Lund discussed the work of three subcommittees working toward Zero Tolerance of Violence. The three subcommittees deal with physical safety, communication, and issues beyond the physical, i.e. attitudes.

Senator Piper moved adoption of the statement of Zero Tolerance of Violence. The motion passed. (See attached.)

Senator Stumpf amended the Mileage Resolution (SRES-12-93) by changing the air miles to Thief River Falls from 560 to 550.

Senator Johnson, D.E. moved passage of the Mileage Resolution as amended by Sen. Stumpf. The motion passed.

SC2116 was amended on line 11 by replacing the word "personal" with the word "private".

Senator Johnson, D.E. moved mileage and living expense rates as outlined in SC2116 as amended. The motion passed.

Senator Moe presented S.F. 38 for Senator Luther in his absence.

Senator Merriam moved that S.F. 38 be recommended to pass.

Senator Pogemiller moved to amend S.F. 38 by adding a sunset date of July 1, 1993.

S.F. 38 was laid on the table.

- 3 Each member of the Senate who has moved from the member's

- 7 member's place of residence for each trip during the 78th
- 8 Legislature. Mileage for travel by automobile must be at the
- 9 rate of 28 cents per mile, or any greater amount authorized by
- 10 the internal revenue service for employees. Mileage for travel
- ll by personal aircraft must be at the rate of 43 cents per mile.
- 12 Commercial airfare must be the actual cost.
- Each member of the Senate shall be paid per diem living
- 14 expenses in an amount up to \$50 for each calendar day during the
- 15 sessions of the 78th Legislature.
- 16 Each member of the Senate shall be reimbursed up to \$500
- 17 per month for actual lodging expenses during the sessions of the
- 18 78th Legislature.
- 19 Each member of the Senate shall certify in writing to the
- 20 Secretary of the Senate for the actual travel and lodging for
- 21 which the member seeks reimbursement.
- The Secretary of the Senate shall prepare and issue
- 23 warrants from the Senate legislative expense fund in payment of
- 24 mileage and living expenses to each member of the Senate.
