H. F. No. 414, A bill for an act establishing metropolitan transit commissions to promote the public health, safety, and welfare by regulation and control of public transit facilities in contiguous cities of the first class and the metropolitan area adjacent thereto; providing for the organization, administration, and financing of such metropolitan transit commission.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Metropolitan and Urban Affairs.

Messrs. Kirchner, Ashbach, Wozniak, O'Brien and Adams, S., introduced:

H. F. No. 415, A bill for an act authorizing certain banks to invest in corporations whose purpose is to provide clerical services for them, and for other purposes.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Financial Institutions and Securities.

Messrs. Clark, Chilgren, Renner, Prifrel and Rutter introduced:

H. F. No. 416, A bill for an act relating to wild animals; amending Minnesota Statutes 1961, Section 100.27, Subdivision 2.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Game and Fish.

Messrs. O'Dea and Albertson introduced:

H. F. No. 417, A bill for an act relating to annexation of certain unincorporated lands in Washington county.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Metropolitan and Urban Affairs.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 2

Relating to living expenses of Legislators during the Legislative Session.

Be It Resolved, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Secretary of

Senate is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives is hereby authorized and directed to prepare and issue warrants in payment of living expenses to each member of the House of Representatives, from their respective Legislative Expense Funds, for each calendar day of the 1963 Legislative Session.

Resolved Further, that per diem living expenses in the sum of \$18 per diem shall be paid to such members who have moved from their usual place of lodging during a substantial part of the 1963 Session of the Legislature;

Provided Further, that the per diem living expenses of members of the Legislature who have not so changed their place of lodging for a substantial part of said Session shall be the sum of \$12 per day.

Provided Further, each member of the Legislature shall certify in writing to the Secretary of the Senate or to the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives prior to the issuance of the first of such warrants for such living expenses whether or not he has moved from his usual place of lodging.

Mr. Dirlam moved that Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 2 be now adopted.
