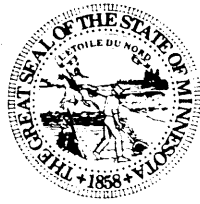

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I. Introduction

The Minnesota Department of Corrections (DOC) has collected probation data from Minnesota counties on an annual basis since the early 1980's. The reporting of entries, removals, year-end populations, and distribution by race and gender has remained largely unchanged since the 1984 survey. Throughout these years, one purpose of the Minnesota Probation Survey has been to collect data requested by the Bureau of the Census and the Bureau of Justice Statistics regarding Minnesota probationers. The organization of the Minnesota questionnaire and its definition of "probationer" is patterned after that used by the federal questionnaire. In addition to meeting federal reporting requirements, the findings of the probation survey are used by the Minnesota Department of Corrections, other state agencies, the Minnesota Legislature, county probation offices, and other parties for management and policy-making purposes.

"Probation officers" do much more than provide probation supervision. Other duties can include supervising individuals on supervised release, parole, intensive community supervision, pre-trial diversion, or CHIPS (child in need of protection or services), as well as conducting presentence investigations, processing transfer requests, and working with prevention programs. This report includes a profile of some of these additional contributors to the workload of probation service providers. The DOC's Corrections Management Information System (CMIS) maintains information on individuals on supervised release, intensive community supervision, and parole from state correctional facilities, and was used as the source of the releasee data included in this report.

II. Methodology

This chapter describes the content of the probation survey, and how the probation survey data was collected. Issues that arose in the course of this year's data collection are also addressed.

A. Survey design

The 1995 probation survey instructions and questionnaire are shown in Appendix A. Throughout the years, the essential definition of "probationer" has been "those who have been placed under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court-order—regardless of whether they have been convicted." However, clarifications and changes have been made in the detailed instructions in recent years, to ensure we collect the data needed for reporting and management purposes, and to promote more consistent interpretations of the instructions by all counties. For instance, prior to the 1993 survey respondents were told to exclude "cases for whom an agent is only monitoring compliance with a sanction such as a fine or restitution." However, the Bureau of Justice Statistics directs us to report on all probationers, including those in "paper" or "administrative" classifications, so the Minnesota survey's instructions were changed to include these cases.

The handling of diversion cases has also undergone changes in recent years. In the 1993 survey, counties were instructed to include individuals supervised in pre-trial diversion programs. In the 1994 survey, counties again were asked to report on diversion cases, but the questionnaire provided separate columns for this reporting, so that probation and diversion could be differentiated in the data. While planning the 1995 survey it was found that diversion data could be obtained from the county attorneys' required biennial reports to the Department of Corrections and the legislature (MS. 388.24, 401.065), so diversion was excluded from the 1995 survey's data collection.

Thus the only year in which any diversion cases were included in the probation figures was in the 1993 survey. The 1993 data included in this report is not adjusted to deduct diversion cases. The number of diversion cases reported in the 1993 survey is believed to be small, because in the largest counties (including Hennepin and Ramsey) diversion services are not provided by Community Corrections and thus were not reported on the survey, and because this survey predated the statutes mandating that diversion programs be established in counties.

B. Survey administration

Questionnaires were mailed on December 21, 1995 to the following:

- Community Corrections Act (CCA) directors—to collect data on all probationers in their counties.
- Department of Corrections district supervisors—for reporting probationers supervised by adult state agents and contract agents in each county where they provide probation services.
- County probation offices in non-CCA counties not served by DOC contract agents—for reporting all probationers under their supervision (juveniles and adult non-felons).

Appendix E shows how court services are provided in Minnesota's counties.

C. Reporting issues

All counties and DOC district offices completed and returned the survey. The obstacles encountered by probation offices using PROBER and CSTS while completing the 1994 survey were overcome by the parties involved in time to complete the 1995 survey. Reporting capabilities were added to CSTS+ during 1995 which enabled its users to complete the 1995 survey more efficiently and with greater uniformity.

III. Findings

This chapter provides an analysis of the 1995 probation survey data. Comparisons are also made to probation data from previous years.

A. Overview

Appendix B presents the data reported by the counties on their questionnaires. One set of data is shown for each county. In the case of non-CCA counties, this was obtained by adding the numbers provided on the state agent and county agent questionnaires. After each county's data, Appendix B presents various aggregations of the data:

- by agent type (adult state agents, CCA agents, contract agents, and non-CCA county agents)
- by CCA status (CCA counties, non-CCA counties)
- by metro/non-metro status (where "metro" is defined as consisting of Hennepin, Ramsey, Anoka, Washington, Dakota, Scott, and Carver Counties)

as well as statewide totals of all probationers.

The reader will observe that the Appendix B column headings correspond to questions 1 through 8 of the questionnaire. The first columns report the 1994 and 1995 year-end populations, as well as movements (entries and removals) during 1995. After establishing the December 31, 1995 population, the remaining columns show its distribution by gender, race, Hispanic status, and offense category.

Appendix B's first two columns give the December 31, 1994 population as reported on the 1994 survey, then as reported on the 1995 survey. In some cases counties reported December 31, 1994 populations on the 1995 survey that differed considerably from what they reported on last year's survey.

Appendix B shows that on December 31, 1995, there were 83,778 adults and 15,655 juveniles under probation supervision in Minnesota. Using the 1994 probation survey as the source of December 31, 1994 probationer population data results in the following comparison:

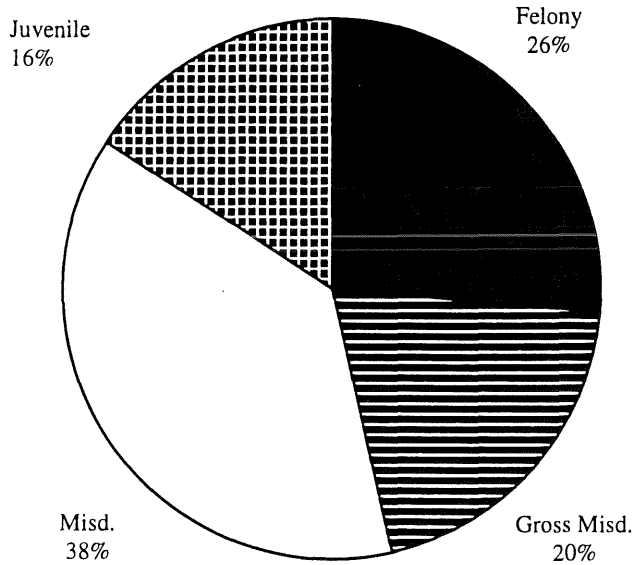


Figure 2: Comparison of 1994 and 1995 year-end probation populations

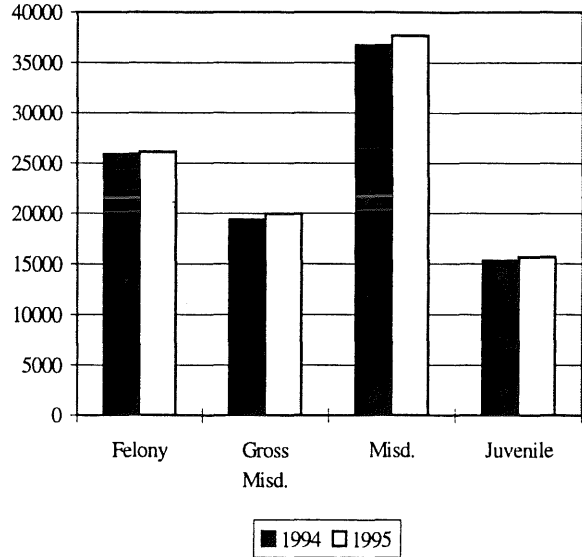
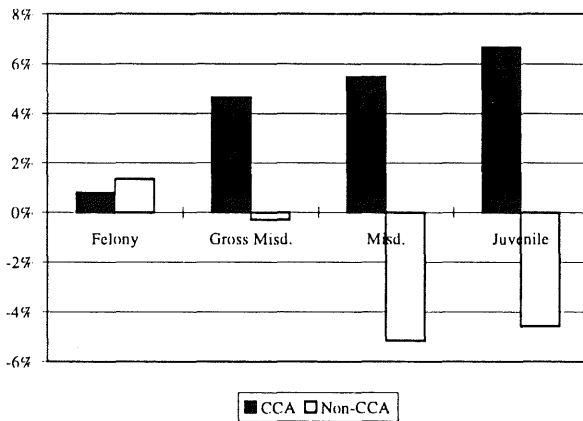


Figure 3: Percentage change in year-end populations from 1994 to 1995 in CCA and non-CCA counties

Figures 1 and 2 present the Table 1 data graphically. The distribution of the 12/31/95 probation population is given in Figure 1, while Figure 2 provides a comparison of year-end 1994 and 1995 populations. Figure 3 shows that during 1995 the CCA-county probation population increased for all offense levels, while among non-CCA counties the probation population decreased at all offense levels except felons.

The year-end probation population of 99,433 means that approximately one out of every 37 Minnesotans age 12 or older, and one out of 25 juveniles, were on probation on that day (although not all were under active supervision). The Bureau of Justice Statistics reports that as of December 31, 1994 (the most recent nationwide per-capita probation data available), only four states had more adult probationers per 100,000 adult population than Minnesota.

Figure 1: Distribution of 12/31/95 probation population

B. Minnesota probationer population, 1984-1995

While the probation population increased at every offense level during 1995, at every level the rate of increase was smaller than last year, and smaller than the average annual percentage increase as shown numerically in Table 2, and graphically in Figure 4. The Table 2 numbers were obtained from probation surveys conducted over these years. The pre-1993 data is supplemented with annual statewide counts of

felony probationers supervised by DOC felony agents. (DOC felony agents did not participate in the probation survey before 1993.) From 1984 to the present, the probation surveys obtained nearly a 100% response rate from the counties. In the three instances where a populous county failed to submit probation data over this span, the missing numbers were estimated, using the county's population data from the year before and after, so that Table 2 and Figure 4 represent a complete accounting of the Minnesota year-end probation population for each year from 1984 through 1995. With the exception of a slight dip in 1992, adult probation populations always increased from one year to the next. In fact, the adult probationer population increased by 160% during the ten-year period from December 31, 1984 (31,440) to December 31, 1994 (81,972). By comparison, the population of Minnesota-committed inmates in state correctional facilities increased by about 108% during that period.

Prior to 1993 respondents were instructed to exclude cases where the agent was "only monitoring compliance with a sanction," whereas in the past three years these cases have been included. If these cases had been counted prior to 1993, it would have increased the number of probationers for those years, and would lessen the percentage of probation population increase when comparing any year prior to 1993 to any year after that. Since the probation survey has never collected information regarding the supervision level of probationers, attempts to adjust the pre-1993 numbers would be speculative. However, the general trends of steady growth in probation populations from 1984 to 1995, plus the observation that the rate of adult population increase from 1992 (with administrative cases excluded) to 1993 (with administrative cases included) was little different than the average annual increase in previous years, suggests that including administrative supervision cases had only a small impact on the total probation numbers of the last two years, so that Table 2 and Figure 4 represent the probation population situation fairly accurately, even without adjustment of the pre-1993 data.

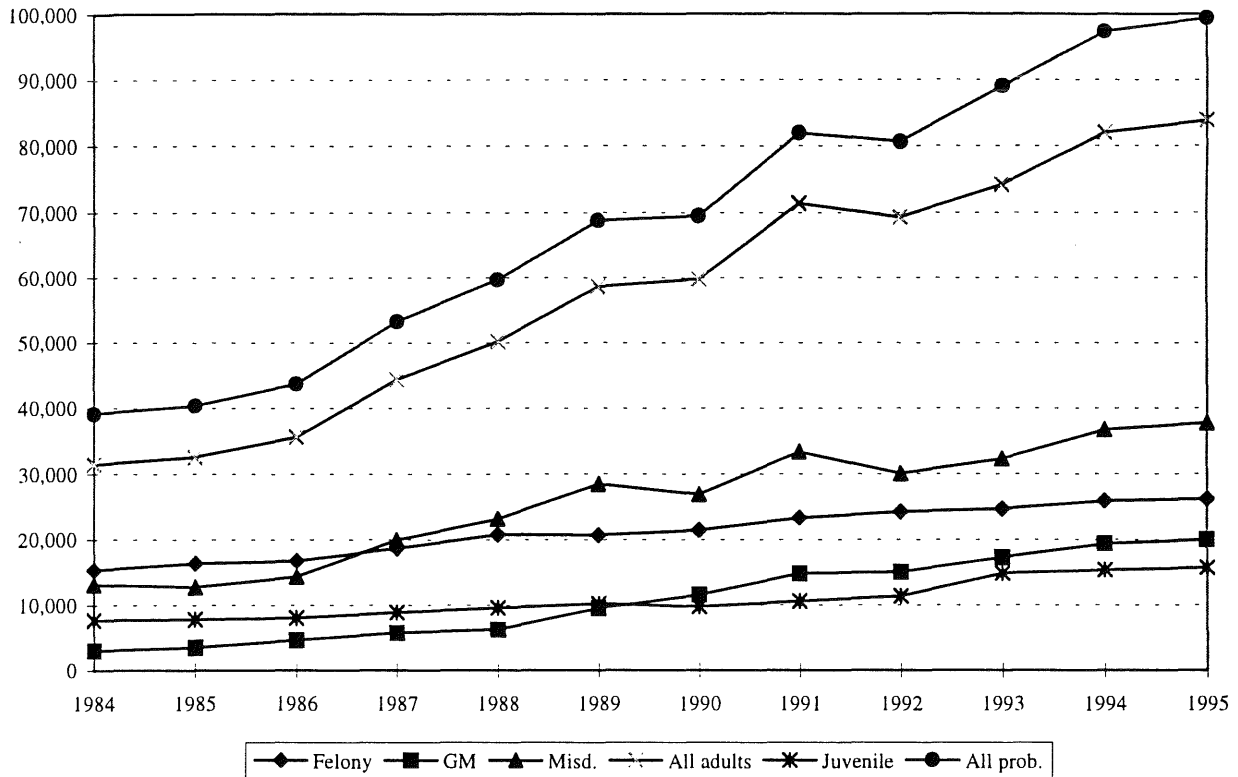

Table 2 shows that the sharpest population increase is in gross misdemeanants. They have increased more than five-fold from 1984 (3012) to 1995 (19,966). This represents an annual growth rate of 51%. The least increase has been in felony probationers, whose numbers have increased about 70% from 1984 to 1995. It should be noted that the designation of an offense as a felony, gross misdemeanor, or

misdemeanor, is not always clear-cut. Thus the data on the total adult probationer population over the years provides another useful perspective.

The juvenile probation population increased markedly from 1992 to 1993 (about 31%). The juvenile probation growth has subsequently returned to a slower rate.

C. Minnesota probationer demographics, 1985-1995

A common element of the probation survey over the years has been the reporting of the gender and race distribution of the year-end population. However, 1985 was the first year in which gender data was reported for a clear majority of probationers. Race data is presented from 1986 to the present, since that was the first year of substantially complete race data for all four offense levels—adult felony, adult gross misdemeanor, adult misdemeanor, and juvenile. The 1995 data used in this section is given in Appendix B. This appendix also provides the breakdown of demographic data on a by-county basis, for the reader interested in examining this level of detail.

Probationers supervised by adult state agents are included in the demographic data only in 1989 and 1993-present (since these are the only years within this span in which adult state agents participated in the survey). However, since county-supervised felony cases outnumbered state felony cases by ratios of

two- or three-to-one over these years, the findings presented in this section should not be substantially distorted by the missing data. With the exception of adult state agent cases, race and gender were reported for virtually 100% of the probationer population from 1987 to the present.

The composition of the felony, misdemeanor, and juvenile probationer population by gender has shifted somewhat over the years, from about 80% male in 1985 to 75% male in 1995, as shown in Figure 5. The gross misdemeanor population was about 90% male in 1985 and 1986, and still is the most heavily male segment of the probationer population, but the percentage of male gross misdemeanants has decreased over the years and is at about 81% in 1995.

The race categories were changed on the 1994 survey to correspond to the race categories used in the federal Bureau of Justice Statistics probation survey and other BJS and Census Bureau surveys. The changes made were the addition of an "Asian/Pacific Islander" category and the removal of "Hispanic" as a racial category. In order to present race data in a format comparable with that of previous years, the previous years' Hispanic population figures were moved into the "other" race category, and the "Asian/Pacific Islander" figures reported in the 1994 and 1995 survey were included in the "other" category of the Figure 6 charts. The 1995 data used in producing the bar charts of Figure 6 is given in Appendix B.

Figure 6 shows that probationers at all offense levels have been predominantly white, from 1986 to the present, but that the proportion of minority probationers has increased over this time. For the past five years, the proportion of white felons on probation has held constant at about 73%; this is a decline from levels around 80% in earlier years. At present, whites constitute about 83% of the gross misdemeanor and misdemeanor probation population, and about 74% of the juvenile probation population; in each case this percentage has declined about eight to twelve percentage points from that of 1986.

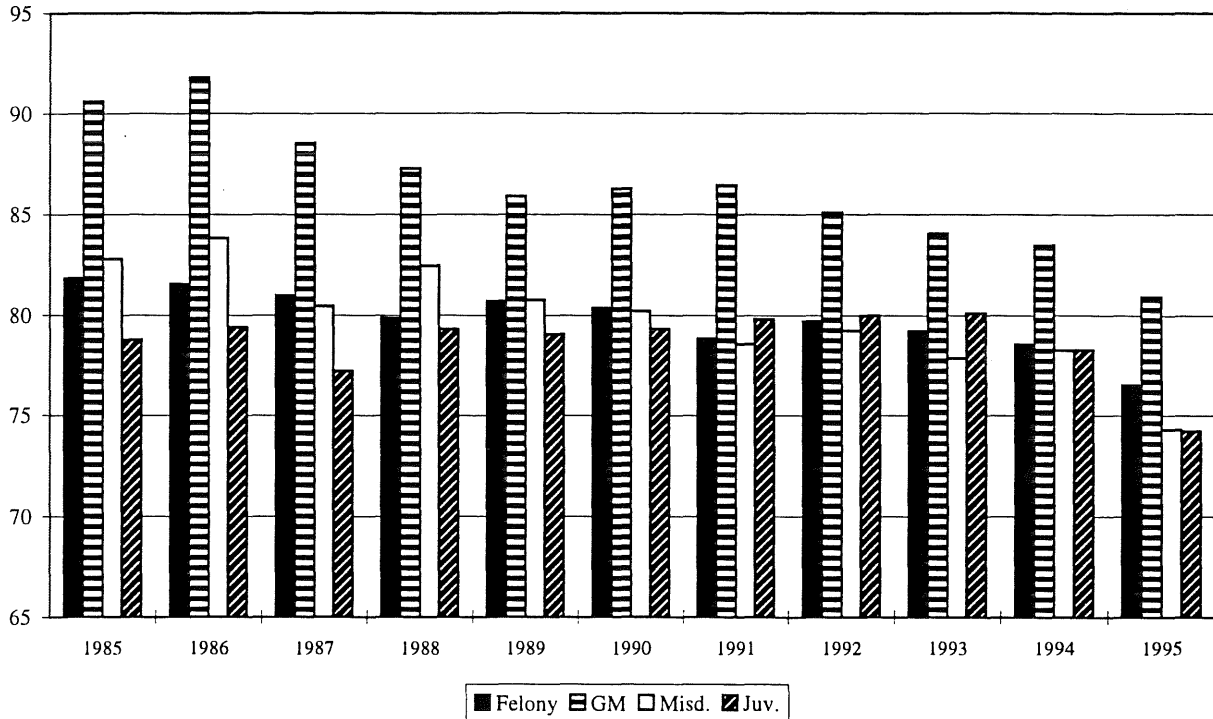
The percentage of blacks among felony probationers increased to about 21% in 1995, continuing a trend of gradual increases over the duration of the study. (The data used to plot these graphs was taken from the previous years' probation survey reports. The sharp decline in black felony probationers in 1988, as shown in Figure 3(a), is due to that year's report showing only 221 black felons for Hennepin County, as compared to 1242 in 1987 and 1482 in 1989. Almost certainly this indicates a data quality problem, rather than an actual fluctuation in the racial distribution of probationers.) There has been a sharp increase in the percentage of black gross misdemeanants and misdemeanants, and a gradual increase in black juveniles, over the period shown in the graph. The proportion of American Indian probationers has held quite constant over the years at all offense levels.

The 1995 year-end population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities displays some notably different gender and racial characteristics from the felony probation population. Nearly 96% of adult inmates are male, and their racial distribution is 51.3% white, 35.0% black, 6.6% American Indian, 5.3% Hispanic, and 1.8% other. ("Hispanic" is counted as a racial category in the Corrections Management Information System.)

To synchronize the Minnesota survey with the federal probation survey, an "ethnic origin" question was added to the probation survey in 1994, in which respondents were asked to break down their year-end probation population as "Hispanic" or "not Hispanic." (The survey instructions in Appendix A include definitions and additional discussion of this change in the survey.) As is shown in Appendix B, 3.8% of all probationers in the 1995 study were reported as being of "Hispanic origin," the same as in the 1994 study. In 1993 (when Hispanic was included in the survey as a racial category), 2.8% of all probationers were reported as being of "Hispanic race." This would represent a sizable increase from 1993 to the present in the number of Hispanics under probation supervision, except that the 1994 and 1995 data is not directly comparable to that of years past. When "Hispanic" was used as a racial category as in years past, one would have to choose whether to code a black Hispanic (for example) as black or Hispanic. On

this year's survey such an individual would be coded as black in question 6 and Hispanic in question 7. The current method of counting Hispanics results in higher counts.

Figure 5: Percentage of male probationers by offense level, 1985-1995



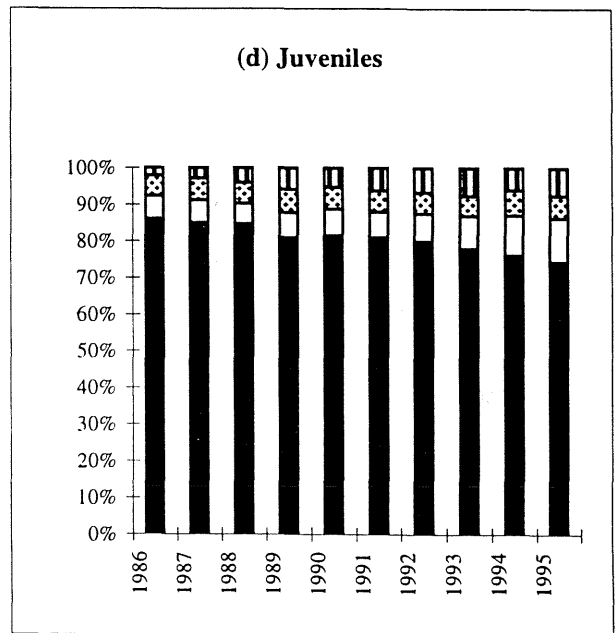
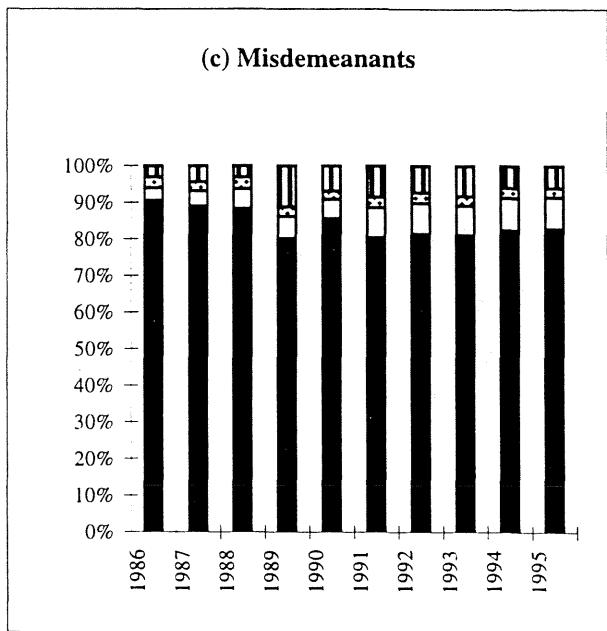
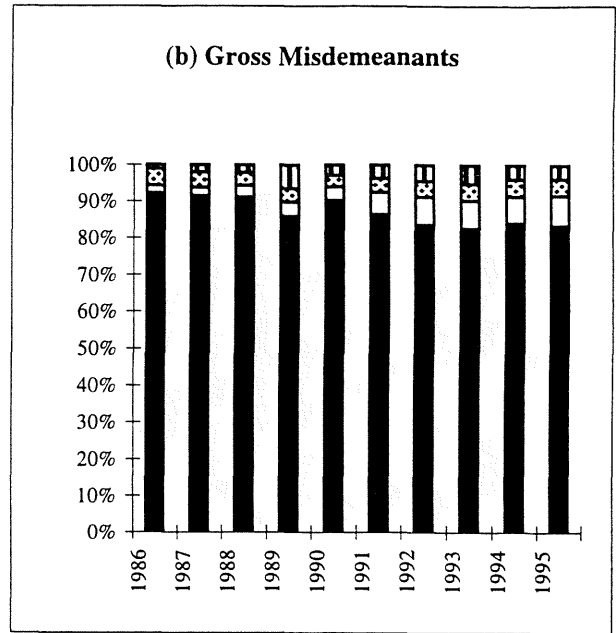
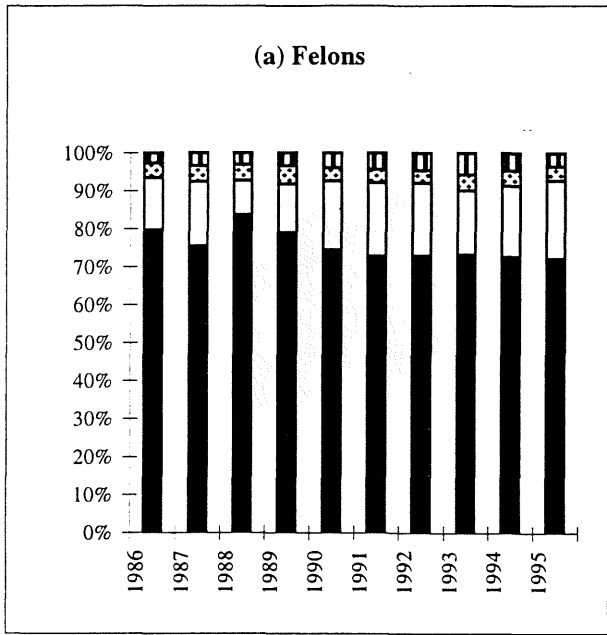
D. Probationer distribution by agent type

The table below shows the distribution of December 31, 1995 probationers by agent type by offense level. Note that the first three data columns include only probationers processed in adult court; all juveniles are reported in the fourth column. (This data can also be found in Appendix B.)

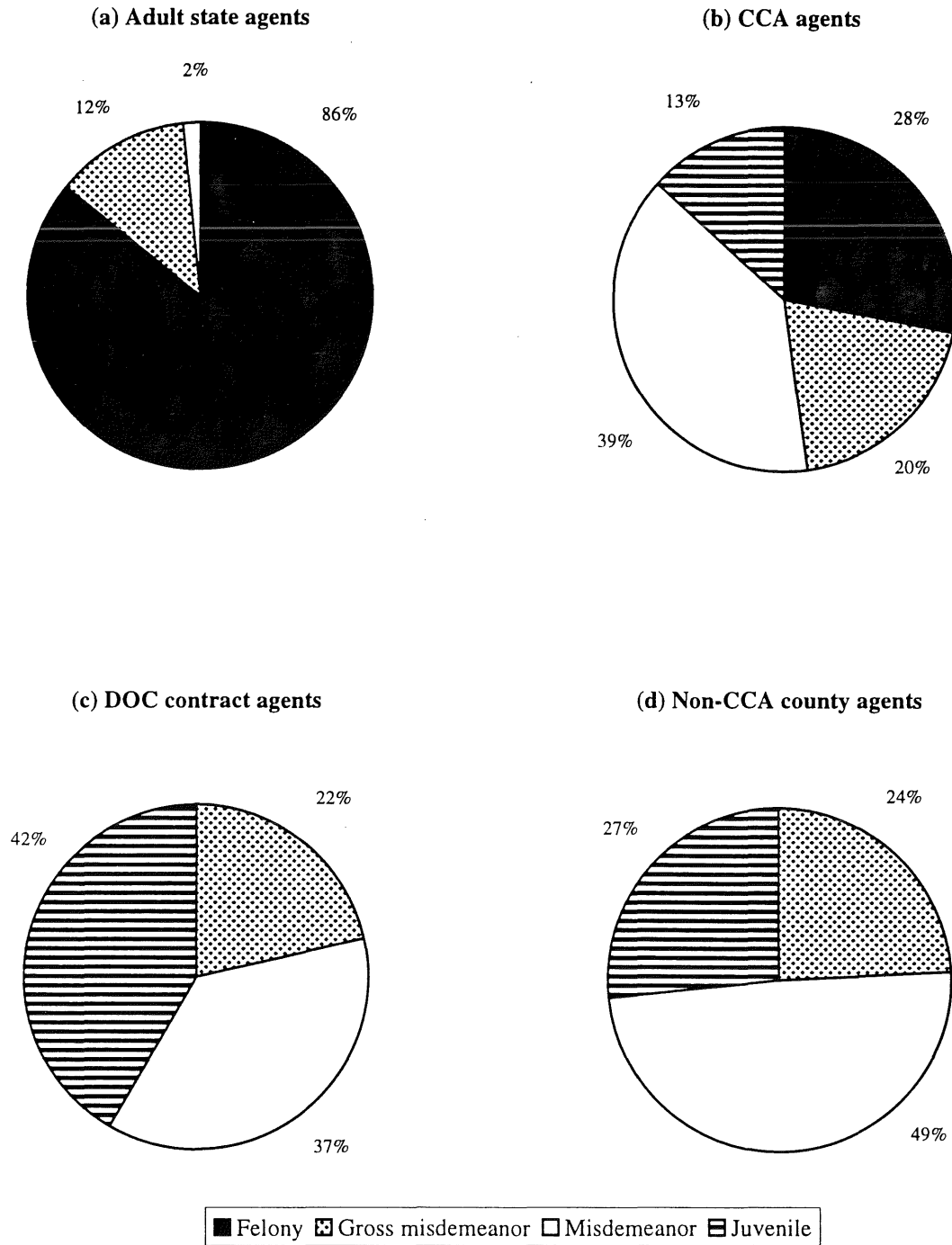
Figure 7 uses these numbers to present the statewide probation population served by each agent type. As might be expected of "felony agents," about 86% of the probationers under the supervision of adult state agents are felons, with most of the remainder being gross misdemeanants. Among probationers supervised by agents in CCA counties, about 28% are felons, 20% are gross misdemeanants, 39% are

misdemeanants, and 13% are juveniles. Contract agents (DOC employees providing non-felon probation services in non-CCA counties) had a caseload consisting of approximately 22% gross misdemeanants, 37% misdemeanants, and 42% juveniles. Probation agents employed by non-CCA counties served a caseload of which about half (49%) were misdemeanants and 27% were juveniles, with the remainder (24%) being gross misdemeanants.

Figure 8 looks at the data in the above table from the other perspective; that is, how are cases at each offense level distributed among the agent types? About 70% of the state's population live in CCA counties, and nearly the same percentage (73%) of the state's probationers were supervised by CCA agents. CCA counties are supervising over three-fourths of the statewide felony probationer population, with the adult state agents being responsible for the remainder. CCA counties supervise over 70% of the gross misdemeanor and misdemeanor probationers in the state, and about 61% of the juvenile probationers.

E. Probationer distribution by type of offense

The 1993 probation survey included an "offense category" question for the first time, and this question has been included again in the 1994 and 1995 surveys. The offense categories used in the questionnaire were derived from the Minnesota Offense Code general index categories, with the main differences being the creation of separate categories for DWI and juvenile status offenses, due to the frequent occurrence of these offenses in the probationer population.

The national probation survey from the Bureau of Justice Statistics asks for the number of DWI probationers, so the addition of the offense category question allows us to provide this information to the BJS. The most serious offense of each probationer is also a useful descriptive characteristic of an offender, or an offender population. Probationers commonly are under supervision for more than one offense, but survey respondents were directed to count each individual exactly once, according to their most serious offense.

A significant development in this year's reporting of offense data is that CSTS+ (Court Services Tracking System) can now generate a report to complete the "offense category" section of the survey. This report selects the most serious offense for each probationer using the offense-ranking techniques described in the survey instructions (see Appendix A). In the 1993 and 1994 surveys, most counties using CSTS provided estimated answers to this question by using a CSTS report of cases under supervision and applying a probationers/cases ratio.

Appendix B provides the numbers of probationers in each offense category (i.e., arson, assault, burglary, etc.) by offense level (felony, gross misdemeanor, etc.) by county, and also provides summary data by agent type, county type, and statewide. A more concise summary of the offense data is provided in Appendix C. In Appendix C, offense categories have been collapsed into "offense types" as shown below:

Person: assault, criminal sexual conduct, homicide, kidnapping, robbery

Property: arson, burglary, forgery, property damage, stolen property, theft, theft related, vehicle theft

Other: crime against family, crime against administration of justice, crime against government, disturbing peace, escape, gambling, obscenity, sex related, weapons, other

In addition, the survey's offense categories for "drugs", "DWI", "juvenile status offenses", "traffic/accidents (except DWI)", "other", and "unknown/not applicable" are each represented as an offense type in Appendix C.

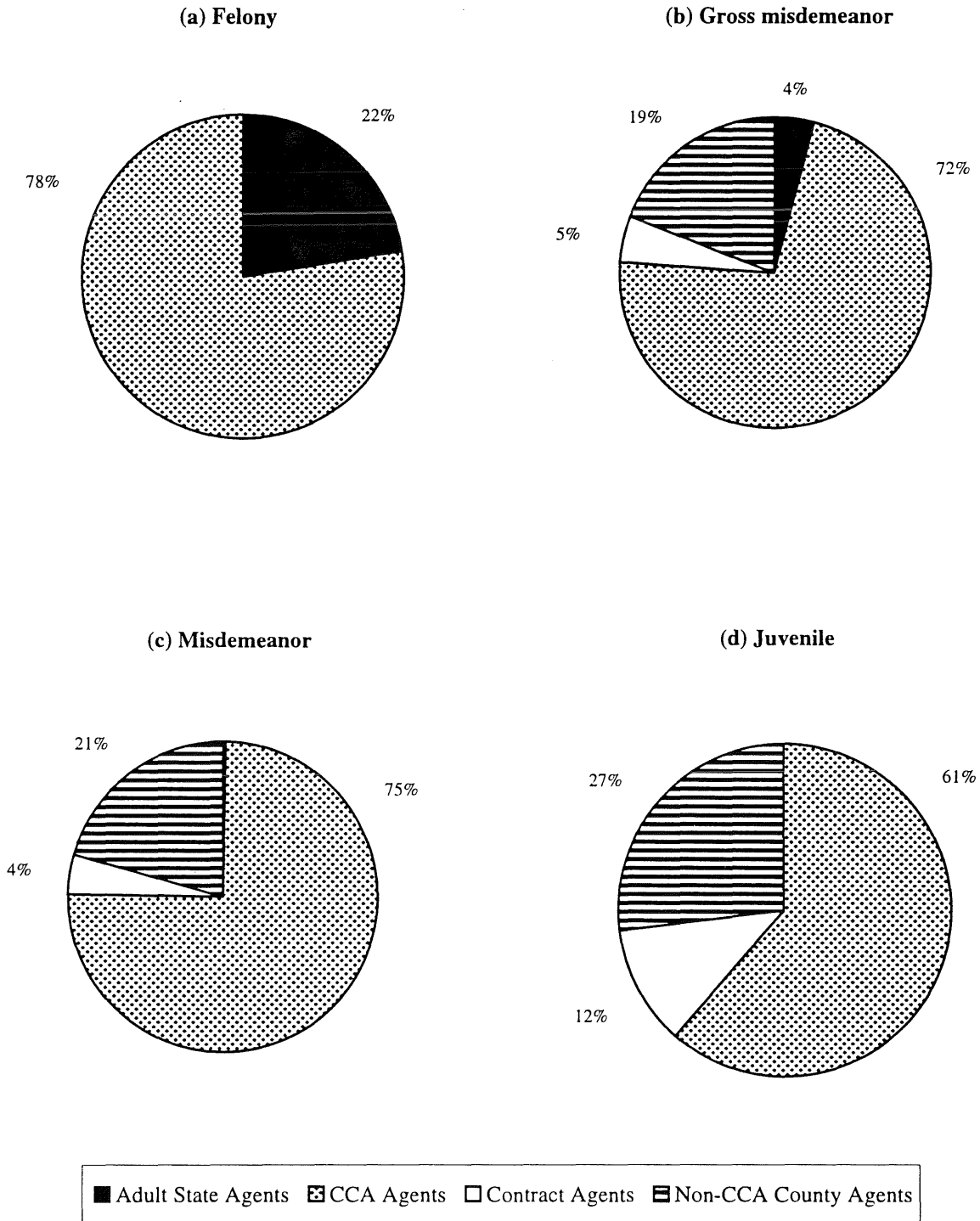


Figure 9: December 31, 1995 probationers by offense level by offense type

Figure 9 shows the types of offenses represented in the probationer population at each offense level. About half (48%) of Minnesota's felony probationers were under supervision for a property offense, with

Figure 8: December 31, 1995 probationers by offense level by agent type

most of the remaining felons divided fairly evenly between person offenders (24%) and drug offenders (21%). In comparison, the 1995 year-end adult population of Minnesota's state correctional facilities included 65% person offenders, 21% property offenders, and 11% drug offenders.

Fifty-nine percent of the gross misdemeanants were DWI cases; another ten percent were property offenders. Forty-three percent of the misdemeanants were under supervision for a DWI as their most serious offense, with the next largest slices representing person offenders and other traffic offenders (15% each). The most serious offense of 46% of the juveniles was a property offense. Next most common among juveniles were person offenders (19%).

F. 1995 probation population by county

The Minnesota counties with the largest December 31, 1995 adult probationer populations are shown below:

Table 3 shows the number of adult probationers per 1000 adults (age 18 and older) for each county, as well as on a summary level. The adult county populations were obtained using 1995 projections from the state demographer's office. In the table, counties are listed in descending order of their per-thousand adult probationer population. Five of the six counties with the highest proportion of their adult population on probation are the contiguous counties of Pine, Isanti, Aitkin, Anoka, and Mille Lacs, in east-central Minnesota. With the exception of Aitkin County, these counties were all in the top ten in this ranking in 1993 and 1994 as well. Kittson, Marshall, and Lake of the Woods Counties (all in extreme northwestern Minnesota) reported the fewest adult probationers, just as they did last year.

The table shows that while about 25 of 1000 adults statewide are on probation, the median county figure is 18 per 1000. This difference between the mean and the median is due to the more populous counties

tending to have higher proportions of their adult populations on probation. Another way of looking at the 25/1000 probationer ratio is to say that approximately one out of 40 adults in Minnesota were under probation supervision on December 31, 1995.

Table 4 shows the corresponding juvenile probationer data. In this table, the juvenile probationer population in each county is compared to the projected 1995 population of 12- through 17-year-olds in that county, and expressed on a per-thousand basis. The counties with the highest "juvenile probationers per 1000 population" ratios at yearend 1995 were Mille Lacs (109), Wilkin (106), and Meeker (99). Last year, Meeker and Mille Lacs Counties topped this list, while Wilkin was sixth. By contrast, Sibley County's reported probation population equates to only six juvenile probationers per 1000 juveniles in their population; Lake of the Woods, Lincoln, and Todd Counties had the next lowest ratios (each at 15 juveniles per 1000 population).

The statewide figure of 40 juveniles on probation per 1000 is about 60% higher than the proportion of adults on probation. Put in other terms, one out of 25 Minnesotans of age 12-17 were under probation supervision at year-end. Furthermore, Mille Lacs and Wilkin Counties are found to have at least one juvenile in ten under probation supervision. The statewide median of 39 juveniles on probation per 1000 is nearly the same as the mean, and suggests no strong relationship between county population and juvenile probation usage.

G. December 31, 1995 diversion population

Minnesota Statutes 401.065 states that "by July 1, 1994, every county attorney of a county participating in the Community Corrections Act shall establish a pretrial diversion program for adult offenders." Similarly, *Minnesota Statutes* 388.24 states, "by July 1, 1995, every county attorney shall establish a pretrial diversion program for (juvenile) offenders." County attorneys are required to submit biennial reports on the operation of these pretrial diversion programs to the Department of Corrections and the Legislature, in alternate years (juvenile reports in even-numbered years [including 1996], adult reports in odd-numbered years).

In some counties, probation officers provide supervision and services to pretrial diversion cases, while in other counties these services are provided by the county attorney's office or a contractor. The 1994 probation survey collected data on Minnesota's pretrial diversion population. However, since diversion data was not readily available in counties where diversion services were not provided by court services, and since the statutes already require counties to report diversion data via biennial reports, it seemed appropriate to exclude the collection of diversion data from the 1995 probation survey and future probation surveys, and use the county attorney reports as the source of diversion data.

Not all county attorneys had submitted their 1996 report on their juvenile pretrial diversion program at the time this probation report was written. However, the data received suggests that the statewide juvenile pretrial diversion program population at year-end 1995 will be very similar to the year-end 1994 count of 2784 that was obtained from the 1994 probation survey. Counties reported a statewide adult pretrial diversion population of 1916 on the 1994 probation survey.

H. December 31, 1995 supervised release/parole/ICS population

Appendix D presents demographic information concerning offenders on supervised release or parole from Minnesota's correctional institutions. This data was not collected using the probation survey, but was extracted from the DOC Corrections Management Information System (CMIS) database.

Adult and juvenile releasees living in Community Corrections Act counties are supervised by CCA county agents. Adult releasees in non-CCA agents are supervised by Department of Corrections agents. Juvenile parolees in non-CCA counties are supervised by county probation agents in some counties, and by Department of Corrections "contract agents" in counties where the counties contract with the DOC to

supervise their juvenile probationers and parolees. Due to the more serious nature of their crimes, releasees tend to require higher levels of supervision than probationers. Thus it is important to include releasees in considerations of the overall workload of community correctional systems.

The majority of adult releasees live in and are supervised by Hennepin and Ramsey Counties. In fact, the number of adult releasees living in these counties is disproportionately large in comparison to the populations of these counties. Juveniles parolees are distributed more evenly throughout the state.

The offense distribution of adult releasees includes higher percentages of property and drug offenders, and a lower percentage of person offenders than is found in the correctional institutions. This is due to the longer sentences served by person offenders. The percentages of female offenders and white offenders in the adult releasee population are higher than in the prison population, due to these groups having shorter sentences, on average, than males and non-whites, respectively.

I. Summary

The number of Minnesotans on probation again increased in 1995. At year-end, nearly 84,000 adults and over 15,000 juveniles were under probation supervision. Additionally, 1835 adults and 276 juveniles are being supervised in Minnesota as releasees from state correctional institutions. This adds up to over 100,000 offenders under community supervision in Minnesota.

While it is important to count the number of offenders on probation, additional information is needed to determine the workload represented by these probationers. Standards for face-to-face contact with a probation agent vary according to the risk represented by the offender, the sanctions pronounced in court, the offender's compliance with the probation conditions, and local probation policies. Having weighted workload data allows individual probation services providers and the State of Minnesota to allocate resources in proportion to needs. While individual providers of probation services have caseload management systems, at present no procedures exist to uniformly measure probation workloads statewide. The Minnesota Legislature has taken several steps to address this concern:

1. *Minnesota Session Laws* 1992, Chapter 571, Article 11, Section 15 appointed a "probation standards task force." *Session Laws* 1993, Chapter 326, Article 10 directed this task force to report to the Legislature concerning statewide probation officer and funding needs, and to make recommendations to facilitate uniform case classification and reporting. In their December, 1994 report, *Probation in Minnesota: Putting the Pieces Together*, the task force proposed a method of weighting probation survey population data to estimate the workload represented by the probation population.
2. In *Minnesota Session Laws* 1995, Chapter 226, Article 1, Section 11, Subdivision 3, the Legislature asked the Legislative Auditor's Office to conduct "a weighted workload study to be used as a basis for fund distributions across all three probation delivery systems, based on uniform workload standards and level of risk of individual offenders." The study was to "recommend to the Legislature...a statewide uniform workload system...; a standardized data collection system...; and a new mechanism or formula for aid distribution based on the data." The Legislative Auditor's report (*Funding for Probation Services*, January 1996) explains that subsequent discussions with legislators led to some modification of the focus of their study. The Legislative Auditor concluded that "a weighted workload study based on the risk of individual offenders cannot be done at this time." However, the Auditor's report made suggestions on how to implement a statewide method of offender risk assessment. A bill was introduced during the 1996 legislative session to implement recommendations included in the Legislative Auditor's report concerning data collection, offender classification, and probation outcome measurement, but the bill did not pass.
3. The 1996 Omnibus Crime Bill directs the Office of Strategic and Long-Range Planning to develop "a weighted workload study to be used as a basis of distributing probation officer caseload reduction

funding across all three probation delivery systems, based on uniform workload standards and level of risk of individual offenders."

The Minnesota Department of Corrections plans to conduct its next probation survey at year-end 1996, to meet the ongoing need for information on the number of individuals on probation. No significant changes are planned in questions, definitions, or data collection methods. However, given increasing interest in quantifying the supervision or "work" represented by the probation population and identifying the outcomes of probation, the DOC is working with other stakeholders to develop methods to collect additional data concerning probation in Minnesota.

Appendix A

1995 Probation Survey instructions and questionnaire

Instructions for Completing the 1995 Probation Survey

Why do a probation survey? Who participates in the survey?

Thank you for your participation in this annual study, which is conducted in order to provide caseload information to probation policymakers in the Minnesota Department of Corrections, Minnesota counties, and other government agencies. In order to obtain information regarding all 1995 probationers, this questionnaire is being mailed to:

- Community Corrections directors, to collect all CCA-county probation information
- Department of Corrections district supervisors, to collect data on all probationers supervised by DOC felony agents and DOC contract agents
- Chief probation officers in non-CCA counties, to collect data on all probationers supervised by non-CCA county agents.

One questionnaire is enclosed for each county in which your office provides probation services. Please answer the questions for all cases under your supervision.

DOC district supervisors should note that their reports can be generated using PROBER. Your questionnaires simply serve as a list of the reports that we expect to receive from you. You can simply submit the reports produced by your software; you need not transcribe the numbers from the computer printouts to the questionnaires.

It is expected that enhancements to the CSTS+ software will allow its users to generate the report from their software, so CSTS+ users as well can simply send in the report printout, provided that the information is laid out in a manner similar to the questionnaire.

Who should be counted as a "probationer" for purposes of this report?

- Include all probationers, regardless of conviction status, who were under the supervision of a probation agency as part of a court order at any time between December 31, 1994 and December 31, 1995.
- Count individuals if there is a court order for supervision and/or services such as restitution, community services, or monitoring.
- Include persons placed on probation under Minnesota Statutes 152.18 ("deferred adjudication" for certain drug offenders) and 609.135 (stay of imposition or execution) if you are providing probation supervision or services.
- Exclude persons on investigative status only, such as PSI's, pre-pleas, bail evaluations, etc.
- Exclude persons on "bench probation," "court probation," or "summary probation," who have not been placed under the supervision of a probation agency.
- Exclude pre-trial diversion cases.
- Exclude juveniles receiving services under a CHIPS petition.
- Exclude persons released from state correctional facilities, who are on supervised release, parole, intensive community supervision, ITP, etc.
- Include those probationers who are sent to your county from another county or state for supervision.
- Exclude those whom you send to another county or state for supervision.

In all questions on this survey, you are asked to report the number of **people**, not the number of offenses or open files. In each question, each offender should be counted only once. If an offender is under both juvenile probation and adult probation supervision, count the offender only once, placing the individual as an adult or juvenile according to the more serious offense. If you are unable to eliminate double-counting of individuals under both adult and juvenile supervision, asterisk the juvenile total on line 4 of page 1 and in the "Comments" section on page 2, estimate the number of juveniles also counted as adults.

If an adult offender is on probation for offenses of differing severity, count him in the category of highest severity. (For instance, the offender under supervision for a felony and a misdemeanor would be counted as a felon.)

What's new in the 1995 Probation Survey?

- A "total" column has been added to all questions.
- Collection of pre-trial diversion data has been eliminated from this survey, because diversion data is being collected from counties via required biennial reports (MS 388.24, 401.065).
- More detailed instructions have been added.

Notes on specific questions

Question 1. You will note that the "1994 year-end population" figures you reported on line 4 of last year's survey have been entered on line 1 of the enclosed questionnaire(s). If you no longer agree with these numbers, strike them out and write in your amended numbers.

Question 2. Count individuals who newly entered probation supervision during the year. If an offender picks up another offense while on your caseload, this should not be counted.

Question 3. Count individuals who were removed from probation supervision during the year—for example, offenders who are discharged from probation, are sent to another county or state for supervision; are incarcerated upon revocation of their probation, absconders who you remove from your caseload; or offenders who die. Do not count as a removal an offender who is discharged from probation for one offense but remains on probation for another offense.

Question 4. The year-end populations reported for this question are the most important data collected by the questionnaire. Questions 5 through 8 ask you to provide a breakdown of the question 4 population by gender, race, Hispanic origin, and offense category.

In past years this question has included a formula indicating that line 4 should equal line 1 + line 2 - line 3. Some counties have made the correct observation that this formula will not necessarily be exactly correct for each individual column¹, but the line 1 + line 2 - line 3 = line 4 formula should be true for the "total" column.

Question 5. Self-explanatory.

Questions 6-7. The DOC reports the aggregate statewide data from this annual probation survey to the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) on their nationwide probation survey. The race and ethnic origin categories used in questions 6 and 7 are the same as those used by the BJS survey. The federal government regards "Hispanic" as a designation of ethnicity, not race. Thus Hispanic probationers will generally be counted as White or Black in question 6, and as Hispanic in question 7. The following Census Bureau definitions may be useful.

White (race)—A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East. (DOC note: this is true of most Hispanics. If your agency records Hispanic origin as a racial category but does not have a white/black distinction, then include them in the white category.)

Hispanic (ethnic origin)—A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

Question 8. As was mentioned previously, a probationer being supervised due to more than one offense should only be counted once (not as many times as he/she has offenses). Report the most serious offense for which the individual was under supervision on 12/31/95.

The offense categories used in question 8 are derived from the Minnesota Offense Code (MOC) general index categories, except that "juvenile status offenses" and DWI were made into separate categories, and some MOC "miscellaneous" offenses (liquor, conservation) were added to the "crime against government" category. Therefore, if you are familiar with the MOC system, you can consult its tables if you have questions in categorizing offenses.

Here are some offenses for which survey completers had questions in the past, and how to categorize them:

Offense	Offense category
terroristic threats	Assault
criminal vehicular homicide	Traffic/Accidents
witness tampering, probation violation	Crime against administration of justice
bad checks, welfare fraud	Theft related
tax evasion	Crime against government

On question 8, questions have arisen as to how to determine the "most serious offense" for the probationer who is under supervision for more than one offense. In a recent study, the Bureau of Justice Statistics used the statutory maximum sentence for each offense to determine which was most severe. Strict application of this approach may not be feasible in your reporting, but their definition provides a useful guiding principle that you can probably apply to some extent. For example, if one offense is a felony and the remainder are gross misdemeanors or misdemeanors (all of these terms are defined in terms of their statutory maximum sentences), report the felony offense. If one offense is a gross misdemeanor and the others are misdemeanors, report the gross misdemeanor offense.

A computer program was developed to automatically produce the probation survey report for users of PROBER caseload management software (used by Department of Corrections agents/offices). The PROBER data lacks detailed offense information, so its offense selection logic used an arbitrary ranking of the offense categories of question 8 to select one felony over another, or one misdemeanor over another. This offense ranking logic will also be built into CSTS+. The ranking of the question 8 offense categories used by PROBER and CSTS+ is given below for your information:

Homicide; Criminal Sexual Conduct; Kidnapping/False Imprisonment; Assault; Robbery; Arson; Escape/Flight; Burglary; Drugs; Crime Against Administration of Justice; Crime Against Government, Liquor, Conservation; DWI; Obscenity; Sex Related; Crime Against Family; Vehicle Theft; Theft; Theft Related; Forgery/Counterfeiting; Property Damage; Stolen Property; Traffic/Accidents (excl. DWI); Weapons; Disturbing Peace/Privacy; Gambling; Juvenile Status Offenses; Other

¹ For instance, suppose an offender is on probation for the entire year. He begins the year as a misdemeanor. During the year he picks up a felony offense, and is under supervision for that offense at year end. In question 1 he would be counted as a misdemeanor. In question 4 he would be counted as a felon. Since he was under supervision for the entire year he would not represent an entry or removal for questions 2 or 3. This occurrence would cause the line 1 + line 2 - line 3 = line 4 formula to fail for the felony and misdemeanor columns (unless there was another offender who went from felon to misdemeanor to cancel things out).

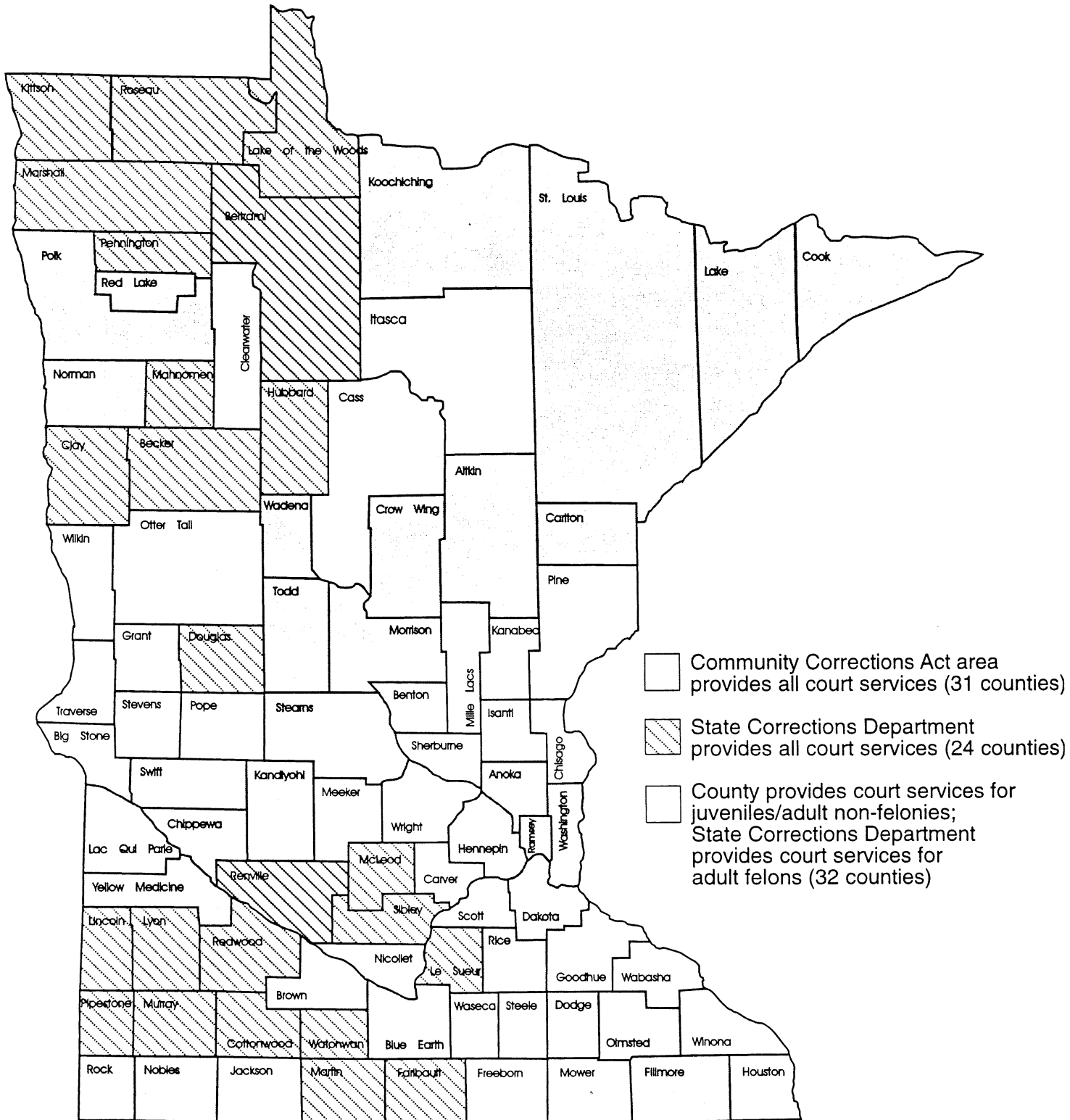
