Minnesota Milestones, the state's 30 -year plan, shows that Minnesota is moving toward its vision of the future established by thousands of citizens in 1992. The 1996 Progress Report examines the state's advancement toward its vision and goals. The 1996 Progress Report is presented in two parts: a small summary publication using a report card format, and a full report providing a detailed description of the changes over the last four years.

Progress toward the 20 long-range goals is measured by 79 indicators. Minnesotans, who participated in the creation of Minnesota Milestones in 1991 and 1992, recognized that the future they wanted for themselves and their children would require time to develop; but without goals and measures of results, arriving at that future would be unlikely.

This report summarizes trends between 1990 and 1995 for each goal and its corresponding indicators and compares outcomes with the predetermined targets that were slated to be accomplished by 1995. Interim data for 1992 is also shown.

Between 1990 and 1995, nine of the 20 Milestones goals rated positive results butsix turned in the wrong direction. The remaining five goals either had mixed results or data was not available.

A positive trend is defined as a goal with half or more of its indicators with data going in a direction toward the target as compared to the base year, 1990. A negative trend is defined as a goal with half or more of its indicators with data moving away from the target as compared to the base year, 1990. Mixed results were recorded for goals with an equal number of positive and negative indicators. No change was used to note those goals where data remained the same over time. All of the indicators will be reviewed in 1997 when Minnesota Milestones is revised to improve its measures of progress.

Because no new data is available for the two indicators for this goal, no conclusion can be drawn concerning Minnesota's progress since 1990.
