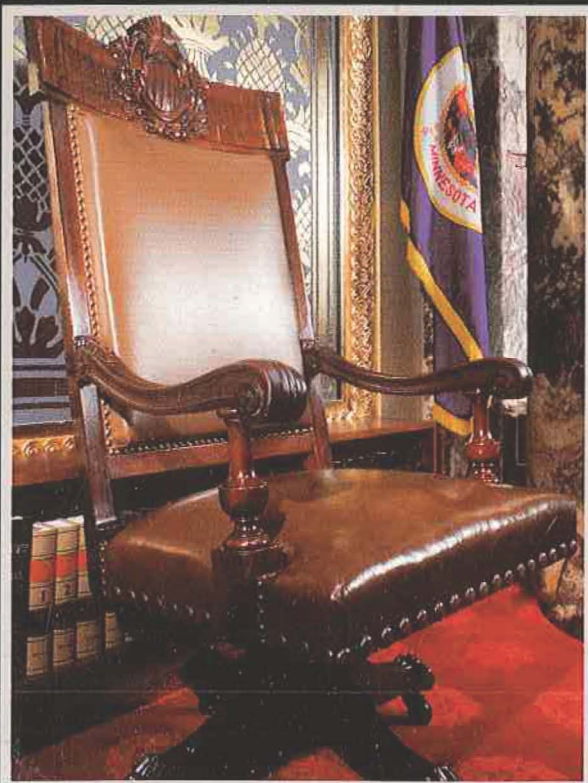
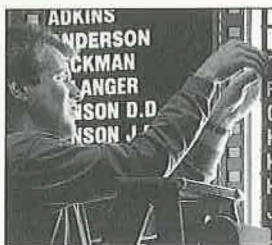

Introducing the 1993 Minnesota Senate

As the pace quickens for the beginning of the 78th Legislative Session, members of the Minnesota Senate are concluding the organizational process that began days after the November election. All 67 seats in the Senate were up for election and, as a result of the election, there are 16 freshman Senators--the Class of '93.

The incoming freshman class has a remarkable symmetry. Of the sixteen new Senators, eight are women with four DFLers and four IRs. Thus, four of the new male Senators are DFLers and four are IRs. Three of the freshman Senators come to the Senate after having served in the House of

Representatives.

For the Senate as a whole, there are 45 DFLers and 22 IRs. Overall, there are 45 men and 20 women serving in the Senate. The number of women Senators is a significant increase over the 14 women Senators serving last session and mirrors a nationwide trend of more women gaining elective office.

The average age for members of the Minnesota Senate is 48; the oldest member is 66 and the youngest is 32. The average length of service is 6.5 years, not counting House service. The two senior most members of the Senate have served 22 years.

When Senators were asked to list their occupation, 17 chose "business," the largest category. Other frequently listed occupational categories include 10 farmers, 11 attorneys, 11 legislators and 5 educators.

The following pages provide a closer look at the 67 men and women of the Minnesota Senate. The information includes the Capitol addresses and phone numbers of Senate members along with their individual legislative interests and their committee assignments. The next section contains a membership listing of the Senate standing committees and divisions.

Majority preview

The Legislature responded to the message recently sent by the Minnesota voters when they said government should put its own house in order so it is better prepared to solve the problems facing our state and our nation. Legislative leaders have heeded this message in creating one of the most dramatic restructurings of the legislative process in many years.

We streamlined the process with fewer committees while creating several new committees in areas that voters said should have a higher priority: Health Care,

Crime Prevention, Campaign Reform, and Family Services, for example.

Another important goal of the restructuring is to bring policy decisions and funding decisions closer together. Too often in the past, the Senators responsible for funding a particular program were not part of the public testimony or the committee debate about the merits of the program. Now the Senators who gain an understanding of the policy arguments in a particular area will also be responsible for setting the priorities for funding programs in that area.

This broader authority for budget decisions means all 67 Senators, Democrats and Republi-

cans, will be part of the budget process. A handful of individual Senators in key positions will no longer be solely responsible for standing up to interest groups clamoring for more funding. It will now be the responsibility of every member of the Senate to say "no" when state resources cannot be stretched any further. Our restructuring should also help us focus more of our attention on the outcomes we want to achieve, rather than on a particular process, program or state agency.

In addition to the restructuring, the Legislature will focus on other ways to bring about government

Minority preview

While the actions taken in the 1993 session will begin and end with the resolution of the \$769 million 1993-94 budget shortfall, the underlying current remains the call for changes in state government.

The Senate I-R Caucus hopes to see a continuation of the cooperative effort and successes of the 1992 Session. That spirit of cooperation must include the diverse interest groups that exist, whether it's due to geographical location or philosophical conviction. It is our job as elected officials to make life better for all of Minnesota's 4.4

million citizens. As evidenced by the 1992 Session, cooperation is preferable to political combat.

The main test for finding a common ground will be the coming biennial budget. State revenues will increase by nine percent, but, unless we change existing laws, state spending will grow by 15 percent. A large part of that spending growth is due to an additional 19,000 students who are entering our schools, and a growing number of residents eligible for Medical Assistance and related services. The solution to the budget shortfall does not lie with cuts in those areas, nor does it rest with tax increases. The shortfall solution should not lead, directly or

indirectly, to higher taxes for Minnesotans. It makes no sense to tax people out of their homes and farms, so we have to focus our efforts on limiting spending increases, and in areas that do not affect the most vulnerable in our society.

I believe there are six additional priority issues ahead.

1992 brought the start of MinnesotaCare, the new health program designed to help uninsured Minnesotans obtain access to health care and also rein in the rapidly increasing costs of health care services. The cost containment provisions of

efficiency and reform. We will review the CORE report and other reform measures to determine ways to make our government work better.

And, like always, the legislature will balance the budget. I do not believe that the financial problem is as great or as unmanageable as the governor would like us to believe. (I believe his proposals to reduce property tax relief programs like local government aid,

the homestead and agricultural credit aid and the in-lieu-of tax program will meet with strong opposition.) The elimination of these programs on the state level would greatly increase local property taxes and the Legislature is not likely to go back to a system where state services are based on the value of the property one owns.

Transportation funding is high on our agenda. Expect increases in the gasoline tax and other related taxes and fees to be discussed

along with the apportionment of state funding between transit programs and highway financing.

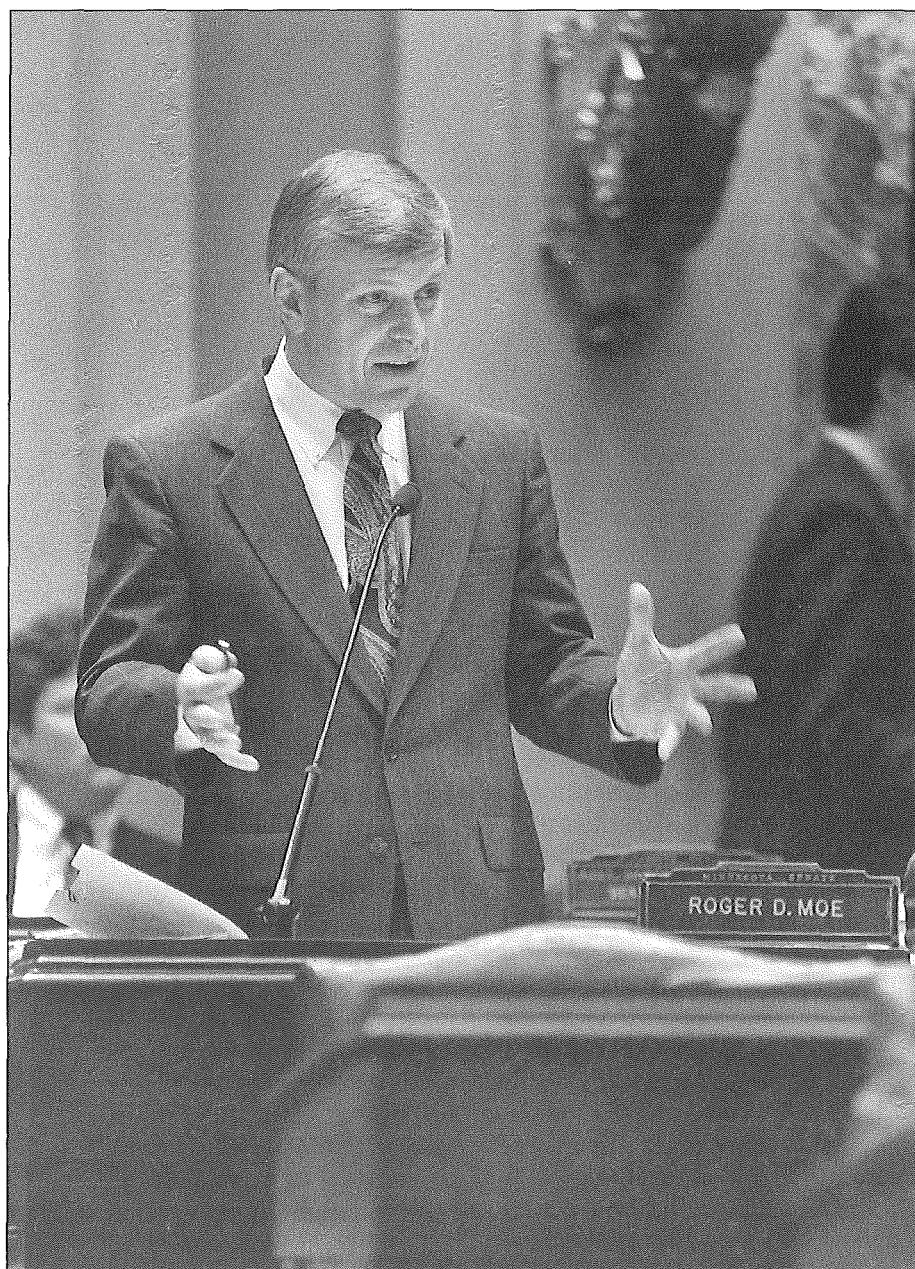
Legislative issues which affect children will receive high priority. Many of us recognize that investment in our youngest citizens and their families is cost-effective as well as sound public policy. We anticipate emphasizing policy that is family-friendly, policy that will help build strong healthy family structures. To do this effectively, the coordination of early childhood programs will be essential as will continued or increased funding of the Family Investment Plan, a plan which helps remove the barriers to self-sufficiency.

The passage of the 1992 health care access legislation was the first step in Minnesota's attempt to improve access and control costs in our health care system. Change will not come easily or quickly, and I anticipate that we will be working with this legislation in the ensuing years.

Bills based on the recommendations put forth by the Select Committee on Packaging and the Environment (SCOPE) will probably make it through the legislative process after failing to do so during the last two sessions. The bills will advocate a significant reduction in packaging waste which constitutes about a third of all garbage.

Most of the issues that were part of last year's gambling bill will be back before the Gaming Committee again this year. There will inevitably be extensive discussion about the future of gaming in Minnesota. We will be hearing from advocates to stop its expansion, from those who would like to expand it to include video machines in Minnesota bars and veterans' clubs.

The aforementioned issues represent only a few of the many which the Legislature will debate during the 1993 session. I am confident that we will enjoy a productive session and I look forward to meeting the challenges which lie ahead.



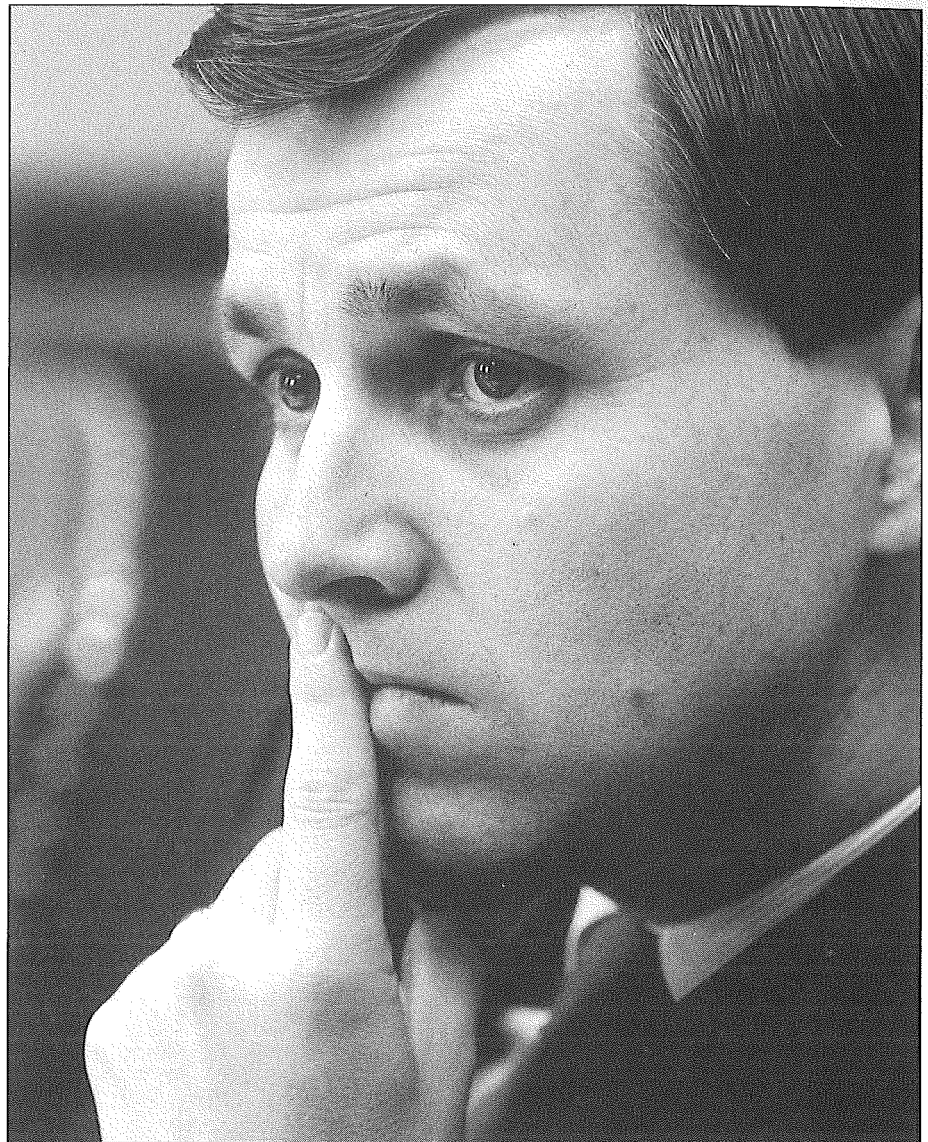

MinnesotaCare and changes in the financing of the program are key challenges facing the partnership of legislators and the medical community. We'll continue to break new ground nationally with each step forward, and resume our work at the start of the session when the Legislative Commission on Health Care Access presents its report.

Education funding comprises 30 percent of the state's general fund, reflecting our commitment to opportunity for a quality education. The state is under the direction of a 1991 court order to address the issue of equity in education funding. Personally, I don't like to see kids become pawns in what is becoming a rural versus metropolitan debate. I believe we should remove unnecessary red tape, and deliver as directly as possible education dollars to the classroom to enhance the student-teacher education relationship.

There are many good things that we want to do for Minnesotans, but we will never be able to afford them unless we continue to strengthen our business climate, thereby maintaining the jobs that now exist and creating new jobs in the future. The jobs issue is changing in the 1990's: still with us are the familiar issues of reforming the workers' compensation system (and its high costs) and a regressive commercial-industrial tax schedule, but we must also recognize workers' needs for day care and other social services, so parents aren't forced to choose between family and job.

The major crime initiatives passed into law this past year dealt with very serious problems, but there are new concerns emerging. It is important we take quick action on such crimes as stalking, and the increasing use of guns and inhalants by juveniles. We will also be reviewing a legislative commission report looking at tougher penalties and treatment for offenders with repeated



DWI convictions.

The proposed expansion of gambling in Minnesota will be a closely-watched issue, but I believe the field of gambling won't be opened up at this time. Supporters of an expansion believe it is important for Main Street businesses, but we are only beginning to see and understand the increasing social costs and consequences of gambling. It would be better to address the concerns of Main Street businesses in the context of the state's business climate, rather than expand gambling and its attendant problems.

Finally, we legislators need to look at ourselves and remove any public doubt as to ethical shortcomings. We can start by banning the

transfer of dollars between legislative candidates and limiting legislators to one campaign fund, which will help make races local races once again. Also, let's repeal the political contribution refund program, and spend those taxpayer dollars on programs that help Minnesotans in need of services.

Change will be the theme of governments at all levels in the future, and Gov. Arne Carlson's Commission on Reform and Efficiency will help us restructure and streamline for the coming years when revenue growth is expected to remain slow. By initiating change now, in cooperative fashion, we can more effectively do our job: the efficient delivery of state services to Minnesotans.



Hidden treasure at the legislature: the Legislative Reference Library

A first-time visitor to the Legislative Reference Library who expects to find a collection of dusty statute books may be in for a surprise. Instead, beyond the doors of Room 645 of the State Office Building unfolds a spare, uncluttered room with bookshelves off to the side. The understated look of the space belies its size and usefulness in the legislative process. Whether a legislator's special areas of concern are farming and insurance, natural resources and metropolitan affairs, or taxes and health care access, there is an embarrassment of riches in information available, with sometimes hundreds of sources from which to draw. The legislative library provides not only this vast sea of information, much of it

available through computer networks, but also the technology and expertise legislators and their staff members need to navigate it.

"The collection is really a very small part of what we're all about," said Marilyn Cathcart, director of Library Services. Although many people still think "you go to the library to check out a book," said Cathcart, the library's resources begin, but do not end with books, magazines and printed materials.

The library was founded in 1969, a time marked by changing attitudes about government. Across the country, government was embracing a new openness and a movement was underway toward research-based decision-making. In the midst of these changes in governing style, the library opened its doors,

boasting a collection that included nine newspapers, three magazines, and, surprising by 1990s standards, an attitude that not just any publication was suitable for the library. At the time, said Cathcart, the library director didn't carry *Time* magazine because he considered it too biased and controversial.

As government has become broader-based and more information-oriented, the library has grown in order to keep a rein on the stunning array of information that is pertinent, even essential, to legislators remaining well-informed about the issues with which they work. Today's library carries 45 newspapers (with more available via computer) and 800 magazines presenting a plethora of views.

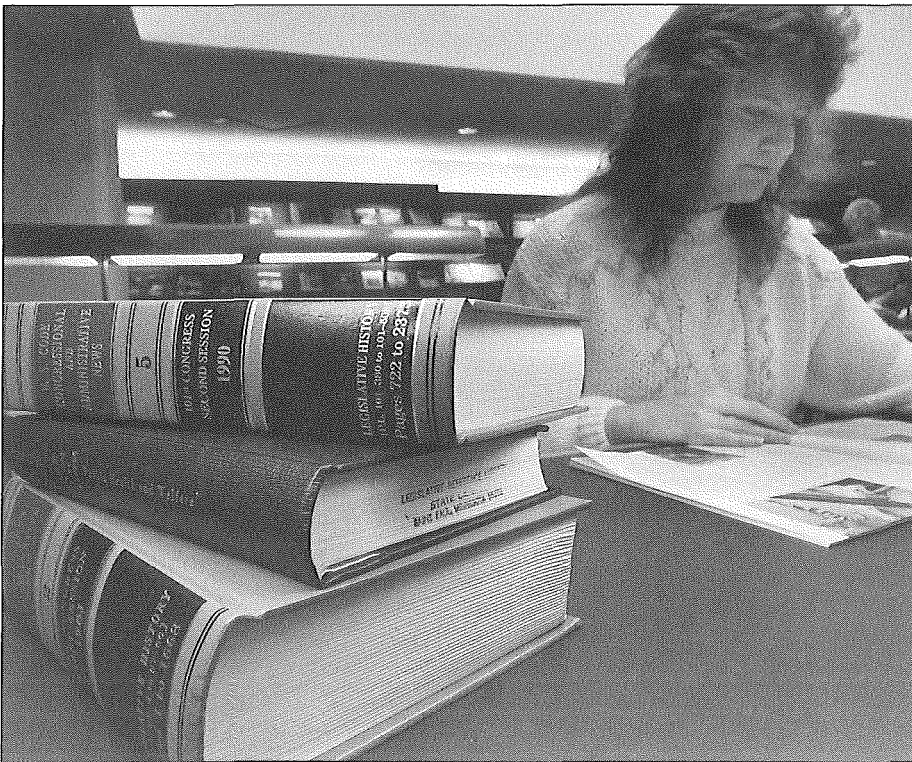
The library staff's expertise, perhaps its least visible resource, is also its strongest suit. Librarians help legislators and their staff members use several forms of information technology, making sure the library's high-tech tools speed, rather than impede their research efforts. Cathcart also stressed that the library's work is nonpartisan and confidential.

"Much of what we do involves mediating technology for people," says Cathcart. The library staff can obtain U.S. Census data on CD ROM (Compact Disc Read-Only Memory), eliminating the need to

plow through thick volumes of data. With similar ease they can obtain U.S. Supreme Court decisions within minutes at no cost via the Internet, an expansive nationwide computer network.

The library's information specialists help legislative staff members tap into the library catalogs of Minnesota's state universities, community colleges, state agencies, some private colleges and selected Internet libraries around the country.

When technology alone isn't sufficient to locate the needed resources, the library's staff can fall back on non-high-tech tools, too, such as their Rolodexes. A call to a librarian in another state's legislative library may be the quickest way to obtain a copy of a bill from that state. The library maintains a nationwide network of other professional relationships with people and organizations who can be of help when legislative research requires some sleuthing.

The library staff's expertise also plays a part in solving more mundane problems. "In talking to legislators," said Cathcart, "the

first thing they'd say was that they were overwhelmed by the quantity of paper coming into their offices." The library, in accordance with a 1991 law, plays a part in reducing the logjam of paper that can obscure, rather than enhance, a legislator's information-gathering process. The law prohibits state agencies from making blanket mailings to legislators. Now, instead of sending reports, newsletters, and other materials to each legislator, agencies send copies to the library. The library publishes a monthly list, called Minnesota Resources, of new state agency documents legislators can request. Each legislator can obtain the state documents he or she needs while facing fewer stacks of paper that must be sorted or discarded. In addition, a similar listing, called Introductions, is offered to legislators detailing new non-Minnesota materials available in the library.

The library offers a contents page service to legislators and legislative staff to help them remain informed about the issues while taming information overload. Legislators who subscribe to the

service may choose magazines that they wish to regularly review. The library sends them the contents pages of these publications, and legislators may order articles that interest them.

Another service offered to legislators and staff is "Inside Issues." Library staff scan all the periodicals received by the library and note articles on topics users have requested. A weekly customized list from which article copies may be ordered is sent to each user.

The legislative library has a number of materials that are available nowhere else. Audio tapes of all legislative floor sessions and committee meetings from the past ten years are kept in the library and may be used by anyone (older tapes are held at the Minnesota Historical Society). The library can be a treasure trove for researchers because all publications by state government for public distribution must be deposited there. In particular, some reports by consultants retained by the state may be unavailable anywhere else.

The library also maintains clipping files of articles that have appeared in newspapers and other publications. The files are organized by topic, by legislative district and congressional district. In addition, files of articles written about the governor and other prominent Minnesotans, Minnesota corporations, and organizations that play prominent parts in state government are kept.

Although the library's primary focus is on assisting legislators and their staff in obtaining information needed in the legislative process, the library is also open to the public. Anyone may visit the library and librarians will assist citizens in searching the online card catalog and using the library's other resources.
