Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Motor Vehicles.

Mr. Schwanke by request introduced:

H. F. No. 1748, A bill for an act imposing an occupational license tax on the privilege of operating a motor vehicle, providing for payment of the proceeds to such veterans' bonus fund as the Legislature may establish, and prescribing penalties for failure to pay the tax imposed by this act.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Messrs. Goodin, Hagland, Murk, Volstad and Biernat introduced:

H. F. No. 1749, A bill for an act relating to the imposition and collection of an educational tax upon income of certain natural and artificial persons required to pay Minnesota State income taxes; said educational tax to provide additional funds for reasonable and necessary school operating expenses of the school board or board of education of any city of the first class now or hereafter having a population of 450,000 or more inhabitants, defining the duties and powers of the commissioner of taxation in connection with the imposition, computation and collection of such educational tax, and the disbursement of the proceeds thereof to such school board or board of education.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Taxes.

Messrs. Biernat, Tomczyk and Hagland introduced:

H. F. No. 1750, A bill for an act relating to the care, removal and trimming of trees in certain cities of the first class; repealing Laws 1945, Chapter 210, and Laws 1947, Chapter 333.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Municipal Affairs.

Messrs. Kinzer, Root and Welch introduced:

H. F. No. 1751, A joint resolution requesting the Congress of the United States to call a convention for the sole purpose of proposing amendments to the constitution authorizing the United States to enter into a world federal government with limited powers adequate to insure peace.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

House Resolution No. 17, A resolution to reimburse members of the House of Representatives for expenses necessarily incurred for travel in excess of the sums heretofore paid.

"The Legislature of the state of Minnesota has been in session since the 4th day of January, 1949 and during said period each member of the House of Representatives has personally expended in excess of the sum of \$375 for various necessary disbursements in connection with the business of the Legislature,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, and it is hereby resolved by the House of Representatives that the Chief Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to prepare, issue and deliver to each member of the House of Representatives his voucher in the sum of \$375 to be paid out of the Legislative Expense Fund to reimburse such member for money expended for the purposes above described."

Amend the title to read:

A RESOLUTION TO REIMBURSE MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES FOR EXPENSES NECESSARILY INCURRED IN CONNECTION WITH THE BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE.

And when so amended that the resolution is reported back without recommendation.
