised by adult state agents and contract agents in each county under their supervision.

County probation offices in non-CCA counties not served by DOC contract agents—for reporting all probationers under their supervision (generally juveniles and adult non-felons).

### **C. Reporting issues**

The past year has been a time of change for the automated systems used by many probation offices statewide. While the changes did not always go smoothly, the offices overcame the difficulties, and a complete accounting of Minnesota's year-end probation population was obtained from all counties. Furthermore, the changes made in these automated systems should result in greater accuracy and ease of reporting in years to come. However, due partially to the difficulties encountered by these probation offices, it does not seem feasible to compare the 1994 data with the 1993 data at the county level in some cases.

Department of Corrections district offices manage felony agent and contract agent workload data using PROBER software. Reporting capabilities were added to the PROBER software that allowed the district offices to automatically tabulate and print the probation survey data. This provides consistency in reporting between districts, and eases their reporting burden considerably. Due to the switch in their reporting methods, the 1993 year-end populations reported on last year's survey sometimes differ from what was reported on this year's survey for the same question.

Approximately 36 Minnesota counties use the Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) software for workload management. These counties, working together through the CSTS User Group, overcame obstacles to their completion of the probation survey, namely the bankruptcy of CSTS's owner and difficulties associated with upgrading to a new version of the software. However, in some cases these counties also reported December 31, 1993 probation population figures that were at variance with what they reported last year.

In some cases counties using neither CSTS nor PROBER reported changes in their compilation of probation survey data which they feel yields more accurate results, but which again makes difficult any comparisons between their 1993 and 1994 data.

### III. Findings

This chapter provides an analysis of the 1994 probation survey data. Comparisons are also made to probation data from previous years.

#### A. Overview

Appendix B presents the data reported by the counties on their questionnaires. One set of data is shown for each county. In the case of non-CCA counties, this was obtained by adding the numbers provided on the state agent and county agent questionnaires. Following the county data, various aggregations of the data are presented:

- by agent type (adult state agents, CCA agents, contract agents, and non-CCA county agents)
- by CCA status (CCA counties, non-CCA counties)
- by membership in the seven-county Twin Cities Metropolitan Area, consisting of Hennepin, Ramsey, Anoka, Washington, Dakota, Scott, and Carver Counties (metro, non-metro)

as well as a summary of all probationers statewide.

Appendix B is organized so that all information regarding a county can be viewed without flipping pages. The reader will observe that the column headings correspond to questions 1 through 8 of the questionnaire. The first columns report the 1993 and 1994 year-end populations, as well as movements (entries and removals) during 1993. After establishing the December 31, 1994 population, the remaining columns show its distribution by gender, race, and offense category.

Appendix B's first two columns give the December 31, 1993 population first as reported on the 1993 survey, then as reported on the 1994 survey. In some cases counties reported December 31, 1993 populations on the 1994 survey that differed considerably from what they reported on last year's survey. As was mentioned in the previous chapter, the changes occurring in counties' data management systems could explain the differences. In other cases the difference can be attributed to the change in the 1994 questionnaire, as columns were added for reporting diversion cases. For example, whereas a county may have reported 100 adult misdemeanor probationers at year-end on last year's survey, on this year's survey they may have revised the December 31, 1993 figures to show 90 adult misdemeanants and 10 adult diversion cases. A by-county breakdown of diversion cases is given in Appendix D and will be discussed later in this chapter. Upward and downward revisions of December 31, 1993 figures made by individual counties tended to balance each other out, so that the statewide total December 31, 1993 populations obtained from these two sources are within one percent of each other.

Appendix B shows that on December 31, 1994, there were 81,972 adults and 15,346 juveniles under probation supervision in Minnesota. Using the 1993 probation survey report as our source of December 31, 1993 probationer population data, we arrive at the following comparison:

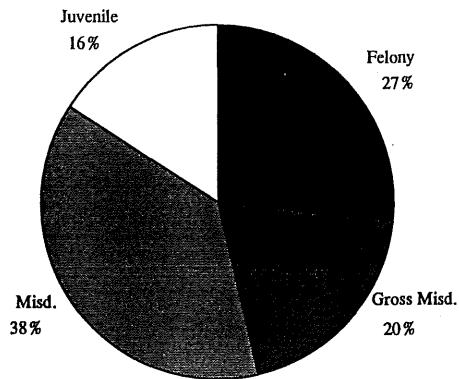

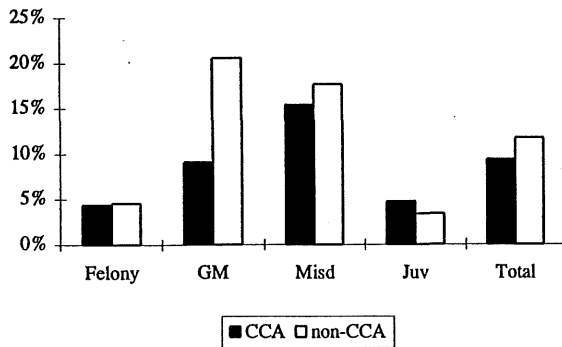
**Figure 1: Distribution of 12/31/94 probation population**

The distribution of the year-end probation population among felons, gross misdemeanants, misdemeanants, and juveniles is shown graphically in Figure 1, and a chart showing the population

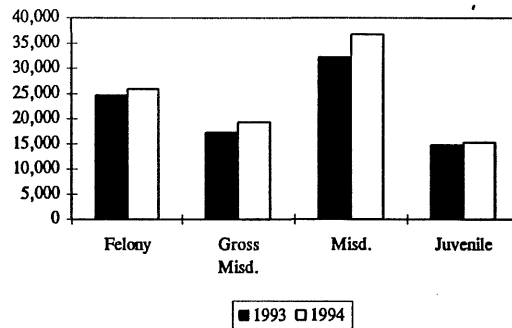
increase in 1994 is given in Figure 2. These numbers and charts indicate that 1994 was another year of strong growth in Minnesota's probation population. Figure 3 shows that in the past year the rates of probation population growth in CCA and non-CCA counties were similar, except among gross misdemeanants, which increased 21% in non-CCA counties during 1994, compared to a 9% increase in CCA counties. (Stearns County is excluded from the Figure 3 data, because it was non-CCA in 1993, and a CCA county in 1994.)

The year-end probation population of 97,318 means that approximately one out of every 38 Minnesotans age 12 or older, and one out of 26 juveniles, were on probation on that day (although not all were under active supervision). The Bureau of Justice Statistics reports that as of December 31, 1992 (the most recent nationwide per-capita probation data available), only six states and the District of Columbia had more adult probationers per 100,000 adult population than Minnesota.

## B. Minnesota probationer population, 1984-1994

The population increases during 1994 are similar to the year-to-year changes that have been observed almost annually since 1984, as shown numerically in Table 1 and graphically in Figure 4. The Table 1 numbers were obtained from probation surveys conducted over these years, supplemented with annual statewide counts of felony probationers supervised by DOC felony agents. (DOC felony agents did not participate in the probation survey before 1993.) The 1984 through 1992 probation surveys obtained nearly a 100% response rate from the counties. In the three instances where a populous county failed to submit probation data over this span, the missing numbers were estimated, using the county's population data from the previous and following years, so that Table 1 and Figure 4 represent a complete accounting of the Minnesota year-end probation population for each year from 1984 through 1994. With the exception of a slight dip in 1992, adult probation populations always increased from one year to the next. In fact, the adult probationer population increased by 160% during the ten-year period from December 31, 1984 (31,440) to December 31, 1994 (81,972). By comparison, the population of Minnesota-committed inmates in state correctional facilities increased by about 108% during this period.

While reviewing this data the reader should remember that prior to 1993 respondents were instructed to exclude cases where the agent was "only monitoring compliance with a sanction," whereas in the past two years these cases have been included. If these cases had been counted prior to 1993, it would have increased the number of probationers for those years, and would lessen the percentage of increase in probation population in 1993 or 1994 as compared to any year prior to 1993. Since the probation survey has never collected information regarding the supervision level of probationers, attempts to adjust the pre-1993 numbers would be speculative. However, the general trends of steady growth in probation populations from 1984 to 1994, plus the observation that the rate of adult population increase from 1992 (with administrative cases excluded) to 1993 (with administrative cases included) was little different than the average annual increase in previous years, leads one to think that including administrative supervision cases had only a small impact on the total probation numbers of the last two years, so that Table 1 and Figure 1 represent the probation population situation fairly accurately, even without adjustment of the pre-1993 data.

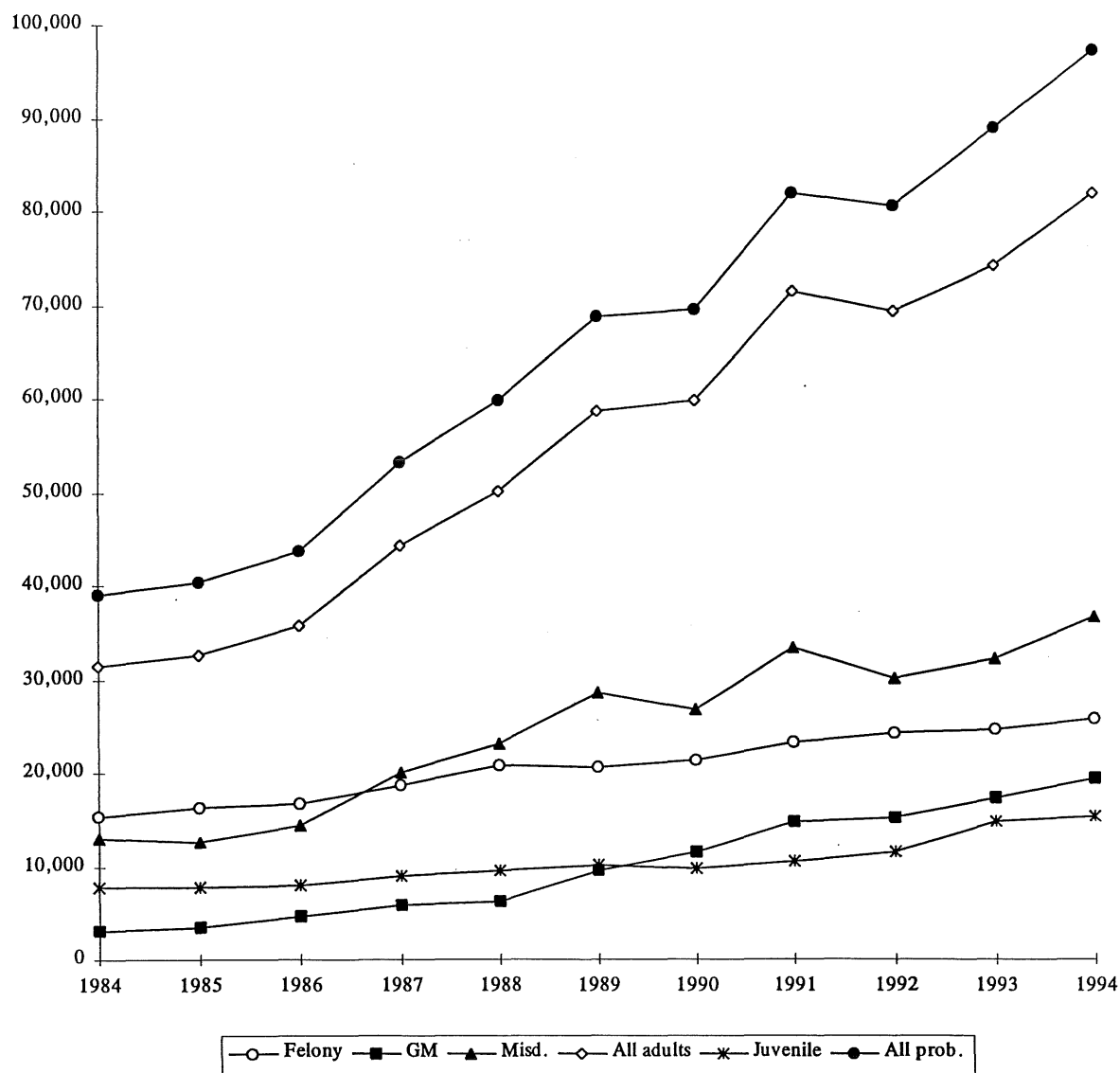

Table 1 shows that the sharpest population increase is in gross misdemeanants. They have increased more than five-fold from 1984 (3012) to 1993 (19,345). This represents an annual growth rate of 54%. The least increase has been in felony probationers, whose numbers have increased about 69% from 1984 to 1994. It should be noted that the designation of an offense as a felony, gross misdemeanor, or misdemeanor, is not always clear-cut. Thus the data on the total adult probationer population over the years provides another useful perspective.

The juvenile population increased markedly from 1992 to 1993 (about 31%). That increase seemed largely due to counties using the more inclusive definition of "probationer." The juvenile probation growth from 1993 to 1994 returned to a slower rate.

### C. Minnesota probationer demographics, 1985-1994

A common element of the probation survey over the years has been the reporting of the gender and race distribution of the year-end population. However, 1985 was the first year in which gender data was reported for a clear majority of probationers. Race data is presented from 1986 to the present, since that was the first year of substantially complete race data for all four offense levels—adult felony, adult gross misdemeanor, adult misdemeanor, and juvenile. The 1994 data used in this section is given in Appendix B. This appendix also provides the breakdown of demographic data on a by-county basis, for the reader interested in examining this level of detail.

Probationers supervised by adult state agents are included in the demographic data only in 1989, 1993, and 1994 (since these are the only years within this span in which adult state agents participated in the survey). However, since county-supervised felony cases outnumbered state felony cases by ratios of two- or three-to-one over these years, the findings presented in this section should not be substantially distorted by the missing data. With the exception of adult state agent cases, race and gender were reported for virtually 100% of the probationer population from 1987 to the present.

The composition of the felony, misdemeanor, and juvenile probationer population by gender has remained quite constant over the years, at about 80% male, as shown in Figure 5. The gross misdemeanor population was about 90% male in 1985 and 1986, and still is the most heavily male segment of the probationer population, but it too has been declining toward the 80% mark of the other offense levels.

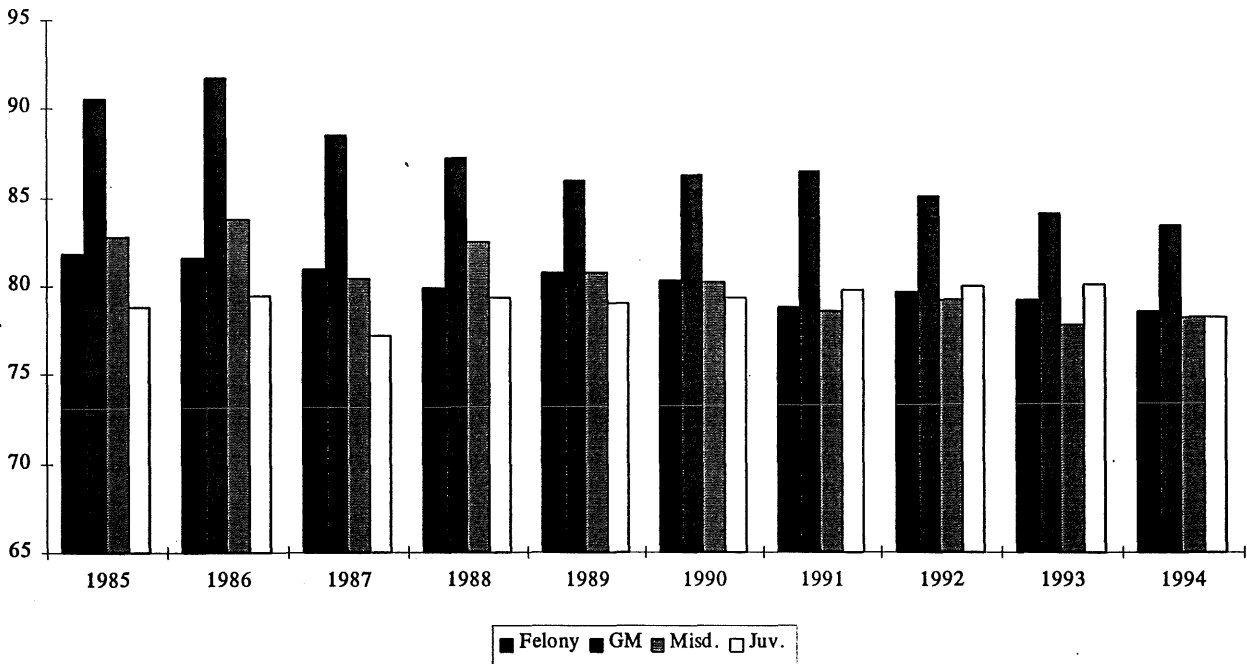
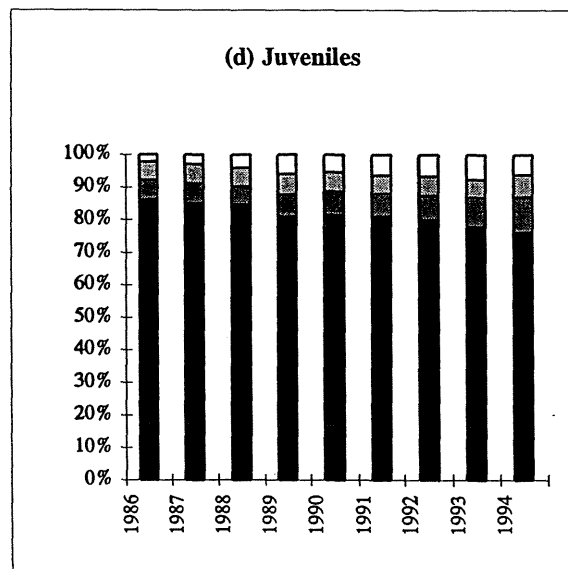
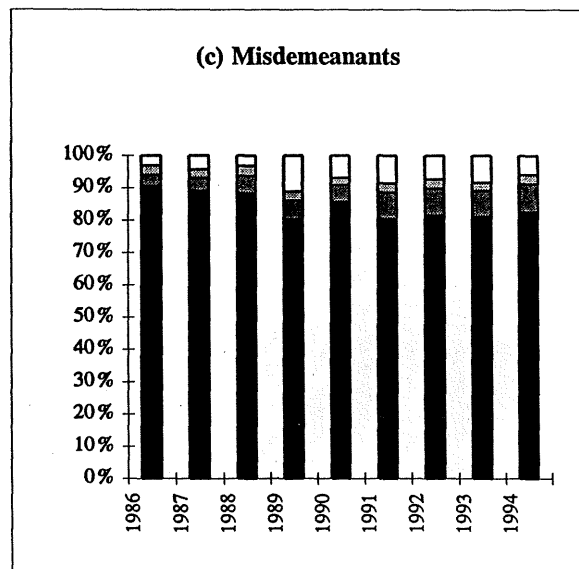
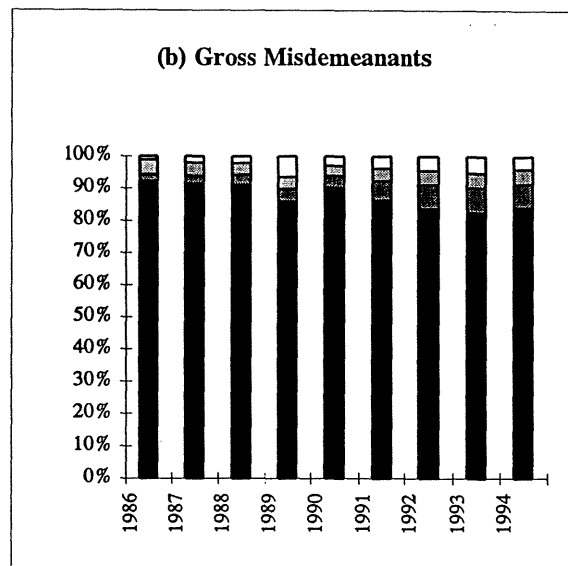
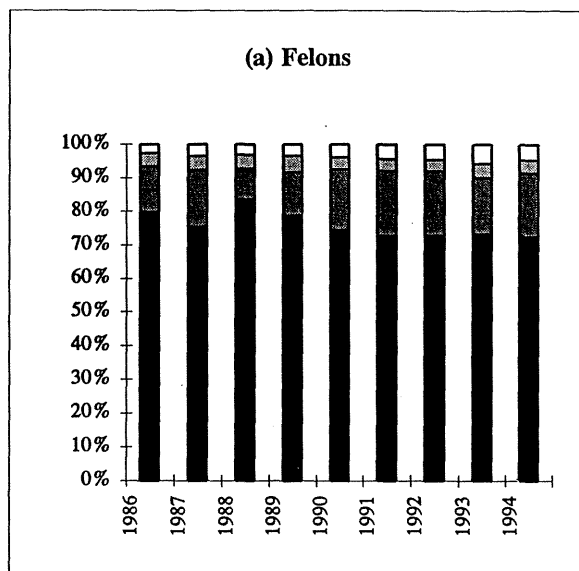


Figure 6: Probationer distribution by race, 1985-1994

The race categories were changed on the 1994 survey to correspond to the race categories used in the federal Bureau of Justice Statistics probation survey and other BJS and Census Bureau surveys. The changes made were the addition of an "Asian/Pacific Islander" category and the removal of "Hispanic" as a racial category. In order to present the 1994 race data in a format comparable with that of previous years, the previous years' Hispanic population figures were moved into the "other" race category, and the "Asian/Pacific Islander" figures reported in the 1994 survey were included in the "other" category of the Figure 6 charts. The actual numbers used to produce the bar charts of Figure 6 are given in Appendix B.

Figure 6 shows that probationers at all offense levels have been predominantly white, from 1986 to the present, but that the proportion of minority probationers has increased over this time. For the past five years, the proportion of white felons on probation has held constant at about 73%; this is a decline from levels around 80% in earlier years. At present, white gross misdemeanants, misdemeanants, and juveniles constitute approximately 80% of the probationers at each offense level; in each case this percentage has declined about eight to ten points from that of 1986.

The percentage of black felony probationers has held fairly constant at 17-19% over the past five years, and has not changed greatly over the duration of the study. (The data used to plot these graphs was taken from the previous years' probation survey reports. The sharp decline in black felony probationers in 1988, as shown in Figure 3(a), is due to that year's report showing only 221 black felons for Hennepin County, as compared to 1242 in 1987 and 1482 in 1989. Almost certainly this indicates a data quality problem, rather than an actual fluctuation in the racial distribution of probationers.) There has been a sharp increase in the percentage of black gross misdemeanants and misdemeanants, and a gradual increase in black misdemeanants, over the period shown in the graph. The proportion of American Indian probationers has held quite constant over the years at all offense levels.

The 1994 year-end population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities displays some notably different gender and racial characteristics from the felony probation population. Slightly over 95% of adult inmates are male, and their racial distribution is 52.6% white, 33.9% black, 6.8% American Indian, 4.9% Hispanic, and 1.8% other. ("Hispanic" is counted as a racial category in this data system.)

To synchronize the Minnesota survey with the federal probation survey, an "ethnic origin" question was added to the 1994 survey, in which respondents were asked to break down their year-end probation population as "Hispanic" or "not Hispanic." (The survey instructions in Appendix A include definitions and additional discussion of this change in the survey.) As is shown in Appendix B, 3.8% of all probationers in the 1994 study were reported as being of "Hispanic origin". Last year, 2.8% of all probationers were reported as being of "Hispanic race." This would represent a sizable increase in the past year in the number of Hispanics under probation supervision, except that the 1994 data is not directly comparable to that of years past. When "Hispanic" was used as a racial category, as in years past, one would have to choose whether to code a black Hispanic (for example) as black or Hispanic. On this year's survey such an individual would be coded as black in question 6 and Hispanic in question 7. The current method of counting Hispanics results in higher counts.

**Figure 5: Percentage of male probationers by offense level, 1985-1994**

**D. Probationer distribution by agent type**

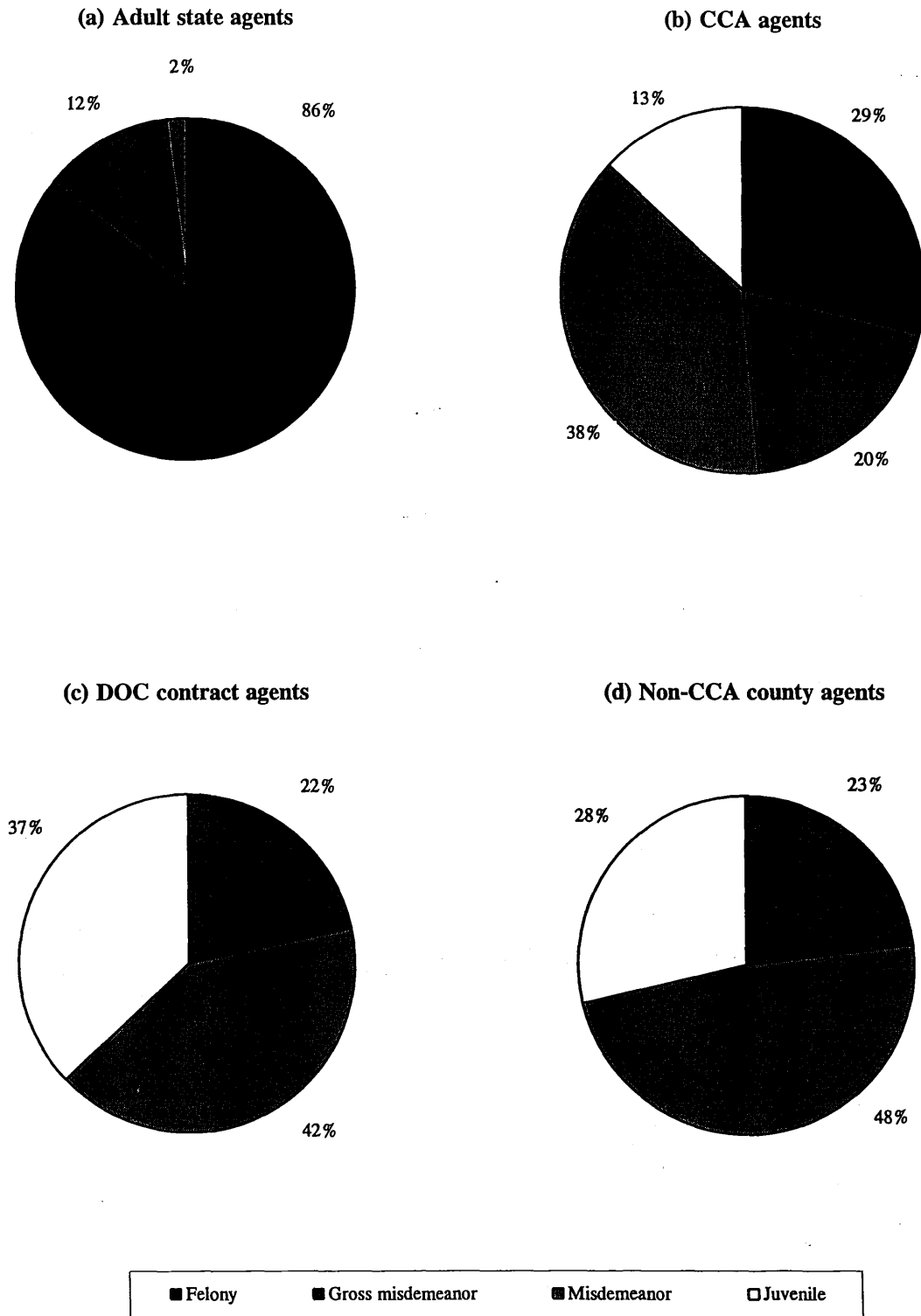
The table below shows the distribution of December 31, 1994 probationers by agent type by offense level. Note that the first three data columns include only probationers processed in adult court; all juveniles are reported in the fourth column. (This data can also be found in Appendix B.)

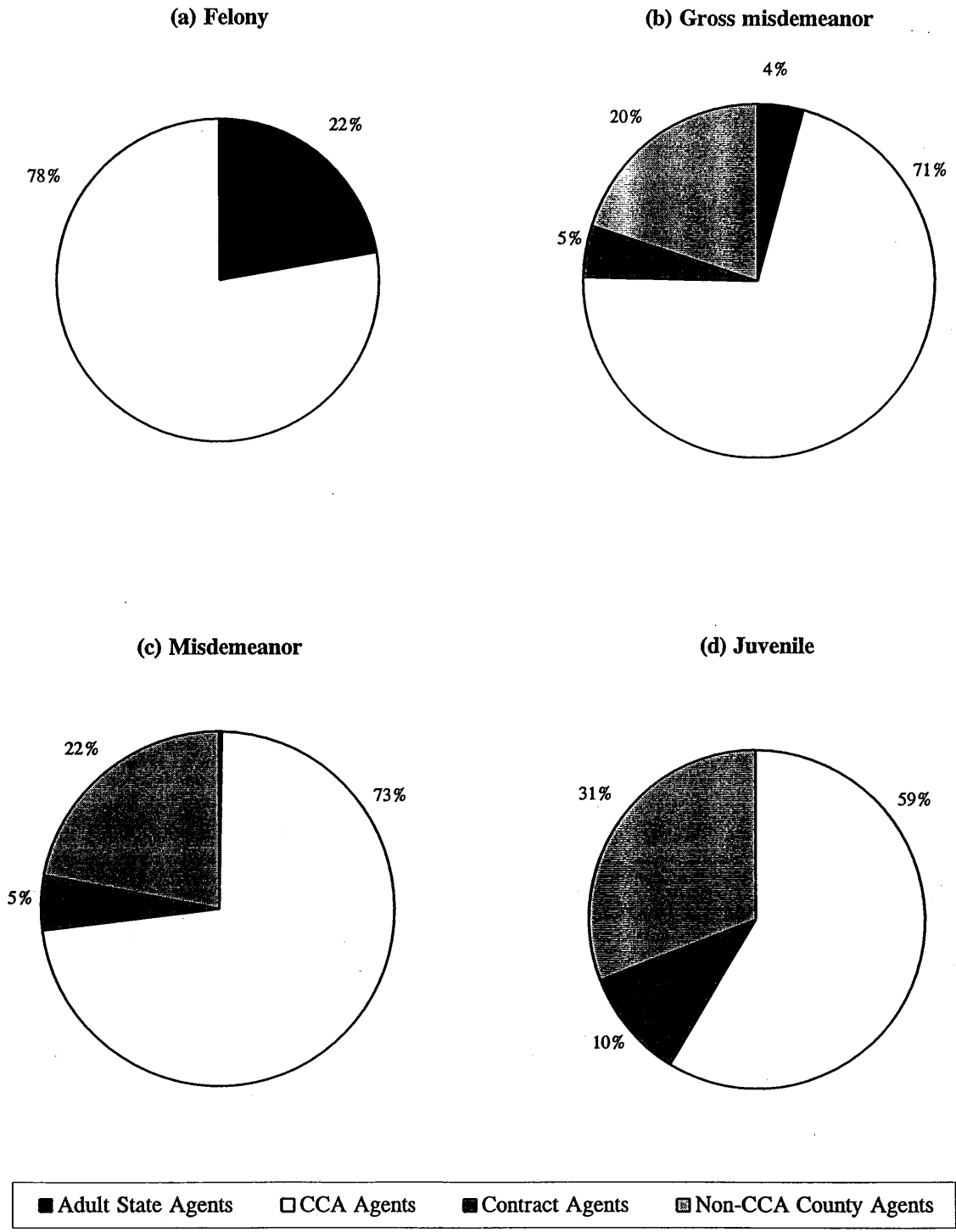
Figure 7 uses these numbers to present the statewide probation population served by each agent type. As might be expected of "felony agents," about 86% of the probationers under the supervision of adult state agents are felons, with most of the remainder being gross misdemeanants. Among probationers supervised by agents in CCA counties, about 38% are misdemeanants, 29% are felons, 20% are gross misdemeanants, and 13% are juveniles. Contract agents (DOC employees providing non-felon probation services in non-CCA counties) had a caseload consisting of approximately 42% misdemeanants, 37% juveniles, and 22% gross misdemeanants. Probation agents employed by non-CCA counties served a caseload of which about half (48%) were misdemeanants and 28% were juveniles, with the remainder (23%) being gross misdemeanants.

Figure 8 looks at the data in the above table from the other perspective; that is, how are cases at each offense level distributed among the agent types? About 70% of the state's population live in CCA counties, and nearly the same percentage (71%) of the state's probationers were supervised by CCA agents. CCA counties are found to be supervising over three-fourths of the statewide felony probationer population, with the adult state agents being responsible for the remainder. CCA counties supervise over 70% of the gross misdemeanor and misdemeanor probationers in the state, and about 59% of the juvenile probationers.

### **E. 1994 probationer offenses**

The 1993 probation survey included an "offense category" question for the first time, and this question was included again in the 1994 survey in essentially the same format. The offense categories used in the questionnaire were derived from the Minnesota Offense Code general index categories, with the main differences being the creation of separate categories for DWI and juvenile status offenses, due to the frequent occurrence of these offenses in the probationer population.

The national probation survey from the Bureau of Justice Statistics asks for the number of DWI probationers, so the addition of the offense category question allows us to provide this information to the BJS. The most serious offense of each probationer is also a useful descriptive characteristic of an offender, or an offender population. Probationers commonly are under supervision for more than one offense, but survey respondents were directed to count each individual exactly once, according to their most serious offense. Since the Court Services Tracking System (CSTS) software's offense reporting is case-based, not offender-based, several counties using that software provided estimated answers to this question by applying a probationers/cases ratio to the CSTS offense report counts.

Appendix B provides the numbers of probationers in each offense category (i.e., arson, assault, burglary, etc.) by offense level (felony, gross misdemeanor, etc.) by county, and also provides summary data by agent type, county type, and statewide. A more concise summary of the offense data is provided in Appendix C. In Appendix C, offense categories have been collapsed into "offense types" as shown below:

Person: assault, criminal sexual conduct, homicide, kidnapping, robbery

Property: arson, burglary, forgery, property damage, stolen property, theft, theft related, vehicle theft

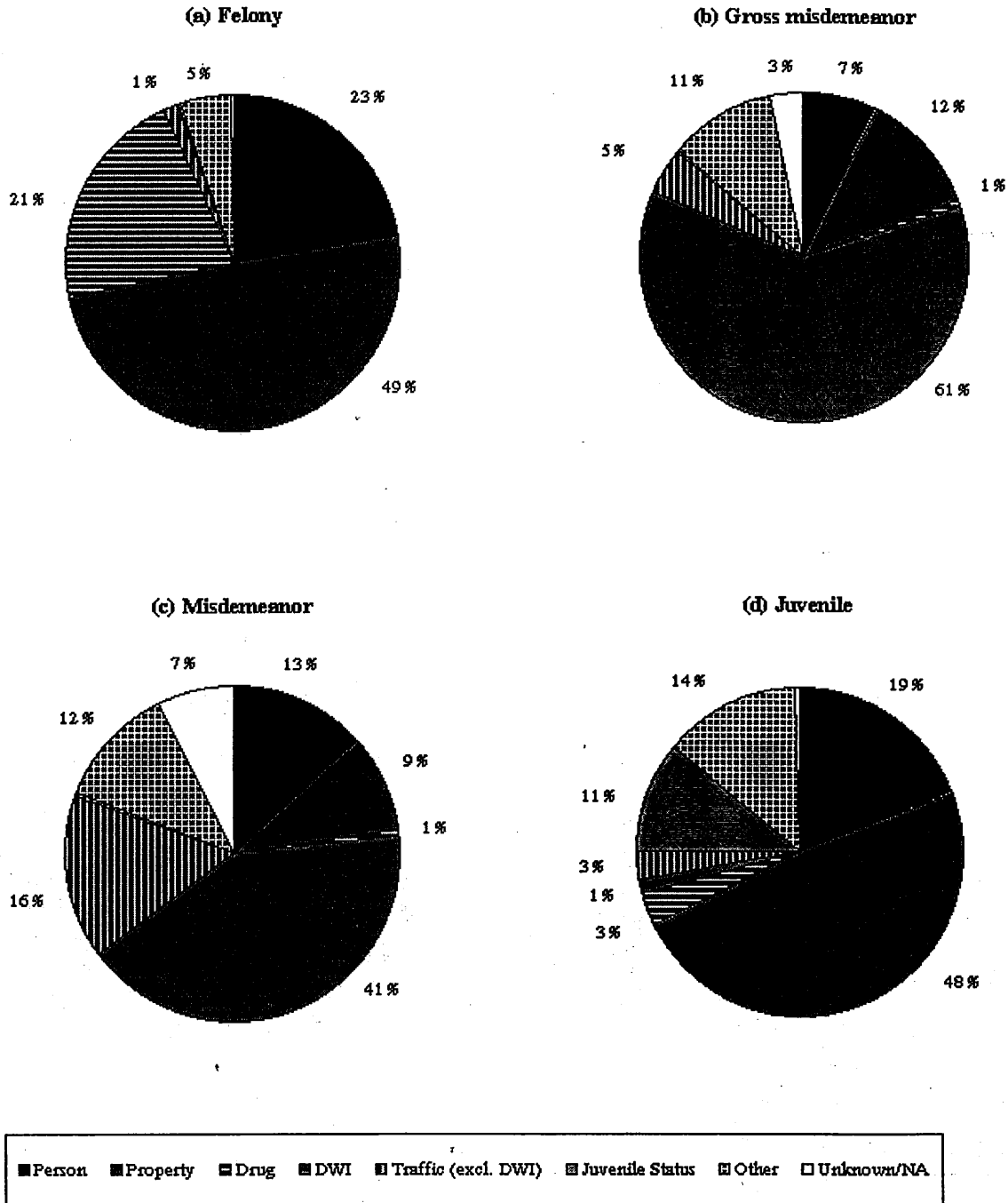
Other: crime against family, crime against administration of justice, crime against government, disturbing peace, escape, gambling, obscenity, sex related, weapons, other

In addition, the survey's offense categories for drug offenses, DWI, juvenile status offenses, traffic/accidents (except DWI), and unknown/NA are each represented as an offense type in Appendix C.

Figure 9 shows the types of offenses represented in the probationer population at each offense level. About half (49%) of Minnesota's felony probationers were under supervision for a property offense, with most of the remaining felons divided quite evenly between person offenders (23%) and drug offenders (21%). In comparison, the 1994 year-end adult population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities included 63% person offenders, 22% property offenders, and 11% drug offenders.

Two-thirds of the gross misdemeanants were DWI cases; another ten percent were property offenders. Forty-one percent of the misdemeanants were under supervision for a DWI as their most serious offense, with the next largest slices representing property offenders and "other" offenders. The most serious offense of 48% of the juveniles was a property offense, with person offenses, juvenile status offenses, and "other" offenses constituting most of the remainder.

Table 3 shows the number of adult probationers per 1000 adults (age 18 and older) for each county, as well as on a summary level. The adult county populations were obtained using 1995 projections from the state demographer's office. In the table, counties are listed in descending order of their per-thousand adult probationer population. Four of the five counties with the highest proportion of their adult population on probation are the contiguous counties of Pine, Isanti, Mille Lacs, and Kanabec, in east-central Minnesota. These counties were all in the top ten in this ranking last year as well. Four of the five counties with the fewest adult probationers per capita are Kittson, Marshall, Lake of the Woods, and Roseau, all in the northwestern corner of the state. These counties were also at the bottom of the list last year.

The table shows that while about 25 of 1000 adults statewide are on probation, the median county figure is 18 per 1000. This difference between the mean and the median is due to the more populous counties tending to have higher proportions of their adult populations on probation. Another way of looking at the 25/1000 probationer ratio is to say that approximately one out of 41 adults in Minnesota were under probation supervision on December 31, 1994.

Table 4 shows the corresponding juvenile probationer data. In this table, the juvenile probationer population in each county is compared to the projected 1995 population of 12- through 17-year-olds in that county, and expressed on a per-thousand basis. There are no clear geographical patterns for high or low juvenile probation usage, as was seen with the adults. Meeker and Mille Lacs repeated their 1993 ranking as the counties with the highest proportion of their juvenile population on probation. Some

counties showed major changes in their Table 4 ranking from 1993 to 1994. In cases where their ranking, and their number of juveniles on probation dropped in 1994, the change may be at least partially explained by the inclusion of juvenile diversion cases in their 1993 juvenile probation numbers, while juvenile diversion cases were excluded from the probation numbers in 1994. However, this would not explain cases of counties showing large increases in juvenile probationers in 1994. Hopefully the data will show more consistency when 1994 and 1995 probation data are compared, because probation offices should be working with more stable "probationer" definitions and data management systems now.

The statewide mean of 39 juveniles on probation per 1000 is over 50% higher than the proportion of adults on probation. Furthermore, Meeker and Mille Lacs Counties are found to have at least one juvenile in ten under probation supervision. The statewide median of 38 juveniles on probation per 1000 indicates no strong relationship between county population and juvenile probation usage.

### **G. December 31, 1994 diversion population**

In addition to the traditional reporting of felony, gross misdemeanor, misdemeanor, and juvenile probationers, the 1994 probation survey included columns for reporting the number of adult diversion and juvenile diversion cases in each county. Appendix D provides demographic information regarding the adult and juvenile diversion population.

Nearly 94% of the 1916 adult diversion cases reported statewide reside in just three counties: Hennepin, Ramsey, and Stearns. Not only are more juveniles (2784) than adults on diversion, but juvenile diversion cases are more widely distributed among the state's counties, as seven counties reported having over 100 juveniles on diversion.

About one-third of the adult and juvenile diversion cases are females. This is a significantly higher proportion of females than are found on probation or in prisons. The racial distribution of the adult diversion and juvenile diversion populations are quite different. In particular, blacks comprise 33% of the adult diversion population, but only 5% of the juvenile diversion cases.

About two-thirds of the adult diversion cases were diverted for property offenses, particularly theft, theft-related, and forgery offenses. About half of the juvenile diversion cases were identified as being property offenders, and one-fourth were diverted for juvenile status offenses.

Both Hennepin and Ramsey noted that diversion cases in their counties are contracted out, and thus do not contribute to the workload of their probation agents. In other counties probation agents commonly provide programming and/or supervision for diversion cases. In counties where diversion cases contribute to the workload of probation agents, it is important to count diversion cases in order to determine their impact on total workload. Even in counties where diversion cases are not the responsibility of probation agents, it is useful to collect and track information on the use of this alternative to court-imposed correctional sanctions.

### **H. December 31, 1994 supervised release/parole/ICS population**

Appendix E presents demographic information concerning offenders on supervised release or parole from Minnesota's correctional institutions. This data was not collected using the probation survey, but was extracted from the DOC Corrections Management Information System (CMIS) database.

Adult and juvenile releasees living in Community Corrections Act counties are supervised by CCA county agents. Adult releasees in non-CCA agents are supervised by Department of Corrections agents. Juvenile parolees in non-CCA counties are supervised by county probation agents in some counties, and by Department of Corrections "contract agents" in counties where the counties contract with the DOC to supervise their juvenile probationers and parolees. Due to the more serious nature of their crimes, releasees tend to require higher levels of supervision than probationers. Thus it is important to include releasees in considerations of the overall workload of community correctional systems.

The majority of adult releasees live in and are supervised by Hennepin and Ramsey Counties. In fact, the number of adult releasees living in these counties is disproportionately large in comparison to the populations of these counties. Juveniles parolees are distributed more evenly throughout the state.

As would be expected, the gender and racial distributions of the adult and juvenile releasee populations are very similar to those of the adult and juvenile correctional facility population. The offense distribution of adult releasees includes higher percentages of property and drug offenders, and a lower percentage of person offenders than is found in the correctional institutions. This is due to the longer sentences served by person offenders.

## I. Summary

The number of Minnesotans on probation again increased significantly in 1994. At year-end, nearly 82,000 adults and over 15,000 juveniles were under probation supervision. Additionally, 1646 adults and 283 juveniles are being supervised in Minnesota as releasees from the state's correctional institutions. This adds up to over 99,000 offenders under community supervision in Minnesota. Furthermore, about 1900 adults and 2800 juveniles were found to be in a diversion program at year-end, which in some cases are under the supervision of probation agents.

While it is important to count the number of offenders on probation, additional information is needed to determine the workload represented by these probationers. Standards for face-to-face contact with a probation agent vary according to the risk represented by the offender, the sanctions pronounced in court, the offender's compliance with the probation conditions, and local probation policies. In their December, 1994 report, *Probation in Minnesota: Putting the Pieces Together*, the Probation Standards Task Force presented a way of weighting probation survey data to estimate the workload represented by the probation population. Their recommendations and other initiatives will likely result in efforts to obtain weighted caseload data in addition to probationer populations in future years.

## Instructions for Completing the 1994 Probation Survey

### *Why do a probation survey? Who participates in the survey?*

Thank you for your participation in this annual study, which is conducted in order to provide caseload information to probation policymakers in the Minnesota Department of Corrections, Minnesota counties, and other government agencies/units. In order to obtain information regarding all 1994 probationers, this questionnaire is being mailed to:

- Community Corrections Directors, to collect all CCA-county probation information
- Department of Corrections District Supervisors, to collect data on all probationers supervised by DOC felony agents and DOC contract agents
- Chief Probation Officers in non-CCA counties, to collect data on all probationers supervised by non-CCA county agents.

One questionnaire is enclosed for each county in which your office provides probation services. Please answer the questions for all cases under your supervision.

DOC District Supervisors should note that their reports can be generated using PROBER. Your questionnaires simply serve as a list of the reports that we expect to receive from you—you need not transcribe the numbers from the PROBER reports to the questionnaires.

### *Who should be counted as a "probationer"?*

- Probationers are those who have been placed under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court order—regardless of whether they have been convicted.
- Count probationers if there is actual or potential agent involvement, even if that involvement is minimal (such as monitoring compliance with a sanction such as a fine, restitution, or community service).
- Include "diversion program" cases and "stay of imposition" cases if you are supervising the individual.
- Exclude persons on "bench probation," "court probation," or "summary probation," who have not been placed under the supervision of a probation agency.
- Exclude persons on supervised release, parole, or intensive community supervision.
- Include those probationers who are sent to your county from another county or state for supervision, but exclude those whom you send to another county or state.

You will note that the "1993 year-end population" figures you reported on line 4 of last year's survey have been entered on line 1 of the enclosed questionnaire(s). If you no longer agree with these numbers, strike them out and write in your amended numbers.

### *Reporting probationer offense categories*

For question 8 (offense categories), a probationer being supervised due to more than one offense should only be counted once (not as many times as he/she has offenses). Report the most serious offense for which the individual was under supervision on 12/31/94. Likewise, for all other questions be sure to report the number of **people**, not the number of offenses or open files.

The offense categories used in question 8 are derived from the Minnesota Offense Code (MOC) general index categories, except that "juvenile status offenses" and DWI were made into separate categories, and some MOC "miscellaneous" offenses (liquor, conservation) were added to the "crime against government" category. Therefore, if you are familiar with the MOC system, you can consult its tables if you have questions in categorizing offenses.

Here are some offenses for which survey completers had questions last year, and how to categorize them:

criminal vehicular homicide	Traffic/Accidents

### *Changes in the 1994 Probation Survey*

The DOC reports the aggregate statewide data from this annual probation survey to the Bureau of Justice Statistics (U.S. Department of Justice) on their nationwide probation survey. Thus we have changed the race categories of our survey to match the BJS race categories, by adding an Asian category and removing the Hispanic category. We have also added a "Hispanic origin" question to match the BJS survey.

The federal government regards "Hispanic" as a designation of ethnicity, not race. Thus Hispanic probationers will generally be counted as White or Black in question 6, and as Hispanic in question 7. The following Census Bureau definitions may be useful.

White (race)—A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East. (DOC note: this is true of most Hispanics.)

Hispanic (ethnic origin)—A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Two additional columns have been added this year, for "adult diversion" and "juvenile diversion." One reason for this change is that diversion cases do not involve the pronouncement of a sentence in court, and thus it may not be possible to categorize these people as felons or misdemeanants, or in a specific offense category (note that an "unknown/not applicable" offense category has been added to question 8 for this purpose).
